Welcome Back to the 1993-94 School Year

We will be ready for school to open on August 24. We may look a little different, classes may be in different locations, and as always there will be some new faces, but Price Laboratory School and the PLS faculty, staff and administrators will be ready to greet each student as they come through the door on the first day of school. You are aware of the field house fire that has necessitated some changes in programs and class locations. You will also see other changes that were planned to improve and expand the PLS educational program. This issue of the PLS newsletter will describe some of the changes you will see in the 1993-1994 school year.

The field house and the status of our physical education and athletic programs have been a topmost priority this summer. The processes necessary to replace the field house are underway. As we wind our way through those processes, we will keep you up-to-date on our progress. The support shown by PLS parents and students, the UNI community, and the PLS community sustained us during those difficult weeks in June. We thank you for your thoughtfulness and wonderful gestures since June 8, and we guarantee you that PLS parents and students will be involved as we move closer to replacing the field house. As we prepare this issue of the Newsletter, we do not yet know if the pool or locker rooms will be accessible. Decisions are pending regarding the safety of the fire wall, the air well, and the upstairs hall. As we receive information, we will quickly pass it on to you.

Elementary physical education will continue to be held daily. Activity classes will be held in classrooms and the cafeteria. We do not have a final decision at this time as to whether or not we will be able to use the pool and locker rooms. If these facilities are not available, other activities will be substituted on what would have been swimming day. As soon as the pool and locker rooms are available, we will resume the swimming program.

Middle school students will be transported to another UNI location for their physical education activity classes. Each middle school student will have two six-week sessions of physical education. Each physical education "period" will consist of two hours, which allows for transportation to the physical education site, time to change clothes for activity, an adequate period of time for physical education instruction, and time to change back into street clothes and transportation back to PLS by 3:00 p.m. This schedule will allow us to offer eight exploratory classes to middle school students. Each

exploratory will consist of one period (about 50 minutes) for a six-week session. Your middle school students will receive a complete schedule the first week of school.

All seniors will take Wellness this year. This arrangement will allow seniors to have outdoor activity during, at a minimum, the nice days of the fall and spring. If the pool is available, there may be an aquatics component. The bulk of the Wellness class is classroom instruction in a variety of topics related to health and personal wellness.

Decisions about the physical education and health program for freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will not be finalized until we receive the engineer's report regarding the pool and locker room. By registration time, we will have made arrangements for the physical education and health classes for grades nine, ten, and eleven.

Arrangements are being made to accommodate our athletic programs. We are hopeful that we will be able to find the space and appropriate times for practices for all of our athletic teams. There may be some need to practice at times different from those used with our field house. Prime practice time for UNI teams and our teams obviously overlaps, so accommodations and compromises will be necessary in order to meet the needs of all our sports teams.

It has been a challenging summer. We have, I am proud to say, risen to the occasion and met each challenge with a problem-solving, determined attitude. As a community, we can and will continue to meet each future challenge with flexibility and a positive outlook. Working together toward a common goal strengthens us.

Registration Days

We will be registering students and collecting fees on Wednesday, August 4 from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. and Thursday, August 5 from 2:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Please fill out the enclosed forms prior to bringing them to school during the designated hours on one of the two registration days. We cannot register students early. If you absolutely are unable to come on the 4th or 5th, please register as soon after that date as possible. All registrations must be completed prior to August 24, 1993. School pictures will be taken for Grades 6-12 ONLY on Registration Days. Elementary pictures and secondary make-ups are scheduled for September 22.

New Faculty Roles Next Year

Mary Beth Kuezy taught in the high school social studies program last year. For next year, she will teach sixth and seventh grade social studies.

Cheryl Timion, Kate Mix, Mary Schneider, and Denise Tallakson will comprise the Unit II team with responsibilities for the multi-aged first and second grade program. In addition, they will assume responsibility for courses in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction.

Nick Toig will teach driver education courses, develop the work experience component of our resource program, serve as safety director, and supervise student teachers in the metro area.

Victoria Robinson will serve as secondary principal. She will administer and supervise all aspects of the middle school and high school programs.

Merrie Schroeder will assist Victoria Robinson as middle school coordinator. She will support middle school teaching teams as they develop model curriculum and coordinate the sixth graders' transition into the middle school.

