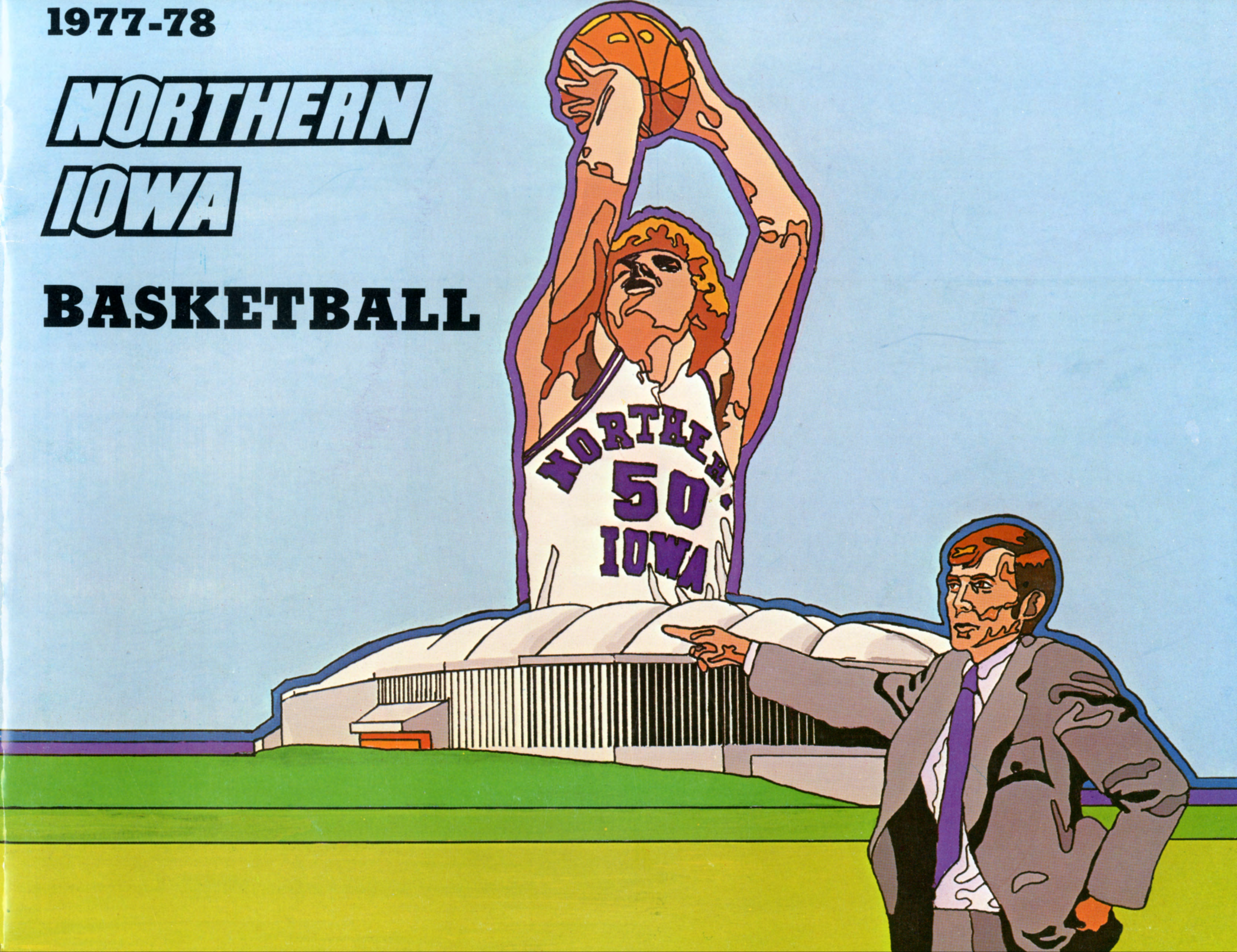

Coach Jim Berry

Head Coach Jim Berry

You can't keep a good man down because good things happen to good people.

Northern Iowa head coach Jim Berry heads into the 1977-78 season with the feeling good things will happen this year despite some mediocre performances that are behind him.

