MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING 1:00 p.m., Gardner Lounge, Main Hall, Grinnell College, Grinnell, Iowa April 27, 1973

President Arnold O. Haugen presiding, with 119 members present.

- 1. The following reports were heard and accepted by voice vote:
 - a. Report of the Board of Directors R. W. Hanson, Executive Secretary

The Board of Directors met at Grinnell College on October 20, 1972, for dinner and the fall meeting. The matters considered at that meeting included the following:

Review of cost and attendance figures for the 84th session of the Academy held at Iowa City April 28–29, 1972, viz. :

Relation of the Iowa chapter of the Mathematics Association of America to the mathematics section of the Academy. Subsequent polling of Academy members with mathematics interest indicated satisfaction with the arrangement of having the Iowa chapter of MAA meet as (or with) the Academy's mathematics section.

Decision that abstracts be printed and distributed to the entire membership prior to the meeting, using camera-ready copy provided by authors.

Recommendations from the Social Implications Committee concerning environmental education in Iowa brought up without resolution the question of how the Iowa Academy of Science relates to the Iowa Conservation Education Council. Concerning the matter of proposals for the development of part of the Academy farm property for outdoor education, the Board took the view that the Finance Committee should receive such proposals and carry them through.

The Finance Committee report included information on the continued development of the farm property — the removal of fences, the conversion of the corn crib to hold shelled corn, the installation of a carved wood sign identifying the farm as an Academy property, the planting of trees, and improvements to the buildings. The need for volunteer labor to carry out some of these projects was again emphasized.

Funds were also approved for the Finance Committee to solicit endowments and bequests, and to develop support and interaction from industry by inviting representatives of about 25 top industries to attend the 85th session as guests.

Two nominations were received for the new Iowa Academy Award of Merit and recommended for approval to the Recognition and Awards Committee.

A new undergraduate section was approved upon recommendation of Norman C. Baenziger of the University of Iowa, although some philosophical differences were apparent within the Board concerning the segregation of research papers on this basis.

The regular spring meeting of the Board was held April 26 from 2:30–6:00 and 7:30 – 10:30 and approved reports and recommendations from all Standing Committees except the Publications Committee which had no report. Hanson reviewed briefly some of the highlights of these reports:

In connection with the work of the Annual Meeting Committee, the Board approved the continued practice of mailing programs to all members prior to the meeting, necessitating the typical early deadlines for the submission of titles and abstracts. The practice of collecting registration fees to help defray the cost of the meeting will be continued. The 86th session will be held at Upper Iowa College in Fayette, April 19–20, 1974. The Social Implications Committee has suggested a theme for at least a portion of the meeting, dealing with the social responsibilities of scientists.

The Report of the Finance Committee indicated vast improvement in income from the farm under Hertz Farm Management. There is a definite need to develop more interest in work on the farm on the part of individual members, perhaps an annual day on the farm as an outing for Academy members. The Board approved the sale of easement for additional right of way for the widening and black-topping of a county road that runs through the farm property. A conspicuous, attractive sign was put in place on the farm last fall.

Although no report came from the Publications Committee several matters have come up that will necessitate a meeting of that committee very soon.

The Board voted to proceed with the first two lowa Academy Awards of Merit in spite of the absence of such a recommendation from the Recognition and Awards Committee.

The report of the Social Implications Committee was accepted with recognition that many programs with worthy objectives are difficult to initiate without outside funding. The committee was commended for its active interest in sponsoring programs that would bring science and the public closer together in Iowa. The soil erosion report from this committee a year ago has been published in the PROCEEDINGS. Three new programs have been under consideration by this committee: a

Scientist-in-Residence program, a Volunteer Science Consultant program, and a symposium on the social concerns of scientists is proposed for the 1974 meeting of the Academy.

The report of the Student Programs Committee indicated that extensive changes are occurring in the way that the Junior Academy operates. Included in the Academy-sponsored student programs schedule now are the UNI Science Symposium, the UI Science, Engineering and Humanities Symposium, field survey programs, and new regional efforts to promote more research projects by high school students.

All available AAAS research grant funds have been awarded. From this time on, applications for these funds will be accepted for consideration twice each year rather than on a first-come first-served basis as in the past.

The ad hoc committee on articulation has been dissolved at its own request with the view that other approaches may be better means of effective communication between the two-year and four-year colleges.

A special committee is being appointed by the new president to plan centennial activities for the 1975 meeting at Iowa State University.

A bill has been introduced in the Senate this year (S.F. 414) that would provide \$8000 per year to help cover publication expenses of the Academy. Discussion of this bill with legislators points up the necessity of better information dispersal about Academy activities.

The report of the Executive Secretary to the Board of Directors covered the year's accomplishments, particularly in relation to the Parish Farm, the progress made in getting the quarterly PROCEEDINGS on schedule, and the extensive improvements made in student programs coordination. The budget included in the executive secretary's report was adopted and is shown elsewhere.

Two resolutions were presented by the Resolution Committee for consideration by the Board. With minor modifications they were approved for presentation to the membership for consideration.

Three Bylaws revisions were approved by the Board for presentation to the membership. They are spelled out below.

b. Report of the Treasurer - H. T. Horner, Jr.

The printed report appears along with others in the Annual Report.

c. Report of the Membership Committee - Wm. Azbell.

Separate motions on each category of membership change were made

by Azbell, seconded, and carried. The names of several deceased members were read in memoriam. The complete report is included with others in the Annual Report.

d. Report of the Editor - Thomas E. Rogers

The Editor reported that excellent progress has been made in getting the quarterly PROCEEDINGS on schedule. During 1973 it is expected that four issues will be distributed. The main delay is the review process, relations with the University of Iowa Printing Service have been exemplary. Another associate editor for the social sciences (particularly economics and anthropology) is needed.

Following the report of the Elections Committee President Haugen introduced the newly-elected officers and directors and recognized the retiring members of the Board (H. T. Horner, Jr., Stanley Wawzonek, Robert E. Buckles, and Edwin M. Vaughan).

2. New Business

a. The following Bylaws revisions were presented and passed unanimously by the members present:

Article VI - Committees

Section 2. Annual Meeting Committee

2a) This committee will be made up of the local arrangements chairman for the Annual Meeting just concluded, the local arrangements chairman for the forthcoming Annual Meeting, and four other Fellows who have preferably served as Section Chairmen, two of whom will be appointed each year to serve two year terms. One of the appointed Fellows should be from the institution to host the meeting two years hence.

- 2b) The chairman of the committee will be appointed by the President.
- 2c) The duties of the Annual Meeting Committee will be to develop general plans for future Annual Meetings and to consider invitations from potential host institutions. They will evaluate each Annual Meeting in terms of various measures of success no later than October 1 following the meeting and make recommendations for the general planning and format for the next two Annual Meetings. The Executive Secretary, the local arrangements chairman and the Section Chairmen will work closely together to implement the recommendations of the Annual Meeting Committee in planning each Annual Meeting.

