P R O F I L E S U M M A R Y

ALL STUDENTS

The total enrollment of 10,954 students enrolled at UNI for the Fall Semester 1981 was a decrease of 66 (.6%) from the previous year. Undergraduate enrollment increased 29 (.3%) and the graduate enrollment decreased 95 (7%). Ninety-four (94) students enrolled as undergraduates already had a bachelor's degree. In previous years, these students were required to enroll as graduate students even though they were not working towards an advanced degree. Of all students enrolled, 77% were full-time; 16% of the undergraduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 12 semester hours) and 79% of the graduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 9 semester hours). The total undergraduates who had declared majors in Teaching curricula were 31%. Of all students registered, 57% were women.

The most popular undergraduate declared majors were: Pre-Business (799), Accounting (451), Management (316), Elementary Education Lower/Upper (449), Special Education (325), Marketing (138), and Pre-Professional Curriculum (245).

The most popular graduate majors were: Business Administration-MBA (151), Special Education (97), Elementary Education (49), Counseling (36), English - all areas (33), and Communicative Disorders (26). Eight (8) students were enrolled in the Doctor of Industrial Technology Program. A total of 394 (32%) were not pursuing an advanced degree.

Of the 9,737 undergraduate students, 5,458 (56%) indicated an interest in Liberal and Vocational Arts curricula, 2,500 (26%) in Teaching curricula, and 1,779 (18%) were undecided.

A total of 10,580 (97% of all students) were Iowa residents, 2,998 (27%) were from Black Hawk County, and 1,289 (12%) were from counties contiguous to Black Hawk.

The 67 Foreign student enrollment included 41 undergraduate students and 26 graduate students from 26 foreign countries.

Of the 9,737 undergraduate students, 9,456 (97%) were white and 201 (2%) were black. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 1% of the undergraduate enrollment.

Of the 1,217 graduate students, a total of 1,168 (96%) were white and 28 (2%) were black. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 2% of the graduate enrollment.

The average age of undergraduates was 21.6 years and graduates was 31.6 years.

A total of 145 permanently mobility-impaired students were enrolled Fall Semester 1981. This represented a gain of 103 (245%) from the previous fall.

Total enrollment of veterans receiving educational benefits from the Veterans Administration was 293 students, a decrease of 27 (8%) from the previous fall semester.

Total residence hall occupancy was 4,891 students, a decrease of 224 (4%) from the previous year. About 45% of the students reside in residence halls.

FRESHMEN DIRECT FROM HIGH SCHOOL

Approximately 21% of the total undergraduate enrollment for the Fall Semester 1981 were new students direct from high school.

More than 58% of the entering freshmen completed their applications for admission to UNI before January 31 of their senior year in high school.

Of all the new students 97% were Iowa residents with 94 counties represented. Approximately 23% were from Black Hawk County, while 63% came from a distance of not more than 100 miles from Cedar Falls. There was an increase in entering students from Black Hawk County and a decrease in students from distances of 100 miles or more from campus.

Approximately 57% of the entering students graduated from high school classes of 200 or less, while 24% graduated from classes of 400 or more students.

Of the entering freshmen, 77% ranked in the top one-half and 51% ranked in the top 30% of their high school graduating class.

Only 10% of the freshmen had ACT Composite Standard Scores of 27 or higher, while 52% earned scores of 21 or above, a higher percentage than the previous year.

About 23% of the entering freshmen ranked in the top 30% of their high school graduating class and had ACT Composite Standard Scores of 24 or higher.

Approximately 92% of the entering students were enrolled as full-time students carrying 12 or more semester hours of credit.

On their applications for admission to UNI, 73% of the entering freshmen indicated a preference for Liberal or Vocational Arts curricula, compared to 72% in 1980, while 24% indicated preferences for Teaching curricula, and 3% did not indicate a preference.

Although 403 (20%) of the new freshmen did not indicate a prospective academic major, for those who did, the most frequently indicated were: Accounting (290), Elementary and Middle School Education (137), Marketing (121), Industrial Technology (70), Special Education (70), Speech (63), Music (52), Physical Education, Health, and Recreation (52), Art (51), Administrative Management (51), Mathematics (50), Business Education (47) and Psychology (47). In addition, 110 new students indicated an interest in Pre-Professional curricula. Of the 110 enrolled in Pre-Professional curricula, 23 (21%) were interested in Nursing, 20 (18%) in Physical Therapy, and 18 (16%) in Engineering.

About 70% of the new women students and 67% of the new men students made their decision to attend UNI during their senior year of high school.

A total of 83% of the new students planned to attend UNI until they received a degree while 11% planned to transfer to another school; about 87% indicated they would attend UNI four or more years.

About 83% of the women students and 74% of the men students expected a 2.67 (B-) or higher grade point average their first semester at UNI. Parent expectations were slightly lower than student expectations. Less than 1% expected grades below a 2.00 (C) average their first semester.

The entering freshmen came from homes in which 32% of the fathers were employed in professional, technical, or managerial occupations, 15% in agriculture, 14% in sales or clerical positions, 11% in machine trades, and 9% in structural work. Of the mothers, 38% were full-time homemakers, 26% were in clerical and sales positions, 18% in professional, technical, or managerial occupations, and 11% in service occupations.

The mean educational grade level of 13.42 (12.00 = high school graduate) attained by the fathers of new students was slightly higher than the 13.07 grade level attained by the mothers. Approximately 45% of the fathers and 42% of the mothers had received post-secondary education and about 29% of the fathers and 19% of the mothers were college graduates. Only 3% of the mothers and 6% of the fathers terminated their education before attending high school.

STUDENTS TRANSFERRING FROM OTHER COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

A total of 823 new students, a decrease of 40 (5%) transferred from other colleges and universities to UNI, Fall Semester 1981. Over one-half of the transfers were from Iowa two-year colleges.

Of the 419 (51%) who transferred from Iowa two-year colleges, about 68% came from the following colleges: North Iowa Area

Community College, Ellsworth Community College, Marshalltown Community College, Iowa Central Community College-Fort Dodge, Des Moines Area Community College-Ankeny, Kirkwood Community College, and Hawkeye Institute of Technology.

Of the 220 (27%) who transferred from Iowa four-year colleges, a total of 87 came from the University of Iowa and Iowa State University, while 133 came from Iowa private four-year colleges.

A total of 178 (22%) transferred from out-of-state colleges.

Of the 26 public two-year college attendance centers in Iowa, the number of transfers to UNI increased from 14 centers and decreased from 12 centers.

NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS

The graduate student enrollment of 264 new students represented a decrease of 31 (11%) from the Fall Semester 1980. A total of 124 (47%) received their bachelor's degree from UNI, 16 (6%) from Iowa State University, and 9 (3%) from the University of Iowa. The majority of out-of-state students came from Illinois, Missouri, Minnesota, and Wisconsin. Nine (9) new graduates came from foreign universities or colleges.

