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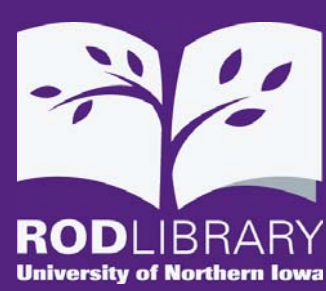

Enlarge images on your computer screen. View Web pages in different colors. Hear computer screen text spoken aloud. The Rod Library has added new assistive technologies and has created Assistive Technology Study Room 315.

Assistive Technology Study Room 315 offers:

- 55" color monitor with desktop computer
- ZoomText Screen Magnifier/Reader with Speech and ZoomText keyboard
- Transformer HD CCTV
- Webcam
- motorized, height-adjustable table.

The room is available for walk-in use or reservations through RodScheduler. Additional new assistive technologies include a 3M Joystick Ergonomic mouse and Evoluent Ergonomic mouse, available for in-Library checkout at the Library Services Desk.

Herb Hake Exhibit

The latest exhibit from the UNI Museum focuses on the life and art of Herb Hake, local television and radio personality and cartoon artist. Hake was known throughout Iowa for his focus on local history, and he would travel the state discussing various historical tidbits about many of Iowa's towns. This exhibit will focus on Hake's work as a pioneer in broadcasting and Iowa history education, including never-before exhibited works featuring local Cedar Falls personalities. In conjunction with the Cedar Falls Authors Festival, this exhibit aims to educate the public on the amazing local talent that has come from Cedar Falls and to continue Hake's work of celebrating local history through imagery and storytelling. The grand opening will take place at 4pm on Sunday, September 24th, in the UNI Museum. We will feature speakers who personally knew Hake to share their impressions of his life's work. This is free, open to the public, and refreshments will be served.