Article VI - Committees

Section 9. Student Programs Committees

9a) The Student Programs Committee shall consist of six Fellows, one of whom is selected by the Science Teaching Section as its representative. The Director of the Iowa Junior Academy of Science shall be an ex-officio member. Each member of the committee shall serve a three-year term. Two members shall be appointed each year.

Article XII - Finance

Section 3. Dues

- 3d) Any Fellow in good standing may become a Life Fellow by making a dues payment of \$150.00 under terms set by the Board of Directors.
- b. The following expressions of appreciation and resolutions were presented by Eugene Spaziani and were passed unanimously by the members present:

Expressions of Appreciation

The Iowa Academy of Science, assembled in its 85th annual session, April 27–28, 1973, wishes to express its appreciation to Professor Irving Fishman, Chairman of the Annual Meeting Committee, to members of the Committee and to Grinnell College for their outstanding accomplishments on arrangements; and to Prof. Robert Hanson for organizing the clearly successful program.

To Professor H. T. Horner, Jr., Treasurer of the Academy from 1968–1973, for his work as chairman of the Finance Committee in carrying out and promoting the development of the Parish Farm property as an incomeproducing asset as well as a model of sound environmental management.

Resolution on Comprehensive State Mapping

Whereas, the members of the Iowa Academy of Science recognize the fundamental nature of topographical information and the general efficacy of maps drawn at the scale and accuracy of the U. S. Geological Survey -- National Map standards (1:24000 Scale 7 1/2-min Quadrangles).

and whereas they recognize the fact that only 38% of the state of lowa is mapped at the above scale and accuracies:

Resolved, that the Governor and the various members of the 65th General assembly of the State of Iowa be urged to give their fullest support to the work of the State Map Advisory Council and the State Geologists so that Iowa can be completely mapped at the earliest feasible date.

It is further urged that the mapping of the State and subsequent revision of extant maps be accomplished as a program that results from a Comprehensive State Mapping Plan.

Resolution on Radiation Protection

Whereas the members of the Iowa Academy of Science recognize that the use of radiation, from X-ray producing devices and radioactive materials, in the healing arts, industry and research is widespread, here to stay and rapidly growing, and whereas almost every person in Iowa comes into contact with some form of man-made radiation and whereas bills on radiation protection, repeatedly introduced in the Legislature, have not been acted upon,

therefore be it <u>resolved</u>, that the Iowa General Assembly be urged to consider legislation that <u>organizes</u>, implements and funds a comprehensive system of radiation regulation and inspection, thereby joining 48 other states which have such laws.

3. The Annual Business Meeting was adjourned at 2 p.m.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

The history of Iowa Academy activity during 1972-73 is covered well in the newsletter (the IAS BULLETIN) and the reports of standing committees submitted to the Board of Directors and published later in the Annual Report. This report provides certain emphases to the various aspects of Academy operation and includes the budget for 1973-74 and contains the revision of some of the Bylaws to reduce some mechanical problems in committee appointments.

The 85th session of the lowa Academy of Science at Grinnell College represented several months of planning by the Section Chairmen and the local arrangements committee at Grinnell. The planning for the meeting started on October 28, 1972, when most of the Section Chairmen met with the Grinnell committee to block out the program and initiate plans for joint sessions and symposia. I wish to express my appreciation for the efforts expended by all these individuals to make the 85th session a success. We are all especially grateful for the fine hospitality extended to the Academy by President Glenn Leggett of Grinnell College, and to Prof. I. Y. Fishman for the efficient manner in which he managed the local arrangements.

The Year in Review

Perhaps the most noteworthy events of the past year to emphasize here are (1) the vastly improved management of the Academy farm with consequent improved income, (2) the successful transition of the PROCEEDINGS to the quarterly format, and (3) the completely revised schedule and management of student programs under the lowa Junior Academy of Science.

(1) The Academy Farm

The first of these is fully covered in the report of the Finance Committee, but special acknowledgment should be made of the efforts of Dr. Harry T. Horner, Jr., Treasurer of the Academy and chairman of the Finance Committee, to improve the farm as a model of sound agricultural practice, to establish long-range goals for its development as an educational resource for the state, and to improve the income available from this property through close contact with the manager and the tenant and through appeals to Academy members and others to contribute their time for work on the farm that would otherwise be very costly.

The Parish Farm was bequeathed to the Academy in 1960 under conditions that required the Academy not to sell it for at least 75 years. From 1960 until March 1971 the farm was leased for three-year periods on a per-acre basis to Nelson Sager. During those periods the net income per year never exceeded \$4,407.45 and the average was \$2,062.00.

In March, 1971 Hertz Farm Management of Nevada, lowa, was engaged to manage the farm on a share-cropping basis, with the tenant on a one-year lease. Transfers from the farm management account during the years 1971 and 1972 were -0- and \$5867, respectively, and additional costs paid out of the Academy's general operating fund were \$1,205.27 and 501.64, respectively, those two years. But in 1973 there have been no additional payments out of the Academy's operating fund for the farm, and none are anticipated. The net income during calendar year 1972 was \$5,365, and already in 1973, \$7,300 has been transferred to the Academy from the farm management account. Additional transfers are anticipated before the end of 1973, giving us some reason for optimism about the general financial condition of the Academy.

In looking at these transferred amounts, it must be borne in mind that they are lower than the true net income from the farm by the amount spent on repairs and capital improvements, such amounts being largely non-recurring. The Finance Committee's report provides additional detail on farm income and expenditures.

(2) The PROCEEDINGS

The second noteworthy event is the fact that Editor Thomas E. Rogers has brought the quarterly PROCEEDINGS into proper phase with the calendar and has built up an adequate backlog of manuscripts to keep the publication close to the schedule. The section editors are to be commended for their cooperation with the Editor in getting manuscripts back without undue delay.

It has only been since last year that the Academy has had the full burden of the cost of printing the PROCEEDINGS and the net cost has turned out to be somewhat less than anticipated. We receive approximately \$3,200 per calendar year for subscriptions to the PROCEEDINGS—\$1,700 from the lowa State University Library for 425 @ \$4.00 (the price is discounted to compensate for storage and distribution costs of back issues) and the balance from about 100 subscriptions @8.00 per volume, and sales of back sets and single issues totaling about \$457. A significant saving to the Academy is the fact that the Extension Division of the University of lowa distributes the PROCEEDINGS from lowa City at no cost to the Academy. Although printing costs are not entirely predictable, it appears that \$8,000 will cover them in a year of four issues. The net cost of the PROCEEDINGS, is then on the order of 4,800, not including the Editor's honorarium and expenses.