The most popular major areas for new graduate students were Business Administration (25), Technology (9 - including 2 in the Doctor of Industrial Technology Program), Counseling (8), Physical Education (6), Spanish (6), and Special Education (6). A total of 125 new graduates enrolled as non-degree students.

MISCELLANEOUS

The total number of new undergraduate students for the 1980-81 year (Summer 1980, Fall 1980, and Spring 1981) was 3,824, an increase of 4% from the previous year. Of the 3,824 new students, 2,471 (65%) were entering freshmen while 1,353 (35%) were new transfers, a 2% increase in the percentage of new freshmen and a 2% decrease in the percentage of new transfers since the previous year.

For Fall and Spring Semesters 1980-81, a total of 567 new undergraduates were enrolled on a part-time basis. This represented 16% of the total new students, a decrease of 1% from the previous year. The percentage of new part-time students has doubled since 1971-72.

Scholarship summary data for fall semesters in recent years (1976-1980) revealed a slight decrease in average semester hour loads for undergraduate students to 13.21 while the average grade index rose

.0472. The average graduate student semester hour load was 5.10 while the grade point average increased .04 to 3.46. Spring semester loads and grade point averages for graduate students tended to be slightly higher than those for the fall semesters.

A total of 242 new undergraduate students were enrolled in Educational Opportunity Programs (E.O.P.) for Fall Semesters 1978-1981. Of the 242 students, 143 (59%) were black and 93 (38%) were caucasian.

Of the 538 students who took College Level Examination Program (CLEP) General Examinations in 1981, a total of 373 (69%) achieved scores which would enable them to receive college credit. In 1980, only 358 (52%) of the 688 who took the examinations received college credit. A total of 94% of the students who took the Mathematics Examination received credit. UNI students achieved higher mean scores on all of the CLEP Examinations (Humanities, Mathematics, Natural Science, Social Science-History, and English Composition) than students from the State of Iowa, the Midwest Region, and the United States.

RESEARCH PERTAINING TO UNI STUDENTS

A follow-up study of entering freshmen, for whom high school decile ranks and ACT Composite Scores were available, revealed the following information at the end of the Fall Semester 1980: A total of 738 (72%) of entering freshmen women and 397 (63%) of entering freshmen men made a grade point of 2.00 (C) or higher. Of the entering freshmen students who ranked in the upper one-half of their high school graduating class, a total of 293 (73%) of the men and 679 (77%) of the women made a grade point of 2.00 or above. Of the freshmen who had an ACT Composite Standard Score of 21 or above, a total of 234 (77%) of the men and 395 (87%) of the women had a grade point average of 2.00 or above.

Entering women students ranked higher in their high school graduating class and achieved higher cumulative grade point averages at the end of their first semester at UNI than entering men students; however, the men students had higher ACT Composite Standard scores than entering women students.

Students who originally enrolled at UNI direct from high school and who received Bachelors Degrees, Fall 1980 and Spring 1981, had a mean grade point average of 2.78 their first semester at UNI and a 3.01 cumulative grade point average at graduation. Their mean high school decile rank was 6.97 (9 = Top 1/10) and their mean ACT Composite Standard score was 22.53.

Students who transferred to UNI from other colleges and who received Bachelors Degrees, Fall 1980 and Spring 1981, had a mean grade point average of 2.84 their first semester at UNI and a 3.01 cumulative grade point average at graduation. Their mean high school decile rank was 6.23 and their mean ACT Composite Standard Score was 20.96.