The personality, the smile, the enthusiasm abounds in the man who has had his share of licks but who has bounced back with more determination to become a winner. For Berry knows that hard work, concentration and discipline do pay off.

Born January 18, 1937 in Waverly, Ia., Berry attended West High School where he earned all-state and All-American cage honors. He participated in the High School East-West All-Star Game his senior year and was also active in football and baseball.

Berry became a two-time All-American cager in 1958 and 1959 at Creighton and graduated in 1960. He began his coaching career as Creighton's assistant basketball mentor after graduation. Berry also served as head baseball coach until 1962.

After two-years in the Army with Berry coached military teams posting a fine 41-11 record, he moved into the high school ranks. In five years at Waterloo Columbus, Berry directed several state-ranked squads and established a 64-36 record.

Moving on to Loras College in Dubuque, Berry coached the DuHawks to a 56-41 record over three seasons which included three NAIA playoff teams before coming to Northern Iowa in 1973.

Berry, who remains active in the Army as a major in the U.S. Army reserve, and his wife Mary Gene have three boys and a daughter — David, 17, was an all-state runningback at Columbus his junior year; Michael, 11 and Jeffrey 10 are his other sons and Kelly, 15 is the couples' daughter.



Assistant Coaches

Dan Breitbach



Dan Breitbach became UNI's first full-time cage assistant in history last year after serving in a graduate assistant's role the past two seasons.

The 27-year-old Breitbach starred for Berry at Loras three seasons and served as team captain his junior and senior years. He's also a member of Loras' 1,000-point club and graduated in 1972.

A Dubuque native, Breitbach attended Wahlert High and graduated in 1968 prior to attending Loras. He taught at Hempstead High in Dubuque, where he served as assistant basketball and head tennis coach before joining Berry's staff at UNI in 1973.

Besides his basketball interests, Breitbach is one of the state's best amateur tennis players and teaches the sport during summers. Born June 14, 1950, Breitbach earned his Master's Degree in physical education from UNI last spring.

He resides in Cedar Falls and is a bachelor.

Bill Runchy

Graduate Assistant



Assisting the Panthers this season while doing post-graduate work at Northern Iowa is Bill Runchy. Runchy, from West Bend, Ia., is a familiar face to Panther basketball in recent years. The former standout as a prep at West Bend High School was a three-year letter winner for Head Coach Jim Berry and finished his four-year stint at Northern Iowa by becoming the 25th all-time leading scorer with 605 points in three years of varsity play. Runchy, a 6-6 forward for the Panthers, was elected captain his senior year.

Northern Iowa — Experienced, Talented, Scrappy

An Outlook

Okay, wipe out 1976-77. Put it to rest, but cherish the thought that last year was a very educating one for a bunch of youngsters.

This season, it's a brand new ball game for the Northern Iowa Panthers.

This club does have a personality of its own and you can bet it will be different from last year. They have the talent back and the scrappiness returns but the thing that's most important is that the Panthers will be a much more experienced team this season.

Back are four seasoned starters that will be expected to carry much of the load this season along with an experienced bench and some very talented freshmen from the high school ranks.

"We should be a better team with the experience coming back," says Head Coach Jim Berry. "We must be insistent upon daily effort and concentration as we prepare for a tough season."

Northern Iowa starts the season 12 men strong and seven of them are either freshmen or sophomores. But with two seasoned seniors and three juniors who started every game for the Panthers last season, the future looks bright. "We have a very good nucleus back," says Berry. "I'd like to think of us as being eight deep with experience coming off the bench to help us."

Berry makes it clear to what the key to this season's team will be. "The key will be 6-10 center Mark Enright. If we can keep him healthy through the season he'll do the job I know he's capable of doing."

The story is so familiar among many teams and it happened to hit the Panthers last season. Enright was leading the team in both scoring (11.2 ave.) and rebounding (7.4) when he broke his right foot during a practice scrimmage. He was ruled out for the remainder of the season and opponents immediately took advantage of the loss of the presence of a big man in the middle.

"Mark is a good shooter and big and strong," says Berry. "We're looking for a good season from him."

