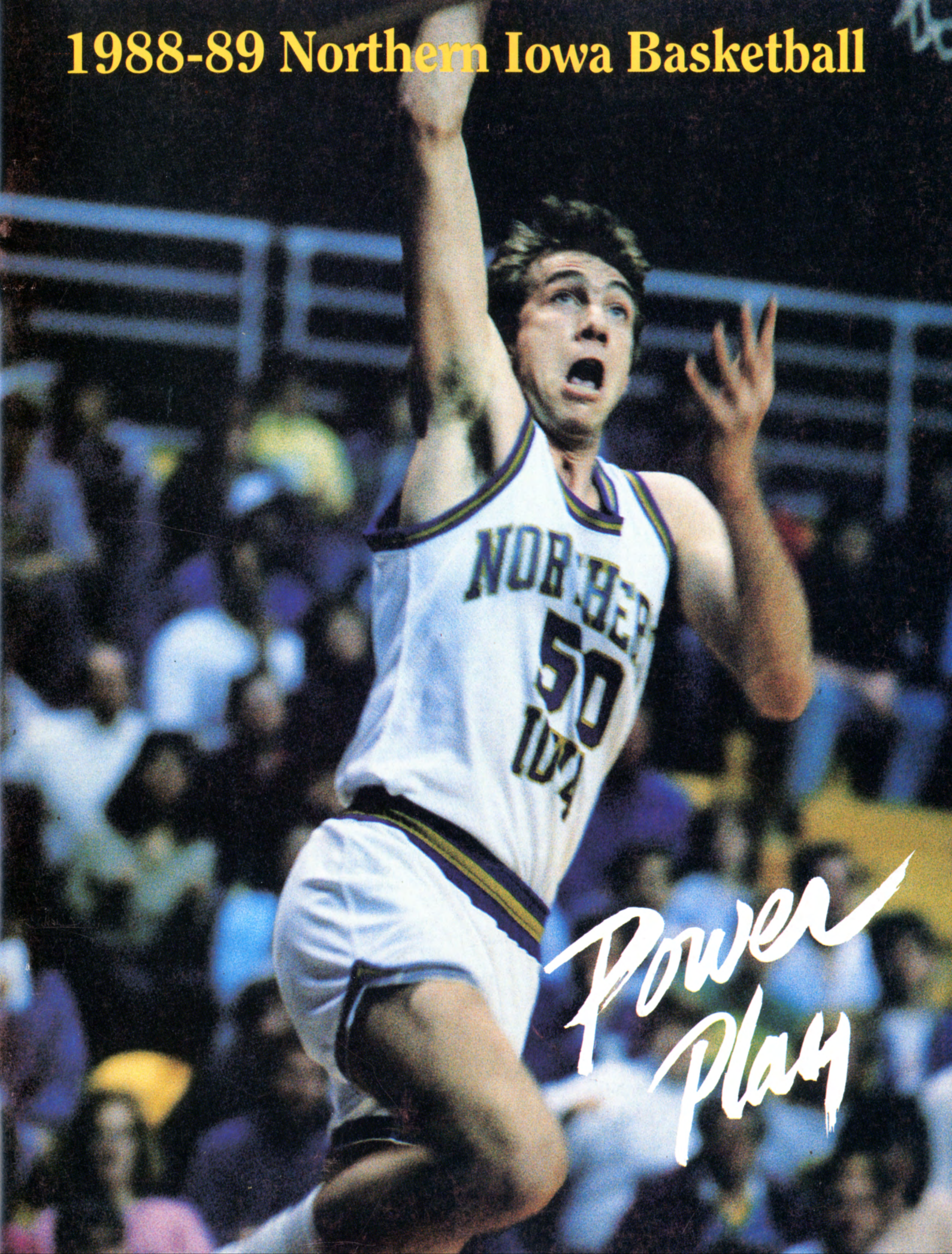

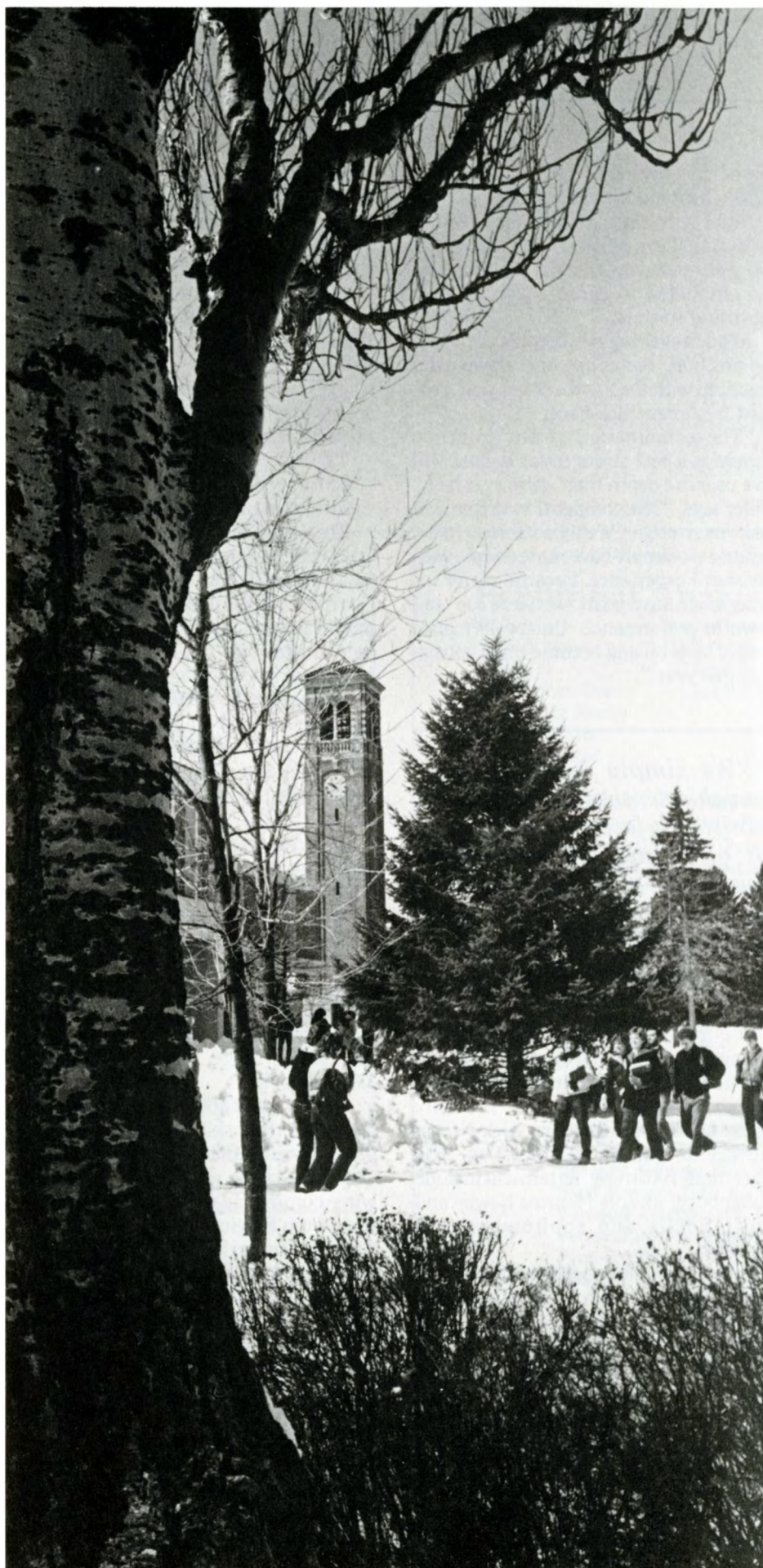

The UNI Community

UNI is an excellent choice for students who want the atmosphere of a smaller college but the faculty and resources of a larger university. UNI is student-oriented and makes you feel welcome and challenged while you earn your education with a minimum of hassle. Located in Cedar Falls, the campus has grown from a single building on a 40-acre site to more than 40 major buildings. Landmarks on the 723-acre campus include the Campanile, the Education Center, Strayer-Wood Theatre, Maucker University Union and the UNI-Dome. Special academic resources include the 600,000-volume University Library, the Industrial Technology Center and the Communication Arts Center. The City of Cedar Falls is a pleasant and historic college town adjacent to Waterloo. Together, they are part of a major metropolitan area with a population of more than 100,000. It is a center for manufacturing, finance, commerce and cultural activities in Northeast Iowa.