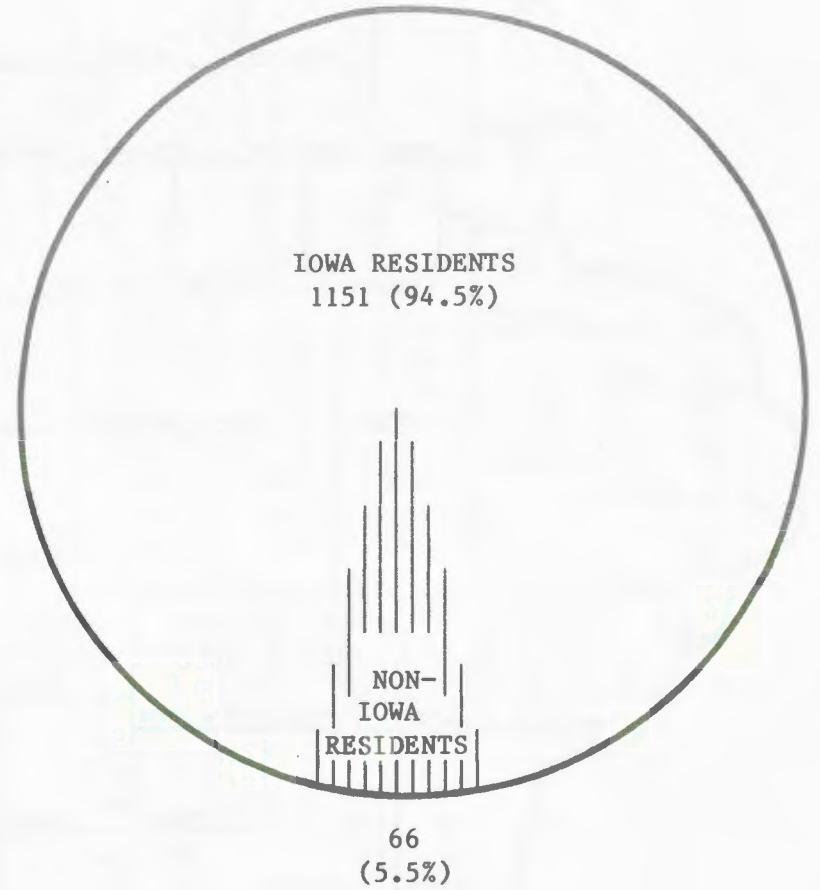

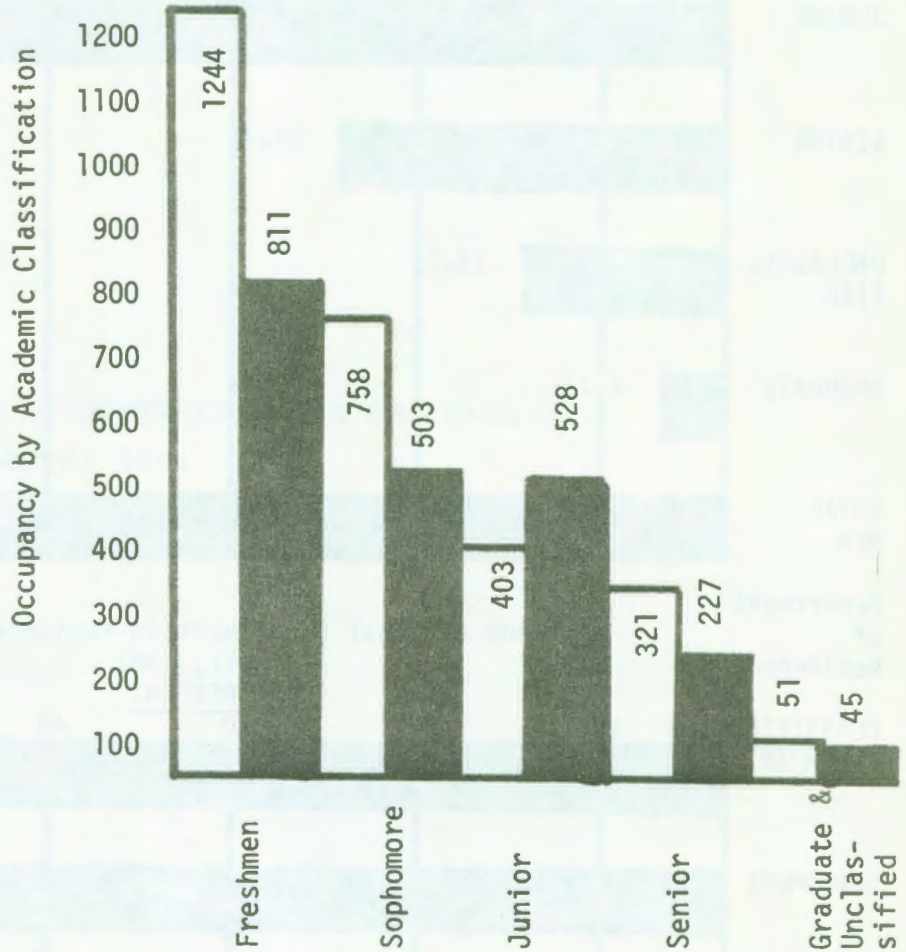

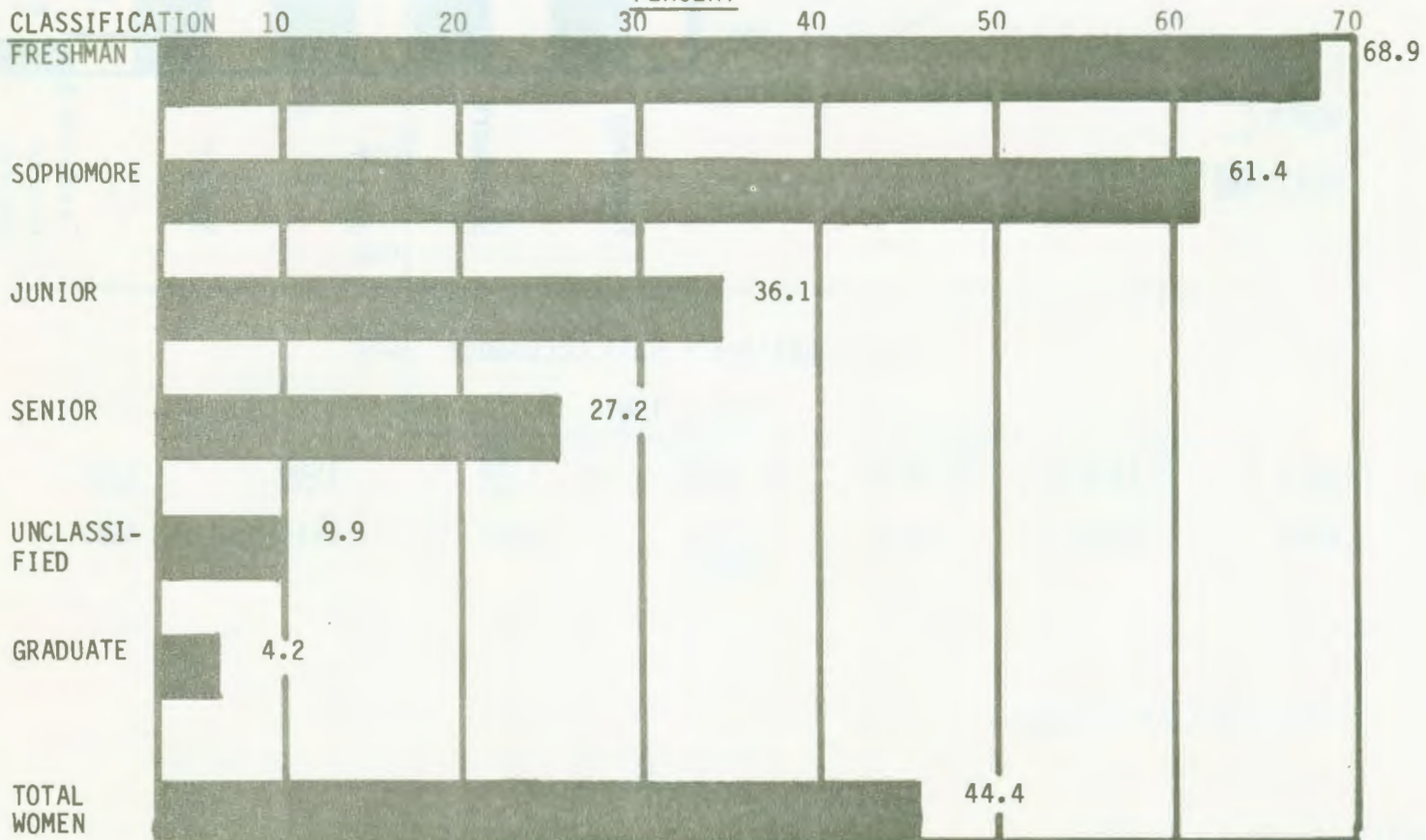

