RETURNING LETTERMEN

Lyle Dodd. Junior. Forward or center. Scored 100 points last year as a sophomore regular. Named on second all-conference team. Lettered in both basketball and baseball. Graduated from Conrad, Iowa, high school in 1934 with three letters each in football, basketball, and track, captain in football and basketball. Ran 4:39 mile in high school.



William Sims. Senior. Forward. Lettered two years ago. Played a lot last year but not enough to get letter. Was out because of injured foot for half season. Is a left hander with lots of speed and even more fight. Graduated from Inglewood, Cal., high school in 1932. Worked to go to college. Won three letters in basketball and two in football in high school.

Ed Trefzger. Senior. Forward. Won letter last year. Is North Central's leading tennis player, winning doubles for two years, placing second in singles both years. Won three letters each in basketball and tennis in high school. Was a 1935 graduate of Inglewood, Cal., high school.

#### RETURNING RESERVES

Francis Babcock. Junior. Guard. Had to drop basketball last year because of poor health. Is back in condition now and threatens to take over one of the vacant guard posts. Won two basketball, one football, and one track letters at New Hampton, Iowa, high school. Was graduated in 1936.

William Bolt. Senior. Forward. Played but little in actual games last year but is a scrapper from the word go. Graduated from Dinsdale, Iowa, high school in 1935 after winning four letters each in basketball and baseball, captaining in both sports.

Ted Buchwald. Junior. Center or guard. Fell just short of a varsity letter last year. Is looking like a regular this year. Big and rugged, Buchwald can play every position. Is a crack golfer. Graduated from Marshalltown, Iowa, high school in 1936. Won two letters in basketball, two in football, and one in golf, captaining basketball.

Paul Mast. Junior. Guard. The real ball handling wizard on the squad. Lacks shooting eye to make him a real threat. Graduated from Teachers College high school in 1936. Won three basketball letters as well as two in football, and one in track.

#### SOPHOMORE PROSPECTS

Wendlen Burekhard. Guard. Plays forward also but Nordly needs backcourt defense too badly to send him out in front. Was regular left halfback last fall in football. Graduated from Grand Forks, N.D., high school in 1937. All state back. A record of four football letters, three basketball, three track. Football captain.

William Close. Guard. All state high school guard in 1937. Will be after regular assignments left vacant by loss of Gilluly, Yatchak, Lee, and Miner. Won three golf letters, two in basketball, and one in track at East Waterloo, Iowa, high school. Was basketball captain. Graduated in 1937.



Robert Hunt. Guard. Speedy and daring little guard. Fair eye for the basket. Graduated from Rapid City, S.D., high school in 1933 after having won one basketball and two track letters. Attended Virginia junior college one year where he won letters in basketball and track. Holds junior college pole vault record of 11 feet 10 inches.

Robert Indvik. Guard. Graduated from Forest City, Iowa, high school in 1937. Won four basketball, three football, two baseball, and one track letters. Brought 1935 team to state finals. Regular fullback on varsity football team.

Charles McAfee. Center. Biggest man on the squad. Graduated in 1936 from Sac City, Iowa, high school. Won three basketball, three football, and four baseball letters there.

Edward Olson. Forward. Comes from Red Wing, Minn., town which gave Nordly to basketball world. Slender, but active near the basket. Three basketball letters in high school and four in golf. Captained cagers in 1936, year of graduation.

#### TRANSFERS

Fred Lofquist. Junior. Forward. Graduated from Biwabic, Minn., high school in 1936. Won three basketball and three football letters there - captaining basketball team. At Virginia junior college he added two more letters in each sport and a second captaincy in basketball.

John Megson, Junior. Forward. Graduated from Duluth Central, Minn., high school in 1935. Won two high school letters in both basketball and track, and one in football. At Duluth junior college he added two more in each sport. All-conference junior college cager and griddor.

Eino Talus. Junior. Guard. Regular end on the varsity football team. Graduated from Biwabic, Minn., high school in 1936. Won three letters in football and two in basketball. At Virginia junior college he was all-conference in both sports and added two letters in each to his list.

Keith Van Winkle. Junior. Forward. Graduated from Webster City, Iowa, high school in 1933. Won four football letters, three each in basketball and track, and two in baseball. Won two letters in basketball at Webster City junior college.

Starting second year as head basketball coach at Teachers College. Brought team into second place tie with the University of North Dakota last year. Does not plan on that same ranking this year. Graduated from Red Wing, Minn., high school in 1923. Won four letters each in football and basketball and one each in baseball and track. Was football and basketball captain in last year. In 1922 was all-state forward. Graduated from Carleton College in 1927. Won four basketball letters, three in football. Captained basketball team for two years, making all conference both years - once as forward, once as guard. All-conference halfback in 1926. Coached at Rochester, Minn., high school for 10 years before coming to Teachers College.

Press box facilities are available but we must request that only working pressmen seek admission there. For tickets to the games we will turn your requests over to the director of athletics. You will be able to call for them at his office the day of the basketball game or wrestling meet. These tickets do not admit you to the press box, nor do press box passes admit you to the game. You may secure your press box passes by writing directly to the Bureau of Publications of the Iowa State Teachers College.