At this writing a bill,has been drawn up by Senator Ray Taylor of Steamboat Rock (S.F. 414) to provide \$8,000 per year for publication costs. It is not certain when the bill will be introduced but since a similar bill passed the House last session, its chances for passage appear good if it passes the Senate first. The cost of publishing the IAS BULLETIN and the IOWA SCIENCE TEACHERS JOURNAL, when added to the net cost of the PROCEEDINGS, brings the total net cost above that which would be covered by an \$8,000 appropriation from the Senate.

(3) The Junior Academy Program

The Student Programs Committee report for 1972 outlined the "Tentative Model" of student programs in science in lowa. Now, a year later, we find that some of the projected aspects of the model have been successfully implemented and the prospects for bringing the rest of the model into play appear very encouraging. These accomplishments deserve special acknowledgement because the Junior Academy activities are continuing at a healthy level in spite of the withdrawal of support from the National Science Foundation.

After several years as state director of the lowa Junior Academy of Science, Frank Starr stepped aside last fall to spend his time on the field studies aspect of the Junior Academy program. The position of state director was taken by Edward L. Pizzini of the Science Education Center of the University of Iowa. By virtue of bringing many student programs in science under the Academy umbrella, including those that are sponsored by the University of Iowa and the University of Northern Iowa, there is now a coordinated program to inform all Iowa high school science teachers in grades 7-12 and their students of the opportunities available. The annual convention of the Junior Academy in conjunction with the Senior Academy's annual session is now a thing of the past, but in its place there is a special section of Junior Academy papers at the senior meeting and a program of awards and recognition at the beginning of the Friday evening general session. However, Junior Academy activities are spread throughout the year and an attempt will be made to regionalize the efforts to promote student research projects, the number of which having declined severely in the past five years. The number of teachers now involved in the IJAS program has increased greatly and will increase even more through the regionalization effort.

(4) Membership Matters

The 84th session of the Academy, held in Iowa City in 1972, included 236 papers authored or co-authored by 349 individuals, 191 of whom were non-members. In the 83rd session there were 148 papers contributed by 219 individuals of whom 114 were non-members. This year the program for the 85th session included 192 papers contributed by 264 individuals, 106 of whom were non-members. This is a change from over 50% non-member contributors to about 40% this year. The requirement that the abstract be signed by an Academy member may have had this effect, although follow-up invitations to membership sent to non-member authors did not produce an appreciable number of new members.

We have not yet recouped the loss in membership suffered between 1971 and 1972. Recruitment of new members must be a steady effort just to replace the usual attrition of about 100 members in addition to improving the membership count by the 250 lost between '71 and '72.

(5) The Financial Picture in 1973-74

The prospects for the passage of S.F. 414, a bill to provide \$8,000 per year of the biennium for publication costs, appear favorable at this writing. Last year H.F. 740 failed in the Senate after passing the House, so the approach this time is to tackle the Senate first. The improved financial condition of the State Treasury is a factor in our favor.

Improved farm income has offset the loss of dues income and the PROCEEDINGS are costing less than originally estimated. Efforts are being made in a serious way to get additional support for special projects from industry. A special program of hospitality and information-sharing was a part of the Finance Committee's efforts in this direction during the 85th session. Representatives of the Meredith Corporation, John Deere (Waterloo), Pioneer Hi-Bred, Collins Radio, and Sundstrand Hydro-Transmission were hosted by individual Academy members throughout the afternoon and evening on Friday, April 27. Any contributions forthcoming from these or other industries will undoubtedly be designated and are not included in the anticipated receipts section of the proposed budget. One state senator was a guest also -- Senator Lucas DeKoster, Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee. Reports from the Academy hosts to their guests were uniformly favorable.

The major differences in anticipated receipts in 1973-74 is increased farm income by about \$3,000 over the budget for the current year. There is no state appropriation anticipated in the budget figures and no marked increase in dues income. The total of planned expenditures is very close to that budgeted for the current year. The differences mainly reflect the experience of the current year but are adjusted in anticipation of rising costs of materials and services.

The Academy's budget does not reflect the contribution of time made by the University of Northern lowa for the administration of the Academy. The Executive Secretary is employed full time as a full professor in the Department of Chemistry at UNI. An agreement with the UNI administration provides for part of his work load to be released for Academy work. The initial agreement has undergone some modification since its beginning in 1969 when it was intended to release 25% of a 47-week university assignment for Academy work. Changes in teaching assignments and other duties eventually shifted all of the released time to the academic year and supposedly amounted to one third of 36 weeks. Due to the nature of teaching assignments and staffing needs in the department, the released time is now down to 25% of a full time assignment during the nine months, with no corresponding reduction in the amount of Academy work. The honorarium paid to the Executive Secretary is considered compensation for work performed outside the instructional calendar and does not duplicate UNI salary paid for the released time.

(7) Bylaws revisions

On recommendation from the Board of Directors the following Bylaws revisions were presented to the membership at the annual business meeting and passed, becoming effective immediately:

Article VI - Committees

Section 2. Annual Meeting Committee

- 2a) This committee will be made up of the local arrangements chairman for the Annual Meeting just concluded, the local arrangements chairman for the forthcoming Annual Meeting, and four other Fellows who have preferably served as Section Chairmen, two of whom will be appointed each year to serve two year terms. One of the appointed Fellows should be from the institution to host the meeting two years hence.
- 2b) The chairman of the committee will be appointed by the President.
- 2c) The duties of the Annual Meeting Committee will be to develop general plans for future Annual Meetings and to consider invitations from potential host institutions. They will evaluate each Annual Meeting in terms of various measures of success no later than October 1 following the meeting and make recommendations for the general planning and format for the next two Annual Meetings. The Executive Secretary, the local arrangements chairman and the Section Chairmen will work closely together to implement the recommendations of the Annual Meeting Committee in planning each Annual Meeting.

Article VI - Committees

Section 9. Student Programs Committee

9a) The Student Programs Committee shall consist of six Fellows, one of whom is selected by the Science Teaching Section as its representative, and the Director of the Iowa Junior Academy of Science, ex-officio. Each member of the committee shall serve a three-year term. Two members shall be appointed each year.

Article XII - Finance

Section 3. Dues

3d) Any Fellow in good standing may become a Life Fellow by making a payment of \$150.00 under terms set by the Board of Directors.

Two of these Bylaws revisions will facilitate the long range planning of annual meetings and the annual appointment of the Director of the Junior Academy. The third will hopefully make the Life Fellow option more attractive. Since the action to implement the lowered dues for Life Fellows, the Board of Directors has authorized payment of this amount in installments as mentioned in the newsletter and on the dues statement. Life Fellow dues become a permanent fund and only the income from them can be used for operating expenses.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE April 14, 1973

The Finance Committee has divided its efforts this past year in two areas. The first has involved exploring ways to increase income and establish ties with lowa industries and the second area is the Parish Farm.