OF ENROLLED STUDENTS NEW FROM HIGH SCHOOL

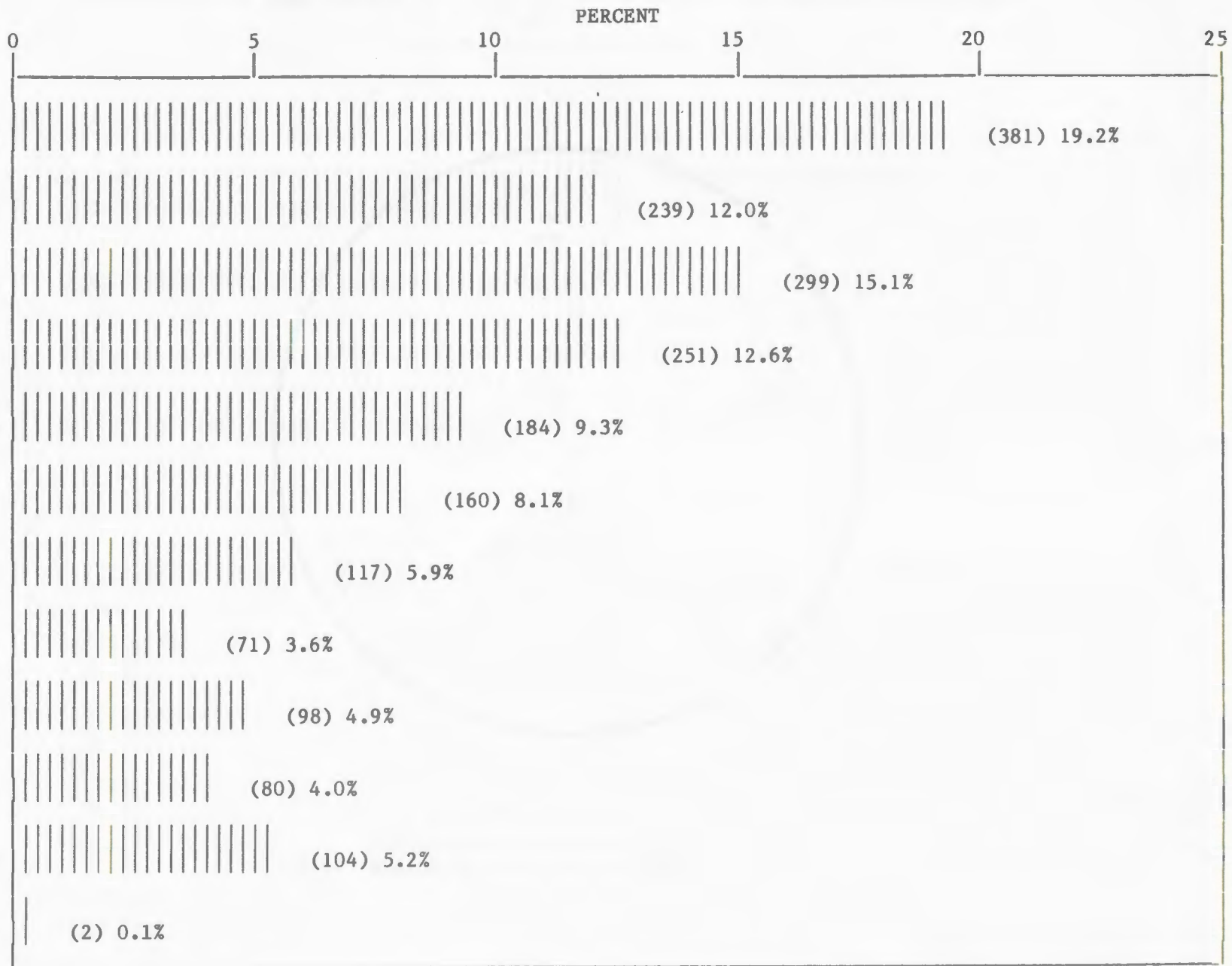

NEW FROM HIGH SCHOOL

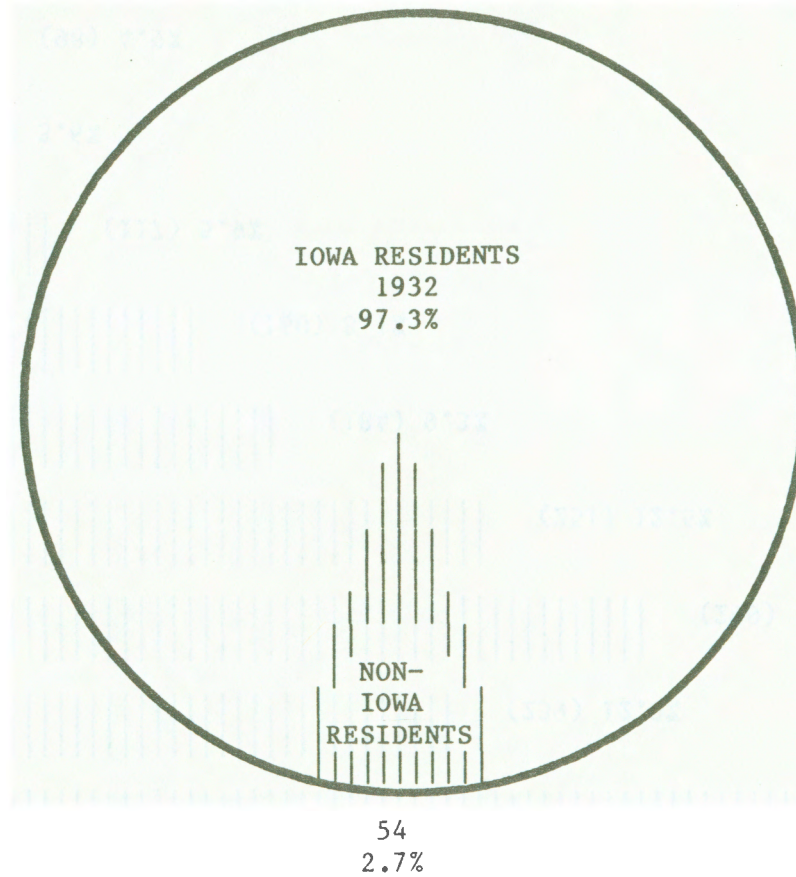

