# Gunning For Another Title

It is a solid team that Head Coach Chuck Patten sends into his 15th season.

"I feel we're a better team than last year," says the Panther mentor. "We have some pretty good talent coming back particularly in the upper and lower weights."

That's a pretty hefty statement to make considering the Panthers rolled to the 1978 NCAA Division II Championships last March in the UNI-Dome. It was the second national championship for Patten and his Panthers after capturing the prestigious crown in 1975. "Like every season, our goal at the beginning is to do well in the dual meets then peak at the conference and NCAA Division II championships," says Patten.

Patten and his squad achieved both of those goals last season when his team captured their final and fifth straight North Central Conference championship and the NCAA title.

All indications are that this year's squad has all the ingredients to make a run at the NCAA Division II crown again and the very first Mid-Continent Conference championship. "Yes, we lost three-time national champion Gary Bentrism plus Dick Briggs and Bruce McClure but we wrestled most of last season without those people," said Patten. "We have some excellent talent coming back plus we have people who we feel will do an excellent job filling in the graduated spots."

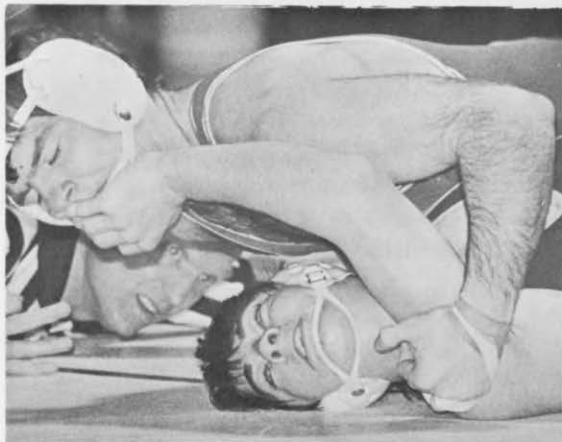
Patten has a solid nucleus returning with six All-Americans returning including two national champions who helped the Panthers roll to a 12-4 dual meet season last year.

Gone is All-American Dick Briggs (3rd) at 150 pounds and 134 pounder Bruce McClure who was a fourth place finisher in the Division II finals two years ago in the UNI-Dome.

Back to defend his 190-pound title and the top new-comer in Division II is sophomore **Kirk Myers**. Myers, a highly recruited prep from Algona, Ia., had a brilliant first year by piling up a 33-6-1 overall mark and a 12-2 dual meet record. Following his national title in the NCAA Division II championships, Myers went on to advance to the semi-finals of Division I where he placed sixth in his very first year of collegiate wrestling. He was a first team pick on the freshman All-American team

compiled by Amateur Wrestling News. He also captured the 190-pound title in the North Central Conference championships. Patten is toying with the idea of moving Myers up to heavyweight.

Senior **Keith Poolman** (Clarion, Ia.) refuses to defend the 167-pound title he won last March in the UNI-Dome. Poolman made a remarkable recovery after undergoing knee surgery early in the season to post a 7-0-1 dual mark and a 15-1-1 overall record. Keith's brother, **Craig**



**Poolman**, (Clarion, Ia.) will provide a solid backup.

This could be the year for **Dave Prehm** after the senior from Eagle Grove lost in the finals to Cal-State of Bakersfield's John Azavedo. Prehm is a two-time All-American who rolled to a 10-4 dual meet mark and 19-6-1 overall record. Prehm will find his biggest opposition from sophomore **Tony Wessely** (Waterloo).

At 126 pounds, Patten will have senior **Jeff Melvin** (Evergreen Park, Ill.) back. Melvin was hampered with injuries last season but came back to wrestle in the NCAA Division II championships where he won three times out of five matches. The three-year letterman was an All-American two years ago with a fifth place finish in the Division II finals. He'll get puched by senior **Paul Herder** (Monroe, Ia.) who did a respectable job replacing the injured Melvin.

Senior **Kevin Finn** (Waterloo) returns at 134 pounds and will be a big threat for the Panthers after finishing a surprising fourth in the Division II championships. Finn, replacing the injured Bruce McClure, posted a 4-3 dual meet mark and 11-6 overall last season. Sophomore **Bill Donnelly** (Bettendorf) will provide stiff competition for Finn.

