Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference

In the late 1970's and the early 1980's, a need arose for conferences to represent collegiate women's athletics because of the decline of the Association of Inter-collegiate Athletics for women (AIAW) and the increased role of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in women's sports.

During this period of transition, some midwestern universities with similar academic and athletic interests bound together in 1982 to form the Gateway Conference.

In August, 1982, the NCAA officially recognized the conference and in September, Patty Viverito was named the first commissioner. Before moving to its permanent headquarters in St. Louis, the Gateway spent three organizational months on the campus of Eastern Illinois University.

The conference is comprised of schools which are members of two different men's conferences. Six Gateway members are in the Missouri Valley Conference — Bradley, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Southern Illinois and Wichita State. Four others are in the Association of Mid-Continent Universities — Eastern Illinois, Northern Iowa, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois.

On August 21, 1985, the Gateway Conference Presidents Council voted to add a Division I-AA football division for six of its members to give their previously all-women's athletics organization. Football playing schools include Eastern Illinois, Illinois State, Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State and Western Illinois. In 1986, Indiana State became the seventh member of the Gateway football division. The move marked the first time in college annals that men's football was added to a women's conference.

The Gateway sponsors championships in 10 sports, including cross country, volleyball, basketball, indoor track and field, swimming and diving, golf, tennis, softball, outdoor track and field and football.

The Gateway, which geographically covers five states, is one of the nation's strongest conferences because of the well-established athletic programs of its members.

"The conference has made great strides since its inception and I feel we will grow even stronger," Commissioner Viverito comments. "The 10 members are so committed to women's athletics that their well-established programs will get even stronger. In addition, I look forward

to the added excitement and challenge that football brings to this fine conference. The national prominence of football will also help to increase the visibility and enhance the prestige of our women's programs."



Tracie Dittmore

Tracie Dittmore joined the Gateway staff as Director of Information on September 1, 1988. Dittmore is in charge of the conference publicity and media information materials.

A 1980 graduate of Kansas State University, she served eight years as the Associate Service Bureau Director of the Big Eight Conference. There she assisted with all matters pertaining to publicity and promotion. While a student, she worked four years in the Kansas State sports information office.

A native of Holton, KS, Dittmore now resides in St. Louis, MO.



Patty Viverito

The only commissioner to govern the Gateway Conference, **Patty Viverito** is entering her seventh year in that capacity. The 36-year old native of Chicago was selected following a nationwide search in 1982. She has a wide and varied background in athletic marketing and administration. Formerly an account executive for the Tidewater Tides minor league baseball team, she served as special projects director at the University of Texas from 1979-81.

Viverito earned her bachelor's degree from Northern Illinois and her master's degree, with honors, in sports management from Massachusetts.

Northern Iowa Administration



A university and athletic program need sound direction and leadership. The Panthers have the ingredients for success starting at the top.

Dr. Constantine W. Curris assumed the Presidency of the University of Northern Iowa in August, 1983. He is only the seventh chief executive in the University's 108-year history.

Known as "Deno" to the University community, he has emphasized four major themes for the University's development: 1) leadership in strengthening teacher education; 2) development of the School of Business as part of Iowa's economic resurgence; 3) a renewed emphasis upon quality in undergraduate education; and 4) expansion of international studies to prepare students for life in the 21st century.

Prior to assuming the UNI presidency, Curris served 10 years as president of Murray State University in Kentucky. His tenure was characterized by expanding enrollments, extensive academic development and professional accreditation and the development of nationally recognized programs in academic advising and student services. In 1983, the Murray State Board of Regents designated the University's new eight-million-dollar student center as the Curris Center.

Other professional experiences include serving as Dean of Students at Marshall University, Vice-President and Academic Dean of both Midway (KY) Col-

lege and the West Virginia Institute of Technology and a year's service as Director of Educational Programs for the West Virginia State Board of Education.

Curris received a bachelor's degree magna cum laude in political science with a minor in speech communication from Kentucky in 1962. He received a master's in political science with a public administration emphasis from Illinois in 1965 and his Ed.D. degree in higher education with minors in student personnel services and public policy from Kentucky in 1967.

Curris serves as Trustee-Emeritus of Midway College and was a charter member of the National Small Business Development Center Advisory Board. He currently serves as a commissioner of the American Council on Education's Commission on Educational Credit and Credentials and on the Committee on Policies and Purposes of the American Assoc. of State Colleges and Universities. He recently served as chairman of the Task Force on Teacher Education and Certification appointed by the Iowa State Board of Public Instruction and now is serving as a member of the First in the Nation in Education Foundation Governing Board on appointment by the Governor. He serves as an ex-officio member of the Iowa Department of Economic Development Board and is a member of Rotary International.



