JIM WITHAM - HEAD COACH

Basketball prospects appear a bit brighter this season for head coach Jim Witham, who starts his second season in directing the fortunes of the Iowa Teachers cage squad. Last winter Jim took over a shallow squad that was rock bottom on experience and qualified personnel. To add to Witham's woes, the squad was slow in picking up his "spot-shooting" offense, that involves intricate screens and patterns. So the team went out and dropped its first three games looking mighty unimpressive.

Then, on a two-game swing through North Dakota, the Panthers caught fire and won a pair surprisingly easily. But Teachers later proved to be more of a "home team" than a road club, and finished the season with a 12 won, 10 lost record. Considering the slow start and the personnel problem, this final mark was more than many expected. It also allowed Witham's record of never having a season below .500 to stay intact.

Jim came to Iowa Teachers from Mankato (Minn.) State College, where he had been in charge since 1945. During his ten year stay there--he took time out during the '54-'55 season to work on his Doctor's degree -- his clubs won 70.5 percent of their games. His worst year at Mankato was 1947-'48 when his team won 16 while losing 11.

Witham is proud of his offense, which he devised several years ago, and which has brought him a great amount of success. The screening, spot-shooting attack allows players to get excellent shots from close range and conditions each player to shoot from his favorite position on the floor. Jim's logic is: the more a player shoots from one particular area or zone on the floor, the more accurate he will become.

Just as important as point-getting, in Witham's book, is a stout defense. His team last year was certainly not one of his better defensive units, but still turned in a very creditable performance in allowing the opposition an average of 67 points a game. His clubs usually throw up a man-to-man defense, but he also uses variations of a zone.

Witham puts a great amount of stress on physical conditioning for his squads. After the season is underway, he holds relatively short workouts, but the squad goes at full speed during these short drills. Prior to the opening of the season, his squad scrimmages about twice a week and the rest of the time works on fundamentals, with a heavy emphasis on running.

Before taking over at Mankato, Jim coached at Hackensack, Osakis, and Benson high schools. He became head man at Bemidji Teachers, his alma mater, in 1942.

The 45-year-old mentor is married and has four children. He received his Master's degree at the University of Minnesota. During his college days Witham was an outstanding basketball and baseball player, and was on several semi-pro baseball teams after graduation. He was also head baseball coach at Mankato.

1957-58 BASKETBALL PROSPECTS

The feeling around Cedar Falls, Ia., is that basketball is on the upswing at Iowa State Teachers College. With a shallow squad a year ago, Coach Jim Witham won 12 of 22 games -- the first time the Panthers finished above .500 in four seasons. This winter, with six lettermen on the roster along with some good sophomores, the outlook is even brighter.

This is not intended to infer that the current season has been designated as "the year" for Iowa Teachers. Far from it. At the moment the hope is that the Panthers can win 15 or more games on their 23-game schedule.

From a negative viewpoint, this season's squad lacks height. It will sorely miss big Del Nicklaus, the rebound hound over the past three years. There is no doubt that the Panthers will be weak under the boards. To offset this lack of height, the club is expected to employ the fast break more frequently than it did a year ago.

Looking at it positively, the squad will be deeper than last winter. Except for the center position, Witham will be two-deep at every position. In short, the regulars can "take a blow" more often than they were afforded last season, with capable replacements filling in during the interim.

The squad will also be faster, and its fast break should be more effective. It should also have a better collective shooting eye, which should be of considerable value, since its lack of height won't afford as many shots as a season ago.

By positions, here's the way it currently stacks up:

Center - Frank Stotts (6-3), the team's leading scorer last season, will be shifted here from a forward spot. Backing him up will be inexperienced Don Roquet (6-5), or sophomore Ron LaFrentz (6-4), ordinarily a forward.

Forward - Veteran Dennis Filliman (6-2) and LaFrentz could be the regulars. Veteran Gary Muhlenbruck (6-3), and sophomores Gary Mohl (6-2) and Larry Timion (6-3) will add good depth.

Guard - Tough rebounder Clark McCleary (6-3) and three others will fight it out for starting roles. They include veterans Jack Mully (6-0) and Gene Nichols (5-10) and top sophomore Dean Jensen (5-11).

