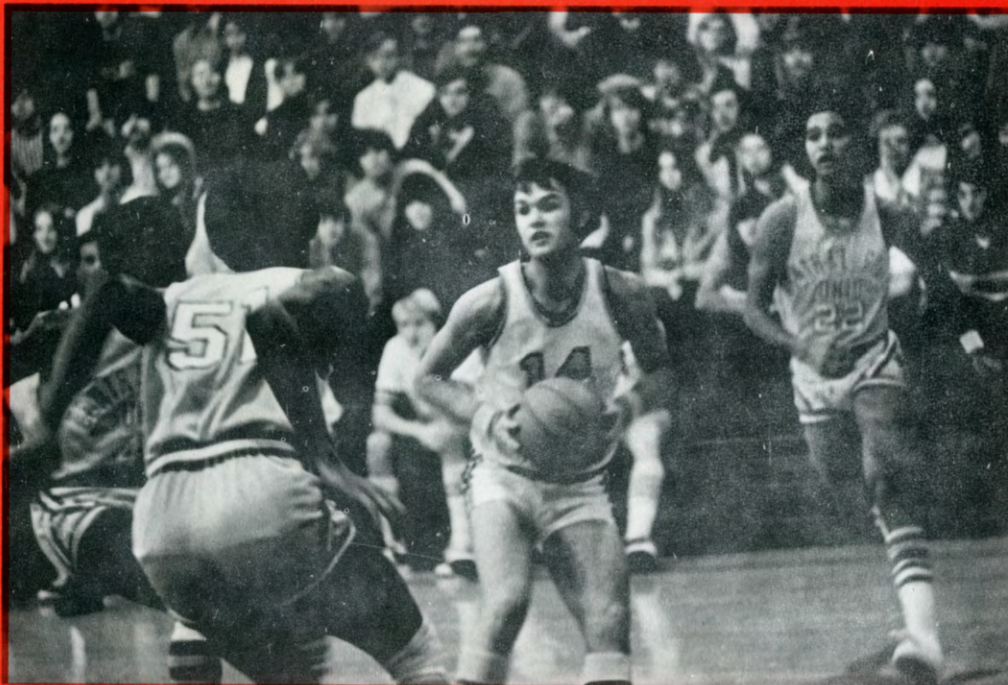

About Northern Iowa

Teacher education remains the chief function of the University of Northern Iowa, but in recent years academic programs have been enlarged to offer degrees in non-teaching fields.

In subsequent years following 1967, when the Iowa General Assembly approved university status for UNI, non-teaching degrees added have included the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Technology and Bachelor of Music.

New construction is evident throughout the campus. A new physical education complex opened in 1971, as did the first phase of a 278-unit married student housing development. A large, modern education center opened its doors in 1972 and shortly afterwards began on an addition to the library.

Perhaps the most exciting construction in the near future will be the multi-purpose Uni-Dome, a 12,000 seat coliseum that in addition to other functions will be the indoor home of Panther football. The fund

drive for the Uni-Dome has passed the three-quarters mark and ground breaking is hoped for by 1974.

UNI's prowess in teacher education has left its mark on the physical education department, which turns out per capita the largest number of coaches in the state.

Maintenance of a well-rounded intercollegiate athletic program of primary interest to the UNI staff. The success of this endeavor is indicated by the fact that Panther teams have won the conference's all-sports trophy in two of the last three years.

The University retains membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association, and is one of eight schools in the North Central Conference. A full round of 11 intercollegiate sports are sponsored by the conference, and have championship events. Other schools are Mankato State, Morningside, Augustana, South Dakota U., South Dakota State, North Dakota U. and North Dakota State.

The Outlook

A very young, inexperienced University of Northern Iowa basketball team, headed by a new coach—36 year-old Jim Berry—will face a difficult and strong cage schedule in 1973-74 but the rebuilding campaign for Panther basketball is strongly scented with the sweet smell of optimism.

"We are young—there are no seniors on the squad—with only one starter back from the 1972-73 squad," said coach Berry. A former All-American cager at Creighton University in the late 1950s, Berry joined the UNI staff this spring after compiling a 51-41 record at Loras College (Iowa) including three NAIA District playoff teams.

His only returning starter is junior guard Joe Ferguson who was the second leading scorer on the squad

A New Deal At Northern Iowa -- Jim Berry Heads It

The University of Northern Iowa has a new deal in 1973-74. Young, personable Jim Berry has taken over the reins of the Panthers and already he has made his presence felt even before the first game of the season. All Berry did in the short time since his selection in mid-March was to recruit one all-regional cager (6-1), one All-State selection (6-2) and two High School All-Americans (6-2, 6-9).

A Waterloo native, Berry graduated from West Waterloo and moved on to Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska where he earned two All-American honors in basketball during the late 50s. Following his graduation from Creighton in 1960, he remained to serve as the assistant coach and head baseball coach until 1962.

A two-year stint in the armed forces followed but he continued coaching, directing service basketball and baseball teams. His basketball squads chalked up a fine 41-11 mark in two years.

High school basketball was next for Berry and he made Waterloo Columbus High a powerhouse, winning or tying for city titles, ranking several squads among the state's top 10, and posting a 64-36 record over a five-year period.

His last stop before UNI was at Loras College where his Duhawk teams went 56-41, 50-26 over the last three seasons including three NAIA play-off teams.