NEW FROM IOWA HIGH SCHOOLS

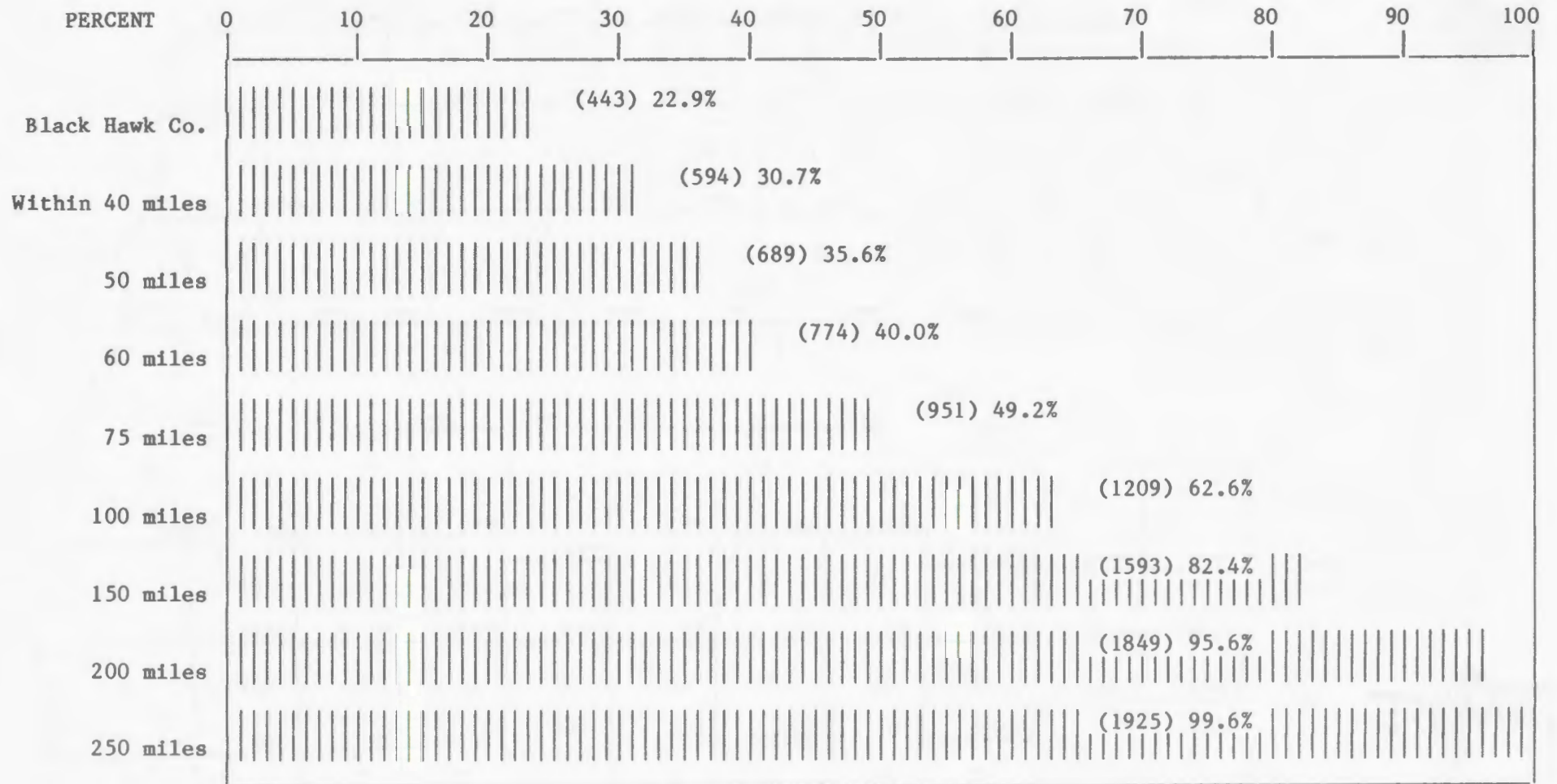
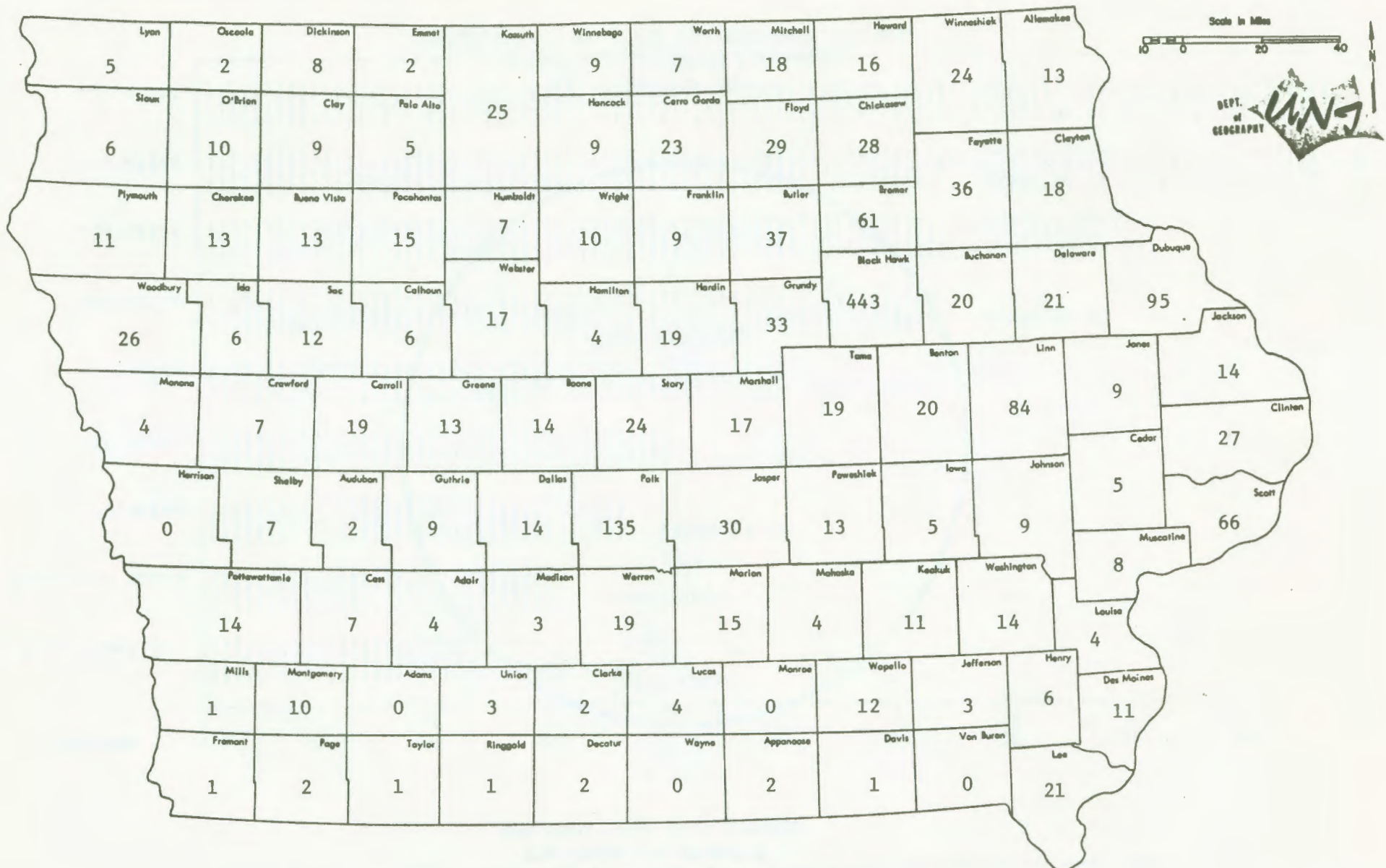