- Jim Amphar (6-0 senior guard) -- first year on varsity squad...not expected to play regular but should lend bench strength...good shot.
- Ray Elietz (5-10 sophomore guard) -- should make a good "spot" player...excellent eye from out front...good back in football...top student.
- Bob Conway (6-1 sophomore forward) -- most aggressive boy on squad...will steal a lot of balls...another situation player...fine track prospect.
- Dennis Filliman (6-2 junior forward) -- should be a regular...best shooter on team last year with a 43 percent mark...deliberate player who calculates every move...his lack of speed is made up for by a good head.
- Ron Havemann (6-0 junior guard) -- transfer student who played with frosh last year...real steady...prepped at Muscatine and made three baskets in 50 seconds to win state championship.

- Jack Mully (6-0 junior F-G) -- has been moved to part-time forward duty, since guards are strong...excellent out-shooter...leads fast break well...greatly improved over last season...quick reactions and fine timing.
- Gene Nichols (5-10 junior guard) -- tops potentially, but played hot and cold last season...good floor man...hard driver, and fair shot from outside..
- Don Roquet (6-5 junior center) -- first season on varsity...his height will help a small squad...good rebounder, and tough shot from underneath.
- Frank Stotts (6-3 junior F-C) -- led team in scoring as sophomore...could easily be 20 point shooter this season...has every shot in the book, but his jumper from 10 feet is most effective...tough rebounder.
- Dennis Stripling (6-2 junior guard) -- first season on varsity...has developed fast in early drills...potentially a fine player...good on boards.

ASSISTANT COACH L.W. (MON) WHITFORD

Assistant basketball coach Mon Whitford is probably best known for his long and successful career as Panther baseball mentor. Next spring Mon will field his 30th Iowa Teachers diamond team.

A graduate of ISTC in 1924, Whitford returned here in 1926 and has coached all baseball since then. No baseball was played during the war years 1943-44-45. During the past 29 seasons, Mon's diamond squads have won 213 games while losing 161. Considering the stiff opposition the club meets annually, the record is even more impressive.

His 1928 team had the best over-all record, winning 11 of 12 contests for a .917 mark. That team scored 1148 runs, an average of 12.3 a game, a mark that has not since been approached.

Born in Edgerton, Wisconsin in 1897, Whitford went through high school there. He entered the army during World War I and saw service in both France and Germany. In 1919 Mon entered ISTC and earned 11 major letter awards, playing football, basketball and baseball.

As a student he started a long officiating career. For many years Mon served as a Big Ten basketball official and as a baseball umpire in the Western and Three-I leagues.

After graduation in 1924, Whitford coached two years at Monticello high school before returning to his alma-mater in 1926. Mon also served as football coach here from 1930 to 1932. His grid teams won 10 games, lost 13 and tied two.

Mon saw more military duty during the second World War as an army officer. Whitford is married and the couple has two sons, Lawrence and Thomas, both in their 20's.

FRESHMAN BASKETBALL PROSPECTS

It will be Mon Whitford's pleasant duty to handle the current crop of freshman basketball material at ISTC, labeled by many as the best group of frosh cagers the school has ever seen. Varsity coach Jim Witham has gone on record as saying it's the best contingent of newcomers he has handled in his 13 years of college coaching.

Too many former prep stars comprise the squad to name them all (see roster on next page). The towering squad -- 114 stand 6-3 or more -- is topped off by big Cliff Svoboda, a 6 foot, 8 inch 240 pound giant whom Witham calls the best big man he has ever had as a cage candidate. Two of Svoboda's teammates from Cedar Rapids Wilson, where he prepped, are also on the squad: Jim Meskimen, a smooth 6-1 guard, and Bob Hess, a 6-3 forward candidate.

The tough Des Moines city league has supplied three to the frosh roster: Hal Faber, who played center on Dowling's state championship outfit; Chuck Collins, East High's all-around athlete, and Jim Long, leading scorer in the Big Six conference. Faber and Collins are also outstanding grid prospects.

Probably the best shot on the squad is classy Bill Herkelman, who carried a 29.5 scoring average in his senior year at Elwood. Tom Caulkins, a hard driving forward from Panora, and Wayne Olson, a member of Grinnell's fine club last season, are other top candidates. And far under the squad's average height is little Ron Lanaghan, a 5-8 fireball guard who played with Clinton's state tournament team a year ago.
