Optional Practical Training (OPT) for Eligible F-1 Students

If you have an F-1 visa and you are planning to graduate in May 2014, now is the time to think about applying for Optional Practical Training as you are probably eligible for this 12 month period of employment authorization within the U.S. See our website for more information on OPT at http://www.uni.edu/internationalservices/f-1-student-employment-information. You may also go ahead and schedule an application appointment with the Immigration and Visa Coordinator if you are ready to submit your application or if you have questions. Income Tax Season

Students may be hearing about W-2 forms and filing "income tax" returns for 2013. An income tax return is a report that you must make to the Internal Revenue Service (http://www.irs.gov) of the U.S. Government for any calendar year when you earn income in the United States. Fortunately, you do not need to do these alone. On Monday, March 10, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program will begin helping international students prepare 2013 income tax returns. Assistance will be available at the times indicated on the attached flyer. Income taxes can be confusing and complicated, so you are encouraged to seek free assistance from the V.I.T.A. volunteers. Be sure to bring your W-2 form from UNI and any other tax forms you have received or do receive before March 10. You will also need your I-20 or DS-2019 form, your passport and I-94 information. If you did not have a job in 2013, you should still file IRS form 8843, available here: http://www.irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/f8843.pdf You will only need to complete Part I and Part III before signing at the bottom of the form and sending it to the IRS at the address indicated in the instructions. April 15, 2014 is the deadline for filing all 2013 tax returns!