A big question mark is at 142 pounds with freshman **Larry Luttrell** (Waterloo, Ia.) and sophomore **Mark Reece** (Comanche, Ia.). Reece will have the upper hand because of more experience but Luttrell, who starred at Waterloo Central, could easily break into the starting lineup.

Another 'if' weight is at 150 pounds with the graduation of Dick BKRIGGS. The two most likely candidates are senior **Mike Woodall** (Eagle Grove, Ia.) and freshman **Ken Gallagher** (Waterloo, Ia.) Woodall wrestled at 142 pounds last season where he posted a 3-6 dual mark and 4-13 overall record. Gallagher was red-shirted last year after undergoing knee surgery to repair torn knee ligaments.

With Bentrin gone at 158 pounds, Patten will be looking for a formidable replacement. Freshman **Ross Yoder** (Sigourney, Ia.) is the top candidate. Yoder captured the state high school title last winter for Sigourney High School and has looked good in pre-season workouts.

If Myers stays at 190 pounds, **Bob Knipp** will be Patten's heavyweight. Knipp placed third in the North Central Conference and wrestled respectively in the Division II championships. Junior **Kevin Kurth** (Tama, Ia.) the Panthers' regular heavyweight last season, is ineligible the first semester.



Progression of youth, particularly in the middle weights, will become a big factor down the road as the Panthers take on the toughest schedule in Division II. UNI opens the dual meet season by hosting national champion Iowa in the UNI-Dome Nov. 25. Minnesota, Cal-Poly, Oregon St., Arizona St. and Oregon will be other tough home opponents for the Panthers.



# Head Coach Chuck Patten

It can only be said that Chuck Patten is the premier wrestling coach in NCAA Division II wrestling. And rightfully so!

Patten is in his 15th season as the Panther boss but the 40-year old possesses all the exuberance, knowledge and personality he had in his first year at Northern Iowa.

His record speaks for itself — two prestigious NCAA Division II Championships (1978 & 1975), 11 outstanding North Central Conference championships including a string of five straight crowns while three Panther teams and finished second in the Division II Championships.

Patten sports a sparking 163-68-7 dual meet record for a lofty winning percentage of .699. A total of 42 All-Americans have wrestled under Patten, including 13 who have garnered NCAA national crowns. Three champions were crowned last March in the UNI-Dome with 158-pound champion Gary Bentrin, 167-pound champion Keith Poolman and 190-pound champion Kirk Myers.

Patten, who established an impressive 28-5-2 record as a Panther himself, is well-known throughout the nation for his knowledge and promotion of the sport he loves. He recently completed a one-year term as chairman of the powerful NCAA Rules Committee. Patten has been chosen to chair the committee for the selection of the wrestling coach for the 1980 Olympics in Moscow. Following last year's championship, Patten was honored by his peers for the second time as the NCAA College Division Coach of the Year — a title he also received in 1969.

For the past three years, he has done the color commentary for the live televised State High School Wrestling Championships on IPBN.

Success has followed the personable Patten everywhere, beginning with a fine mat career at Waterloo East and graduating with a B.A. degree from Northern Iowa in Physical Education in 1961.

Patten-coached teams have never finished lower than runnerup in the NCC but a new challenge looms ahead with membership in the Mid-Continent Conference.

He and his wife, Zig, have two daughters — Jamie 11 and Cindy 8.

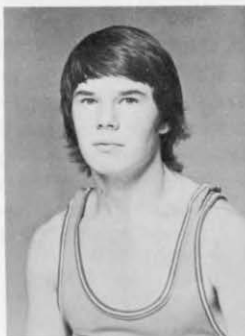

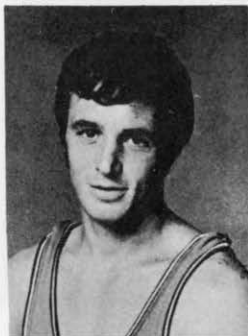
**Keith Poolman**

Posted a 7-0-1 dual meet mark and a 15-2-1 overall mark for the Panthers ... creates excitement every time he takes the mat ... Gained All-American honors in 1976 and 77 by placing fourth in Division II championships ... placed second in North Central Conference after winning the title for the two previous years ... Has a career mark of 46-8-3 as a Panther ... Posted an excellent 9-3-1 mark as a freshman and a 22-4-1 record as a sophomore ... Will be one of the top point-getters for the Panthers this season ... # Assistant Coach Don Briggs

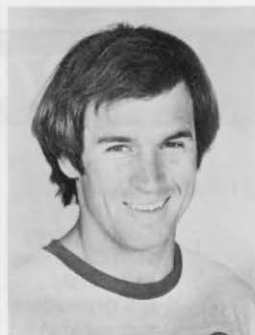
Named as UNI's first full-time assistant wrestling coach. Don Briggs begins his fourth season on the Panther staff.