Robert A. Bowlsby was selected Director of Athletics in mid-February, 1984, after serving as Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities and interim AD when Stan Sheriff resigned the post in September, 1983.

A native of Waterloo, IA, he is a 1970 graduate of West High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation from Moorhead State in 1975 and a master's degree in recreation administration from Iowa in 1978. Bowlsby served as Assistant Director of Recreational Services at Iowa from 1978-81, working in facility management and with responsibilities for supervision of a wide variety of recreation and athletic facilities on campus.

He joined the UNI staff in April of 1981. His experience at UNI has been broadbased, including involvement in all areas of the intercollegiate athletics program and promotion of the UNI-Dome. He has worked with a variety of athletic events, special programs and entertainment attractions.

Since the time of his appointment as Director of Athletics, Bowlsby has been actively involved in the promotion and marketing of the athletics program, the development of the Athletics Hall of Fame and the formulation of the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference football division.

He has served on the NCAA Committee on Financial Aid and Amateurism and the NCAA Wrestling Committee.

1988-89: Seniors Lead Panther Charge

Coach Kimberly Mayden begins her fifth season in Cedar Falls with four experienced seniors returning, her best recruiting class ready to go and the taste of winning at the end of last season. The Panthers won four of their final six games a year ago. It would seem that Northern Iowa is ready to pick up where things left off and make the long awaited run at the upper division of the Gateway Collegiate Conference.

It won't be easy. All-time leading scorer Diane Roberts, the only all-Gateway Conference player Northern Iowa has had, is gone. Also gone is center Kim Smythe. Experience and depth up front could cause some problems. However, two seniors, Sandy Grabowski (Crown Point, IN) and Cindy Harms (Allison, IA), will anchor the frontline.

Both Grabowski and Harms had moments last year when they were unstoppable, but they played inconsistently. This year, senior Chris Shafer (Eddyville, IA) is the only other athlete with size to come in off the bench. She has seen little playing time, however, during her career. That means foul difficulties which have plagued both Grabowski and Harms throughout their careers need to be alleviated to compensate for an inexperienced bench.

"Sandy and Cindy are the two players we're banking on. No doubt about it," Mayden said. "They've looked very good so far. The only worry I have right now is the depth in the frontline."

