A QUICK LOOK AT COACH CLYDE L. (BUCK) STARBECK

Terming himself as always pessimistic, Buck Starbeck tackled his 1953 head coaching task with the same vim and vigor that he did when coming to the Iowa State Teachers College campus in 1936.

But even when making his debut at Iowa State Teachers College "Buck's" name was far from strange to followers of the North Central Football Conference. He is entering his 27th year of association with the league, either as a coach or a player, and during that time he has been a cog in winning 16 conference championships. When he joined the Panthers in March of 1936 it was their first year in the North Central Conference.

Buck's days in the conference date back to 1923 when he enrolled in South Dakota State College and promptly won a berth at center on the team. He was picked as an all-conference selection as a freshman and repeated his remaining three years in college. During that time the Bunnies were twice winners of the conference title.

Upon graduation from college, he began his coaching career at Eau Claire, Wisc., where his high school eleven posted an eight won no lost record. His high school coaching days were short-lived however, when he accepted the position as line coach at the University of North Dakota in 1928. The Modaks brought home six conference crowns during the eight years he was there before accepting the position he now holds.

During his first four seasons with the Panthers, Starbeck enjoyed only mediocre seasons, finishing third, fourth, fifth and seventh in the conference. But when 1940 rolled around, Starbeck's

Panthers became the scourge of the league and carted off 10 straight titles before losing to South Dakota State in 1950.

A third-place finish behind the University of South Dakota and the Jackrabbits in 1951 ended the Panthers stay in the lower rungs, as they went to an upset in the loop for the 1952 flag.

During the Panthers winning streak, from Nov. 4, 1939, to Oct. 8, 1949, Starbeck's clubs chalked up 31 consecutive North Central Conference wins. A 14-13 loss to the Jackrabbits on the latter date tied the Panthers with South Dakota State for the title. It ran the Panthers win string to seven, first time in national collegiate history that one team had so completely dominated a league over such an extended period.

During his 14 seasons with the Panthers, Starbeck has racked up a North Central Conference record of 50 wins, 16 losses and three ties for a .746 mark. His over-all record at Teachers College stands at 71 wins, 41 losses and nine ties for a .624 mark.

Starbeck was born in Montevideo, Minn., on Jan. 7, 1901. He started his football career as a prepman at Montevideo where he played for five seasons.

He continued his football the following year at Hamline University, and then coached at the Pipestone, Minn., Indian school for two years before enrolling at South Dakota State. His Indian team won 12 and lost two games during the two seasons.

Married in 1925, death claimed Starbeck's wife and two oldest sons within a two-year period. He has two other sons, Bob 17, and Pat 15, at home. Starbeck remarried in 1948.

SKETCHES OF COACHING STAFF MEMBERS

OLIVER M. (HON) NORDLY, backfield coach:

He's head coach in basketball and golf at Iowa Teachers besides his football job....began coaching career at Rochester, Minn., high school in 1927, had two undefeated football teams and three conference champions and took basketball teams to state finals three times before coming to Teachers in 1937....his basketball teams here won or tied for four consecutive North Central titles and have won 82 while losing but 42 league games....during World War II he spent 30 months with navy's physical training program, won 35 of 42 games coaching two seasons of basketball at Iowa Pre-Flight as Lt. Comdr....born Nov. 18, 1905 in Red Wing, Minn., was four sport star in high school....went to Carleton college and was twice all-Midwest conference in both football and basketball, was top cage scorer in junior and senior years....married former Florence Hutcheson of Goodhue, Minn., June 21, 1930 and is the father of four daughters, Kathryn 22, Joan 21, Judith 15 and Sarah 13.

JAMES R. CLARK, assistant coach:

Also assists Nordly in basketball and Dickinson in track.... got his BA at Gustavus Adolphus in 1927 and MA's at Columbia in New York City and George Peabody in Nashville, Tenn., as well as a Ph.D. from the latter school in 1950....coached at Kasson, Minn., high school two years, then at Rochester, Minn., Junior College from 1929 to 1939....moved to Mankato, Minn., Teachers College in '39 and stayed there until '49....at Mankato started as head coach in football, basketball and track....three out of his last four grid teams there were undefeated....he was born in St. Peter, Minn., Mar. 30, 1905....married the former Gertrude Johnston in St. Peter in 1929....father of two girls, Jane, 18 and Judy, 14.

