11. What do you like/dislike about your job? Are you doing what you wanted or planned? Do you have room for advancement, benefits, a salary you feel you deserve? (be honest)
12. When you were in college, what did you expect to do when you graduated?
13. What advice do you have for someone seeking the same path as you?
14. Are there similar opportunities like yours?
15. Do you have opportunities for advancement? (Do you see yourself someplace else in ten years? Where?)