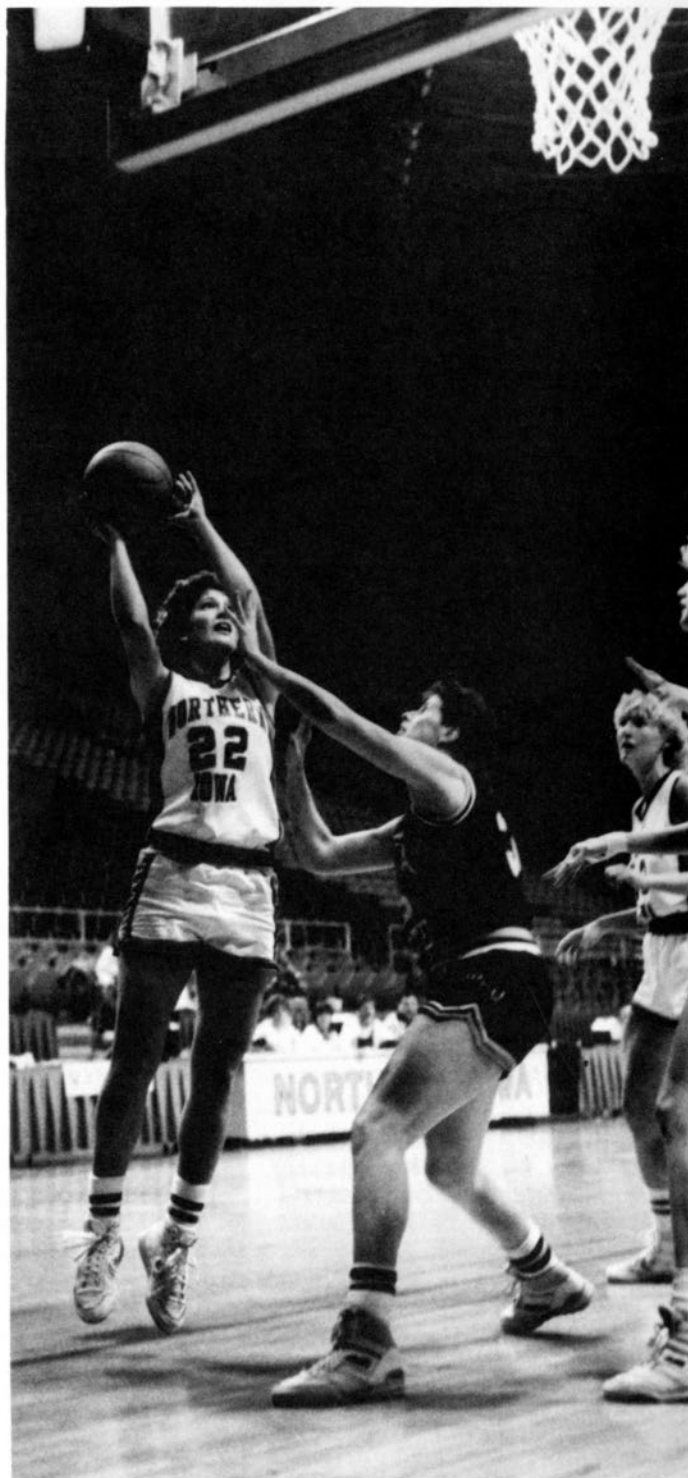

It may be later in the season, but freshman Linda Steiner (Niles, IL) is expected to contribute up front. She has impressive offensive moves, according to Mayden, and could be the best post defensive player on the team by the end of the year. Junior Rhonda Wiebold (Amana, IA) could contribute in the frontline, but her size limits her to the small forward spot. Sophomore Kathy Kolstedt (Racine, WI) was a disappointment as a freshman, but has come back playing the solid, fundamental ball that was hoped for last year.

In addition to foul troubles, poor rebounding has plagued the Panthers during Mayden's four previous seasons. With an offense that will use only two, and sometimes just one, post player, it will be crucial that the seniors have good years on the boards.

"Someone will have to come to the forefront and pick up the scoring and rebounding that Diane gave us," Mayden feels. "One of our forwards really has to be a leader."

While Roberts was one of the best shooters the Gateway Conference has seen, her loss actually could have some positive



effects on the Panthers, as well as the obvious negative ones. Both Grabowski and Harms are exceptionally quick, enabling the Panthers to use more man-to-man pressure up and down the court, and giving them the fast break.

Throughout the first three years of Mayden's tenure and most of last season, the Panthers' offensive strength lay with the forwards. This season, however, the guards are expected to provide much of the offensive punch.

"Looking right now at our backcourt, it's obvious that is where our strength lies," Mayden feels. "Not just because of our experience there, but also because of our depth. We'll be shuffling six players in and out on the perimeter."

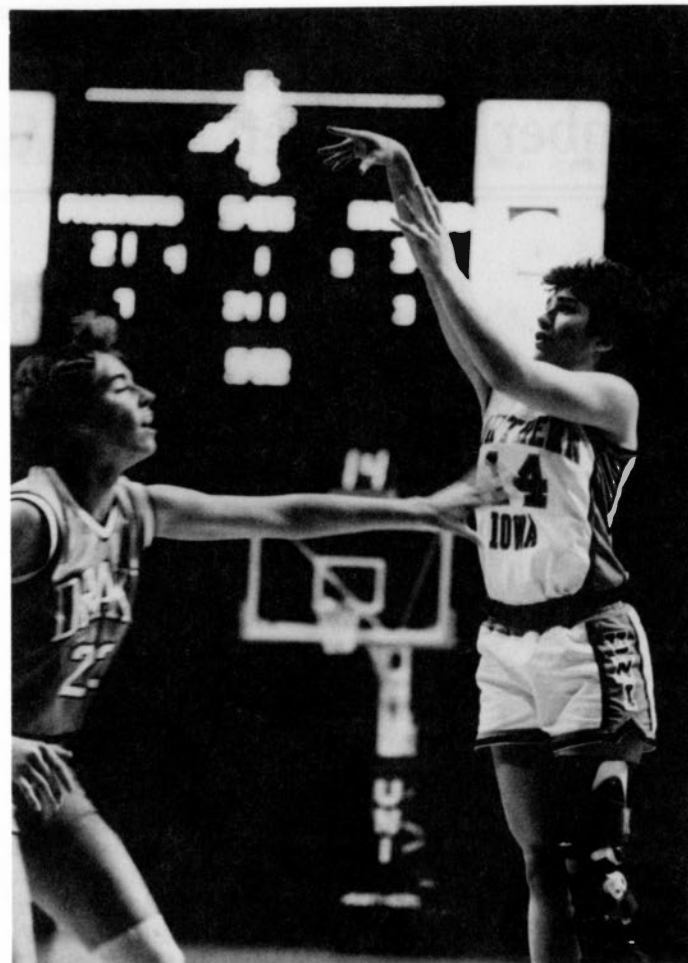
The Panthers' blue-chip guard, Kris Huffman (Fort Dodge, IA), will be expected to provide much of the scoring punch from the off guard-small forward spot. Mayden expects to play three "guards" at one time this season, although the offensive rotation won't distinguish between guard and forward.

