Holds school batting record of .516. Graduated in 1924. Coached at Pocahontas and Monticello. Returned here as baseball coach in spring of 1926. Married and has two sons, mascots of baseball team.
STANDARDS FOR AWARDING BASEBALL LETTERS
Awards will be made by the athletic board of the Iowa State Teachers College upon the recommendation of the head coach and concurred in by the director of athletics under the following regulations:
Baseball letters will be given to the men on the following basis: to men who play in a minimum of one-half of the scheduled games and for a time equal to forty per cent of the total innings played during the season. To pitchers who shall have played in twenty-five per cent of the total innings played during the season.
