

### Pardon Our Progress

As you may be aware, the compact shelving on the library's first floor has been inoperable for almost two and a half years. We have been seeking to replace or repair the shelving, but the cost is prohibitive. As a result, we have decided to remove seating and construct open shelving to make these journals more accessible. This shelving will be constructed in several areas on the first floor to accommodate the over 4,000 shelves of pre-1985 periodicals. Moving the volumes from the compact shelving to the open shelves will occur during spring and summer 2019 and will be completed by the beginning of the fall semester.