Panther Outlook

Superstitious folks like to say that "three's the charm". Northern Iowa head coach Eldon Miller doesn't seem much like the superstitious type, but one of the things that excites him about the upcoming season is this, his third season at the helm with his third recruiting class.

"A real plus for us this coming season is that six players will be eligible to play who weren't able to play last year," Miller says. "Some of these young people will be competing for playing time despite the fact we have a lot of veterans. We expect to get help from our freshman class. We'll have great competition within the squad which will make us stronger. Players will have had to pay a great price over the summer because they know we'll be playing only about eight people this year, whereas in the past we've played 10."

The Panthers ended the 1987-88 season 10-18 overall, down from Miller's first season of 13-15. They were 4-10 in the Association of Mid-Continent Universities, tying for sixth, after finishing fifth the year before.

"We simply were not good enough defensively to win games consistently last year," Miller said. "We scored a lot of points (second in the league), but we would have scored more if we could have gotten more points from our defense."

Miller says the emphasis this season will be placed upon defense and the running game.

"We have to improve defensively as a team and improve our running game, two things which go hand-in-hand," he said. "If we improve defensively, the offense will improve."

The Panthers lose the services of last year's senior co-captains, Mike Bailey and Greg McDermott; co-leading scorer and top rebounder James Parker and walkon Carlos Frazier. Bailey was the third highest rebounder (4.2) and excelled in free throw shooting (.879) and assists (3.4 per game), while McDermott was the third highest scorer (10.8) and fourth highest rebounder (4.0). Parker, a transfer last year, tied with Jason Reese in scoring (14.5) while grabbing 5.7 caroms per game. However, he had difficulty fitting in with the team as the season progressed, which eventually led to his transferring to Chicago State this year. Frazier

played in only eight games, while primarily running the scout team.

Eight lettermen are back for 1988-89, including Troy Muilenburg, a redshirt last season who lettered the previous season. Included in those eight are four returning starters.

In addition, five newcomers are vying for position, including one player who practiced with the Panthers last year, red-shirt freshman Nick Pace.

"The combination of our frontline players is a real strength for us and will give us more depth than we've ever had," Miller says. "The competition within will make us stronger. We'll be stronger, also, because we simply have more people with Division I experience. Because of our inexperience last year, we were up and down in performance. Our performance should level off and become more consistent this year."

The four returning starters, at least those who were starting most often at year's end, include junior forward Steve Phyfe, junior center Reese, the only senior on the squad, guard Nick Nurse; and junior guard Jonathan Cox. The other four returning lettermen include Muilenburg, juniors Maurice Newby and Scott Socha and sophomore Jeff Williams.

Reese, as mentioned, shared top scoring honors with Parker. A two-year starter, he missed two complete games last year with a knee injury.

Nurse, who started all but one game last year, has been an off-and-on starter since his freshman season. He led the team and league last year in three-point field goal percentage (72 of 145 for .497) and averaged 3.5 assists and 1.9 steals.

Phyfe came on strong as the season

progressed, winning a starting role over McDermott at the latter part of the year. He sat out two years ago after transferring from Oral Roberts. He was named to the league's all-Newcomer Team, tying with Newby with a 9.4 scoring average. Cox and Newby actually split starting time, with the former starting 13 games and Newby 12.

The one other returning player is sophomore forward Kent Pollpeter, who played in eight games a year ago.

Though Miller says he'll probably redshirt several players, all may not necessarily come from the four rookies.

The three freshmen scholarship athletes include forwards Steve Deering and Cedrick McCullough and guard Dale Turner. Walkon Christopher Nuss, another guard, is attending UNI on a football scholarship, but he played a lot of basketball during the summer. He competed against the Soviet Junior National team and played in both the Iowa Dr. Pepper All-Star Game and the Midwest All-Star games where Iowa all-stars played against top athletes from other states.

