Only a limited number of spots remain for the COVID-19 vaccination clinics in the West Gym this week.

Due to many factors, including production delays for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, this will likely be the only opportunity to receive this particular vaccine on campus this semester.

Remember, the vaccine is available by appointment only and at no cost. You can register at the [Forward Together site](#). Do not call the Student Health Clinic to schedule your appointment.

Very few spots remain for the one-dose Johnson & Johnson student-only clinic being held tomorrow from 8:20 a.m.-12:25 p.m.

In addition, clinics for the two-dose Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine are being offered this week for faculty, staff and students by appointment only during these dates and times:

- Wednesday, April 14 from Noon-3:10 p.m.
- Thursday April 15 from 8:20a.m.-11:30 p.m.
- Friday, April 16 from 8:20 a.m.-11:30 a.m.

If signing up for the two-dose Pfizer-BioNTech clinic, please be sure you can be present for the administration of **a second dose the week of May 2, Finals Week**, before scheduling your appointment. Those appointments will be scheduled on the same weekday and time in alignment with your selected day/time for the first dose.
