#### PROFILE SUMMARY

#### SECTION I: TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FOR FALL 1999

The total enrollment of 13,553 students at UNI for the Fall 1999 semester was an increase of 224 (1.7%) from the previous year. Undergraduate enrollment increased 220 (1.9%) while graduate enrollment increased 4 (0.3%). Of all students enrolled, 82.8% were full-time; 10.8% of the undergraduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 12 semester hours); and 65.6% of the graduates had a part-time enrollment (less than 9 semester hours). Of all students registered, 58.4% were women. Undergraduates who had declared majors in the teaching curricula were 31.0% of all declared majors.

The most popular undergraduate declared majors were: Elementary Education (1,758), Accounting (665), Communication (647), Biology (614), Early Childhood Education (513), Management (485), Psychology (409), Finance (376), Marketing (373), Art (349), English (326), Management Information Systems (321), General Studies (319), Computer Science (253), Criminology (244), History (227), and Social Work (227).

The most popular graduate majors were: Business Administration-MBA (82), Special Education (81), Elementary Reading and Language Arts (59), Educational Technology (52), Counseling (52), Communication Studies (49), Principalship (47), Speech Pathology (43), and School Library Media Studies (41). Twenty (20) students were enrolled in the Doctor of Industrial Technology program and sixty-five (65) in the program leading to the Doctor of Education degree.

Of the 11,984 undergraduate students, 7,680 (64.1%) indicated an interest in Liberal Arts Curricula, 3,444 (28.7%) in the Teaching curricula, and 860 (7.2%) were undecided or unclassified.

A total of 12,630 (93.2% of all students) were lowa residents, 2,427 (17.9%) were from Black Hawk County, and 1,438 (10.6%) were from counties contiguous to Black Hawk.

The 309 foreign students enrolled included 159 (14.1% decrease) undergraduate students and 150 (11.9% increase) graduate students from 67 foreign countries.

Of the 13,553 students, 12,219 (90.2%) were white and 308 (2.3%) were Black. Hispanics, Asians, and American Indians represented 2.0% of the enrollment. Students with no ethnic response represented 3.2% of the enrollment.

The average age of undergraduates was 21.4 years (0.1% yr. decrease) and graduates was 33.8 years (.3 yr. decrease).

Total enrollment of veterans receiving educational benefits from the Veterans Administration was 177 students, an increase of 29 (19.6%) from the previous fall semester.

A total of 653 (5.4%) undergraduate students and 595 (37.9%) graduate students were married, 526 (42.1%) of these married students had dependents. An additional 238 (1.8%) students identified themselves as single students with dependents.

A total of 209 students identified themselves as being disabled with 30 as mobility-impaired.

Total residence hall occupancy was 4,479 students, a decrease of 25 (0.6%) from the previous year. About 34.6% of the female students (2,736) and 30.9% of the male students (1,743) reside in residence halls.

#### SECTION II: NEW STUDENTS ENTERING UNI FALL SEMESTER 1999

#### PART A: FRESHMEN DIRECT FROM HIGH SCHOOL

A total of 2177 students or 18.2% of the total undergraduate enrollment for Fall 1999 were new students direct from high school. New students direct from high school represented 17.2% of the undergraduate enrollment for Fall 1998.

Seventy-nine percent of the entering freshmen completed their applications for admission to UNI before January 31, 1999. This is 1% lower than the percent of enrolled students who had applied by the same date last year.

Of all the new undergraduates, 94.9% were lowa residents representing 95 of the 99 counties. Of all new freshmen lowa residents enrolled at UNI, 10.0% entered from Black Hawk County.

Of new freshmen, 62.8% graduated from high school classes of 200 or less, an increase of 1.3% from last fall, while 9.2% graduated from classes of more than 400 students, an increase of 2.7%.

A total of 91.5% of the students entered from the top one-half of their graduating classes (an increase of 0.1% from Fall 1998) and 60.2% entered from the top 30% (an increase of 0.9% from Fall 1998).