Loretha Mosley (Fort Dodge, IA) and Nicki Rohde (Des Moines, IA), definitely the two best athletes on the team, each need to contribute greatly if the Panthers are to have a good year. Mosley, a sophomore, was UNI's best player at the end of last season and with a year of experience under her belt, she is a possible all-league selection. Rohde also had an outstanding freshman year, but struggled last season. As a junior, she will need to pick up her scoring and rebounding numbers from last season and contribute both as an off-guard and a forward.

The point guard spot is as solid as it can be. Molly Kelly (Oshkosh, WI) and Karen Amrhein (Milwaukee, WI) give the Panthers a Badger connection at that spot. Kelly, a junior, sat out two years ago with a knee injury, but rebounded last winter with an exceptional campaign. Admittedly, she lost a little bit of speed with the injury, but showed no other effects. As she gets confidence in her jump shot back, and confidence she won't re-injure her knee, her game will get even better. Amrhein, just a freshman, has showed quickness and an uncanny ability to pass the ball in the early season. However, she broke her left thumb and her right arm during pre-conditioning drills and has to rebound from those injuries before contributing. Mosley also can play the point spot. Freshman Jill Jameson (Crown Point, IN) had outstanding high school credentials and should contribute right away.

"While we've got some experienced people in the guard court," Mayden said, "our main weakness is lack of experience coming off the bench, but I think by mid-season that will be history."



Mayden also feels the shooting of the guards will improve. "Huffman had a great year, and I think Nicki and Molly are good enough shooters to improve on their numbers. Mosley is learning to take the ball to the hoop, and her percentage will increase as she does that."

"When we held teams to less than 68 points last year, we were 7-2," Mayden said. "I'm not worried about our offense, we just need to stop our opponents."

Two years ago, the Gateway Conference prohibited all member schools from playing non-Division I schools. That created a major problem for schools such as UNI in scheduling non-conference opponents. For that reason, the rule was rescinded last year. It's back again this year, though. This year's non-conference slate includes Marquette, St. Louis and Arkansas State. One primary objective of the UNI non-conference schedule is to prime than Panthers for conference games.

As far as the conference goes, Mayden expects a four-team race for the title. Drake and Illinois State should be the front-runners, but always strong Southern Illinois and Eastern Illinois also should contend. Indiana State nearly won the league title last year and could contend again, with Southwest Missouri State, Wichita State and Western Illinois battling with Bradley and UNI for the other spots.

Panther Head Coach Kimberly Mayden



Head coach Kimberly Mayden begins her fifth year in Cedar Falls with something to build upon. The Panthers won four of their final six games last year to give Mayden her best finish since her arrival. Northern Iowa players adapted to the new coaching staff, and Mayden's coaching philosophies in those final six games, and that experience will help her team to succeed in 1988-89.

Northern Iowa is Mayden's third stop on the coaching trail. She was quite successful at her previous ventures, and is rapidly building a strong program at UNI from the ground up. Her first coaching experience was at the high school level in Indiana. With the strong basketball tradition in that state, Mayden's success was even more impressive. Her two teams won 16 games each and her second squad was ranked 18th of over 400 schools. Her teams at North Montgomery High School also won a sectional championship for the first time in school history.

Several players from Mayden's tenure at North Montgomery went on to play Division I basketball. Two of her athletes were voted to the Women's Varsity Sports Magazine all-America team and three others were all-state. One player was named to the Indiana Basketball Coaches Association all-state academic team. Mayden also was selected to coach the Fellowship of Christian Athletes All-Star Classic in 1980 and 1981.

