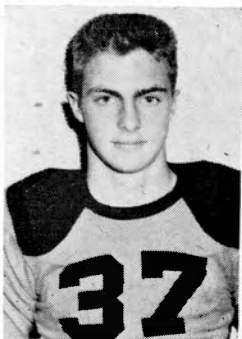

George has played fullback for the Little Tutors for two years. He is one of the high scoring backs of the conference. Having picked off second place as a low hurdler in the State Indoor meet last year, he is considered a track man par-excellent.



Myron Jepson—Right Tackle

During his three years as a letterman Mike has played every line position. Because of being very dependable and a fine defensive player, he was a utility lineman last year. Mike is also a basketball and track man.



Marvin Lindberg—Left Tackle

Last year Red served as equipment manager for the Little Tutors, but decided to play football this year. He has gained some experience as a left tackle.



LaVonne Pierce—Left End

"Rock" is a three year letterman in football. He played guard for two years and has been playing left end this year. He rated a position on the All-Conference team in 1946 and was one of our best track men.

SQUAD MEMBERS

Bill was a quarter back for two years but was moved into the line this year because of a shortage of line material. He has started every game and has played more minutes of football than any other man on the squad this year.

Stamp is the highest scoring back in the conference and possibly in the state. His educated toe seldom fails to get the extra point. He was an Honorable Mention on the All-State selection in 1946. To say he is also a good basketball and track man is putting it mildly.

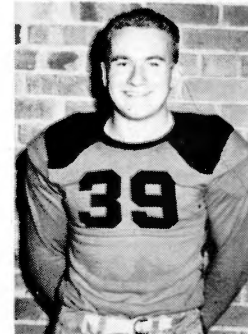

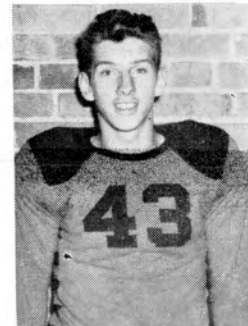
William Rose—Right Guard



Delton Stamp—Left Half

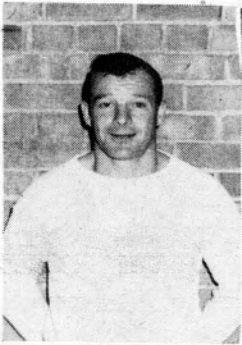

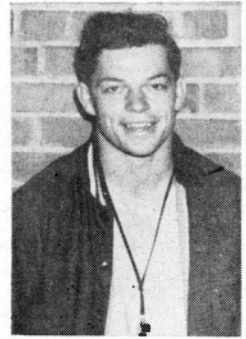


William York—Quarter Back

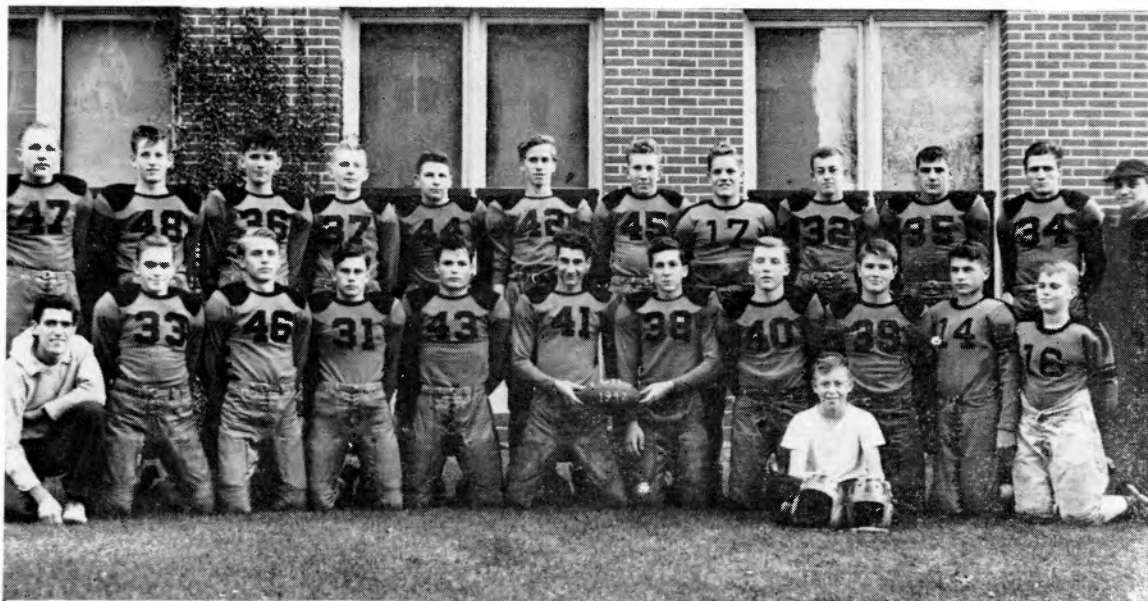