High School and Middle School Advisor-Advisee Program

Discussions this year among PLS faculty, administrators and parents resulted in clarification of expectations of advisors and parents and a new perspective on how to better meet those expectations during parent-advisor-student conferences.

To better achieve the purposes of conferences and support the needs of our middle school students, two changes have been made. First, middle school students will have middle school teachers as their advisors; sixth graders will have sixth grade teachers, seventh graders will have seventh grade teachers and eighth graders will have eighth grade teachers as advisors. Their advisors will change each year as they move from grade to grade. In this way, the same grade teacher will be involved with the student's instruction and will be well-acquainted with curriculum and the student's progress. In order to match middle school students and teachers, it was necessary to change some high school students' advisors. We regret that any advisor change was necessary, but we are confident that high school students and their new advisors will soon adjust to the arrangement.

The second change is the addition of before-school conferences for middle and high school parents, advisors, and students. Before-school conferences have proven to be an excellent vehicle for communication in the elementary grades. Extending this through the middle and high school will provide for earlier communication among parents, advisors and students; give all participants an opportunity to clarify questions and concerns before we are too far into the school year; and establish roles among parents, students and advisors. During registration on August 4 and 5, parents of middle and high school students will be asked to sign-up for a conference time with advisors.

Emergency Information

Two forms of medical/emergency information are included with this mailing. Both need to be filled out and on file for every student at PLS. The Physical Exam side is to be completed by a physician in the case of all new students, all students participating in athletics, and all students entering grades Nursery-Kindergarten, Grade 7 and Grade 10. The Insurance Coverage section is to be filled out for every student. The Athletic Information section is for all students, Grades 7 through 12 - who are participating in athletics. The Emergency Information sheet (packet) will be on file in all administrative offices, the Health Office and will follow the student on all field excursions or athletic trips. Please press firmly in order that the entire carbon pack will print. All forms must be filled out and turned in before current fees are paid and registration considered complete!

1993-1994 School Fees

As you prepare for registration on August 4 and 5, we want you to be aware of changes in our fee structure necessitated by reductions in the PLS allocation. The chart below titled "School Fees, 1993-1994" shows expected fees for each grade. There are additional costs for optional services.

The fees you pay are allocated 100% to support student services, materials, supplies, and activities transportation. We depend entirely on student fees to purchase textbooks, provide field trips, purchase consumable student materials, and supplement classroom materials (e.g., software). If we do not receive expected fees, we cannot provide students the materials, supplies and opportunities the PLS community has come to expect. We understand that some families, particularly those with more than one student, may have difficulty meeting the fee obligation on August 4 and 5. If this is the case, we ask that parents speak with Dr. Nielsen or Mrs. Robinson before registration to make arrangements for a payment schedule. Complete payment must be made at the time of registration unless prior arrangements have been made with Mrs. Robinson or Dr. Nielsen. If there are past due fees on a fee schedule has not been determined, students will not be registered. We regret that we must make such a firm line with our payment policy, but we are unable to meet the financial obligations of our instructional program if student fees are not received.

Lunch Tickets

Your advance purchase of lunches or breakfasts will be entered into the computer program. As your student uses meals, they will be charged against the family's balance in the computer system. Please send payments monthly. You may purchase any amount you wish.

Student meal prices:

Breakfast: per meal - \$1.75

Lunch: per meal - \$1.25

Free and reduced-price meal applications which were approved last year will be honored during the first two weeks of the school year, but new applications must be filed if one is to continue to receive free or reduced meals. Applications are included with your summer packet.

Breakfast Program

This year we are continuing our breakfast program for PLS elementary and secondary students which will be served in the cafeteria area between 7:30 and 8:20 a.m. The cost will be 75 cents per meal.

Athletic Season Tickets

Regular admission for all athletic events, except football, is \$1.50 for students and \$2.50 for adults. Football admission is \$2.00 for students and \$3.00 for adults. A season ticket provides admission to all regularly scheduled football, basketball, swimming, and volleyball events held at home. The season ticket price is approximately 50% of the total regular cost of these events.

Insurance Forms

The school has purchased catastrophic insurance on all students that provides coverage in all school-related activities. This insurance has been arranged through the Iowa High School Athletic Association. It does not replace the need for school or family health insurance; it only supplements such coverage. This insurance goes into effect after the first \$25,000 in medical expenses (in one year) related to a school accident has been covered by the individual or another insurance company. Information on medical insurance that may be purchased has been included with this mailing.