The former Cedar Rapids Kennedy prep was hitting at a 47 per cent clip from the field (55 of 107) before he exited with his injury the first week in January.

But the foot has healed and it's a brand new season.

Northern Iowa will have size, bulk and average speed.

From that, Berry will have to take those ingredients and make the right mixture.

The final batter includes improvement on the boards and the right spot selection — something the Panthers lacked last season.

The potential on the boards is there. It must be brought to the front.

Berry will have something to look forward to this season he missed for the most part last year — a solid backup to Enright. Enter 6-8 freshman Bill Jones from Joliet, Ill. who may raise some eyebrows this season.

Along with Enright at 6-10, returns the most underrated forward in the North Central Conference last year, 6-7 Ron Lemons. The former Des Moines Lincoln star virtually took over where Enright left off and finished as the top scorer (15.8 ave.) and leading rebounder (15.8) for the Panthers. "Ron will undoubtedly be one of the top forwards in the league and possibly one of the best ever at Northern Iowa," says Berry. There's Steve Peters (6-7), Mike Clark (6-5), crowd-pleasing Phil Rilett (6-6), Mark Weber (6-5) and newcomer Tony Hauptert (6-7) to battle it out for the other forward spot. Peters can play either inside or out as proved last year and has to be given the edge for that spot.

The backcourt is steady — maybe the best pair in the NCC. Back are juniors Mark Long (5-10) and Mike Kemp (6-2). Long never gave up — whether it was on defense or just chasing a loose ball — he always gave 110 per cent. Kemp is hot, super quick but is a proven college guard who has the confidence a ball club always needs. But watch out for freshmen all-stater Randy Richards (6-2) and highly touted Rod Underwood (6-2) to make some waves.

Leadership

Leadership at the outset is a plus. The coaches and players know where to look at the start. It's defined from the start. It's Long, Lemons and Enright. And it's established on performance. All three were brilliant in their performances last season. They've earned their spurs.

There's also another plus that is no fallacy. The Panthers possess a winning magic when they play at home in the UNI-Dome. The record speaks for itself — 12 victories out of 14 starts since the UNI-Dome was opened in mid-February of 1976. UNI was 7-5 at home last year but three of those came in the old men's gym because of heating problems in the UNI-Dome.

The North Central

Defending champion North Dakota was good last year and could be even better this season. Sure, Mankato State has departed but it has been replaced by another strong Division II basketball power in Nebraska-Omaha. Late surging Augustana returns four starters while North

Dakota State has only two starters coming back. "The Sioux are loaded," says Berry. "They've practically got everyone back from last year's post-tournament team."

South Dakota and Morningside return the bulk of their 1976-77 squads while South Dakota will also be considered improved with excellent returning material and a top-flight recruiting year.

"Don't count us out," says Berry. "We plan to be tough all the way though and make it an exciting race. We'll certainly be competitive."

The Final Word

Northern Iowa has some things going for it . . . experience, enthusiasm and that same youthful scrappiness displayed through much of last season.

"I'm excited about this team and I feel the team is rarin' to go," says Berry. "We've got a tough schedule so the team will need the support more than anything this season."

There is experience here and there is a tremendous feeling to prove something.

Yes, look for the 1977-78 Northern Iowa Panthers to be reckoned with because there's a new ball club in town!

Home, Sweet Home In the UNI-Dome

Northern Iowa has the most attractive home basketball schedule in the history of the school.

That's a pretty powerful statement to make but consider the facts:

— Illinois State, a perennial power in Division I, comes to the UNI-Dome in February with four returning starters back including All-American candidate forward Billy Lewis.

— A new opponent Northern Iowa has never played in Division II power Missouri-St. Louis makes its first visit.

— North Central Conference foes Nebraska-Omaha, North Dakota and Augustana make the Panther home schedule even more demanding.

— Plus, tipoffs with Youngstown St. and Western Illinois — two schools who are charter members of the newly formed Mid-Continent Athletic Association.

Challenging, demanding and exciting can best sum up the 1977-78 Northern Iowa home basketball schedule.

