NABT Announces Awards for Secondary School Biology Teachers

The National Association of Biology Teachers (NABT) is seeking nominations for five secondary school biology teaching awards. Recipients will be recognized at the NABT National Convention in St. Louis, MO, November 16-19, 1994.

The Biotechnology Teaching Award recognizes a secondary school teacher or undergraduate college faculty member who has successfully demonstrated an innovative approach that incorporates the principles and processes of biotechnology in the classroom.

The Outstanding Biology Teacher Award will be given to an outstanding biology teacher in grades 7-12 from each state and Canadian province, as well as Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico.

One middle or high school biology teacher who has made contributions to the profession within his/her first three years of service will be recognized with an Outstanding New Biology Teacher Achievement Award.

The Molecular Biology Teaching Award recognizes a precollege biology teacher who has developed an innovative approach to teaching molecular biology in the classroom.

NABT members who have encouraged, promoted and strived for equity in the biology education community may be nominated for the "Role and Status of Women's Equity" Award.