Several new opponents make appearances on this year's schedule, including Texas Wesleyan, Jackson State, Stephen F. Austin and Southern Methodist, replacing Central Florida when the latter cancelled the game with the Panthers. Reappearing after several years absences on the slate are Augustana, an old North Central Conference foe; Iowa, Youngstown State, Florida International and Wartburg.

The veterans got an early opportunity to refresh their skills when the Panthers played seven games in Europe in August. UNI came home with a 2-5 record, with wins coming against the Waterkleger team from Belgium (100-89) and against Chen of Switzerland (99-86). UNI lost a one-point game to Amsterdam Sports Life, the Dutch national champion.

"The trip was great from a basketball standpoint," Miller says. "The competition was brutal, particularly against the Belgium teams. Reese played the most consistently, while Phyfe, Nurse and Newby had their moments. Socha established himself more on the trip, playing by far his best basketball."

Those early games will prove to be very

beneficial because, as Miller says, "the basketball in this league will be better this year. We need to be much stronger as a group and we can be and we should be. Our tour overseas is a big plus for us."

The Mid-Continent Conference resumes its post-season tournament after a year's layoff. Previously scheduled to be played at the top four seeded sites, the league voted to reschedule the tourney for Southwest Missouri State.

Head Coach

Eldon Miller



Eldon Miller's passion has not dimmed one iota. Two years ago he took over the reigns of an unknown ball club, something he has done more than once, and as in those previous assignments, he fully intends on making the Panthers a contender within the AMCU Conference and an NCAA tournament participant sometime within the near future.

A 26-year college coaching veteran, Miller has seen the bright lights and media attention that arises from a big-time program. He doesn't much miss the hoopla associated with it. What he would like to see happen is the same type of excitement surrounding Northern Iowa basketball.

Miller led his first Northern Iowa squad to a 13-15 record overall and a 7-7 finish in the league which placed the Panthers fifth. Quite an accomplishment, considering they were picked to finish last in the eight-team field with only three returning lettermen. Those 13 wins tied for second the most wins in a season since moving to Division I, and they won more road games than any UNI team since the 1979-80 season.

Because of the relative success of Miller's first team, expectations were even higher for last season. However, the Panthers finished 10-18 overall and 4-10 in the AMCU. Picked to finish fifth, UNI ended in a tie for sixth place with Illinois at Chicago.

In summing up the season, Miller said there were three critical elements.

"One, our teamwork on offense improved drastically as the season went on," Miller said. "Two, our team defense was never good enough but it was a little better at the end of the year. Three, our ability to prevent the second shot was never good."

Miller knows what battles are. Prior to taking the UNI job upon Jim Berry's resignation, he spent 10 years at Ohio State, compiling a 176-118 record there. Nine of his Buckeye teams compiled winning records, seven played in post-season tournaments and four recorded 20 or more wins. They had participated in the NCAA tournament three of his last five years and, in 1986, defeated Wyoming for the NIT title. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year twice.

He was born June 19, 1939, in Gnadenhutten, OH. He played basketball four years at Wittenberg. As a senior in 1961, Miller starred on the NCAA College Division championship team and was chosen Most Valuable Player.

After graduation, he remained at Wittenberg to take graduate work and to assist coaching. He was named head coach at the end of the 1962 season at the tender age of 23. Miller enjoyed eight successful seasons there, compiling a 142-55 record, and won three Ohio Conference titles while sharing two others. He recently was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Fame.

Miller went to Western Michigan in 1971. Charged with rebuilding that program, his 1976 team won its first Mid-American Conference championship and finished 25-3 overall. Western earned a berth in the NCAA tournament and advanced to the regionals before losing 62-57 to Marquette. He then accepted the Ohio State position.

Miller is starting his 28th year of coaching this fall, 27th as a head coach. His overall record is 427-274.

He and his wife, Dee, have three children — daughters Amy and Caroline and son Ben.

Kevin Boyle

Former University of Iowa basketball star Kevin Boyle was the first to be named to head coach Eldon Miller's staff.