The Committee has sent a letter to all Academy members, forty years of age and older, explaining some of the ongoing programs of the Academy and suggesting that each member consider supporting the Academy through estate planning. It is hoped that this avenue of approach will provide a means for Academy members to commit various kinds of gifts either in the near or distant future to the Academy. Gifts may be specifically designated or given to the general operating fund.

The status of Life Fellow membership in the Academy is being reconsidered by the committee. A change in the rules governing this membership may provide more benefits for a greater portion of the members. A recommendation will be presented to the Board.

The Committee has attempted to interest major lowa industries in the Academy by inviting corporation presidents or their representatives to the annual meeting at Grinnell College. Letters were sent out to 68 corporations in March and early April. As of the writing of this report the response has been disappointing with only a handful of replies. The committee believes this association would be of benefit to both the Academy and corporations and therefore will continue its efforts in establishing this relationship.

The Parish Farm has been operated for the second year under the auspices of the Hertz Farm Management Service (Mr. Jim Freevert, manager) and the tenant Mr. Melvin Schildroth. During this past year many improvements have taken place, which have moved the Farm closer to the ultimate goal of -- a model farm encompassing the best farm and environmental conservation practices.

Last summer a native prairie, consisting of about 7 acres, was established north of the woodlot. Good weather helped the prairie get started. A list of plant species planted is part of the committee record. The woodlot was further cleaned up in preparation for new plantings.

Last fall several work crews helped convert the corn crib to hold shelled corn. It was completed just prior to corn harvest and holds 10-12 thousand bushels. At the same time, the IAS sign was put in place next to the road. It was provided by the lowa Conservation Service. The southeast quarter of the 160 acres was also tiled out reducing a major soil erosion problem there.

This spring further improvements will be carried out involving further cleanup of woodlot, planting of 3000 seedlings, moving a honeysuckle hedge, and removing north-south fences along the road. The latter will be widened and paved during this summer or fall.

REPORT OF THE SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS COMMITTEE April 26, 1973

The Social Implications Committee met twice in the course of the year on September 23rd and January 20th. Work was continued in the areas of:

- 1) Soil conservation and initiated in the areas of:
 - Scientist-in-Residence;
- 3) Science consultant program;
 - 4) a symposium on social concerns of scientists and several minor matters.

A brief summary of the activities of the committee on each topic will be given below.

1) Soil Conservation

Several attempts were made to get a wider publication of the "Landers Report" on Soil Erosion in Iowa. These have not been successful as of the moment.

The subcommittee for developing a symposium on soil erosion was formed in January by Frank Mendell. The subcommittee consists of Frank Mendell and Dick Wilcox, co-chairmen; Fred Higgenbottom, Frank Schaller, Roger Landers, and William Greiner. A meeting date has not been fixed, but the subcommittee is thinking of next fall as a suitable time. The committee on Social Implications hopes that the results of the symposium will serve as a basis for projection for legislators and administrators and encourage research in these fields where data is lacking.

- 2) The Scientist-in-Residence program (see IAS Bulletin Vol. 6, No. 5, Nov. 1972 and Vol. 7, No. 1) is getting nowhere fast. So far we have responses from five scientists and no service organizations. The Committee decided to wait until Spring and decide whether to abandon the program or try again.
- 3) The Science Volunteer Consultant program is being shaped up by Paul Smith. This program of Volunteer Science Consultants to Schools seeks to accomplish:
 - 1. The stimulation and improvement of science education in kindergarten through twelfth grade
 - The stimulation of a greater awareness on the part of science teachers and researchers of each other's needs and potential contributions to an integrated kindergarten through college science education program.

The IAS seeks to serve as an information gathering and distributing agency leaving the initiative to make use of consultants to recipients of the information.

The information gathered here will be distributed to science teachers across the state. A proposal will be presented to the Board of Directors at the April meeting.

4) A symposium on social concerns of scientists:

This symposium would be aimed at the 1974 or 1975 meeting of the IAS. Focus of such a symposium could be on any combination of three topics:

- A. the role or non-role of scientists in governmental decision-making;
- the role of scientists in schools and colleges in forming images and attitudes;
- C. the importance of the participation of scientists within the grassroots political process. Paul Smith is working on this symposium and the committee hopes to make a recommendation at the April meeting.

The Committee also investigated in-service workshops, OE and NSF funding for committee activities.

MINUTES OF THE SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS COMMITTEE April 27, 1973

The Social Implications Committee of the IAS convened at luncheon at 12:30 p.m., at the Christiansen residence, Grinnell, Iowa, Friday, April 27, 1973.

The following topics were discussed:

1. Symposium Plans for the IAS

After a brief discussion, the committee formulated their intention in the following statement: The Social Implications Committee of the IAS seeks to encourage the Academy to place a major emphasis on Scientists' Contributions to Public Decision–Making at an annual meeting, probably in April, 1974.

Paul Smith reported on corresponce he had from two possible speakers for such a meeting:

- 1) Detlov Bronk The reply was dated 19 April 1973.

 Dr. Bronk is former president of the National Academy of Science,
 1950-62; Chairman of the Board of National Science Foundation, 1956-64;
 a member of the President's Advisory Commission, 1956-73; recipient of
 55 honorary degrees, among many more distinguished honors. He is now
 at Rockefeller University, New York City.
 - 2) Edward E. David, Jr. The reply was dated 16 February 1973.

 Dr. David is Executive Vice President of Research, Development and Planning for the U. S. Government. The Committee agreed that he would be considered a back-up speaker for Detlov Bronk.

If the stated intentions of this Committee meet with the approval of the Board of Directors, it is hoped that the sectional chairmen, program committee or other suitable body would encourage papers augmenting this theme.

II. Scientist-Consultant Program

Discussion of the Scientist-Consultant Program followed. Paul Smith presented a working model of a means of listing categories (of achievement and expertise) for scientists to check, providing they are willing to partake in this program. This model met with the approval of the committee with only minor changes in wording. Paul Joslin will put together a final copy including these minor changes.

These data will be arranged in such a manner that a composite can be photocopied and sent to those seeking scientist consultants. Dr. R. W. Hanson consented to the use of his office as a clearing house for such information.

III. Soil Conservation Symposium

Kenneth Christiansen announced that the Soil Conservation Symposium formerly planned for this spring (of minutes 1/20/73) had now been moved to autumn. Frank Mendell is the convening chairman; a committee has been appointed consisting of the following members:

Wm. Greiner, Director of Iowa Department of Soil Conservation Fred Higginbottom, President Iowa Soil Conservation Society Roger Landers, Professor of Botany and Plant Pathology, ISU Dick Wilcox, Iowa Soil Conservancy District Frank Schaller, Extension Agronomist, ISU

This symposium would proceed with joint sponsorship with the IAS.

IV. Scientist-in-Residence Program

Kenneth Christiansen reported that the Scientist-in-Residence Program (of minutes 1/20/73) would likely be dropped from lack of interest. He stated that every service organization in the state had been circularized with too few replies to make the program feasible.