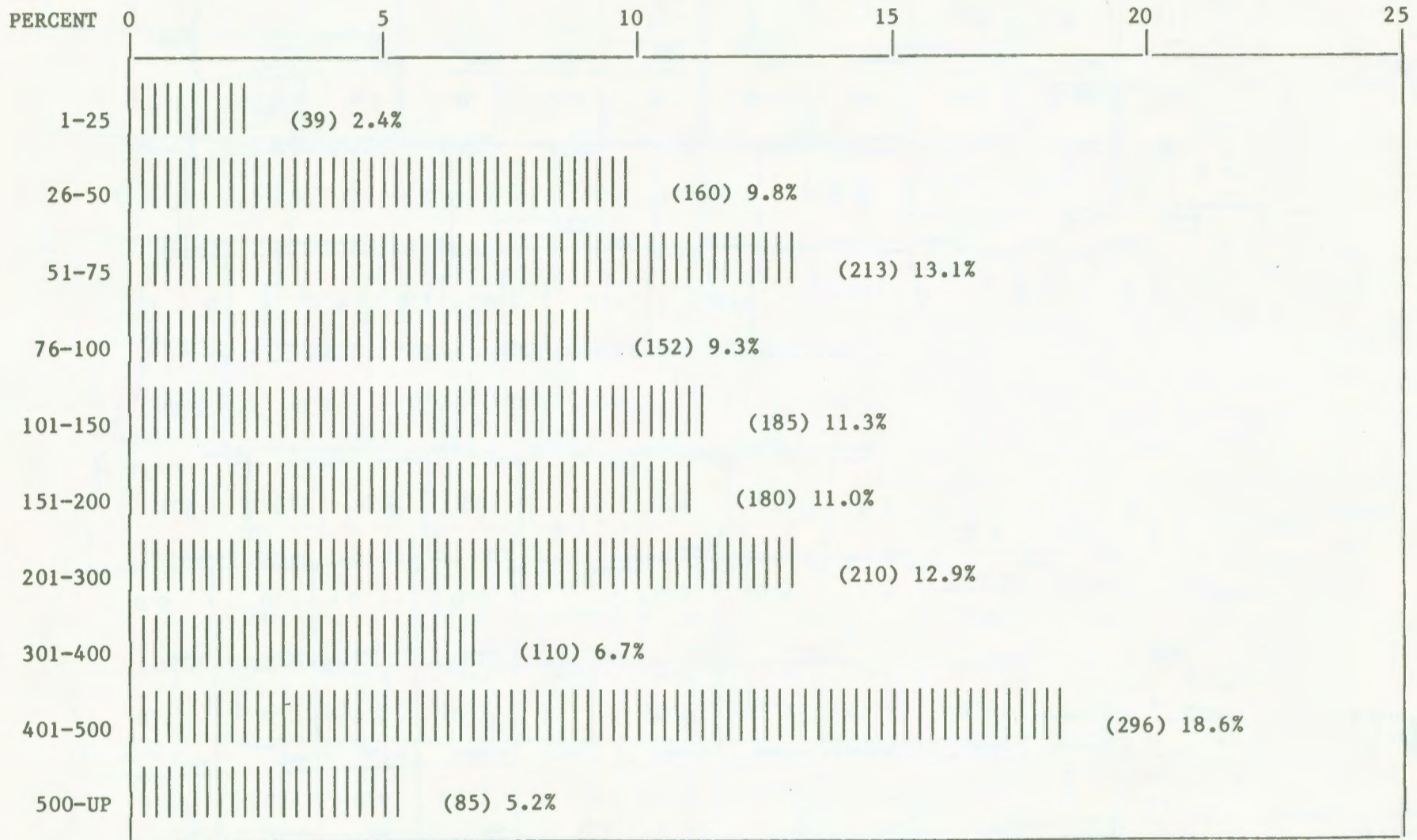

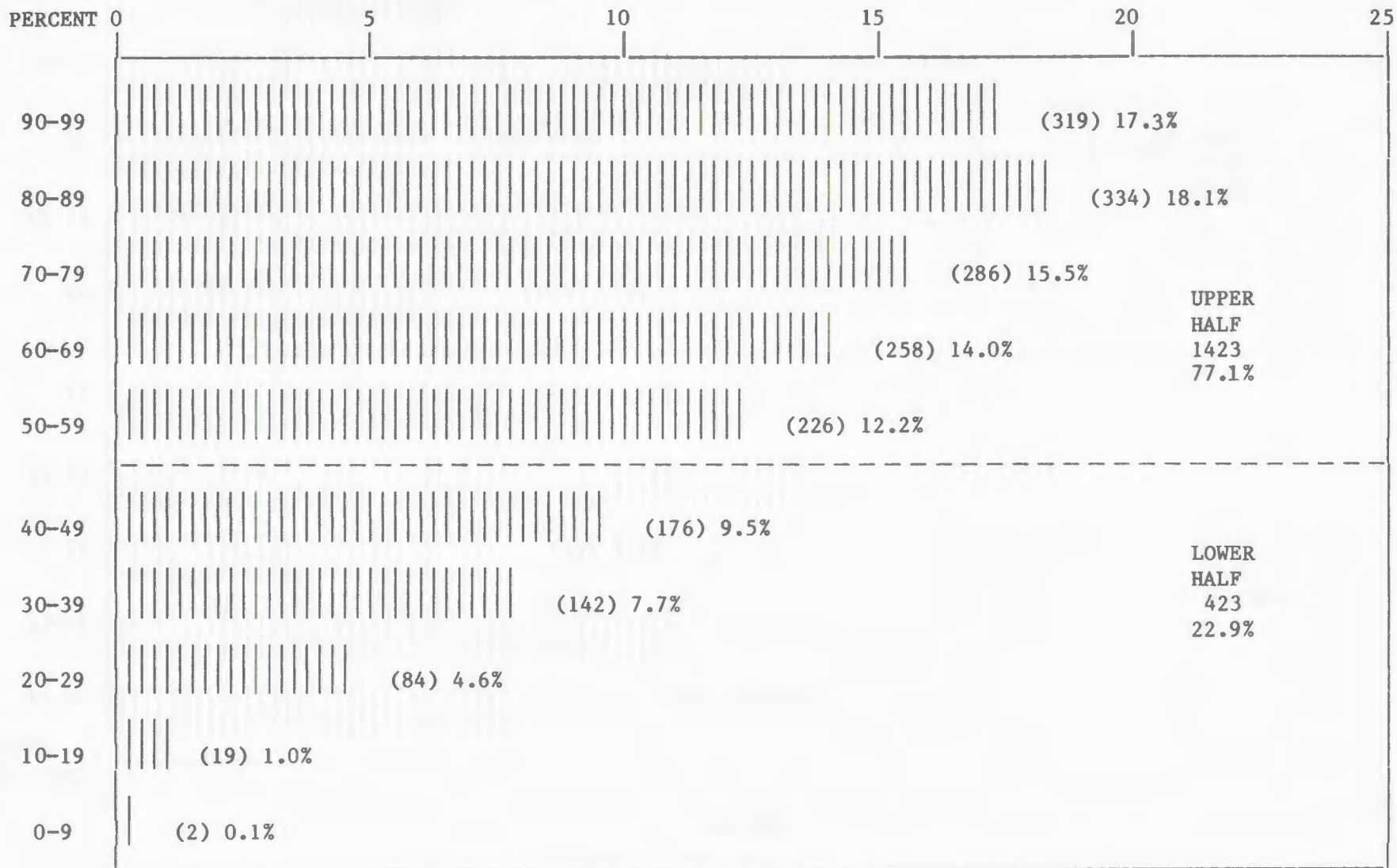

NEW FROM HIGH SCHOOL