Mayden advanced quickly to the college level. She pursued graduate work at Bemidji State and assisted with the men's basketball team there. She received her master's there in 1982 and received a bachelor's degree in 1979 from Ball State.

Her first coaching assignment at the collegiate level was at Wayne State. There she compiled records of 14-14 and 18-10. The Division II school finished third in the Great Lakes Conference both years, and her squad was ranked in the top five in the Great Lakes Region during the second season. She coached two academic all-Americans and one player who finished in the Top 10 in the nation in scoring. She also coached three all-conference players and one honorable mention all-American.

Finally, in the fall of 1984, Mayden moved to Northern Iowa, succeeding J.D. Anderson. The Panthers were 2-25 the year before her arrival. With only eight players on the roster, six of them already on campus before she arrived, things were difficult early. Since that time, however, she has been rebuilding the program. The Panthers have improved each season, and this year should be no different.

There is more to Mayden's tenure than just what she has done on the court. The quality of recruiting has improved, and those athletes have a propensity for doing well in the classroom, as well. She took over a program just entering Division I and has an established team and staff for the first time in her five years. That, accompanied by a very talented recruiting class, could produce the best season yet in Panther basketball history.

Jane McConnell and Mary Smith



Jane McConnell returns for her second season as first assistant coach under Kimberly Mayden. McConnell is a familiar face to Midwestern basketball fans. She had an outstanding basketball career at Iowa State before beginning her coaching career in her home state of Indiana.

At Iowa State, McConnell was a four-year starting guard until graduation in 1985. She was defensive player-of-the-year in 1983 for the Cyclones and team captain her senior season. She carried her excellence on the court into the classroom, as well, being presented with the Iowa State Academic Athletic Scholarship Award.

Her athletic success goes back to her high school days in Crown Point, IN, where she was three-sport athlete. She was named all-state in basketball, was a state track qualifier and also qualified in swimming. Her achievements led to her being named Crown Point Senior Athlete-of-the-Year.

McConnell graduated from Iowa State with a degree in physical education in May, 1985. She returned to Indiana to coach at Munster High School in 1986 and 1987. She was the freshman coach both seasons and junior varsity coach her second year. During this same period, she was the assistant varsity basketball and track coach. She also headed up the Lady Mustang Basketball Camp in the summer of 1986 and has been an instructor at numerous other camps, including those at Notre Dame, Iowa State and Illinois.

Her responsibilities include coordinating recruiting, academic advising and directing Northern Iowa women's basketball camps. Since she arrived, she also has upgraded the recruiting process and, according to Mayden, broadened the entire scope of the program.



Mary Smith joins Kimberly Mayden's staff this season as her number two assistant. She graduated last spring, cum laude, from Western Illinois, with a degree in psychology and a minor in coaching. She played basketball for the West-erwinds from 1983-1987, being named to the Gateway all-academic team in 1984 and 1985.

Smith has had much experience working in camps and clinics, including three this past summer—Mary Murphy's 1988 Basketball Camp, Dan Gosz Champion Basketball Camp and the Wisconsin Coaches Scouting Service Camp. In total, Smith has worked in over 20 camps and clinics since 1985.

In 1987, she was the volunteer coach of an athlete participating in the Special Olympics.

Smith also was the Student Orientation Board Leader at WIU from 1985-87 and she later played intramurals. She is certified in Illinois as an athletic coach.

Smith's duties with the Panthers include heading up pre-season conditioning, scheduling practice times and handling travel arrangements for UNI.

1987-88: Season-End Surge Brings Hope

The 1987-88 basketball season came to a disappointing end for the Northern Iowa women. Not disappointing because of the record — the 9-17 mark was the best at UNI since the 1982-83 season — but disappointing because it had to end. The Panthers were playing their best basketball of the season and had won four of six games, two in a row, as time ran out.

The rally at the end of the year began in early February with an overtime loss in the UNI-Dome to Southern Illinois. Despite the loss, the close game with a team ranked as high as 11th nationally gave the entire team confidence.

"That game was the turning point in our season," UNI head coach Kimberly Mayden said. "We had been on a downslide, and after that game, we picked things up and played very well the rest of the year."

After that loss, UNI fell to conference co-champion Eastern Illinois before winning in overtime at Western Illinois. A loss to a hot Bradley team followed before a win over a Wisconsin-Green Bay team that was 18-5 at the time. Drake survived a close battle in the UNI-Dome, but UNI avenged earlier losses to Southwest Missouri State and Wichita State with season-ending wins.