V. Funding for the Social Implications Committee

Dropped, also, will be any request for funding for the Social Implications Committee (of minutes 1/20/73).

VI. Circulation of the Landers report

Paul Smith reported that he was in the process of preparing a summary of the Landers Report (of minutes 1/20/73) for publicity.

VII. Informal Discussion

- a) The attention of the committee was called to the lack of publicity concerning the educational opportunities for teachers and pupils concerning scholarships, workshops, etc., credited or non-credited. Paul Joslin agreed to prepare a news release for local papers listing these. Kenneth Christiansen will then attempt to get these to the teachers via the press.
- b) Members of the Committee expressed concern about elementary and high school teachers teaching subjects outside their fields of certification, particularly in high school physics.

There being no more new business to present to the committee, the meeting adjourned at 2:00. The committee expressed its thanks for the gracious hospitality of Dr. and Mrs. Christiansen.

REPORT OF THE STUDENT PROGRAMS COMMITTEE

The past year has been rather busy with a variety of different happenings. A number of the aspects of the proposed restructuring of the lowa Junior Academy of Science have been implemented. One notable aspect concerned the involvement of the IJAS in the UNI Science Symposium and the U of I lowa Junior Science, Engineering and Humanities Symposium. The top two students selected at the 1972 Academy meeting presented their papers to general sessions at the UNI Science Symposium in November and then, accompanied by Frank Starr, went to Washington, D.C. in December and presented their papers at the American Junior Academy of Science. Twelve student papers were presented at the U of I Symposium, ten of which were invited to present papers at Grinnell.

Edward Pizzini was appointed Acting Director of IJAS. Ed Pizzini, in his capacity with the Extension Division of the University of Iowa, is in a rather unique position to stimulate the development of the new coordinated plan of student programs reported in the 1972 Annual Report. Through the U of I Extension Division, he is provided with released time to direct IJAS activities and visitations as well as partial support for traveling expenses associated with student visitations, workshops, symposia and field programs.

Frank Starr, Director of IJAS Field Programs, has developed an exciting and worthwhile program for elementary, junior high and senior high students and their teachers. The field programs are listed below:

Okoboji Science Survey (Senior High) - September, 1972 Springbrook Winter Survey (Senior High) - February, 1973 Springrook Survey (Elementary) March, 1973 Springbrook Survey (Junior High) - April, 1973 Red Rock Survey (Senior High) - May, 1973 Bloody Run Survey (Senior High) - May, 1973

The involvement of elementary and junior high students and teachers has added new dimension to the student programs and has been well received. This aspect coupled wifh the fact that the field programs are self-supporting has made them a very viable part of Student Programs.

A newsletter, <u>Sigh Ants</u>, has been initiated and distributed to some 2300 teachers throughout <u>Iowa</u> as well as to all student participants in various programs.

We have been running behind in the regionalization aspect of IJAS. Some of the monies requested in last year's budget were intended to prime the regional pumps. This will be one of the major focal points during the 1973–74 campaign. It is hoped that with greater regional participation the quality and quantity of student research can be increased, more students can be touched, a larger number and variety of field excursions can be conducted, community betterment campaigns can be initiated and communication between science prone students can be enhanced as well as communication with teachers and Academy members.

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN of the DISTRIBUTION OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE IOWA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE 1972

In November, 1971, after the Board of Directors of the Iowa Academy of Science had agreed to allow the Iowa State University Library to dispose of excess numbers of the PROCEEDINGS, the following scale of volumes to be retained for backsets was agreed to:

1 - 5 years	150 copies
5 - 15 years	75 copies
15 - 25 years	50 copies
25 years and older	25 copies

Before cutting back our stock to these figures, we arranged with the approval of the Board, for a special sale. Complete sets (less out-of-print volumes) were offered at \$25.00 plus postage and individual volumes at \$.50 plus postage. The sale was in effect from January 3, 1972, to May 1, 1972. During this sale nine complete sets totaling \$274.58 were sold. During the year 176 miscellaneous volumes were sold totaling \$181.73. This figure includes both volumes sold at the special rate and regular backset issues.

REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON THE ARTICULATION BETWEEN TWO- AND FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES

This committee met once during the year. In the report to the Board of Directors at that time it was emphasized that the most important factor in successful articulation was the exchange of information and ideas between the teachers in the 4-year colleges and the teachers in the 2-year colleges. The best efforts of this sort appeared to be at the level of the individual disciplines—that is biology teachers, chemistry teachers, physics teachers, etc. It was the consensus of the committee that wider efforts to accomplish this articulation were not being too successful.

The committee also discussed the role of the Academy with respect to the continued activities of retired scientists. It was recommended that the Board refer this subject to the Social Implications Committee.

Teachers of scientific subjects in the Vo-Tech programs in Community Colleges are not at present accommodated in the Academy. The committee considered this problem which was originally brought up at the April, 1972 Board Meeting. A member of the committee, John McCurdy, made an initial survey of such personnel at Marshalltown Community College where he teaches. He found over 50% quite receptive to the possibility of Academy membership. It would appear that following up these membership possibilities should be recommended to the Membership Committee.

Unless the scope of the present ad hoc committee is broadened by the Board of Directors, it would seem that its existence should be terminated. Its main reason for existing has been the encouragement of articulation, but this activity seems best to be limited to informal exchanges of information.

Constitution, Bylaws, and Articles of Incorporation

CONSTITUTION OF THE IOWA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE, INC. (Adopted 1970 and Amended 1972)

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as The Iowa Academy of Science and shall be incorporated under the laws of the State of Iowa.

ARTICLE II - OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Iowa Academy of Science shall be the promotion of interest in the sciences, in scientific research, improvement of instruction in the sciences, the dissemination of scientific knowledge, and the recognition of high achievement in attaining these objectives in the State of Iowa.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Classes of Membership. The membership shall consist of Emeritus Fellows, Life Fellows, Fellows, Associates, Student Associates, Corporate Members, and Institutional Members. No candidate for membership shall be excluded on the basis of sex, religion, race, color, or national origin.
- la. *Emeritus Fellows*. Fellows who are 60 or more years of age and who have been members in good standing for a total of 15 years and are retired (from their regular occupation) may request transfer to the status of Emeritus Fellow.
- lb. Life Fellows. Any fellow in good standing may automatically become a Life Fellow by payment of the transfer fee as provided in the Bylaws.
- lc. Fellows. Fellows shall be elected from persons actively engaged in research in science, or teaching science, or administration in science. They must be nominated by two members and the nomination must be approved by the Membership Committee. Assent of three-fourths of the members present at an annual business meeting shall be necessary for election.
- ld. Associates. Persons interested in the progress of science may apply for Associate membership, even though they may not be actively engaged in scientific work.
- le. Student Associates. Bona fide students in institutions of higher learning may apply for membership as Student Associates. Their student status must be vouched for by a professor in the department of the institution in which they are enrolled.

lf. Corporate and Institutional Members. Corporate and Institutional Members shall be corporations or institutions which are interested in science and in support of the Academy. Each corporation or institution may designate one representative who shall have voting privileges in the Academy.