"It's a tough schedule for us but an exciting one for the fans," says UNI head coach Jim Berry. "You must play tough competition for your team to grow and improve throughout the season."

There's also another plus that is no falacy. The Panthers possess a winning magic when they play at home in the beautiful UNI-Dome. The record speaks for itself — 12 victories out of 14 starts in the UNI-Dome since the spacious coliseum was opened in mid-February of 1976. UNI was 7-5 at home last year but three of the losses came in the old men's gymnasium because of heating problems in the Dome.

Northern Iowa's road slate is equally tough highlighted by a December 14 meeting with tough Valley member Wichita State. Another big road test will be the Dec. 1 game at Western Michigan.

The Panthers will make their annual, and last, appearance in the North Central Conference Holiday Tournament in Sioux Falls, S.D. Dec. 28-30.

Nothing comes easy in basketball. For that reason, it's tough to single out any one game as more important than another.

Stan Sheriff, Athletic Director



Collegiate athletics are undergoing some major changes and even more are on the horizon.

The man that must cope with these changes while heading a very potent 11-sport intercollegiate athletic program at the University of Northern Iowa is Stan B. Sheriff.

Sheriff is not only the Panther Athletic Director but also recently completed his 18th season as head football coach. The 45-year-old Sheriff has already reached two pinnacles in Panther grid history by becoming the winningest coach and becoming the first Panther mentor to reach in the century mark in career victories.

Under Sheriff's direction Northern Iowa has won the North Central Conference All-Sports title four consecutive years, stressing a well-balanced philosophy of athletics.

An even more challenge looms in the future with Northern Iowa entering the newly formed Mid-Continent Athletic Association which begins league play with the 1978-79 season.

Born April 24, 1932 in Honolulu, Hawaii, his family later moved to San Francisco, where he earned all-state football honors at George Washington High School.

He went on to earn all-conference honors as a center and linebacker three straight years at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo and received All-American recognition as a center in 1953. He became one of the first college division

players ever to participate in the Annual East-West Shrine All-Star Game and the Hula Bowl.

The Los Angeles Rams drafted him as a linebacker in 1954 and he also played with Pittsburgh, San Francisco and Cleveland, before retiring in 1958.

From 1955-56 Sheriff served in the U.S. Army and planted his first seeds as a coach. As a recreation director, he coached the 4th Infantry Division to the European football title in 1955.

In 1958 he received his M.A. in Physical Education from Cal Poly and came to UNI as assistant line coach for Head Coach Bill Hammer at then Iowa State Teachers College. Sheriff served in this capacity for two years and became head coach in 1960.

His first Panther team recorded an impressive 9-0 regular season, finally losing 17-6 to Hillsdale College in the Mineral Water Bowl. This marked the first time in school history the Panthers had been invited to participate in a bowl contest.

After 17 seasons, his football record stands at 99 wins, 66 losses and 3 ties. This season the Panthers were 8-3-0, finishing third in the North Central Conference with a 4-2 mark.

Sheriff-coached teams won the North Central title outright in 1960 and shared the crown in 1961, 1962 and 1964. In 1964, UNI captured the Pecan Bowl, 19-17 over Lamar Tech in Abilene, Tex.

Eleven All-Americans have played for Sheriff and 60 times his players have been named to All-North Central Conference teams.

Sheriff holds positions on the NCAA Football Rules Committee, the American Football Coaches Public Relations Committee and is a regional member of both the NCAA Football and Baseball Post-Season Selection Committees.

A busy man interested in making UNI a greater university, Stan Sheriff is constantly on the move promoting Panther athletics.

Stan and his wife, Jane, have three sons: Paul, Michael and Richard.



R. C. Johnson, Assistant Director of Athletics

A personality that personifies the spirit and enthusiasm of Northern Iowa intercollegiate athletics is R. C. Johnson. Johnson is in his fourth year at UNI as Assistant A.D. and handles the chores of Athletic Business Manager and Athletic Ticket Manager for the Panthers. Johnson was offensive line coach at Mankato State (1968-74); offensive coordinator at Youngstown State (1967); graduate assistant at UNI (1966-67); student assistant at the University of Iowa (1964-65.) Johnson, who is also a strong force in the UNI Athletic Club, received his B.A. in Education from Iowa in 1965 and his Masters Degree from Northern Iowa in 1976. He and his wife, Reenie, are the parents of a young son, Jeff.