Elementary News

• Nursery-Kindergarten

For nursery/kindergarten children, August 24-26 will be devoted to Parent-Teacher conferences. We ask that parents of children in the nursery/kindergarten program sign up for a conference during registration days August 4-5. Parents of students entering the PLS nursery or kindergarten classes for the first time should bring to the conference the completed physical and immunization forms, the questionnaire about the child, and a copy of the child's birth certificate if it was not available at the Round-Up or the time of preregistration. One-hour "mini-classes" will be held Friday, August 27. The time each child will attend mini classes will be scheduled at the conference on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday. The first full day of classes for all nursery/kindergarten children will be Monday, August 30, 1993.

• First Week's School Hours

For children in grades 1-5, the 1993-94 school year will begin on Tuesday, August 24, 1993. On the first two days of school, students will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m. There will be no afternoon classes for K-12 students because of parent conferences.

Normal school hours for the elementary school are 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. For children in grades 1-3, lunch will be scheduled from 11:10 to 11:30 a.m. and recess from 11:30-11:50 a.m. For children in grades 4-5, recess will be from 11:30 to 11:50 a.m. and lunch from 11:50 a.m. to 12:10 p.m.

Students should arrive at school between 8:20 and 8:30 a.m. If they arrive prior to that time, they should go to the cafeteria area which will be supervised.

• Change of Address

We need to be notified immediately of any change of address or telephone number.

• Parent Conferences

We will start the school year with parent conferences. Classes will be held in the morning only (8:30-11:30 a.m.) during the first two days of school. In order to schedule times for parent conferences, we ask that parents sign up for a conference when registering their children on August 4-5.

• Safety Patrol

The school Safety Patrol will operate at three points of traffic: 1) 19th and Summit; 2) 19th and Campus; and 3) 20th and Campus. Please instruct your children to cross streets at these points as they come to school. Patrol students will be on duty from 8:15-8:30 a.m. before school and 3:00-3:15 p.m. after school.

• Parking

For safety reasons, please do not park on Campus Street in front of the school. Parents who wish to pick up or drop off students at school are asked to use the drop-off lane at the south end of the building near the primary playground. There are also a limited number of visitor parking spaces available in the "B" lot adjacent to the drop-off lane south of the building.

• Absences

When your child is going to be absent from school for any reason, we ask that you please contact Dody Olson, school nurse, at 273-2348 between 8:00 and 9:30 a.m. This procedure gives the school a check on students who are absent from school without parental knowledge. If the school has not been informed, the nurse will contact the parent either at home or place of employment to verify absence.

• Class Lists

Elementary class lists will be posted in the main school lobby on registration days August 4-5, 1993.

Secondary News

• Classes Begin

Northern University Middle and High School will begin classes on Tuesday, August 24 at 8:00 a.m. in the Butzler Auditorium. At that time, students will be given instructions and report to their homerooms where they will be given their individual class schedules. Following the homeroom meetings, an abbreviated morning schedule will be in effect. School will be dismissed at 11:32 August 24, and 25. Advisers will meet with parents and advisees during these two afternoons.

• Middle School Orientation

All middle school students are invited to attend an orientation starting at 3:00 p.m. on Monday, August 23. We will meet in the auditorium where you will receive your schedule and information about classes and activities. Following the meeting, students will tour the building to find where their classes will be held. Please plan to attend!

• Lockers

Students are to use the locker assigned to them. Locks are not provided by the school and it is expected that the student will have a secure lock with them the first day of classes and keep that lock on their locker and locked at all times. Preferably, they should be high quality combination padlocks, but key locks are acceptable. Should keys be lost or forgotten, however, it may be necessary to cut keyed padlocks off student lockers.

• Absences

We ask that parents call the Attendance Office (273-2185) between 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. when your student is unable to attend classes. This procedure gives the school a check on students who may be absent from school without parental knowledge, and it alerts the nurse to situations where the student has been seriously ill, thus allowing an opportunity to adjust the academic expectations for that student. We do need to be informed daily if the student is absent more than one day. Please note: We will attempt to contact a parent either at home or place of employment if a call is not received.

