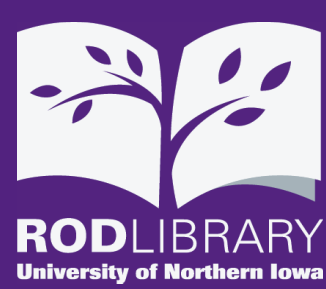

African American Read-In

On Thursday, February 27, UNI has invited over 800, first-grade students from across the Cedar Valley to visit Rod Library as part of UNI's 12th annual African American Read-In. First-graders will have the opportunity to learn from award-winning author, literacy advocate, publisher, and motivational speaker Ty Allan Jackson. Library staff, faculty, and student workers will be coordinating sessions highlighting African American children's literature. The Read-In is part of a national event sponsored by the Black Caucus of the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE) and endorsed by the International Literacy Association. UNI's African American Read-In is in conjunction with the annual African American Children and Families Conference.