ARTHUR D. DICKINSON, trainer:

He's also Teachers head track coach, took over job in 1925.... his teams have won North Central crown seven times, placed second seven times and third once since joining league in 1935.. ..at one stretch his runners won nine titles in eight years, including both NCC and Iowa loop crowns in 1935....also served as Panther basketball coach for 12 years starting in 1924....born in Shellsburg August 14, 1896, he graduated from ISTC in 1917.... served on Mexican border and in France as army sergeant in World War I....began coaching career at Washington high school in 1920, moved to Marshalltown in 1923 and came to Teachers in 1924.... married former Madeline Nisbet of Cedar Falls June 29, 1921.... father of two children, Art, 27 and a '50 TC grad, and Doris, 18.

1953 PROSPECTS

As usual, Coach Buck Starbeck was not too optimistic when his 42 candidates reported for practice August 31. But the opening drills presented even more problems than he had counted on, especially after he discovered the lack of experience within the group.

With 13 lettermen returning, Starbeck feels that he can field one team quite adequately, but after that "the ranks really get thin," he says. Whether the Panthers can come up with an aerial attack comparable to that they had in 1952 when they won the North Central Conference championship will be a big measuring stick in the '53 success.

Position by position, the 1953 squad stacks up thusly:

Ends--Two lettermen help shape the starting end corps for the Panthers. A third letterman, Charles Novotny of Cicero, Ill. received his induction notice only a week before practice opened. Dick Beetsch set a new school pass-catching record last fall with 24 completions for 368 yards and nine touchdowns. Tom Walker, other letterman end, caught two passes for 33 yards. Jim Rosien, transfer student from Fort Dodge, has drawn several plaudits from Starbeck.

Tackles--A wide open battle is being waged for the starting tackle berths, with two lettermen back to defend their old positions. LeRoy Dunn of Manly and two-time letterman Jim Tachenheim of Chicago are drawing stiff competition from Bob Elmore, Des Moines, and Lyle Smith, Cedar Falls.

Guards--Carl Rauch, double letter winner from Chicago Heights, Ill., leads the list of three lettermen back for starting guard positions. Roy Voggessor and Robert Case have both sparkled in early practice sessions. Some untried sophomores will undoubtedly get a chance at these spots as the season progresses.

1953 PROSPECTS, Cont'd.

Centers--This is definitely the weak spot of the line as far as veterans are concerned. Jerry Foster is the lone returning vet, and he won his letter at tackle last year. Foster, along with several promising newcomers must fill the shoes vacated by the Panthers' Little All-American Lou Bohnsack.

Quarterback--Diminutive Ralph Capitani, 150 pound, two-year letterman, commands top spot here with his sizzling aerial tosses. Whether he will be able to run from the single wing as throw will depend on how well he willfill the position. LaVerne Rohlfson, two-year letterman just out of the Marine Corps, adds experience to the quarterback spot.

Halfbacks--Probably the strongest position in the Panther backfield. Art Landau and Doug Butler, both lettermen, loom as the top prospects for starting berths, with several newcomers adding needed depth.

Fullbacks--Bud Bitcon is the only returning vet, but should get help from Fred Loffredo and Vern Rosene.

Although the two-platoon system has been ruled out, specialists are still required. Teachers specialty crew:

Punting--Neither Bud Rowray nor Jim Miller, who handled the punting chores last year are back. Starbeck is still testing new personnel for the job, with Capitani and Bitcon showing the best booting ability.

Passing--Considerable of the Panthers' success fall depends on how well their passing stands up. Last year's ace, John Cory, is gone, but Capitani, who served as his understudy appears a top-notch performer here.

Receiving--There seems to be few worries in this department, with Dick Beetsch, who set the new school record, teaming with Jim Rosien, an untried transfer student, at the end posts.

Rushing--Landau, Butler and Capitani are the only returning rushing leaders from last year, but figure to keep the Panthers as the top.

VERLIN ALLER, HB--A three-year letterman as a prepper at Keota, he is moving up to the varsity from the reserve squad....a junior, he plans to coach when he graduates....teammates call him "Squirrel."

