Courses sponsored by Continuing Education and Special Programs, with the exception of Guided Independent Study (correspondence study), are considered residential courses. (*Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98*)

3. Non-Resident Enrollment

Students enrolled only in Guided Independent Study (correspondence). Courses sponsored by Continuing Education and Special Programs. (*Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98*)

4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.

Declared candidate is one who has been accepted at admission by departments [major is prospective (P) or declared (D)]

Non-candidates are major code 090. They have not been accepted by a department.

Total graduate students = graduate students (above) = grads of UNI + grads of Iowa colleges + grads of out of state

Grads of refers to Bachelor's degree college

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Guided Independent Study

1. All students enrolling for a guided independent study (correspondence) course during any semester or session of the full year (summer, fall and spring).
2. Each student is counted only once regardless of the number of guided independent study (correspondence) courses enrolled in or completed during the full year.

Extension

1. All students enrolling in a course identified as one offered by Continuing Education and Special Programs.
2. Each student is counted only once regardless of the number of extension courses enrolled in during the full year.

Checks

Totals = guided independent study (correspondence) + extension. Duplicates are omitted.
Totals < guided independent study (correspondence) + extension.

Guided Independent Study (correspondence) totals = not in residence (page 1). Students also enrolled in residence work during the full year are omitted.

Guided Independent Study (correspondence) totals > not in residence (page 1).

The total hours for which all students are enrolled at the end of the second week (effective Fall 2004) of Fall/Spring semesters, and the final enrollment of the summer session are determined. These are added together to determine the total hours for the year. Undergraduate hours are divided by 30 and graduate hours by 18 to determine a full-time equivalent.
