Class Schedule Update

We are excited to have you join us here at UNI in just a few weeks! We know you are excited, too and may have some questions about your schedule and classes. Included below is an overview of how to read your schedule.

Although a few minor modifications may still be made, the schedule for fall semester is mostly complete. Review your classes at any time in your Student Center within the MyUNIverse portal. Three common delivery modes for fall classes are as follows:

- **In Person** - Traditional classes that meet face-to-face in a classroom. See below for what an in-person class will look like as posted in the List View of your class schedule. Notice that there is only one row of information about meeting time and location. This class meets three times each week in Sabin Hall.

- **Hybrid** - These classes include both in-person and online components. One example of a hybrid class is SCI ED 1300 (see below), which meets in person on Mondays from 8:00 - 9:50 am in Lang Hall 243. Students also participate in an online component of the course from 8:00 - 9:50 a.m. on Wednesdays and 9:00 - 9:50 a.m. on Fridays.

Students also participate in an asynchronous online (no specified meeting time) component for the remaining 75 minutes each week. No specific time is given for the asynchronous portion, but students are expected to continue making weekly progress based on guidance provided by their instructors.

- Online** - Classes that do not meet in a room, but might either be synchronous (convene online at a set time, such as by Zoom) or asynchronous (no set meeting time). Here are two examples of online courses as they appear on course schedules. The first example, HUM 1021, meets online on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 1:00 - 1:50 p.m. The instructor will provide instructions on how to meet.

Provides a general understanding of normal and disordered speech, language, and hearing in adults and children. Covers the normal development of communication behavior, the nature of communication disorders, and how speech and hearing pathology and audiology interact with allied fields (e.g., education, medicine, psychology, and special education). Incorporates the influence of cultural and linguistic diversity.
