LAWRENCE W. WHITFORD. Head Baseball Coach. Starting fifteenth year as Teachers College baseball coach. Won four letters each in football, basketball, and baseball at Edgerton, Wis., High School, graduating in 1915. After one year at Teachers College he enlisted for the war. Played service football, basketball, baseball, and added boxing to the list. Then won four letters in football and baseball and three in basketball here. Held three captaincies. Holds school batting record of .516. Graduated in 1924. Coached at Pocahontas and Monticello. Returned here as baseball coach in spring of 1926. Married and has two sons, mascots of baseball team.

STANDARDS FOR AWARDING BASEBALL LETTERS

Awards will be made by the athletic board of the Iowa State Teachers College upon the recommendation of the head coach and concurred in by the director of athletics under the following regulations:

Baseball letters will be given to the men on the following basis: to men who play in a minimum of one-half of the scheduled games and for a time equal to forty per cent of the total innings played during the season. To pitchers who shall have played in twenty-five per cent of the total innings played during the season.

Lyle Dodd, pitcher. Won three basketball and two baseball letters. Dropped out of school this quarter to earn enough money to finish school. Working in Waterloo.

Forrest Hanifan, outfielder and catcher. Won letter last year. Hurt shoulder and the injury will keep him out this season.

Bernard Hughes, outfielder. Handy man in the outfield for three years, won first letter senior. Coaching at Monroe, Iowa.

Allen Kane, pitcher. The "Slugger" won three baseball letters and two in football. Is coach at Bagley, Iowa.

Hubert Missildine, third baseman. Won three baseball letters and led team in hitting in 1939. Coach at Exira, Iowa.

William Bolt. Senior. Bolt has won two letters in basketball and one in baseball. Was born in Campbell, Minn., March 3, 1918. Son of Mr. and Mrs. John Bolt, Traer, Iowa. Graduated from Dinsdale High School in 1935 with four baseball and two basketball letters. Captained both sports. Is physical education major. Member of Lambda Gamma Nu fraternity and the "I" Club. Is working way through school. Has "C" average.

Arthur Borwick. Junior. Won letter in baseball last year. Son of Mr. and Mrs. John Borwick, Story City, Iowa. Born Dec. 22, 1916. Graduated from Roland High School in 1937, with four baseball and three basketball letters. Physical education major. Member of "I" Club and Xanho fraternity. Is working way through school. Plays a guitar. Aiming toward major leagues. Average student.

GOLF FOR 1940

No definite schedule has yet been arranged for Panther golfers but it is certain that several dual meets will be hold in competition with other Iowa college teams. If the North Central conference votes to continue the conference meet it is likely that the Panthers will be on hand to defend the title they won in 1938 and successfully defended in 1939.

Coach Oliver Nordly will again be the head man in the sport, his third season on the job. He has won the conference title both years and produced an individual champion in 1938.

Before the season could officially open only two veterans were certain candidates for the 1940 team. Ted Buchwald, a member of both championship teams, and Bill Close, a team member last year but not a participant in the conference meet.

Ted Buchwald. Senior. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Buchwald, Marshalltown, Iowa. Born November 13, 1918, in Marshalltown. A 1936 graduate of Marshalltown High School. Won two football, two basketball, and one golf letter at Marshalltown. Captained basketball one year. Physical education major. Member of Alpha Chi Epsilon fraternity, Blue Key, and the "I" Club. Runnerup last year in conference golf meet. Has won two basketball letters here. Working way through school. Has a "C" average.

William Close. Junior. Son of Mr. and Mrs. W.N. Close, Waterloo, Iowa. Born March 4, 1919, in Waterloo. Graduated in 1937 from East High School. Won three golf, two basketball, and one track letter. Captained both basketball and golf teams. Named all-state guard in 1937. Commercial major. Member of Lambda Gamma Nu fraternity. Working way through school. Has "C" average.