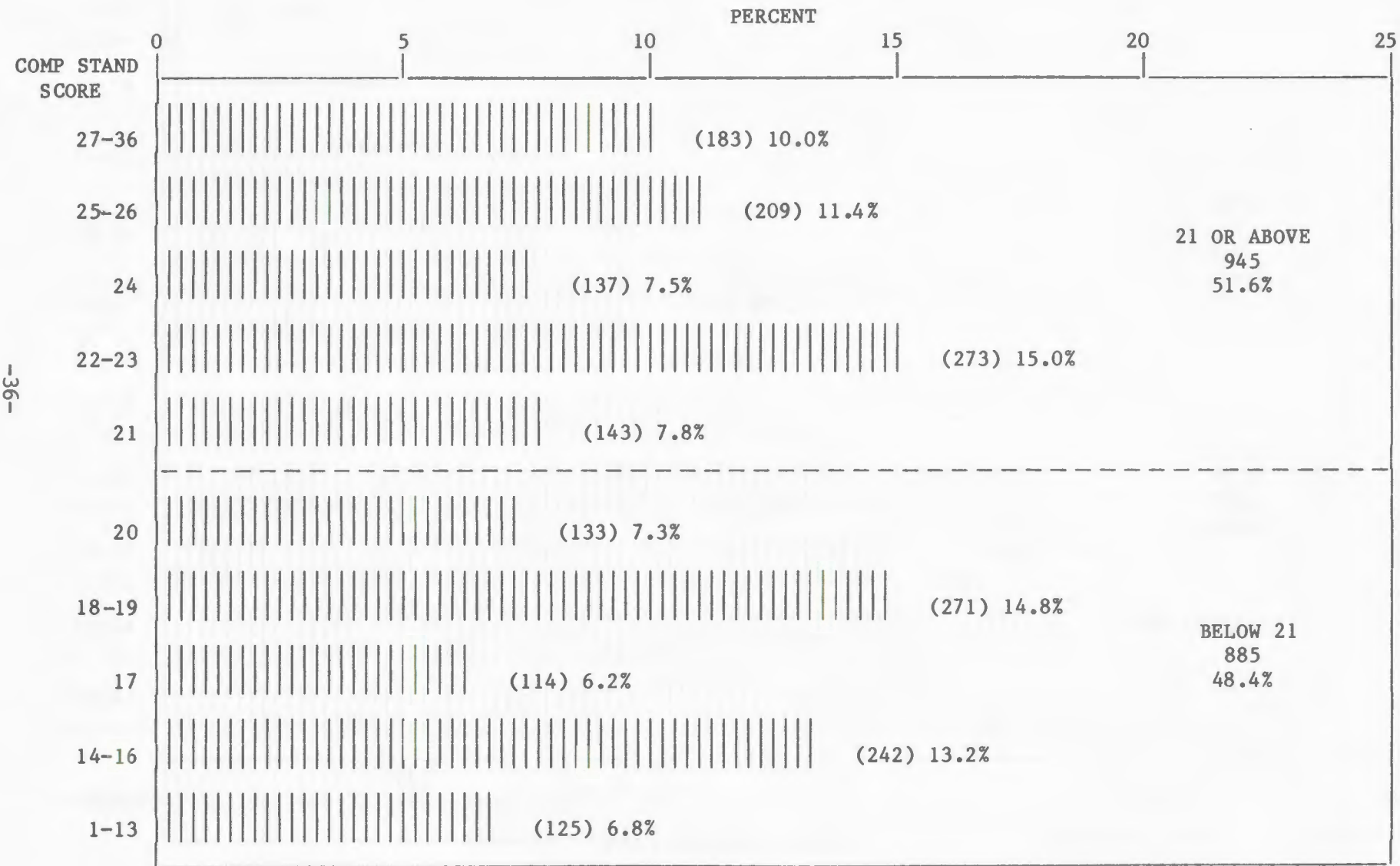


DISTRIBUTION BY PERCENTILE RANK IN HIGH SCHOOL