"All around, I'd say the Wichita State game was our best effort of the year. We certainly played the best half (second) that we played all season," Mayden said. "Green Bay was also a big win for us. We played well both games."

UNI had to play well in the Wichita State game. In the conference opener in late December in Wichita, the Shockers defeated UNI by 49 points in a game Mayden said was the worst of the year for UNI. In the second meeting, the Panthers generated a 71-point swing in an 80-58 victory.

While the final weeks of the season stand out, the beginning of the year also has its memories. UNI started out 4-2, playing good basketball, but after a loss to Iowa State, the season seemed ready to fall apart as Gateway Conference play opened up.

UNI opened the conference season with six straight losses. A killer of a schedule contributed greatly to the rocky start. The Panthers opened with a trip to Wichita State and Southwest Missouri State before coming home to face Illinois State and Indiana State. Those two teams ended the year as Gateway co-champions.

UNI tripped up Bradley in overtime to snap the six-game streak. Another six-game losing streak began two days later and was capped off with a strong effort against Southern Illinois, after which the turnaround began.

When the year began, Diane Roberts was expected to provide the most highlights. The record-setting senior from Eldora, IA was only 123 points away from becoming UNI's all-time leading scorer. She broke that record early in the conference season and went on to average 14.4 points, putting her career point total at 1,701. She holds 29 school records, more than any other athlete in UNI history.

Roberts is one of two senior co-captains who played their final season last year. The other is Kim Smythe, a forward from Cedar Rapids, IA. Smythe saw action in every game last season and finished her career missing only one game. She ended her career with her best game ever, 13 points and six rebounds, in the Wichita State win.

While those two players had strong seasons, UNI's leading scorer was junior Kris Huffman from Ft. Dodge, IA. The shooting guard averaged 16.1 points, placing her ninth in the league. Her 50.7 field goal percentage also was ninth in the GCAC, and she led the league with an 87.3 free throw percentage. She led the team with 41 percent shooting from three-point range and was second in rebounding.

Another Ft. Dodge, IA, guard, freshman Loretha Mosley, had a brilliant season. She drew the starting nod in the final eight games, finishing in a flurry. She averaged 8.1 points and was the team leader with 81 assists and 63 steals. She had a 24-point effort at Bradley and also grabbed 11 rebounds in one game, despite being the point guard.

Major stumbling blocks for the Panthers were defense and rebounding. UNI was outrebounded by an average of five per game and outscored by nearly eight per game. In games which UNI allowed fewer than 68 points, the Panthers' record was 7-2. Offense has not been a problem since Mayden arrived. UNI averaged just under 70 points last year, but as the defense goes, so go the Panthers.

"I'm pleased with the way the year went," Mayden said. "You have to give the players a lot of credit for not folding when the middle of the season was rough. It shows we are maturing as a team and that is what we've needed to do the past couple of years."

