1. Annual

3. Non-Resident Enrollment

Students enrolled only in Guided Independent Study (correspondence). Courses sponsored by Continuing Education and Special Programs. (*Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98*)

4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.

1. All students enrolling in a course identified as one offered by Continuing Education and Special Programs.
2. Each student is counted only once regardless of the number of extension courses enrolled in during the full year.

Totals < guided independent study (correspondence) + extension

Guided Independent Study (correspondence) totals = not in residence (page 1). Students also enrolled in residence work during the full year are omitted.

These are added together to determine the total hours for the year. Undergraduate hours are divided by 30 and graduate hours by 18 to determine a full-time equivalent.