Section 2. *Privileges*. Fellows of all classes shall be eligible to hold offices of the Academy and shall have full voting privileges. Associates, Student Associates, and representatives designated by Corporate and Institutional Members shall be entitled to all privileges granted to Fellows except the holding of elective office.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1. President. The President-elect shall succeed to the office of President at the adjournment of the next Annual Meeting following his election. He shall serve as President for a period of one year. He shall discharge the usual duties and have such powers as generally pertain to his office or as may be required by this Constitution or by the Bylaws, or by the Articles of Incorporation, or by the Board of Directors. In event of his resignation, absence, disability, or death, the duties of President shall be assumed for the remainder of the unexpired term by the President-elect. Should he be unavailable, the duties of the President shall be assumed for the remainder of the unexpired term by a Fellow, properly qualified, appointed by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. President-Elect. A President-elect shall be elected annually in accordance with the Bylaws; his term of office shall commence at the adjournment of the Annual Meeting. The President-elect shall become President at the adjournment of the Annual Meeting in the following year. He shall perform such duties and have such powers as required by this Constitution, or by the Bylaws, or by the Articles of Incorporation, or by the Board of Directors. In event of his resignation, absence, disability, or death, his duties shall be assumed for the remainder of the unexpired term by a Fellow, properly qualified, appointed by the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected annually in accordance with the Bylaws; his term of office shall commence on the first of July next following the date of his election. The Treasurer shall serve as the Chairman of the Finance Committee and shall be custodian of all non-operating funds and endowments of the Academy. He shall arrange for the audit of the general operating account that is in the custody of the Executive Secretary and shall prepare an annual financial statement of the Academy's assets. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties and have such powers as required by this Constitution, or by the Bylaws, or by the Articles of Incorporation, or by the Board of Directors. In event of his resignation, absence, disability, or death, his duties shall be assumed for the remainder of the unexpired term by a Fellow designated by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Executive Secretary. The Executive Secretary shall be appointed by the Board of Directors at its Annual Meeting. His term of office shall commence on the first of July following his appointment. He shall be custodian of the operating funds of the Academy and shall collect all monies due the Academy. The Executive Secretary will perform such other duties and have such powers as required by this Constitution, or by the Bylaws, or by the Articles of Incorporation, or by the Board of Directors. In event of his resignation, absence, disability, or death, his duties shall be assumed for the balance of the unexpired term by a Fellow appointed by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Editor of the Proceedings. The Editor of the Proceedings shall be appointed by the Board of Directors at its Annual Meeting. His term of office shall commence at the adjournment of the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors. His duties, powers, and term of office shall be as required by this Constitution, or by the Bylaws, or by the Articles of Incorporation, or by the Board of Directors. In event of his resignation, absence, disability, or death, his duties shall be assumed for the remainder of the unexpired term by a Fellow, properly qualified, appointed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. Authority. The authority to manage the affairs of the Academy shall be vested in the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors is empowered to engage the services of qualified individuals to assist in the proper execution of the activities of the Academy.
- Section 2. Membership. The Board of Directors shall consist of twelve members, including the President, President-elect, the Treasurer, the most recent Past-president, the Editor of the Proceedings, the Executive Secretary, plus six additional Fellows to serve three year terms, two to be elected at each Annual Meeting of the Academy. None of the six elected Directors shall be chairmen of Standing Committees.
- Section 3. In the event of the resignation, absence, disability, or death of a Director, the balance of his unexpired term shall be filled by a Fellow appointed by the remaining members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI - PROSCRIPTIONS

- Section 1. The Academy shall be organized and operated exclusively for the advancement of scientific work and science-related educational activities in the State of Iowa.
- Section 2. The Academy shall not be organized nor operated for profit, either to itself or to any officer of, member of, or substantial contributor to, the Academy. This shall not, however, prevent the Academy from engaging in all activities permitted to it by Article IV of the Articles of Incorporation.

Section 3. The Academy shall not pay compensation to any member, nor to any other individual, beyond that which is a reasonable salary or compensation for personal services actually rendered to the Academy.

Section 4. No substantial part of the activities of the Academy shall consist of dissemination of propaganda or the influencing of legislation; provided, however, that the Academy may make public factual information which provides background on issues directly concerned with conservation or scientific endeavors in the State of Iowa.

Section 5. The Academy shall not participate in, nor intervene in, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual Meeting of the Academy by assent of two-thirds of the votes cast, provided that notice of the proposed amendment has been sent to the members at least one month previous to the meeting, and that any absent member may cast his vote by placing it in a sealed envelope and depositing it with the Executive Secretary in advance of the meeting.

BYLAWS OF THE IOWA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE Adopted 1970 and Amended 1972 and 1973

ARTICLE I - MEETINGS

Annual meetings of the Academy shall be held on or about the third Friday and Saturday of April, unless otherwise decided by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II - QUORUM

A quorum at the business session of the Annual Meeting shall consist of twenty-five members, of whom at least twenty shall be Fellows.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. The Board of Directors shall meet at least twice each year, once in a regular annual session in the spring of each year immediately preceding the Annual Meeting of the Academy, and once on a date set by the Executive Committee, normally in the fall of the year at a time and place designated by the President. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President upon recommendation of the Executive Committee.
- Section 2. The President of the Academy shall serve as the presiding officer of the Board of Directors. He may invite chairmen of Standing Committees, or other Academy members, individually to sit with the Board and to participate on a non-voting basis in the deliberations of the Board.
- Section 3. The President, President-elect, Treasurer and Executive Secretary shall constitute an Executive Committee which shall be empowered to act for the Board on an interim basis when action is necessary between the meetings of the Board. Such actions shall be reported to the Board at its next meeting for its approval.

ARTICLE IV - EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

- Section 1. Duties . The duties of the Executive Secretary shall be:
- $$\operatorname{\sc la}$)$$ to implement the policy decisions of the Board of Directors.
- lb) to maintain the central office of the Academy as its place of business, to prepare federal and state income tax returns for the Academy, and to keep on file the letters of incorporation and postal permits.
- lc) to receive and disburse money in the normal operation of Academy business, under the supervision of the Treasurer.