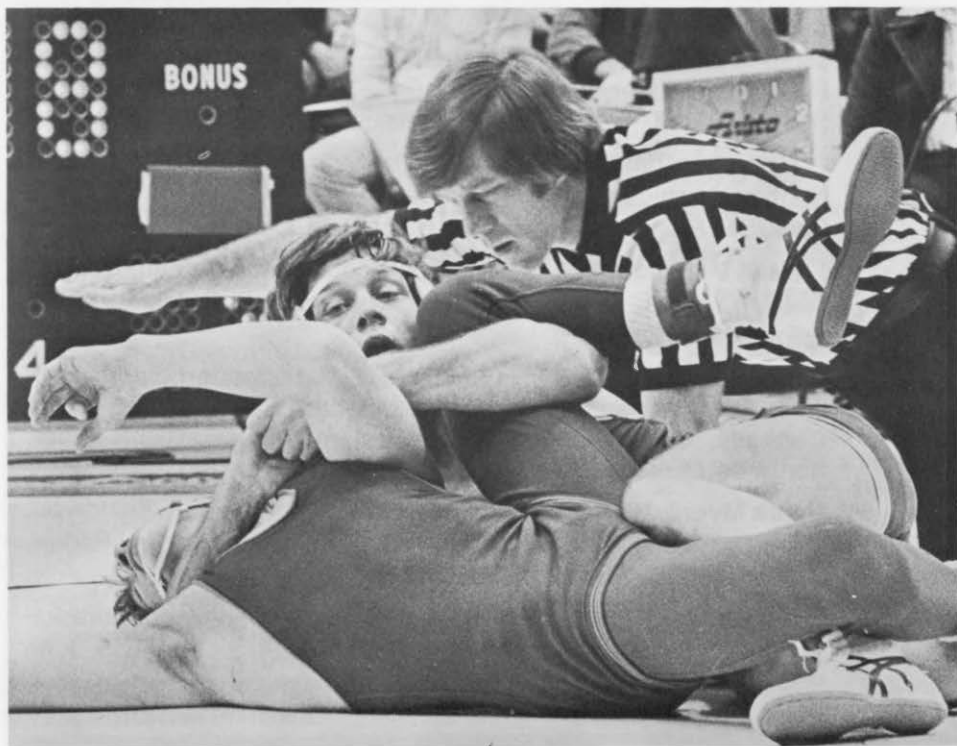

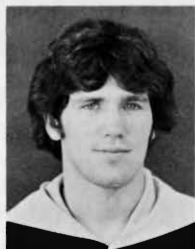

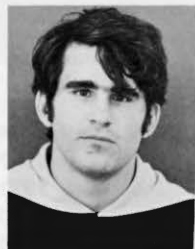

# University of Northern Iowa

The University of Northern Iowa, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher learning, is the outgrowth of the Iowa State Normal School established by the General Assembly in 1876. On September 6 of that year 27 students under four instructors began classes in a renovated home for Civil War orphans. This building, later named Central Hall, was destroyed by fire in July, 1965.

From a single building on a 40-acre campus, the University has grown to include over 40 major buildings, a 721-acre campus, over 500 faculty members and over 9,300 on-campus students. Of the 10,181 enrolled for university credit in the fall of 1977, 9,358 were on-campus and 823 were through extension and correspondence. The University also maintains a laboratory school for some 700 students in pre-school through 12th grade.

On July 1, 1967, the General Assembly on recommendation of the Regents approved university status. The name was changed to University of Northern Iowa and its function was again redefined.

Although teacher education remains its largest program, the University offers degrees to students majoring in a wide variety of subjects. Thus UNI has two Bachelor of Arts degrees, one with certification to teach and one without certification. Also, a Bachelor of Technology degree can be earned with or without certification to teach, and since 1969, the Bachelor of Music degree has been offered. A Bachelor of Fine Arts degree was approved by the Regents in 1976. An Individual Studies major enables a student to pursue, with faculty approval, a wide assortment of study areas.