BLAINE ANDRADA, E--A Wayzata sophomore, he is making his first bid for a varsity berth....spent 37 months in the navy, serving most of it in Europe and the Carribean area....goes by Andy.

LAWRENCE BITCON, HB--Shooting for his second letter at Iowa Teachers as a sophomore....a slight 5-9, 160 pounder, he won nine letters at Greenfield high school, three in football....goes by the nickname of "Bub".. ..idols Jim Thorpe as his favorite athlete.

LYLE BITCON, HB--Older brother of Lawrence, he carries but 145 pounds on his 5-8 frame....moved up from the reserve outfit this fall....could develop into a dangerous scatback....played his freshman year at Simpson College where he also ran the two mile race.

RICHARD BEETSCH, E--A welcome Gopher in the Iowa Teachers ranks....hailing from Mankato, Minn., he won three varsity letters--football, basketball and baseball--as a freshman last year....won nine letters in high school, three each in the above sports....was all-state in football in 1952.

JAMES BURRIGHT, T--The heaviest man on the team at 225 pounds....calls Waterloo his home, where he won a letter in football and wrestling at West High....took second place as a heavyweight in state wrestling meet in 1949.

JAMES BUTLER, HB--A two-year letterman with two years of competition remaining....comes from Charles City, and goes by his middle name, Doug....expected to be one of Teachers leading ground gainers this fall....does artistic painting as a hobby.

RALPH CAPITANI, QB--A mighty mite at 5-8, and 150 pounds....majoring in physical education and social science, he plans to coach when he graduates next spring....a graduate of Dowling High in Des Moines, he earned letters in baseball, football, basketball and golf....was one of leading scorers on Teachers '53 golf team....goes by "Cappy."

ROBERT CASE, G--Hails from Perry, where he was a triple letter winner in football, baseball and basketball....a junior physical education major, he was a regular most of last year.

ERWIN CHRISTIANSON, FB--Another newcomer to the Panther varsity this fall....called "Duffy" by his teammates, he is a music major at Teachers....while in high school at Lake Mills, he set a new record in the football throw in the North Iowa Conference in 1952....is a member of the accappella choir and plays a cornet with the band.

CHARLES CLAUSON, FB--A local boy, he is making his first bid for a football berth, although a junior....goes by "Chuck."

JAMES COSE, HB--Only a third-quarter freshman at Teachers, he is one of four yearlings on the squad....a 6-1, 180 pounder, he helped Denison to the Midwest Conference football title in 1952 as a guard....named to the all-conference team, and the all-state fifth team....likes Eddie Mathews of the Milwaukee Braves as his favorite athlete.

DEAN CRAMER, QB--A 19-year-old sophomore from Audubon, he is making his first trip on the varsity....stands 5-8 and weighs 153....majoring in the business field at Teachers....was an all-Coon Valley Conference performer in football and basketball in 1952.

LE ROY DUNN, T--Lends more chatter to the team during practice than any other man on the field....a rugged blocker and tackler, he lettered as a freshman last fall....is the only colored boy on the Teachers squad this fall....comes from Manly where he earned four letters in football...won the state football throw in 1952....spectacles don't dim his rough tactics on the field....capable of sitting in on any jam session with a pair of drum sticks in his hands.

ROBERT ELMORE, T--A rugged second-quarter freshman from North High in Des Moines....has been tabbed by Starbeck as one of the most promising candidates....carries a hefty 194 pounds on his 6-1 frame....a crack pitcher, he helped pitch his team to the championship in the Des Moines inter-city race in 1952.

PAUL FIELD, G--Returns as a junior after spending 21 months with the army, including duty in Korea....attended the State University of Iowa for a year, and is making his first bid in football at Teachers....shoots billiards as a hobby....goes by his middle name, Bert.

DONALD FISHER, G--A Cedar Falls product, he is starting his sophomore year at Teachers....Captained Downtown high school in 1952....named to the Northeast Iowa Conference team in 1951 and '52.

JERRY FOSTER, C--A rugged letterman 200-pound tackle, he is going to take a stab at center this fall....lettered three years as a center at Greenfield, and played quarterback as a freshman at Iowa State.