- ld) to maintain an accurate and up-to-date list of members of the Academy and their dues records, with dates of their election to the different classes of membership, their sectional affiliations, and the date of their separation from the Academy.
- le) to prepare the agenda of and keep records of the proceedings of the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors, and the Academy.
- lf) to coordinate the activities of the various officers, committee chairmen, the Iowa Junior Academy of Science, and other Academy projects.
- lg) to have charge of the preparation, printing, and mailing of circulars, blanks, notifications, and programs of meetings, etc.
- 1h) to act as editor of the IAS Bulletin and to handle subscription matters for the Iowa Science Teachers Journal.
- li) to prepare an Annual Report and Membership List of the Academy.
- lj) to assist the Finance Committee in the interaction between the Academy and any corporations or institutions desirous of encouraging scientific endeavors in Iowa, either by Corporate or Institutional Membership or by other projects.
- lk) to serve as the representative of the Academy on the Council of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and at the meeting of the Association of Academies of Science held in conjunction with the AAAS annual meeting.
- 11) to do all things within his power, as directed by the Board of Directors, to enhance and extend the effectiveness of the Academy.
- Section 2. *Committee Membership*. The Executive Secretary shall be a member of the Executive Committee and an ex-officio non-voting member of all Standing Committees.

ARTICLE V - EDITOR

- Section 1. Term of Office. The Editor of the Proceedings of the Iowa Academy of Science shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for a four year term.
- Section 2. Duties. The Editor shall supervise and edit the content of the Proceedings of the Iowa Academy of Science with the help of an Editorial Committee made up of Section Editors recommended by the sections and approved by the Board of Directors. The Editor shall be an ex-officio member of the Publications Committee.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

Section 1. Standing Committees. The incoming President shall appoint Standing Committees, as named in the following sections, immediately at the close of the Annual Meeting. The responsibilities of each Standing Committee shall begin upon appointment.

Section 2. Annual Meeting Committee.

- 2a) This committee will be made up of the local arrangements chairman for theAnnual Meeting just concluded, the local arrangements chairman for the forthcoming Annual Meeting, and four other Fellows who have preferably served as Section Chairmen, two of whom will be appointed each year to serve two year terms. One of the appointed Fellows should be from the institution to host the meeting two years hence.
- 2b) The chairman of the committee will be appointed by the President.
- 2c) The duties of the Annual Meeting Committee will be to develop general plans for future Annual Meetings and to consider invitations from potential host institutions. They will evaluate each Annual Meeting Meeting in terms of various measures of success no later than October 1 following the meeting and make recommendations for the general planning and format for the next two Annual Meetings. The Executive Secretary, the local arrangements chairman and the Section Chairmen will work closely together to implement the recommendations of the Annual Meeting Committee in planning each Annual Meeting.

Section 3. Elections Committee.

- 3a) The Elections Committee shall be made up of six Fellows each serving two year terms with three members being appointed each year.
 - 3b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 3c) The duties of the Elections Committee shall be to nominate candidates for the offices of President-elect, Treasurer, and Directors such that there is more than one candidate provided for each vacancy. The Committee shall gather biographical data on each candidate and prepare election materials to be distributed by mail from the central office at least 45 days prior to the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be returned to the central office by mail and turned over to the Elections Committee for counting. The chairman of the Elections Committee shall report the result of the election at the Annual Meeting.

Section 4. Finance Committee.

- 4a) The Finance Committee shall be composed of the Treasurer and at least six Fellows appointed for three year terms with two appointed each year.
 - 4b) The Treasurer shall serve as chairman.

4c) The duties of the Finance Committee shall be to solicit financial support in the form of Corporate and Institutional Memberships, contributions, grants, bequests, and endowments. It shall seek optimum return on Academy investments and income property.

Section 5. Membership Committee.

- 5a) The Membership Committee shall be made up of six Fellows appointed for three year terms with two members appointed each year.
 - 5b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 5c) The Membership Committee will annually conduct a membership drive to increase membership in the categories of Associate, Fellow, and Student Associate. It shall review nominations of new Fellows, applications for transfer from Associate to Fellow status, and requests for transfer to Emeritus status, and requests such approved actions at the Annual Meeting. It shall inform itself of deaths among members of the Academy and prepare obituaries annually of such members.

Section 6. Publications Committee.

- 6a) The Publications Committee shall consist of the Editor, ex-officio, and six other Fellows serving three year terms, two of the six being appointed each year.
 - 6b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 6c) Duties. Matters relating to all Academy publications, excepting programs, shall be referred to the Publications Committee by the Board of Directors. It shall report recommendations to the Board of Directors for action.
 - Section 7. Recognition and Awards Committee.
- 7a) The Recognition and Awards Committee shall consist of six Fellows each serving three year terms, two being appointed each year.
 - 7b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 7c) Duties. One member of this committee will act as the coordinator of the Excellence in Teaching Awards program; another member will act as the chairman of the AAAS Research Grants Committee. The committee as a whole will deal with matters relating to all recognition and awards programs of the Academy other than the Science Talent Search.
 - Section 8. Social Implications Committee.
- 8a) The Social Implications Committee shall consist of six Fellows appointed for three year terms, two being appointed each year.
 - 8b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 8c) Duties. Matters relating to the social and environmental implications of science and Academy activities shall be referred to this committee by the Board of Directors. The committee shall report recommendations to the Board of Directors for action.

- Section 9. Student Programs Committee.
- 9a) The Student Programs Committee shall consist of six Fellows, one of whom is selected by the Science Teaching Section as its representative. Each member of the committee shall serve a three-year term. Two members shall be appointed each year. The Director of the Iowa Junior Academy shall be an ex-officio member.
 - 9b) The chairman shall be designated by the President.
- 9c) Duties. This committee shall support and supervise the activities of the Iowa Junior Academy of Science and the Iowa Science Talent Search. All matters relating to Academy programs for pre-college students shall be referred to this committee by the Board of Directors.
- Section 10. Temporary Committees. The President may appoint temporary committees, of suitable size, at intervals as needs arise. The committees shall serve one year. Temporary committees may be reappointed annually. The President shall designate the chairman of each committee and shall specify duties for each committee, in writing, to the chairman.

ARTICLE VII - SECTIONS

- Section 1. Formation of Sections. Twenty-five or more persons may petition the Executive Secretary for the establishment of a new section. At the time of petitioning they shall suggest an appropriate name for the section. If the petition is favorably voted on by the Board of Directors, a temporary section chairman shall be designated by the President. New sections will be considered temporary for at least one year, at the discretion of the Board of Directors.
- Section 2. Privileges. Each section shall elect a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman who are Fellows in the Academy. The Vice-Chairman shall become the Chairman in the following year. Each section is empowered to perfect its own organization as limited by the Constitution and Bylaws of the Academy. The Section Chairman shall report its organization and names of newly elected officers to the Executive Secretary immediately following their election. Each section may propose to the Elections Committee for their consideration any Academy member for each office of the Academy to be filled in the next annual election.
- Section 3. Dissolution. If a section does not prepare and conduct a sectional program at the Annual Meeting for two consecutive years it may be dissolved by the Board of Directors; or three-quarters of the membership of a section may petition the Executive Committee, at any time, for dissolution of the section.

ARTICLE VIII - PUBLICATIONS

Section 1. Official Organ. The official organ of the Academy shall be the Proceedings of the Iowa Academy of Science.

