## PROFILE SUMMARY

## SECTION I: TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FOR FALL 1998

The total enrollment of 13,329 students at UNI for the Fall 1998 semester was an increase of 221 (1.7%) from the previous year. Undergraduate enrollment increased 110 (0.9%) while graduate enrollment increased 111 (7.6%). Of all students enrolled, 82.5% were full-time; 10.8% of the undergraduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 12 semester hours); and 67.5% of the graduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 9 semester hours). Of all students registered, 58.6% were women. Undergraduates who had declared majors in the teaching curricula were 31.6% of all declared majors.

The most popular undergraduate declared majors were: Elementary Education (1,730), Accounting (753), Communication (595), Biology (564), Early Childhood Education (505), Management (496), Psychology (409), Finance (359), Marketing (352), General Studies (318), English (307), Art (290), Management Information Systems (278), Criminology (277), History (261), and Social Work (216).

The most popular graduate majors were: Special Education (101), Business Administration-MBA (94), Communication Studies (65), Counseling (47), Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (45), English (44), Elementary Reading and Language Arts (42), and Speech Pathology (41). Seventeen (17) students were enrolled in the Doctor of Industrial Technology program and fifty five (55) in the program leading to the Doctor of Education degree.

Of the 11,764 undergraduate students, 7,430 (63.2%) indicated an interest in Liberal Arts Curricula, 3,429 (29.1%) in the Teaching curricula, and 905 (7.7%) were undecided or unclassified.

A total of 12,403 (93.1% of all students) were lowa residents, 2,414 (18.1%) were from Black Hawk County, and 1,453 (10.9%) were from counties contiguous to Black Hawk.

The 319 foreign students enrolled included 185 (12.8% increase) undergraduate students and 134 (3.1% increase) graduate students from 63 foreign countries.

Of the 13,329 students, 12,064 (90.5%) were white and 283 (2.1%) were Black. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 1.9% of the enrollment. Students with no ethnic response represented 3.1% of the enrollment.

The average age of undergraduates was 21.5 years (no change) and graduates was 34.1 years (.7 yr. increase).

Total enrollment of veterans receiving educational benefits from the Veterans Administration was 148 students, a decrease of 76 (33.9%) from the previous fall semester.

A total of 729 (6.2%) undergraduate students and 627 (40.1%) graduate students were married, 536 (39.5%) of these married students had dependents. An additional 269 (2.0%) students identified themselves as single students with dependents.

A total of 187 students identified themselves as being disabled with 36 as mobility-impaired.





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

## Distribution by Curriculum All Undergraduate Students Fall 1998






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# Combined Undergraduate and Graduate Minority Student Enrollment Fall 1998












Enrolled Freshmen New From Iowa H S Fall 1998




# Distribution by Size of H S Class Enrolled Freshmen New From High School





Enrolled Freshmen New From High School Fall 1998



### Distribution by Curriculum Enrolled Freshmen New From High School Fall 1998



### Part-Time Students New From High School Percent of Total Enrolled Freshmen New from High School Fall 1998



### Comparison of Applications to Enrolled Fall Terms 1983-98




### Comparison of Applications to Enrolled Fall Terms 1983-98





# Graduation Rate of Fulltime Students Total Class and Athletes




