PROFILE SUMMARY

SECTION I: TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FOR FALL 1992

The total enrollment of 13,045 students at UNI for the Fall 1992 semester was a decrease of 118 (0.9%) from the previous year. Undergraduate enrollment decreased 168 (1.4%) while graduate enrollment increased 50 (4.3%). Of all students enrolled, 81.9% were full-time; 13.5% of the undergraduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 12 semester hours); and 62.9% of the graduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 9 semester hours). Of all students registered, 57.1% were women. Undergraduates who had declared majors in the teaching curricula were 30.1% of all declared majors.

The most popular undergraduate declared majors were: Elementary Education (1,448), Accounting (594), Early Childhood Education (507), Management (323), Psychology (288), General Studies (325), Marketing (242), and English (274).

The most popular graduate majors were: Special Education (84) and Business Administration-MBA (70). Twenty (20) students were enrolled in the Doctor of Industrial Technology program and fifty-one (51) in the program leading to the Doctor of Education degree.

Of the 11,825 undergraduate students, 7,573 (64.0%) indicated an interest in Liberal Arts Curricula, 3,267 (27.6%) in the Teaching curricula, and 985 (8.4%) were undecided or unclassified.

A total of 12,413 (95.2% of all students) were Iowa residents 2,753 (21.1%) were from Black Hawk County, and 1,452 (11.1%) were from counties contiguous to Black Hawk.

The 198 foreign students enrolled (24.5% increase) included 101 (16.1% increase) undergraduate students and 97 (34.7% increase) graduate students from 49 foreign countries.

Of the 13,045 students, 12,348 (94.7%) were white and 279 (2.1%) were Black. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 1.7% of the enrollment (an increase of .3%).

The average age of undergraduates was 22.0 years (.1 yr. increase) and graduates was 33.9 years (.2 yr. decrease).

Total enrollment of veterans receiving educational benefits from the Veterans Administration was 300 students, a decrease of 12 (3.8%) from the previous fall semester.

A total of 1,093 (9.2%) undergraduate students and 674 (55.2%) graduate students were married, 870 (49.2%) of these married students had dependents. An additional 334 (2.6%) students identified themselves as single students with dependents.

A total of 313 students identified themselves as being handicapped with 48 as permanently mobility-impaired.

Total residence hall occupancy was 4,487 students, a decrease of 489 (9.8%) from the previous year. About 34.5% of the female students and 34.3% of the male students reside in residence halls.

PART C: NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS

Those students new to graduate study were 264 and represented an increase of 28 (11.9%) from the Fall semester 1991. A total of 100 (37.9%) received their bachelor's degree from UNI, 67 (25.4%) from other Iowa colleges and 97 (36.7%) from out-of-state or foreign universities. Of the 264 new graduate students, 191 (72.3%) were residents of Iowa.

The most popular major areas for new graduate students were Speech Language Pathology (12), TESOL (12), Special Education (11), and History (11). There were 108 (36.6%) non-degree students.

SECTION II: NEW STUDENTS ENTERING UNI FALL SEMESTER 1992

PART A: FRESHMEN DIRECT FROM HIGH SCHOOL

A total of 1,727 students or 14.6% of the total undergraduate enrollment for Fall 1992 were new students direct from high school. New students direct from high school represented 16.9% of the undergraduate enrollment Fall 1991.

Approximately 82% of the entering freshmen completed their applications for admission to UNI before January 31. This is 4% higher than the percent of enrolled students who had applied by that time last year.

Of all the new students 93.4% were Iowa residents representing all 99 counties. Over 15% of the Iowa 1992 high school graduates enrolled at UNI were from Black Hawk County. Nearly 18% of all new freshmen Iowa residents enrolled at UNI entered from Black Hawk County.

Of new freshmen, 62.9% graduated from high school classes of 200 or less, a decrease of 1% from last fall, while 4.7% graduated from classes of more than 400 students, an increase of 2%.

The percent of students entering from the top one-half of their high school graduating class dropped slightly (0.4%) in comparison to Fall 1991. A total of 92.7% of the students entered from the top one-half of their graduating classes and 58.9% entered from the top 30%.

Both the mean and median ACT composite standard scores for entering freshmen rose Fall 1992 in comparison to Fall 1991; from 22.8 to 22.9 for the mean ACT and from 23.0 to 23.2 for the median ACT. Although the percentage of students entering Fall 1992 with an ACT of 21 or above is the same as the percentage entering last year, the percentage of students entering Fall 1992 with an ACT score in the top two categories (27-36 and 25-26) rose a total of 1.2% in comparison to Fall 1991.