- la) The *Proceedings* shall include such scientific papers presented to the Academy by members as are offered and accepted for publication and such organizational and informational material as is deemed of importance and is not transmitted to members by other methods.
- lb) Papers from non-members shall be accepted for publication at the discretion of the Editor.
- 1c) The Proceedings shall be sent to all members of the Academy who are in good standing.
- Section 2. Newsletter. The IAS Bulletin shall be published periodically as the official newsletter of the Academy. The editor shall be the Executive Secretary.
- Section 3. The *Iowa Science Teachers Journal* shall be published for members and special subscribers and shall be open to all persons interested in science education; preferential consideration shall be given to Academy members. The editor shall be appointed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX - LIBRARY

The Iowa State University Library shall be the depository for the Proceedings of the Iowa Academy of Science, and the Director of that library shall be requested to serve as Librarian of the Academy. The Librarian shall arrange for the distribution of the Proceedings, in cooperation with the Executive Secretary and will arrange for such library exchanges and sales as he deems appropriate. The Librarian may be invited to meet with the Board of Directors when matters pertaining to the library policies of the Academy are under consideration.

ARTICLE X - AAAS AFFILIATION

The Academy shall be affiliated with the American Association for the Advancement of Science, and shall be represented on the Council of that organization by the Executive Secretary, who shall also serve as a representative to the Association of Academies of Science held in conjunction with the AAAS annual meeting. The President shall designate a Fellow to represent the Academy in the absence of the Executive Secretary.

ARTICLE XI - IOWA JUNIOR ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

- Section 1. The Academy shall maintain a Junior Academy as a means of discovering and fostering ability and interest in science among high school students, under the supervision of the Student Programs Committee.
- Section 2. The Director of the Junior Academy shall be a Fellow in the Academy, appointed by the Board of Directors for a term of one year. He should succeed himself in office for a minimum of three years to provice continuity in Junior Academy affairs.
- Section 3. The Junior Academy is empowered to perfect its own organization as limited by the Constitution and Bylaws of the Academy.

ARTICLE XII - FINANCE

- Section 1. The fiscal year of the Academy and its agencies shall be from July 1 through June 30 of the following year.
- Section 2. Budget. The Executive Secretary, in consultation with Academy officers and agency heads concerned, shall prepare an annual asking-budget of income and expenditures for the new fiscal year and present it to the Board of Directors at their Annual Meeting for approval or amendment. The Executive Secretary is authorized to make only those expenditures provided for in the approved annual budget. Emergency-deficiency appropriations shall be approved by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. Dues.

- 3a) Emeritus Fellows shall be exempt from all fees.
- 3b) The Board of Directors shall be empowered to recommend annual dues. The establishment of such dues as are recommended by the Board of Directors shall be by majority vote of the members at an annual business session of the Academy.
- 3c) The dues shall be ten dollars per year for Fellows and Associates, and four dollars per year for Student Associates.
- 3d) Any Fellow in good standing may become a Life Fellow by making a dues payment of \$150 under terms set by the Board of Directors.
- 3e) Corporate and Institutional Membership shall be conferred upon a corporation or institution which pays minimum dues of \$50 annually.
- 3f) The membership year of the Academy shall coincide with the calendar year. New members joining after October 1 shall have their dues credited to the following membership year unless requested otherwise by the member.
- 3g) Non-payment of dues by December 31 shall constitute a request for withdrawal from the Academy.
- Section 4. Basic financial policies of the Academy shall be formulated and investments for the Academy shall be made by the Board of Directors with the advice of the Finance Committee or other appropriate consultants.
- Section 5. Funds from Life Fellowship payments shall be invested and only the interest therefrom shall be used for current expenses of the Academy.
- Section 6. An annual audit of the financial records of the Academy shall be made by an auditing committee appointed by the President. The report of the Auditing Committee on the records of the calendar year just past shall be presented to the Board of Directors at its next Annual Meeting.

Section 7. The surety bond of the Treasurer and of the Executive Secretary shall be fixed and approved by the Board of Directors. The bond in each case shall be sufficient to cover the maximum amount of monies and negotiable securities in the custody of the Treasurer and Executive Secretary, respectively.

ARTICLE XIII - AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended at any Annual Meeting of the Academy by the recommendation of the Board of Directors and the affirmative vote of a majority of the Academy members present.

RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

0F

IOWA ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 39 of Chapter 504A, Code of Iowa (1966), the undersigned corporation adopts the following Restated Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be Iowa Academy of Science.

ARTICLE II

This corporation shall have perpetual existence unless sooner dissolved by a three-fourths (3/4) vote of all of the members thereof.

ARTICLE III

The principal place of business of this corporation shall be located in Cedar Falls, Black Hawk County, Iowa. The registered office shall be located in the Science Building, University of Northern Iowa, Cedar Falls, Iowa, and the registered agent shall be Robert W. Hanson at the same address.

ARTICLE IV

The object and purposes of this corporation shall be the encouragement of scientific work and to own and/or to lease sufficient and suitable real estate, buildings and structures; to accept gift, to purchase, sell, hold, manage, mortgage, convey, and otherwise acquire, rent, maintain and dispose of real estate and personal property as may be necessary and proper for the conduct and advancement of said scientific work; and to do any and all other things that are necessary and incident to the execution of the objects and purposes herein specified.

ARTICLE V

The members of the corporation shall be all persons engaged or interested in the objects and purposes of the corporation who are duly elected to membership therein as provided in the Bylaws of this corporation.

ARTICLE VI

The business affairs of the corporation shall be managed and controlled by the Board of Directors to be elected at the annual meeting in such manner and form as may be provided in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII

- Sec. 1. The officers of the corporation shall perform such duties and have such powers as generally appertain to such offices or as may be required of them by the Bylaws or by the Board of Directors hereof.
- Sec. 2. Vacancies occurring in the Board of Directors shall be filled by vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors until the ensuing annual meeting, when the vacancies shall be filled by vote of the members of the corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

The annual meeting shall be held on such date and at such place as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX

In all elections for members of the Board of Directors each member of the corporation shall be entitled to one vote.

ARTICLE X

The private property of the members and officers of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of the corporation debts in any amount or to any extent whatever.

ARTICLE XI

The greatest amount of indebtedness to which the corporation may subject itself shall not exceed Three Thousand Dollars.

ARTICLE XII

These articles may be changed, altered, or amended by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting or special membership meeting provided notice is sent to each member in good standing at his last known address, at least one month prior to such meeting and that any absent member may cast his vote by placing it in a sealed envelope and depositing it with the Executive Secretary in advance of the meeting.

ARTICLE XIII

These Restated Articles of Incorporation: (1) correctly set forth the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation of the corporation as heretofore and hereby amended; (2) have been duly adopted as required by law; and (3) supersede the original Articles of Incorporation of the corporation and all amendments thereto.


