OLIVER MARTIN NORDLY

First year as head coach at the Iowa State Teachers college. Took competition at Red Wing, Minnesota, high school. Won four letters each in football and basketball and one each in baseball and track. Was captain of football and basketball teams in senior year. Named as all-state high school forward in 1922. Graduated in 1923 and that fall was matriculated at Carleton college. After serving his one semester of residence he settled down and won four basketball awards and three in football. Captained the basketball team his last two years and was twice named all-Mid-West conference, once as a forward and once as a guard. In 1926 he was named on the all-conference football team as a halfback. Today still rates as one of the outstanding athletes in Carleton history. After graduation in 1927 he took over the coaching reins at the Rochester, Minnesota, high school, mentoring football, basketball, and track. Was rated as the outstanding basketball coach in the state. Teams in all sports ranked high in conference and state competition. Now head basketball and assistant football coach here. Married, has 3 girls.

THE PANTHER PACK

ROBERT CURTIS. Seniro. Center. All-conference center for two years. Rates as fine offensive player and an equally good defensive ace. Had scored total of 245 points in 28 games up to start of this year. Has won two letters each in baseball and basketball. Was chosen as basketball player of greatest value to team last year.

GEORGE GILLULY. Senior. Guard. Has been both forward and guard in winning two letters. Confines efforts entirely to basketball. Has scored 31 points in two years.

ROMAN YATCHAK. Senior. Guard. Big, rugged, fair shot. Has won two letters in football and one in basketball. Transferred from Ironwood, Michigan, junior college. Scored 19 points last year.

GEORGE MINER. Senior. Guard. Can also play forward. Has won one letter in basketball and one in tennis. Asked to be shifted to a guard post this season. Scored 25 points last year.

WILLIAM SIMS. Junior. Forward. Hard fighter. Not polished but is fast, always on the ball. Has one letter in basketball. Scored 27 points last year.

JOHN LEE. Junior. Guard. Big, fair speed. Was regular at start of 1936-37 season but slumped and failed to letter. Going good this year. Scored 15 points last season.

ED TREFZGER. Junior. Forward. Played only a few minutes last year. Greatly improved this season. Aggressive to the limit. Good shot when he will use it, fine team player. Did not score last year. Won letter in tennis, runner-up in singles and is co-doubles-champ.

WILLIAM BOLT. Junior. Forward. Did not play last year. Another aggressive player, nerveless, seems always to be in position. Real worth as a reserve.

FRANCIS BABCOCK. Sophomore. Forward. Unpolished but possesses lots of ability. Hot from far out on the floor.

TED BUCHWALD. Sophomore. Forward or guard. Big, rangy, good ball handler, scores well at either position.

LYLE DODD. Sophomore. Forward or center. Big, good eye, spells Curtis at center.

MERLYN GERSEMA. Sophomore. Center. Biggest man on squad.

PAUL MAST. Sophomore. Guard. Small, a brilliant dribbler.

PAUL MINER. Sophomore. Forward. Good eye, good passer, good shot. Determined to be THE basketball player in the Miner family.

FRED NUS. Sophomore. Guard. Tallest defense man on squad.

Attended high school at Woodbine, Iowa. There he won four letters each in football, track, and baseball, and three in basketball for a grand total of 15. Graduated from Woodbine high school in 1926 and started college work at Iowa State Teachers college the following fall. At Teachers college he won four letters in football and two in baseball. In 1929 he captained the grid team. Won all-Iowa conference honors as a halfback in both 1928 and 1929. Was named player of greatest value to the 1929 football team. Following graduation in 1930 he began coaching at his alma mater, taking over the wrestling team that year. In addition to head coaching duties with the grapplers he works with all freshman teams except basketball.