UNI supporters and the entire state of Iowa realized a dream come true with the completion of the UNI-Dome — a completely covered, multi-purpose facility with an air-supported roof — in February of 1975.

UNI-Dome, the prefix stands for University of Northern Iowa, as well as meaning one and unique, combines the features of three buildings — a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. It will host such events as concerts, exhibitions, trade shows, pageants, rallies and conocations, as well as football, basketball, softball and field hockey games and wrestling and track meets.

The UNI-Dome's air-supported, Fiberglass fabric roof constructed by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corporation, was erected at a cost equal to half that of conventional roof construction. And because of the dome's translucence, ample natural light is available during daylight hours — a sizable savings on utility costs.

Multi-Purpose Use

UNI-Dome was designed with "something for everyone." Its artificial turf for football games and practices can be rolled up in 45 minutes. Underneath, on a synthetic floor area, are basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track. As many as 12 tennis matches and two basketball games can take place simultaneously at the field level.

Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football and 7,254 for court-sized activities. For stage activities, such as commencement, concerts and artist or speaker series, total capacity — using movable bleachers and folding chairs — can reach 25,000.

The UNI-Dome — A Unique Coliseum

Air-Supported Dome

The 168,000-sq. ft. dome, which rises 124 feet above the arena floor, is supported entirely by a network of 12 stranded steel cables and four air blowers. A concrete and steel ring around the top of the 70-foot high stadium wall holds the cables.

The cables, which shape, as well as support the dome, are 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ inches in diameter. They vary in length from 395 to 484 feet, and together weigh 47 tons, or 94,000 pounds.

Two 40,000 cfm (15 hp) fans circulate air and maintain enough air pressure in the building to keep the roof inflated during normal use. Two additional 135,000 cfm (125 hp) fans, are used during inflation of the roof, during mass exiting from the building (which causes great loss of air pressure), during heavy snow fall for aid in melting snow on the roof, and during spectator events for heating and cooling the building.

Fiberglass Fabric Roof

The roof of UNI-Dome is made of 49 tons of woven Fiberglass fabric coated with Teflon. The fabric is self-cleaning and requires virtually no maintenance. It will not burn or support combustion, nor is it affected by ultra-violet radiation.

Approximately 60 percent of the dome has an inner liner of fabric that provides acoustical as well as thermal benefits. The liner tends to baffle the sound waves, and air from perimeter, where the pressure is greater than outside the building, can be diverted and blown between the two layers to facilitate snow melting.

Other Features

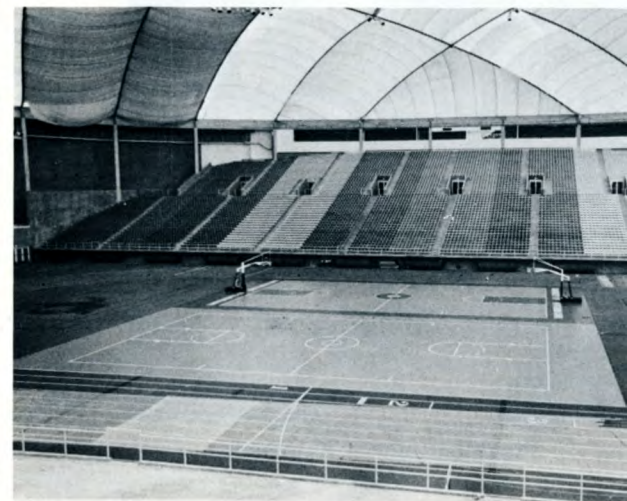
UNI-Dome has four main entrances, leading to a 32-foot wide concourse. Seats, color-matched to tickets, are easily reached through seven access gates on the east and west sides. A total absence of columns and posts give every seat in the stadium an unobstructed view.

