OLIVER M. "HON" NORDLY, head basketball coach, is starting his eighth season at Iowa State Teachers College. Nordly-coached teams have won 31 North Central conference games while losing only 25 since he took the reins in 1937. Only three times have Nordly's quintets finished below third in the final loop standings. He graduated from Carleton college where he won all-conference honors in football and basketball. His high school career as an all around athlete at Red Wing, Minn., was just as sensational. Before coming here Nordly coached at Rochester, Minn., where he turned out championship teams. Nordly also coaches golf, is football backfield coach and scouts the Panthers' gridiron opponents. In winning 13 of 20 games in 1945-46, Nordly's quintet made the best record since he took over as Panther cage boss. Nordly, who is married and the father of four children, coached the Iowa Pre-flight quintet during the war.

RETURNING BASKETBALL LETTERMEN

- Van Combs 6-2, 180 Leading Panther scorer last year with 234 points in 20 games. The 22-year old junior, a one-handed push shot artist, poured in 31 points against St. Ambrose last year to set a new single game scoring mark.
- Dean Hogeland 5-11, 170 Sophomore guard from Marshalltown, who broke into the starting lineup after the holidays last season. Hogeland finished third among Panther scorers with 102 points in 13 games. He is fast, aggressive, and a good ball handler.
- Norman Jespersen 6-3, 170 After a slow start as a freshman last year, "Jes" will undoubtedly hit the stride which brought him all-state recognition during his prep school days.

SKETCHES OF VETERAN PANTHER MAT IEN

RUSSELL BUSH - won the national title for the Panthers in the 128-pound class in 1947. Bush was runner-up in the 136 pound class in 1946. He won four dual meets for the Panthers in 1946, and 5 of 7 dual meet starts last year. Bush was runner-up in the state AAU meet last spring, losing to Cornell's Lange. Bush hails from Waterloo, Iowa.

BILL KOLL - winner of the national 145 pound title for the McCuskey-men in 1946, and 1947. Koll won the acclaim of the coaches and officials as the meet's outstanding wrestler in 1947, an honor which Koll's team mate, Gerald Leeman, won in 1946. Koll won six dual meets in 1946, three in 1943, and seven in 1947, to remain undefeated in intercollegiate competition. He won the state high school title for Ft. Dodge, Iowa in 1941, and the state AAU championship in 1942. Injuries kept him from competing in the 1947 state meet. Bill has his eye on the coming Olympic games.

BILL NELSON - sophomore from Eagle Grove, who won the national title and the state AAU championship for the Panthers in the 165 pound class this year. Nelson handed Illinois' great Dave Shapiro his first setback (6-5) in the semi-finals of the national meet, to avenge for an early season defeat by Shapiro in a dual meet in Cedar Falls. Nelson won the State High School Title in 1945, and the midwest AAU championship in 1944.

GERALD LEEMAN - won the national title for the Panthers in the 128 pound class at Stillwater, Okla. in 1946. He was also voted the outstanding wrestler of the tourney by a committee of coaches. He is undefeated in intercollegiate wrestling competition, winning five dual meets in 1946 and seven in 1947. Leeman was state high school champion at Osage, Iowa, and national AAU champ three years. In 1942, he won the state AAU title for the Panthers. Injuries kept Leeman from participating in the 1947 state AAU meet and NCAA tourney. Leeman is pointing to the Olympics.

HAROLD MOTT - Mason City, Iowa, brother of Cecil, winner of the 121 pound title for the Panthers in 1946, has taken over in this bracket for Coach Dave McCuskey. Mott won the state AAU title for the Panthers in 1947, losing in the semi-final round of the national meet.

DICK BLACK - sophomore sensation from Ft. Dodge, Iowa, where he won the high school title in 1940. He captured the state AAU title for the Panthers last year. In dual meet competition in 1947, Black lost only to Gale Mikles of Michigan State (3-0), who captured the national title.

LEROY ALITZ- a transfer student from Iowa State college in Ames, Ia. He won 6 of 7 dual meet bouts last year, losing only to Norm Anthonisen of the University of Illinois. Alitz lost to Thomas of Cornell in the finals of the state AAU meet. Alitz hails from Rockwell Ia.

JIM JENSEN- a junior "Light weight-Heavy weight" from Waterloo, Ia., who in wrestling out of his weight class, dropped seven dual bouts in 1947. Jensen is tough in the middle weights.

ED AHRENS- a Waterloo, Ia. freshman who won the state AAU title for the McCuskey-men in the heavy weight bracket in 1947. Ahrens did not compete during the dual meet season last year. Ahrens may be the answer to the heavyweight problem.

DAVID H. MCCUSKEY, Head Wrestling Coach and secretary of the wrestling NCAA. Last year McCuskey's team was runner-up in the national wrestling tourney for the second consecutive year. Again, the Panthers were the only team in the Nation to produce three individual title holders, and have the outstanding grappler of the meet (Bill Koll in 1947, and Gerald Leeman in 1946). In dual meets the McCuskey-men defeated the University of Minnesota, Michigan State, Iowa State, Wheaton College and Kansas State College, and battled the national champs, Cornell, and the Big Nine title holders, University of Illinois to a tie. McCuskey is starting his 16th wrestling season here. He graduated in 1930, and started his coaching career at his alma mater in the fall. Against the toughest wrestling competition in the nation, his teams have a record of 59 victories, 27 losses, and 7 ties. McCuskey was one of the greatest football players in the history of Iowa Teachers, winning four letters as a triple threat halfback. He was also an outstanding pitcher, winning three letters in baseball. During the war McCuskey served in the navy as director of athletics at the Tinian naval base in the Pacific. He is married and the father of two sons.