The graph showing a combination of rank in class and ACT for each individual entering student is very important when comparing entering students. In comparison to last year, the number and percent of students entering with a rank in the top 10% and ACT of 27 or above has decreased. The number of students in this category is 136 for Fall 1992 representing 8.1% of the total number of new entering freshmen. The percent of students in the comparable range last year was 8.8. Likewise the range including those ranking in the top 30% who also have an ACT score of 24 or above and the range making up students ranking in the top 50% with an ACT of 21 and above has decreased in both number and percent.

Of the new classified freshmen, 190 (11%) did not indicate a prospective academic major, a decrease of 3.2% over last year. Those selecting a Liberal or Vocational Arts program increased by 1.8% and those selecting a teaching major increased by 1.4%. The most frequently indicated majors (40 or more) were: Accounting (291), Elementary Education (185), Management (84), Psychology (73), Business - undeclared (64), Marketing (51), English (46), Finance (43), Biology (41), and Mathematics (40). In addition, 53 new freshmen indicated an interest in Pre-professional curricula.

A total of 1,657 (95.9%) of the entering freshmen were enrolled as full-time students (12 semester hours or more). Eleven (16%) of those counted as part-time students were enrolled in non-credit developmental courses in English and/or mathematics and had a total contact load equal to that of full-time students.

PART B: TRANSFERS FROM OTHER COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

A total of 987 new students transferred from other colleges and universities. The number entering Fall 1992 is down 108 students compared to Fall 1991. This number does not include unclassified students who may have attended other colleges before registering at UNI. Of the 987 classified transfers, 659 (66.8%) were from Iowa two-year colleges.

Of those transferring from Iowa two-year public colleges, nearly 72% enter from colleges sending 30 or more students. The same seven institutions as Fall 1991 proved to be UNI's top feeder schools Fall 1992: North Iowa Area Community College, Kirkwood Community College, Des Moines Area Community College - Ankeny, Iowa Central Community College - Ft. Dodge, Ellsworth Community College, Indian Hills Community College - Ottumwa, and Marshalltown Community College.

Of the 192 who transferred from Iowa four-year colleges, 42% came from the University of Iowa and Iowa State University while 58% came from Iowa private four-year colleges. In comparison to Fall 1991, the percent entering from Iowa private four-year colleges dropped by 5%. The largest number entering from a four-year college came from the University of Iowa.

Although the total number of transfers entering Fall 1992 is down, both the number and percent of out-of-state transfers have increased. Out-of-state transfers rose from 114 (10.4% of new transfers) to 136 (13.8% of new transfers).

SECTION III: MISCELLANEOUS

New admitted students represented 82.5% of the gross applications for Fall 1992. This ratio shows a 2.2% increase over last year. New enrolled freshmen

as a percent of admitted freshmen is 53.8%, a record low for the eleven year period beginning Fall 1982.

The number of admitted classified transfers as a percent of gross applications is 80.8% for Fall 1992, a 1% increase over Fall 1991. The number enrolled as a percent of those admitted is 72.5%. The yield of enrolled transfers continues to surpass freshman yield, as experienced consistently each of the past 10 years.

Denials as a percent of gross applications is 9.7%, a 2.9% decrease from last fall's record high of 12.6%

The percentage of new freshmen entering UNI with high school course deficiencies continues to drop. Statistics for 1992 indicate that fewer students entered with deficiencies in each academic area included in UNI's required high school core. Ninety-three percent of new freshmen entering Fall 1992 satisfied or exceeded the required high school core. This positive trend continues as reflected by a 19% increase in the number of students who have satisfied the required core when comparing Fall 1992 with Fall 1988.


Again this fall fewer students had to rely on alternative means in order to meet the high school core required for admission. Those entering 1992 showed a 22.9% improvement over the first freshman class required to meet the high school core and a 1.6% improvement over last year. The percentage of new freshmen who have elected to complete two or more years of a single foreign language before entering UNI dropped slightly this year. This group of new entering freshmen decreased by 2.3% when comparing Fall 1992 with Fall 1991, but is still 33.4% above Fall 1988, the year preceding implementation of the requirement. The number and percent of students completing three years or more also decreased. The percent decreased by 3.3% for Fall 1992 in comparison to Fall 1991. Compared to Fall 1988, this percent shows a total increase of 19.2%.

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



DISTRIBUTION OF TOTAL GRADUATE STUDENT ENROLLMENT BY COLLEGE, RACE, AND SEX, 1992-93








- (1) A significant number of students with handicapping conditions are never identified by their own choosing.

Veterans Receiving VA Educ Benefits Fall Semesters 1973-92



UNI RESIDENCE HALL OCCUPANCY PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL ENROLLMENT IN HALLS










Distribution by Month of Application Enrolled Freshmen New From High School




Distribution by Size of H S Class Enrolled Freshmen New From High School



Enrolled Freshmen New From High School Fall 1992



Enrolled Freshmen New From High School Fall 1992



Distribution by Curriculum Enrolled Freshmen New From High School



















Graduation Rate Total Class and Athletes
