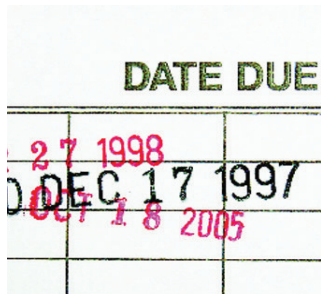

The Great Migration was a movement of over six million African Americans from fourteen southern states into the north, west and northeastern states from 1910 through 1970. This Migration had a lasting impact, not only in major US cities, but also in small town Iowa.