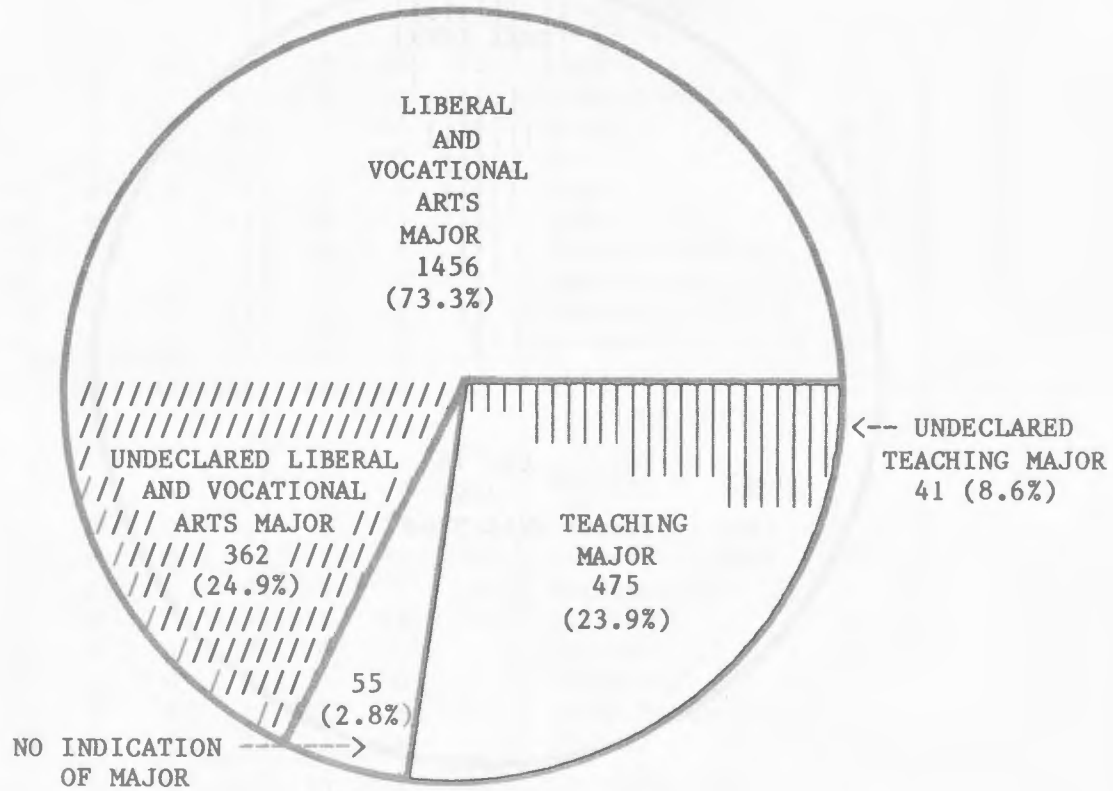

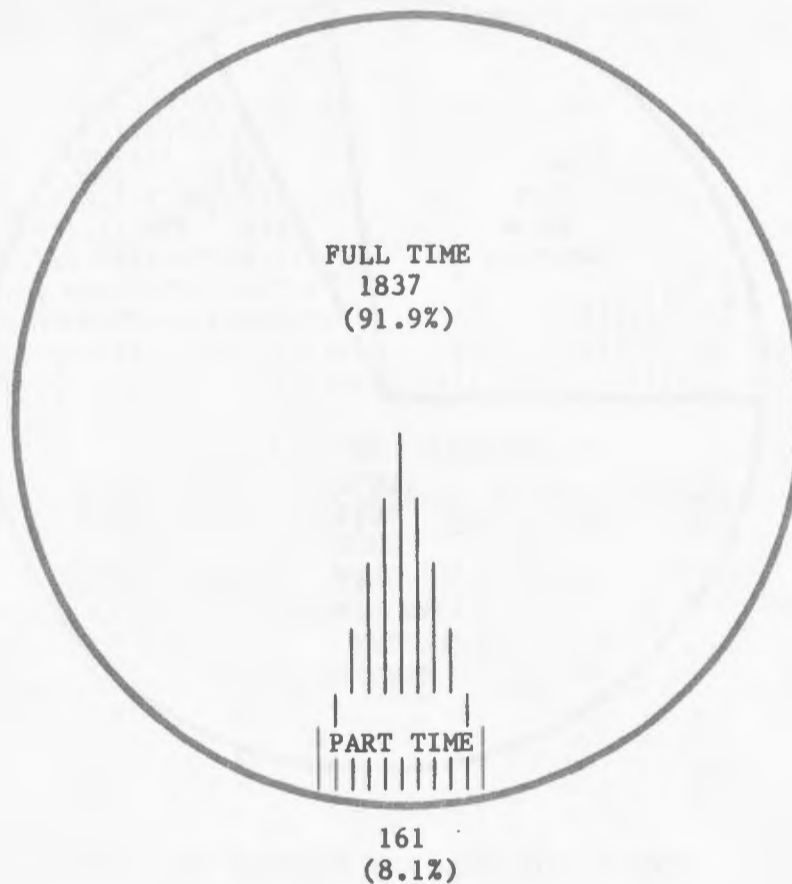

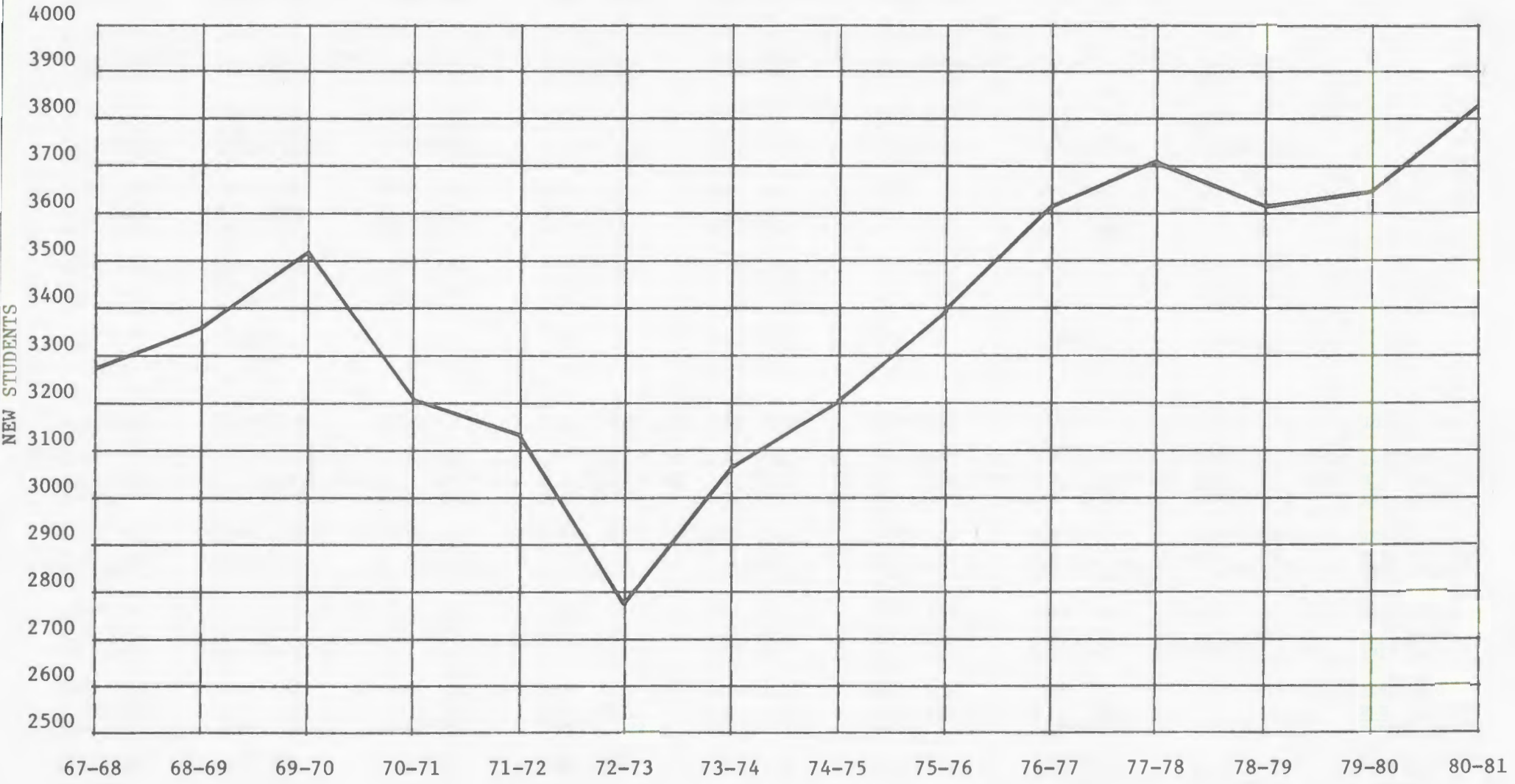