The mean ACT composite standard scores for entering freshmen decreased for Fall 1999 in comparison to Fall 1998, from 23.3 to 23.0. The median ACT decreased from 23.5 for Fall 1998 to 23.2 for Fall 1999. The percentage of students entering Fall 1999 with an ACT composite score of 21 or above decreased to 74.5%, down 3.0% in comparison with Fall 1998.

The table showing a combination of rank in class and ACT score for each individual entering student is helpful in comparing entering students. In comparison to last year, the number and percent of students entering with a rank in the top 10% and ACT of 27 or above fell slightly. The number of students in this category is 179 for Fall 1999, down 1 student and representing 8.8% of the total number of new entering freshmen. The percent of students in the comparable range last year was 9.4%. The range including those ranking in the top 30% who also have an ACT score of 24 or above has decreased slightly to 33.8% (down 0.5%). The range making up students ranking in the top 50% with an ACT of 21 and above fell to 68.5% (down 2.4%).

Of the new classified freshmen, 255 (12.1%) did not indicate a prospective academic major, a decrease of 0.5% from last year. Those selecting a Liberal or Vocational Arts program rose 0.3% from Fall 1998 to 61.3%, and those selecting a teaching major increased by 0.2% to 26.6%. The most frequently indicated majors (40 or more) were: Elementary Education (293), Accounting (170), Management (163), Psychology (111),

Biology (76), Marketing (69), Art (62), Computer Science (59), Finance (57), Music (44), and Criminology (40). In addition, 106 new freshmen indicated an interest in Pre-Professional curricula.

A total of 2147 (98.6%) of the entering freshmen were enrolled as full-time students (12 semester hours or more).

#### PART B: TRANSFERS FROM OTHER COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

A total of 1114 new students transferred from other colleges and universities. The number entering Fall 1999 is up 49 compared to Fall 1998. This number does not include unclassified students who may have attended other colleges before registering at UNI. Of the 1114 classified transfers, 790 (70.9%) were from lowa two-year colleges.

Of those transferring from Iowa two-year public colleges, over 58% entered from colleges sending 30 or more students. UNI's top feeder schools for Fall 1999 are as follows: Hawkeye Community College (164), North Iowa Area Community College (128), Kirkwood Community College (120), and Iowa Central Community College-Ft. Dodge (51).

Of the 196 who transferred from Iowa four-year colleges, 48.0% came from the University of Iowa and Iowa State University while 52.0% came from Iowa private four-year colleges. The percent entering from Iowa public colleges rose by 6.2%, while the percent entering from Iowa private colleges decreased by a like amount. The largest number entering from a four-year college came from the University of Iowa.

Both the number and percent of out-of-state transfers have decreased. Out-of-state transfers fell from 133 (12.5% of new transfers in Fall 1998) to 128 (11.5% of new transfers in Fall 1999).

#### PART C: NEW GRADUATE STUDENTS

Those students new to graduate study were 347 and represented an increase of 50 (16.8%) from the fall semester 1998. A total of 117 (33.7%) received their bachelor's degree from UNI, 95 (27.4%) from other lowa colleges and 103 (29.7%) from out-of-state or foreign universities. Of the 347 new graduate students, 241 (69.5%) were residents of lowa.


The most popular major areas for new graduate students were Principalship (35), Business Administration (29), English (17), Physical Education (17), Communication Studies (15), Postsecondary Education:Student Affairs (12), Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) (12), Speech Pathology (12), Psychology (12) Special Education (11), Education:Curriculum and Instruction (10), and Public Policy (10). There were 110 (31.7%) non-degree students.



## Distribution by Curriculum All Undergraduate Students Fall 1999








## Combined Undergraduate and Graduate Minority Student Enrollment Fall 1999







# UNI Residence Hall Occupancy Percentage of Total Enrollment in Hall Fall 1999











### Distribution By Percentile Rank


# Enrolled Freshmen New From High School Fall 1999







## Comparison of Applications to Enrolled Fall Terms 1984-99



# New Transfers Comparison of Applications to Enrolled Fall Terms 1984-99




## New Undergraduate Students for Fall 1965 through 1999




# Graduation Rate of Fulltime Students Total Class and Athletes


