# BASKETBALL

## THIS IS UNI

The University of Northern Iowa, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher learning, is the outgrowth of the Iowa State Normal School established by the General Assembly in 1876. From a single building on a 40-acre campus, the University has grown to include over 40 major buildings, a 721-acre campus, over 500 faculty members and over 10,300 students. The University also maintains a laboratory school for some 700 students in pre-school through 12th grade. Although teacher education remains a major program, the University offers degrees to students majoring in a wide variety of subjects. UNI has two Bachelor of Arts degrees, one with certification to teach and one without certification. Also, a Bachelor of Technology degree can be earned with or without certification to teach and the Doctorate of Industrial Technology is the newest degree to be offered. Since 1969, the Bachelor of Music degree has been offered and a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree was approved by the Board of Regents in 1976. An Individual Studies major enables a student to pursue, with faculty approval, a wide assortment of study areas. On the graduate level, courses leading to the degree of Master of Arts in Education, a sixth-year program leading to the Specialist in Education degree and one with a program in science education, a Master of Arts degree and a Master of Business Administration also are offered.

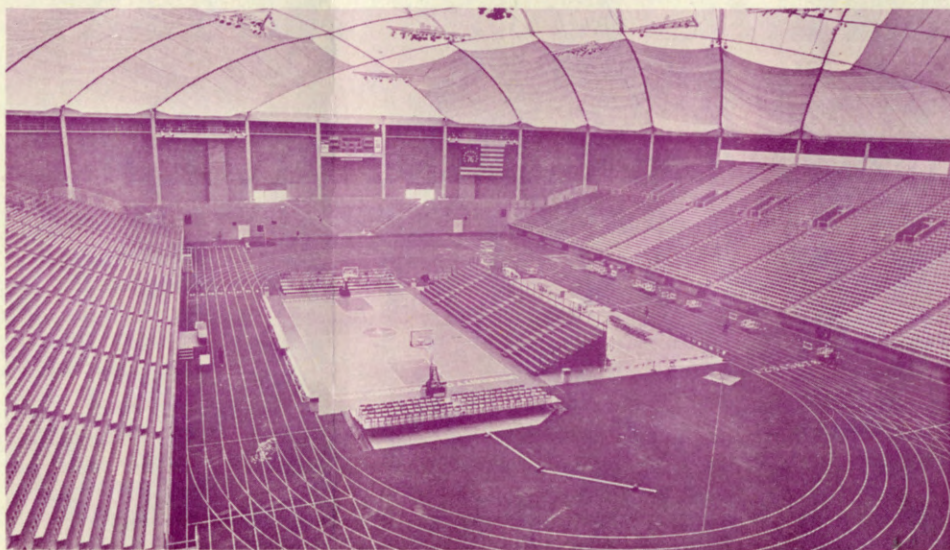
# HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

## SANDRA WILLIAMSON



A native of Texas, Sandra Williamson joined the UNI staff in July of 1978 as the first UNI associate athletic director for women and at the same time, taking over the head coaching duties of the women's basketball team. Prior to coming to Cedar Falls, she was working on her doctorate degree at Northern Colorado in Greeley. Before that, she spent six years at Carroll College in Helena, MT, as the women's basketball and volleyball coach. During her last year at Carroll, her basketball squad was invited to the Northwest Regional AIAW Basketball Tournament for small colleges. She also was involved with the formation and direction of the women's varsity athletic program. Her goal for the UNI women's basketball team and the Intercollegiate Athletic Program as a whole is to make the Panthers respectable in the eyes of their opponents and to obtain total University-community support.

## UNI BASKETBALL FACILITIES



UNI supporters and the entire State of Iowa realized a dream come true with the completion of the UNI-Dome — a completely covered, multi-purpose facility with an air-supported roof — in February of 1975. UNI-Dome, the prefix stands for University of Northern Iowa, as well as meaning one and unique, combines the features of three buildings — a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. The UNI-Dome's air-supported, Fiberglass fabric roof constructed by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corporation, was erected at a cost equal to half that of conventional roof construction. And because of the Dome's translucence, ample natural light is available during daylight hours. Underneath the artificial turf which can be rolled up is the synthetic floor area which is used for basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track. About 8,000 spectators can be seated for court-side activities. The permanent floor is Monsanto Astro-turf Resilient Surface, i.e., three-eighths inch of polyurethane material (hard rubber).

## THE PROGRAM

Women's intercollegiate athletics at Northern Iowa have a short history but one they can be proud of. Three sports were offered for the first time in 1968 and the program has been expanded to include a total of nine sports. Even though the women's athletic program is young, UNI's competitors have made a name for themselves state-wide, regionally and nationally.

The men's and women's athletics programs merged into one administrative body July 1, 1978, under the direction of Stan Sheriff, athletic director, R.C. Johnson, associate athletic director for men, and Sandra Williamson, associate athletic director for women. Scholarship monies for women athletes were made available for the first time in accordance with Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women regulations and student-athletes interested in receiving an athletic scholarship in basketball should contact Williamson.

UNI's basketball team competes in Division II of the AIAW structure, which provides for 50 percent of the maximum aid allowable by the AIAW. The players and teams are sanctioned by state, regional and national AIAW and all sports are played under National Association for Girls and Women in Sports (NAGWS) rules.
