Students enrolled only in Guided Independent Study (correspondence). Courses sponsored by Continuing Education and Special Programs. (*Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98*)

4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.

The total hours for which all students are enrolled at the end of the second week (effective Fall 2004) of Fall/Spring semester, and the final enrollment of the summer session are determined. These are added together to determine the total hours for the year. Undergraduate hours are divided by 30 and graduate hours by 18 to determine a full-time equivalent.
