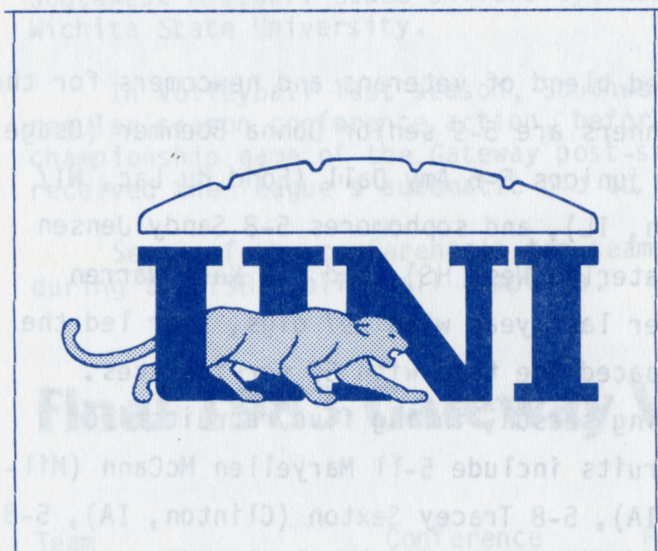

# 1984 Panther Volleyball Outlook

Facing the Panthers' largest Division I schedule ever, fourth-year Northern Iowa coach Dr. Iradge Ahrabi-Fard leads the UNI volleyball women in a quest for their sixth consecutive winning season.

The Panthers' mentor is optimistic about the UNI volleyball future as the women enter their third season in the NCAA Division I and the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference. "We should be pretty competitive the next three years. Three years from now, we should be a good, strong team. This season, we are aiming to be among the top four in the conference."

Ahrabi-Fard returns six letterwinners from a 1983 squad that posted a 21-20 record. "This is the first year that we will play 80 percent of our matches against Division I teams," commented the UNI coach. "If we can match last year's record, we have done a good job."

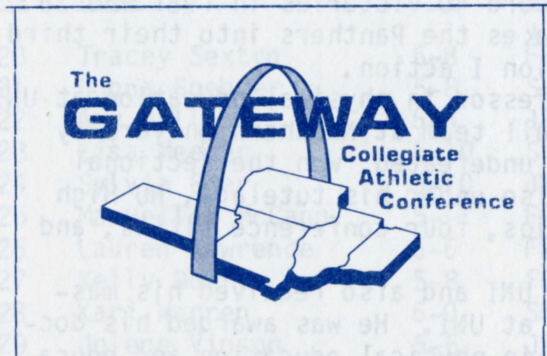
The 1984 season will have a balanced blend of veterans and newcomers for the Panthers. Among the returning letterwinners are 5-9 senior Donna Boehmer (Osage HS/Waldorf College), two-time lettermen juniors 5-6 Amy Dall (Fond du Lac, WI/Goodrich HS) and 5-10 Sylvia Eder (Elgin, IL), and sophomores 5-8 Sandy Jensen (Waterloo West HS), 5-10 Lisa Meeker (Waterloo West HS), and 6-0 Kari Warren (Neenah, WI). Dall was UNI's team leader last year with 297 digs, Eder led the squad in attack percentage, and Warren paced the team with 59 service aces.

Ahrabi-Fard enjoyed a good recruiting season, inking five recruits from a three-state area. The UNI freshmen recruits include 5-11 Maryellen McCann (Milwaukee, WI), 5-9 Mary Bernhardt (Dike, IA), 5-8 Tracey Sexton (Clinton, IA), 5-8 Kelly Duffy (Deerfield, IL), and 5-6 Lauren Lawrence (Morton, IL). "Our success will depend on how the recruits will adjust and shape up as far as our needs are concerned," Ahrabi-Fard said.

The Panthers' 1984 schedule includes matches against state foes Iowa, Iowa State, and Drake (all both at home and away); a nine-match Gateway Conference slate, including six teams that posted winning season records in '83; and tournament action at Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Iowa, Illinois-Chicago, and at home in the UNI Invitational.



# Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference



The University of Northern Iowa women's intercollegiate athletic program began a new era in the fall of 1982, entering the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference and the NCAA Division I. Last season, championships were held in 10 sports in the league, including cross country, field hockey, volleyball, swimming, indoor track, basketball, golf, tennis, softball, and outdoor track.

Participating schools in the conference are Bradley University, Drake University, Eastern Illinois University, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, University of Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois University, Southwest Missouri State University, Western Illinois University, and Wichita State University.

In volleyball last season, Southwest Missouri recorded a 9-0 mark in the regular season conference action, before falling to Illinois State in the championship game of the Gateway post-season tournament. Illinois State then received the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division I National Tournament.

Seven of the conference's ten teams posted winning overall season records during the 1983 volleyball campaign.

# Panther Coaching Staff

## HEAD COACH--DR. IRADGE AHRABI-FARD

Dr. Iradge Ahrabi-Fard, who enters his fourth season as UNI volleyball coach this fall, led the Panther women to a school-record 40 victories in 1981 and 38 more victories a year later. This season, he takes the Panthers into their third season in the Gateway Conference and NCAA Division I action.

Ahrabi-Fard, who has been an associate professor in physical education at UNI since 1972, formerly coached the girls' volleyball team at Northern University High. His 1980 volleyball team at NU High went undefeated, won the sectional tournament, and went to the district finals. Also under his tutelage, NU High boys' track teams won three district championships, four conference titles, and one state title.

The Panthers' mentor is a 1965 graduate of UNI and also received his master's degree in physical education a year later at UNI. He was awarded his doctorate from the University of Minnesota in 1975 in physical education and educational administration.

Ahrabi-Fard has been involved with several sports at the international level and has published six books on various health and physical education subjects in his native Iran. In Iran, Ahrabi-Fard served as President of Institution of Sports (1967-69), head men's and women's national swimming coach (1967-70), Executive Director of the Education Department of Sports Ministry (1970), and Vice-Minister of Sport Ministry (1977-78). He was also appointed as the special physical educator for the Crown Prince and Princess of Iran.

He competed on the Iranian national volleyball team internationally and in the Asian Games. He also was a performer on his national track team as a high jumper and jumped for UNI his freshman year.

## ASSISTANT COACH--JAN BITTNER

Bittner continues as Northern Iowa's first assistant volleyball coach for the third year after completing a four-year stint at St. John's High School in Houston, TX.

In her two years as head girls' volleyball coach at St. John's, she compiled an impressive 51-11 record and led her 1980 squad to a Southwest Preparatory Conference championship. She also served three years as the head girls' tennis coach and girls' junior varsity basketball coach at St. John's.

Bittner is a 1976 graduate of Valparaiso University, where she was a four-year basketball letterwinner and earned her bachelor's in physical education. She was awarded her master's in physical education administration from Illinois State University in 1981.

## STUDENT ASSISTANT--LORI NAUMAN

Former UNI volleyball player Lori Nauman will be assisting the Panthers' coaching staff this fall, while working on her degree in elementary education as a senior.

A first-team all-conference, all-area, and all-state volleyball player at Dubuque (IA) Hempstead High School her senior year, Nauman played two seasons for the Panthers (1981-82).