• Parking Permits

A permit is required of any student who parks a motor vehicle in the Laboratory School lots. Permits for additional vehicles may also be obtained by purchasing the "Car Pool" plan. The charge is \$16.00 plus \$2.75 for each car in the pool. This policy is a University policy and will be enforced by University Public Safety Officers. Permits are available at the Public Safety Office in Gilchrist Hall.

• School Pictures

Pictures will be taken on Registration Days, August 4 and 5 for all students in Grades 6 through 12. Seniors do not need to have theirs taken unless they wish to obtain a student identification card. All other students need to be photographed for the yearbook and parents have the option of purchasing or not. However, if the student is photographed as YEARBOOK ONLY, pictures may not be purchased from that sitting. Payments must be made at the time the student is photographed and checks need to be made out to Litchbach Studios.

Pictures re-takes and make-up day will be September 27. The final re-take and make-up day will be October 27.

• Physicals

Physical examinations are required for all students entering Grade 7 and 10 and for all new students. Athletic physicals meet this requirement. If a student wishes to participate in athletics, physicals are required each year and a student will not be allowed to begin practice until a physical form is on file in the nurse's office. Immunization records are required of new students also.

• Handbook

All elementary/secondary students will receive a handbook in which school related information and school procedures may be found. Everything from reporting an absence, to study hall procedures, to weather emergencies is covered. Please review this information with your student. It is provided in the spirit of being informative so that the school experience for both you and your child can be as trouble free and productive as possible.

• Summer Office Hours

The office is generally open from 7:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. However, because of vacations the office may not be covered at all times. If you plan in step in, please call ahead to see that someone is in the office.

• Bus Transportation

Free bus transportation is provided to Laboratory School students under two types of arrangements. Rural Cedar Falls student (K-12 only) may ride the Cedar Falls Community School bus without charge. Cedar Falls students who reside within the city, but are a great distance from school or located in a hazardous pedestrian area, may wish to purchase monthly bus transportation passes. Such passes are sold on a "space available" basis, and require children to walk to and from the most convenient pick-up point near their home. Information about these passes is available from Clair Brooks, Personnel Director for the Cedar Falls Community School District, (277-8300).

Cedar Falls Community School bus transportation for rural students will be available on August 24. Transportation for non-rural Cedar Falls students who purchase monthly passes will begin as well on August 24.

• Student Records

Cumulative student records may be examined by parent on request. Appointments for that purpose may be made by calling the Guidance Office at 273-2370.

"Just Say Yes" to Parents and Teachers In Partnership (PTP)

The 1993-1994 school year will be a year of adjustment for all of us as we make the changes that are necessary as a result of the tragic fire. It also can be a year in which we show tremendous support for our school. I challenge you to choose membership in PTP as one part of your plan to support our school. Our goal is to have 100 percent of parents and teachers join PTP this year. For your convenience, a membership form and envelope are included in this mailing.

PTP's primary fundraiser this year will be the annual carnival. Mark your calendar for Saturday, October 16 from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the school. Plan to come for a continental breakfast, participation in a variety of games, bid on great items at the silent auction, and stay for lunch. Also, "just say yes" when you are called to help with the carnival. Or better yet, "just call us" to volunteer! Let's work together this year to have another record-breaking carnival. Last year's carnival netted a record \$5,458. As a result, PTP purchased a camera for PE classrooms and sports teams (\$2,000), audio-visual equipment for general school use (\$870), a laser disc for Technology Education (\$800), sand bags for the fly system for Drama (\$400), a computer workstation for Fourth Grade (\$348), and three Senior Scholarships (\$300).

A new PTP project this year involves the Campbell's Labels for Education Program. The poster that is included in this mailing identifies the 1,000+ products and the prices of purchase which will help us earn free equipment for our school. Please make copies of this poster to give to your friends and relatives before you hang it on your refrigerator as a reminder to participate!

Volunteers play a vital role in school activities. Therefore, a volunteer form is included in this mailing.

Proposed PTP Bylaw changes also are included in this mailing. PTP members will vote on the changes during the Fall PTP meeting which will be held on Tuesday, September 21 at 7:00 p.m. in the Auditorium (Elementary and Secondary Open Houses will follow the meeting). Also, we anticipate that a motion (or additional Bylaw changes) will be forthcoming from the floor concerning whether PTP will provide some funding for future post-prom parties. PTP members please exercise your right to vote on these Bylaw changes.
