Research Subject Sought

Faculty incorporating service learning in one or more courses (currently or in the past two semesters) are invited to participate in an IRB-approved study. All such instructors are eligible, regardless of discipline or rank. Participants will be interviewed for 60-75 minutes each and questions will be provided in advance. This study is one of the first of its kind and will investigate faculty perceptions of students' research skills in service-learning courses. Ultimately, the results will be published in a peer-reviewed journal to help librarians, faculty, and administrators understand implications for academic library/service-learning collaborations.
