C.L. (Buck) Starbeck, dean of the North Central conference football coaches, has spent 33 years in the loop football picture. From 1923 to 1927 he was an all-conference center at South Dakota State. He coached the line at North Dakota from 1928 until he came to Iowa Teachers in 1936. During this time, he has figured in 16 conference championships either as a player or a coach.

Starbeck has played an important role in the development of the single wing offense. Every season he introduces some change in the Teachers style of attack. When the material was at hand, his teams played a wide open passing game. Other years, with different manpower, Starbeck's clubs have relied mainly on a ground game. Part of Starbeck's success undoubtedly stems from an amazing memory that quickly relates play situations to his experiences of the past -- and after forty years as a coach and player, not many situations arise which the grey mentor hasn't experienced.

Starbeck, who owns the best college coaching record in the state of Iowa, has sent more men into the coaching field than any other Iowan. His version of the single wing, either from an offensive or defensive point of view, is virtually a prerequisite to coaching in the state. Few coaches fail to meet a team that uses this style of attack some time during the season.

During his many years as head coach at Iowa Teachers, Buck has maintained a sincere loyalty toward the school and the men who represented it on the gridiron. Name one of his players of the past, and he'll likely tell you where he is and what he's doing. If the former player is now a coach, he'll tell you how many games he won last season.

This fall, Buck Starbeck starts his twentieth season as head coach of the Panthers. (no football was played in 1943-44) It's difficult to write off 20 years of coaching in a few paragraphs, but here, briefly, is the way football fortunes have gone at Iowa Teachers since Starbeck became head man:

After taking over in 1936, his teams finished fifth, third, seventh and fourth in the conference. Then in 1939 a string of four victories unraveled into 31 conference games without a defeat. During this time, Iowa Teachers won seven consecutive conference championships. From 1940 to 1949 no other loop member gained the top position -- the first time in national history that a school so completely dominated a conference over such an extended period. While setting this national record, the Panther clubs scored a fantastic 1,002 points to their opponents' 172.

From 1950 through 1956 Iowa Teachers has finished second three times, third twice, seventh once, and in 1952 captured the loop crown. During his 19 seasons with the Panthers, Starbeck's cumulative North Central conference record is 63 wins, 26 losses and four ties. His over-all record reads 90 wins, 55 losses and 10 ties.

Starbeck was born in Montevideo, Minn. on January 7, 1901. He first broke into the starting line-up at Montevideo where he prepped for five years. He then enrolled at Hamline University where he continued his football, before moving into his first coaching position at Pipestone (Minn.) Indian School. After two years of coaching there and winning 12 games while dropping two, Starbeck enrolled at South Dakota State College.

LOUIS BREITBACH is the newest member of the Iowa Teachers coaching staff. His duties consist only of assisting Starbeck with the football team, since he is a district personnel manager of a corporation specializing in home decorations. Breithach, 39, is a graduate of Iowa Teachers and played three years of football under Starbeck as an end and halfback. After his graduation in 1939, he took his first coaching job at Baxter, Ia. Then came a series of six high school jobs: Dallas Center, Ia.; Creston, Ia.; Hinsdale, Ill.; Manchester, Ia.; and East and West high schools of Waterloo, Ia. At Creston and Hinsdale he served as assistant coach and at the other schools was the head grid mentor. Breitbach's record reads 60 won, 26 lost and 6 tied. During his high school coaching career, Louis used basically the same single wing he learned under Starbeck, which is, fundamentally, the same system being used at Iowa Teachers today. Breitbach is married and has four sons and a daughter.

ART DICKINSON, who has been on the athletic staff at Iowa Teachers since 1924, is also the trainer of the team as well as Starbeck's assistant on the field. "Dick" has been head coach of the Panther track teams for over 30 years and has compiled one of the best cinder records in the country. His teams have won the North Central conference championship eight times since joining the conference in 1935. He also coached the Panther basketball teams for 12 years, starting in 1924. Dickinson has taught anatomy at Teachers for years and is recognized as one of the outstanding trainers in the United States. He was born in Shellsburg, Ia. in 1896 and is a graduate of ISTC (1917). He served on the Mexican border and in France as an army sergeant in the first World War. His first coaching job was at Washington, Ia. in 1920, he moved to Marshalltown, Ia. in 1923 and joined the staff at Teachers in 1924. Dickinson has a son and a daughter.

ED LYONS starts his second season on the Tutor athletic staff this fall. He is also a graduate of Iowa Teachers (1941) and was a member of the Panther "mighty midget" football teams of the pre-war era. Ed has ten years of high school coaching on his records, one year at Orient and nine at Forest City. His grid teams have compiled an overall record of 54 wins, 19 losses and 6 ties. Lyons' Forest City teams finished unbeaten and untied twice and won five North Iowa Conference titles. After graduating from Iowa Teachers, Lyons spent four years in the Navy. He returned to ISTC after discharge to do graduate work, took a job at Orient, and earned his Master's degree at Drake University attending summer sessions. Lyons will take over the wrestling and tennis teams at Teachers this year, in the absence of Bill Koll, who is on leave working towards his doctorate. Ed is married and the father of five daughters. He is 38 years old.

JIM CLARK is becoming another "oldtimer" on the Tutor athletic staff, starting his ninth year this fall. Jim is also the Panther golf coach and has turned out some fine link teams. He graduated from Gustavus Adolphus in 1927 and earned M.A.'s at Columbia University and George Peabody, as well as a Ph.D. from the latter school. Clark coached at Kasson, Minn., two years; then moved to Rochester (Minn.) Junior College in 1929, where he stayed for 10 years. In 1939 he joined the staff at Mankato (Minn.) State College and served there until coming to Iowa Teachers in 1949. He coached football, basketball and track at Mankato and three of his last four grid teams were unbeaten. Jim was born in St. Peter, Minn., March 30, 1905. He is married and has two daughters.