An exciting player, an exciting coach, Berry is enthusiastic over the UNI program and its position in the North Central Conference. He plans to be a winner.

with a 13.5 average last season. Three other lettermen are available—6-0 junior guard Rick Nielson, 6-5 junior forward Jim Davis, and 6-6 sophomore forward Bill Runchey—but none have extensive playing experience behind them.

"How quickly they (the team) can pick up our system of offense and defense," continued the personable Berry, "could spell out how successful we are. If we can get by the first part of our schedule without getting too worried about the early-season scores, then we will be all right."

And that early schedule promises to be very tough with Central Missouri State, Western Illinois and Big 8 powers University of Kansas and University of Nebraska on the slate. All but the West-

ern Illinois contest are on the road. The Western Illinois contest is the second sandwiched between home opener Wisconsin State—Stevens Point and Westmar. The Panthers will also open the North Central Conference Holiday Tournament in Sioux Falls, S. D. in late December, facing NCC favorite University of North Dakota.

Perhaps a late but highly successful recruiting effort on Berry's part could make the task easier in the latter half of the season. No less than eight freshmen will be on the roster including some lofty front line help and some outstanding guard court potential. The list has high school All-Americans Jim Riggert (6-9) of Eldora and Bill Barnhouse (6-2) of Oskaloosa on it.

The Uni-Dome

Something for everyone. . . that's the tab. The proposed Uni-Dome for the University of Northern Iowa will be Iowa's 1st and only truly multi-purpose, domed coliseum. Construction of the \$4.5 million dollar structure is tentatively scheduled for spring 1974. It will seat 12-19,000 for football. A completely removable artificial gridiron turf can be rolled up in 45 minutes revealing a base surface for basketball games, track, etc. Community and business-oriented groups will be able to use the coliseum for sales meetings, conventions and related activities. Pop music concerts, theatrical productions, circuses, shows and commencement exercises are special possibilities for the Uni-Dome.

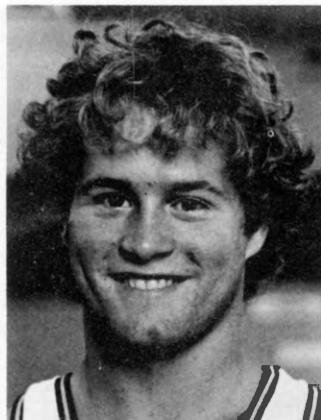

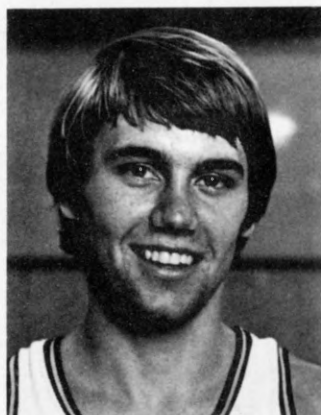
COSTIGAN

Not a big man by basketball standards, scrappy Dan still figures into the UNI basketball picture. Saw limited action with the varsity last season but averaged 11.7 points per game on the junior varsity. Good free throw shooter, hitting 82 per cent for JVs. A second team All-State selection in high school at Central Elkader in 1972, Dan averaged over 20 points per game during his three varsity seasons at Elkader.

Joe played exceptional in the NCC as well, winding up 12th in league scoring with a 14.2 average, 12th in field goal shooting at .283, and 8th in assists with 47. For the season, he had excellent marks of .504 from the floor and .744 from the charity stripe. 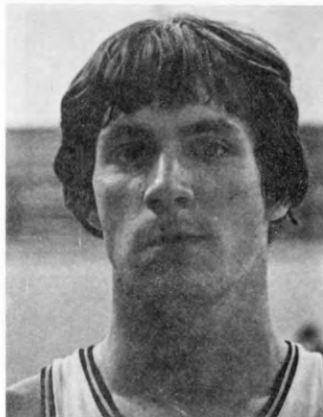

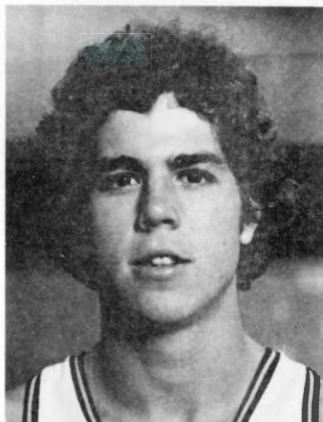

A history major, Dave is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Peterson of Estherville.

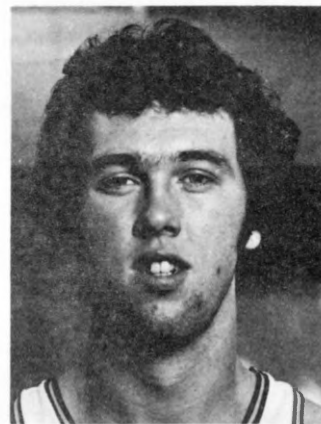

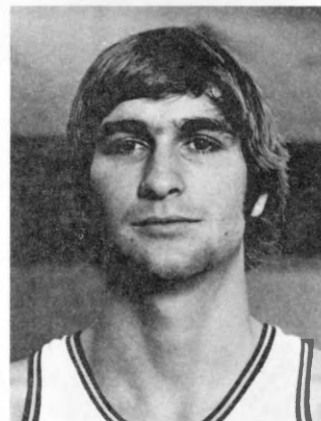