A service entrance, large enough for a tractor-trailer, is located on one end of the stadium. Concessions, displays, first aid stations and rest rooms are conveniently located on either side of the building.

A spacious press box atop the east stands has facilities for 10 radio stations, television capabilities and seating for up to 125 people. A photography darkroom, photo bay, concession area and scouting booths are a few other features.

Two huge scoreboards can flash messages and information to spectators throughout the events.

Plans call for the addition of handball courts, administrative offices, wrestling rooms, locker and training rooms and VIP boxes. Currently a tunnel connects UNI-Dome with the Physical Education Center for locker facilities.

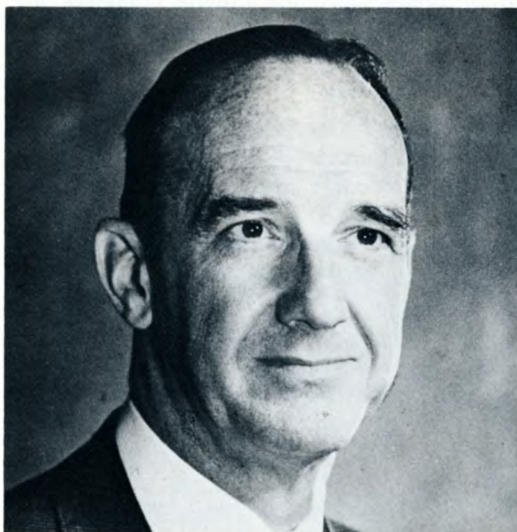


University of Northern Iowa

The University of Northern Iowa, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher learning, is the outgrowth of the Iowa State Normal School established by the General Assembly in 1876. On September 6 of that year 27 students under four instructors began classes in a renovated home for Civil War orphans. This building, later named Central Hall, was destroyed by fire in July, 1965.

From a single building on a 40-acre campus, the University has grown to include over 40 major buildings, a 721-acre campus, over 500 faculty members and over 9,300 on-campus students. Of the 10,181 enrolled for university credit in the fall of 1975, 9,358 were on-campus and 823 were through extension and correspondence. The University also maintains a laboratory school for some 700 students in pre-school through 12th grade.

During the first 27 years, the school issued teaching certificates requiring 12 weeks to two years of training. In 1903 a four-year curriculum based on high school graduation and leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts in Education was authorized.

In 1909 the institution was renamed the Iowa State Teachers College and the government of the College, along with that of the University of Iowa and Iowa State University, was vested in the State Board of Regents, a nine-member body appointed by the Governor. Under the new name, the College attained a reputation as one of the nation's outstanding institutions for preparation of teachers.

On July 5, 1961, the Iowa General Assembly on recommendation of the Regents changed the name of the school to State College of Iowa and redefined its function to include the offering of liberal arts degrees.

On July 1, 1967, the General Assembly on recommendation of the Regents approved University status. The name was changed to University of Northern Iowa and its function was again redefined.

Although teacher education remains its largest program, the University offers degrees to students majoring in a wide variety of subjects. Thus UNI has two Bachelor of Arts degrees, one with certification to teach and one without certification. Also, a Bachelor of Technology degree can be earned with or without certification to teach, and since 1969, the Bachelor of Music degree has been offered. A Bachelor of Fine Arts degree was approved by the Regents in 1976. An Individual Studies major enables a student to pursue, with faculty approval, a wide assortment of study areas.

On the graduate level, courses leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Education were offered for the first time in the summer of 1952 and a sixth-year program leading to the Specialist in Education degree began in 1960. A sixth-year Specialist degree with a program in science education was inaugurated in 1970.

In 1964, the Master of Arts degree was approved by the Regents. The first Master of Arts degrees were granted in 1966. The Master of Business Administration degree was approved by the Regents in 1975, and the Master of Music degree in 1976.

The Industrial Technology Center on the South campus opened on August, 1975, while the UNI-Dome, a multi-purpose coliseum on the west campus, opened in February, 1976. Ground was broken in October, 1975, for the Speech/Art complex located southwest of Russell Hall, with completion anticipated in the summer of 1977.