If the situation were reversed on the lettermen and sophomores comprising this year's Iowa Teachers squad, the Panthers could hold a bright outlook for the season. As it is, the prospects are far from gloomy, but at the same time an uncertain atmosphere hangs over the Teachers camp.

Consider the fact that Coach Buck Starbeck will be working with a squad of which nearly half are sophomores -- 20 in all-- and at the same time a small contingent of only a dozen lettermen are on hand to season the unbalanced mixture. Add this to the fact that the Panthers went through their conference schedule a year ago without winning a game -- the first time it had happened since 1938 -- and the fate of this year's Starbeck edition begins to look a bit bleak.

Missing from the Teachers camp this fall are several gridgers who will be difficult to capably replace. Dick Formanek, as tough a competitor as the school ever had, has left a gaping hole at left guard. Tackle Jim Hershberger will be another lineman tough to replace. Don Gabrielson, Formanek's running mate at guard, is also gone. In the backfield, talented fullback Ron Brinkley will be missing along with halfback Stan Norenberg. This is not the entire list of "absentees" but they are the ones Starbeck will have the most difficulty replacing.

Speaking in general terms, Iowa Teachers will have essentially the same problem as early last year: finding a line to measure up with what could be a top-notch backfield. Several sophomores, both linemen and backs, showed great promise in spring practice, but until they've proven themselves in competition the whole picture remains questionable. There is no doubt that the backfield should be faster, with the addition of some fleet newcomers. But unless they can be sprung loose on occasion, their speed will be useless.

The glaring weakness of last year's club -- pass defense -- will have to be rectified if the team hopes to win many games. The '56 Panthers ranked first in the conference in total offense and rushing, but still failed to

win a game because of its failure to stop the opponents' passing game. If this year's club could lick the problem, it might finish well up in the standings. If not, it could be destined for another cellar spot.

By position, here's the rundown on the 1957 Iowa Teachers squad:

Left end - Sophomore Todd Stastny held down the number one spot all through spring practice. However, he may be ousted when letterman Roger Freeman, who was on the track squad at the time, dons his grid gear. Starbeck was impressed with Stastny's desire and competitive spirit during spring drills. He's definitely one soph who could nail down a starting role. Dean Dawson, a holdover from last year, will probably be the number three man.

Left tackle - One letterman and two sophomores will scrap for this spot. The veteran is Marvin Sloan, but he could be knocked out of his starting role by newcomers Dennis Remmert and John Berryman. All three are big men -- stand over six feet and top 200 pounds. Remmert, also a good cage prospect, might eventually grab this position.

Left guard - This will be the toughest spot on the team to fill. Formanek manned it last year. Nobody but a sophomore appears likely to take over. The two most promising are Jim Stillwell and Don Harty. Starbeck might find it necessary to send a veteran from the right side of the line here eventually, but at the moment only sophomores are being considered.

Center - Letterman Bob Knock will have a lot of help from sophomore Gene Dietz, a rugged defensive linebacker. Others here are holdovers Paul Pemble and Gresham Roskamp, who will also be used at right end.

Right Guard - Letterman Morris Smith, a junior, showed he had gained a great deal of experience during spring drills. He'll undoubtedly be the number one boy barring injury. Behind him are two promising sophomores, Bill Wohlers and Ron Merial.

Right tackle - A letterman back from the service and a sophomore will be the mainstays here. Don Grove is the returning letterman, and he'll be aided by newcomer Ron Roderick. Big Jon Swenson, who saw considerable action last year but didn't letter, is also on hand.

Right end - Larry Sabus is another letterman who showed marked improvement during the spring. Tough and durable, Sabus has two competent wingmen backing him up: junior Gene Lowry and sophomore Greg Bice. Roskamp will also see action here if needed.

Quarterback - Letterman Clark Cochran and sophomore Duane Bonsalle should make this position plenty tough. It's the blocking back spot in Starbeck's single-wing. Another letterman, Clayton Thomas, will be used here this year instead of at left halfback. Another converted quarterback is Jim Hazlett, who played end last year.

Left halfback - Old reliable Pat Halligan will be back. He gained 517 yards rushing for a 4.7 yard average last fall and led the team in scoring. Another letterman is Bobby Hahn, one of the fastest backs on the team. Top newcomers are Max Huffman and Ray Blietz. Both have better than average speed and a good change of pace.

Right halfback - Speed merchant Larry Roberts will undoubtedly man this position. Extremely agile, he can change direction at top speed without losing a stride. Roberts should get away for some long ones this fall if the blocking springs him for the first few yards. Holdover Dave Koos looked impressive in spring drills, and letterman Frank Sovich will also be back. Paul Kellerhals is another sophomore who should play plenty of ball.

Fullback - Veteran Tom Murphy will take over this position, manned by Brinkley a year ago. Murphy proved what he can do last fall against North Dakota when he ran for more than 100 yards. Aside from that performance, Murphy didn't appear for very long in any one game. A good thrower, he'll call the shots in the Panther huddle. Murphy could develop into a capable leader after a few ball games. Behind him will be a good sophomore prospect, Glen Borland, who's a fine thrower and a hard runner. Holdover Loren Parker will probably back up this pair of fullbacks.