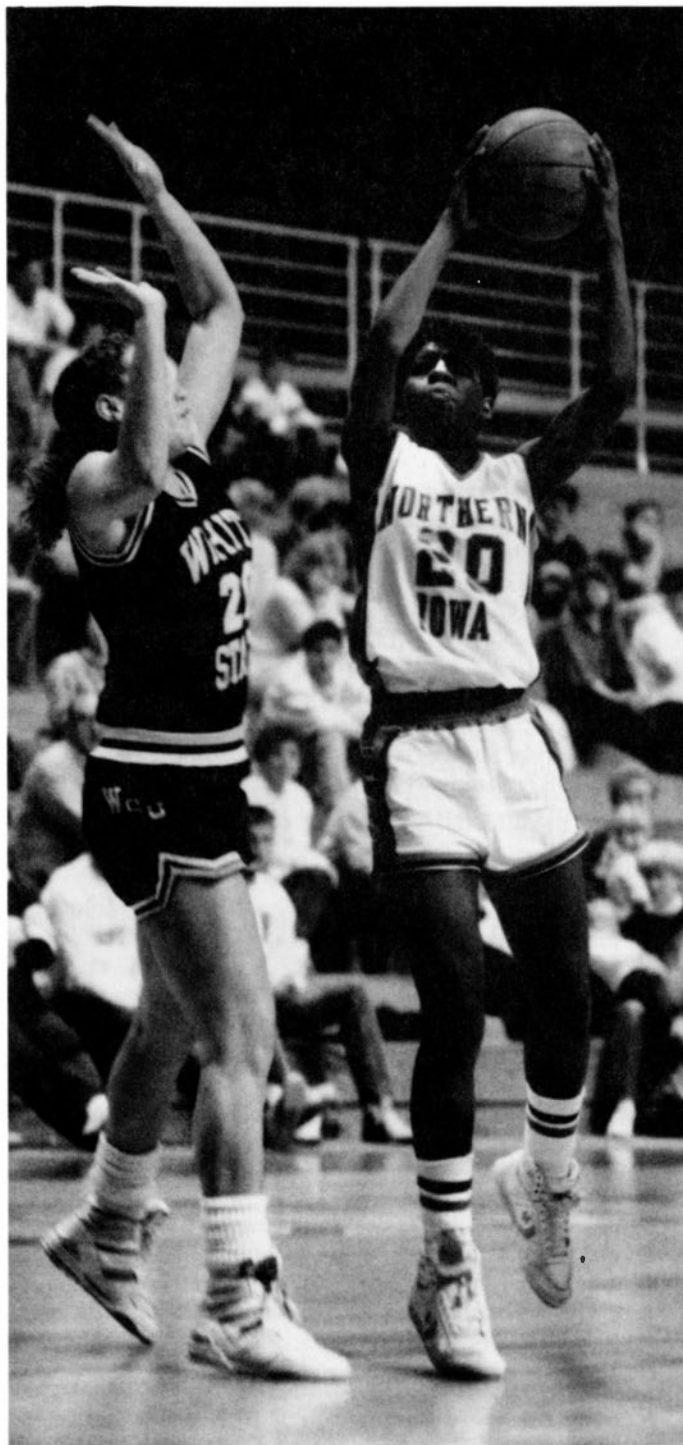

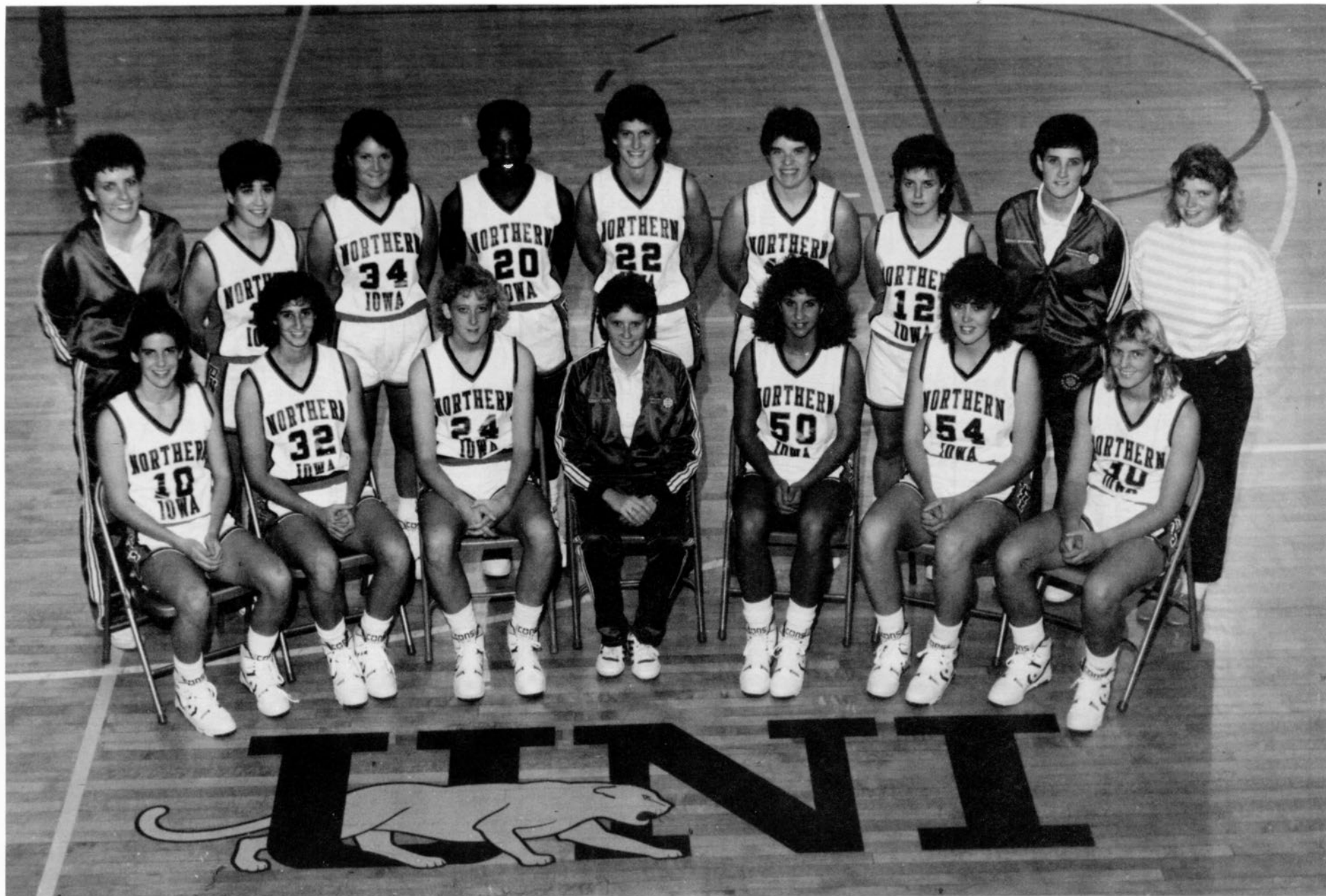

University of Northern Iowa

Northern Iowa is an excellent choice for students who want the atmosphere of a smaller college but the faculty and resources of a larger university. Northern Iowa is student-oriented and makes you feel welcome and challenged while you earn your education with a minimum of hassle.

Located in Cedar Falls, UNI was founded in 1876 as the Iowa State Normal School. From a single building on a 40-acre campus, the University has grown to include more than 40 major buildings and 11,500 students.

UNI emphasizes outstanding undergraduate education with complementary graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. Building on its historic strength in teacher education, Northern Iowa has developed other fine programs in its School of Business, College of Humanities and Fine Arts, College of Natural Sciences and College of Social and Behavioral Sciences.

Northern Iowa publishes the prestigious North American Review, a quarterly journal of literature that has received sev-

eral National Magazine Awards. The University also operates KUNI-FM and KHKE-FM, serving eastern Iowa with quality music and public affairs programming. The Management Development Center and Small Business Development Center are two outreach programs of the School of Business, whose Department of Accounting is ranked among the best in the country.

Landmarks on the 723-acre campus include the Campanile, the Education Center, Strayer-Wood Theatre, Maucker University Union and the UNI-Dome. Special academic resources include the 600,000-volume University Library, the Industrial Technology Center and the Communication Arts Center.

The City of Cedar Falls is a pleasant and historic college town adjacent to Waterloo. Together, they are part of a major metropolitan area with a population of more than 100,000. It is a center for manufacturing, finance, commerce and cultural activities in northeast Iowa.

