Since 1954, through its *Excellence in Science Teaching* Awards program, teachers from all areas of the state have been recognized for their outstanding work.

Presently, the Academy recognizes excellence in elementary, junior/ middle high school, and senior high school science teaching. Further, in the senior high school program, the specialty areas of biology, chemistry, earth science, environmental education, and physics are focused upon.
