## Domestic & International Travel Update

UNI faculty, staff and students,

On March 13, 2020, Governor Reynolds implemented a moratorium on all non-essential travel by state employees. In accordance with the Governor's travel moratorium and based on direction from the Board of Regents, the University is prohibiting all non-essential university-sponsored travel by faculty, staff and students, including all student organizations, effective immediately.

This moratorium **includes domestic travel as well as international travel** (which was previously prohibited by the Board of Regents). This moratorium does not apply to personal travel.

Future travel should not be scheduled or commenced until further notice.
