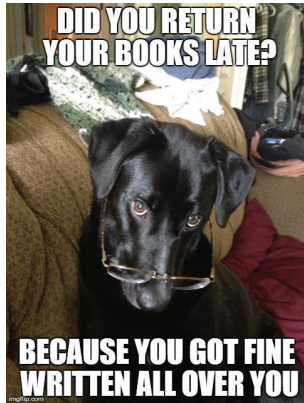
NOTES FOR THE STALLED

The UNI Museum hosts a collection of worldwide ethnographic and historical resources for all students to freely use for their classroom work and research projects. The museum also hosts the Center for Rural School History, where the history of Iowa education is kept alive, and a one-room schoolhouse where you can experience life in a 1920's classroom. The museum is a teaching institution where we prepare students for a career in museum work and provide jobs and internships in collection management, education, and curation.

The UNI Museum will open the new exhibit "Whose Voice " on October 11th, examining how colonialism has a long history with museum collections and exhibits.