UNI-Dome

Northern Iowa's fans demand the best from the Panthers on the court and the school provides some of the best facilities in the Midwest.

The UNI-Dome is one of the nation's finest basketball facilities, no matter at what level the game is played. The building actually combines the features of three different buildings—a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. It contains facilities to hold a variety of events, such as concerts, exhibitions, trade shows, pageants, rallies and convocations, as well as football, basketball and softball games and wrestling and track meets.

The UNI-Dome has hosted such events as the NCAA gymnastic and wrestling championships, the Iowa High School football playoffs, concerts by Dolly Parton, the Eagles, REO Speedwagon, Fleetwood Mac and the Rolling Stones, antique car shows, tractor pulls and many other non-athletic events.

The UNI-Dome's air-supported Fiberglass fabric roof allows for ample natural light during daylight hours. Its artificial turf for football games can be rolled up in a minimum of 36 hours. Underneath, on a synthetic floor area, are basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track.

Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football and 10,000 for courtside activities. For stage events, such as commencements, concerts and speaker's series, total capacity, using movable bleachers and chairs, can reach 25,000.

A spacious press box atop the east stands has facilities for 20 radio stations, television capabilities and seating for up to 125 people. A photography darkroom, photo bay, concession area and scouting booths are other features. Two huge scoreboards flash messages and information to spectators throughout events. The west press box provides a meeting room for UNI Athletic Club and space for special events.

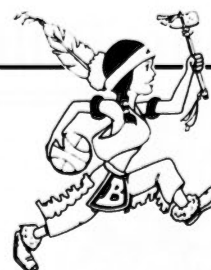