On the graduate level, courses leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Education were offered for the first time in the summer of 1952 and a sixth-year program leading to the Specialist in Education degree

began in 1960. A sixth-year Specialist degree with a program in science education was inaugurated in 1970.

In 1964, the Master of Arts degree was approved by the Regents. The first Master of Arts degrees were granted in 1966. The Master of Business Administration degree was approved by the Regents in 1975, and the Master of Music in 1976.

The Industrial Technology Center on the south campus opened in August, 1975, while the UNI-Dome, a multi-purpose coliseum on the west campus, opened in February, 1976. Ground was broken in October, 1975, for the Speech/Art complex located southwest of Russell Hall with completion anticipated in the summer of 1977.

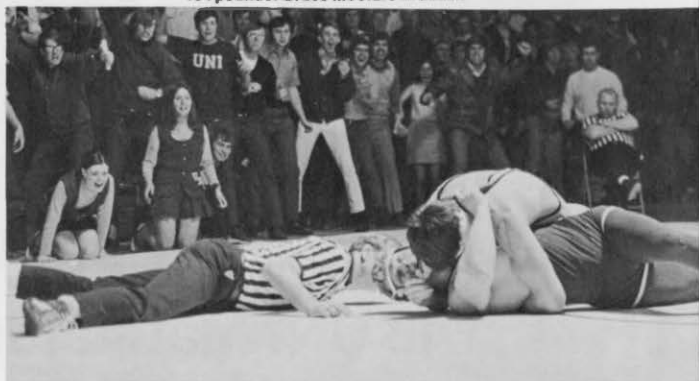

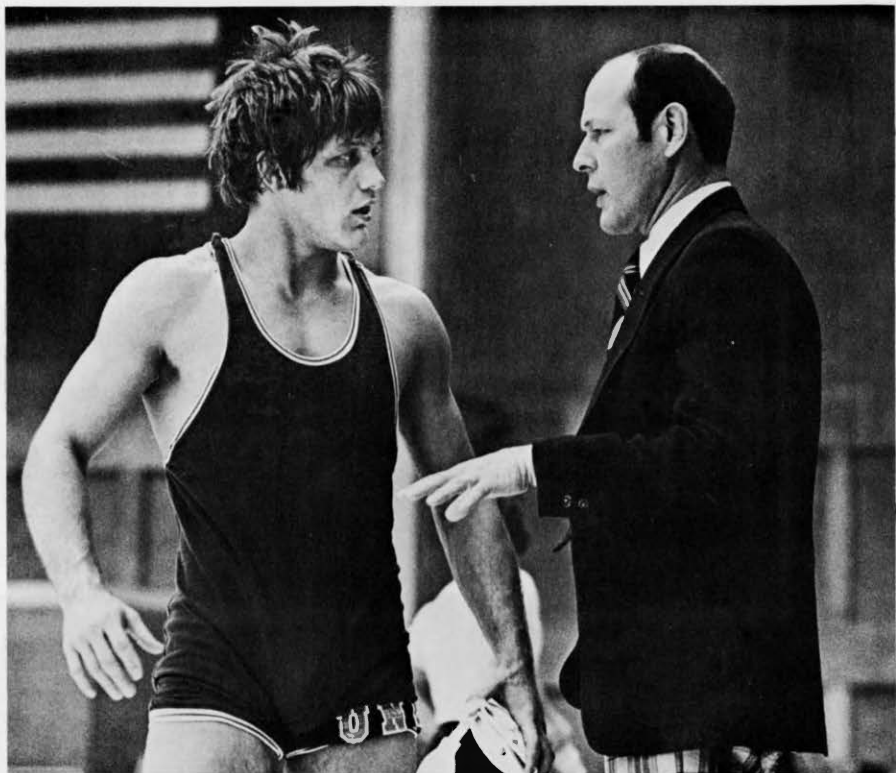

## The UNI Matmaids

MATMAIDS is a volunteer organization of 22 girls who work together as a group to help keep the UNI WRESTLING PROGRAM running smoothly. They get to know each other and the wrestlers socially and professionally throughout the school year. This year there are 13 returning matmaids and 9 new ones.

A matmaid is scheduled to work in the wrestling office once every three weeks, in addition to working at dual meets, tournaments, and attending monthly meetings. Some of the responsibilities include: typing letters, answering the phone, keeping score, and selling programs. At tournaments the girls work at registration, in the hospitality room, timing, scoring and help with wall brackets.
