My Library Account

- Preferred Searches

Would you like to know when a new book by one of your favorite authors is acquired by the Library? Do you try to keep up with all new acquisitions on a particular subject? If so, the Preferred Searches option in the My Library section of UNISTAR, the online catalog, is for you.

To set up search alerts, click on the "Save This Search" button when you have conducted a catalog search and have identified an author, title, subject, or keyword search that you want to save to monitor or set up e-mail alerts for new acquisitions. If, for instance, you want to monitor newly cataloged titles on the subject "Presidents - United States" when the results for this search are displayed on the screen, click on the "Save This Search" button which appears directly below the boxes in which you have entered your search terms.

To monitor or establish e-mail alerts for your preferred searches, click on the "My Library" link in the banner at the top of the Library home page (www.library.uni.edu). Or, choose the "Books and Other Materials (UNISTAR)" link on the home page. You will see the "Library Catalog Search" screen. Choose the "My Library" link near the top of the screen. In either instance, you will see the "My

Library Account Login" screen. Enter your last name and UNI ID number as prompted, and click on the "Submit" button. The next screen will display the personal information associated with your Library Account. In the middle of the screen you will see a listing for "Catalog Searches"; click on the "Preferred Searches" link. If you have preferred searches set up, they will be displayed at the bottom of the screen. You may mark them for e-mail alerts or deletion, or click on the "Search" link at the right of an entry to display current holdings.

Favorite 4 for Freshmen

The following four databases are brilliant for quickly locating information critical to your papers and projects.

1. **Academic OneFile** – great for locating scholarly research articles from academic journals, and news articles from magazines and newspapers.

2. **CQ Researcher** – great for choosing your topic, getting an overview of your topic, putting your topic in historical context, and locating statistics for your project.

3. **Gale Virtual Reference Library** – concise background information from well respected online dictionaries and encyclopedias

4. **Opposing Viewpoints** – bring balance to your paper or project with well reasoned arguments from both sides of the issue.