Boyle played for the Hawkeyes from 1978-82. He was named Big Ten Rookie of the Year in 1979 and was a first team all-Big Ten selection by both AP and UPI as a junior. He was an honorable mention all-American after the 1980-81 season and a preseason all-American pick as a senior.

A starting forward-guard for the Gold Medal team at the 1981 World University Games, Boyle was named Amateur Player of the Year in 1982 by the ABA-USA Olympic Committee. A Hawkeye captain his senior year, he was a four-year starter and holds the school record for games started (118). He also was named Iowa's Most Valuable Player his senior year.

Boyle's other accolades include being named one of the nation's elite defensive players by Sports Illustrated. He played in four NCAA tournaments with the Hawks, including being a starter on the team that made it to the Final Four in 1980.

Iowa's seventh-leading all-time scorer with 1,189 points, Boyle was drafted in the sixth round by the Philadelphia 76ers in 1982 and played during the exhibition season. He also played with the San Diego Clippers during the 1983 Los Angeles Summer League.

He played extensively in Europe. After being released by the 76ers, he played in England, France and Switzerland. He also coached youth while playing in Europe.

Boyle played his high school career at Saint Laurence in Chicago, Ill.



Kevin Lehman

Kevin Lehman was the second fulltime aide to be hired by Miller. At the time of his UNI appointment, he was an assistant boys' basketball coach at Dowling High in

West Des Moines, IA. He is a native of Iowa City where he played his prep career at Regina High School.

Lehman had been on staff at Dowling since 1983. His junior varsity record for three years was 31-5. Prior to that, he was assistant basketball and head golf coach at Johnston (IA) High School three years.

He graduated from Wartburg College in 1977 after also attending Palmer Junior College. While at Wartburg, he played with the Knights' basketball team which toured Australia in 1977. He was an all-conference and all-state selection at Regina and an all-region pick at Palmer, when he set records for most points in a single game (49) and season (583). He received his master's degree from Drake University in 1985.



Samuel Skarich

Eldon Miller's staff was made complete with the hiring of former St. Cloud State head coach Samuel Skarich as parttime assistant.

No stranger to Miller and his style of basketball, Skarich worked with Miller at Ohio State from 1976-78 as a parttime assistant.

A native of Keewatin, MN, Skarich received his bachelor's degree from Notre Dame in 1964 and his master's in 1965. He was a two-year letterman for the Irish, participating in the NCAA tournament in 1963.

His coaching background is wide and varied. He assisted the Notre Dame freshman team while working on his master's and the St. Joseph's High School program in South Bend, IN, where he got his first fulltime coaching job following graduation. He also taught and coached at St. Joseph's Catholic High School in St. Joseph, MI. He was promoted to head coach of Lake Michigan Catholic High School after St. Joseph's consolidated.

In 1973, he resigned that position to rejoin the St. Joseph staff in Indiana and was elevated to head coach there when Bob Donnewald joined the Indiana University staff. After two years there, he became Miller's parttime assistant.

From 1978-81, Skarich worked with Donnewald at Illinois State as a fulltime aide and then was named head coach at St. Cloud State where he coached until 1984. He spent one more year at St. Cloud as administrative assistant to the

athletic director. He was programmer for Sports and Health Clubs of Minnesota immediately prior to taking the UNI position.

The Players

UNI's Little Big Man — Nick Nurse

The only senior on the University of Northern Iowa basketball team, 6-1 guard Nick Nurse from Kuemper High School in Carroll, IA, is looking for a change in his final year with the Panthers, under third-year head coach Eldon Miller.

Nurse, who helped lead Kuemper to the Class 3A 1985 state championship, hasn't seen a winning season with the Panthers.

The 170-pounder, who has started 61 of 83 games over the last three seasons, saw UNI go 8-19 in his freshman season under coach Jim Berry.

As a sophomore, the Panthers went 13-15 in Miller's first season and a year ago, Northern Iowa compiled a 10-18 mark.

But there are a lot of positive signs this season as UNI prepares for its opener against Augustana (SD) on November 29.

Four starters are back, including Nurse who started all but one game a year ago. In all, eight lettermen return.

"It's going to be a lot different because

we lost a couple of players, including Greg McDermott who was good on the inside and outside," noted Nurse, who was fourth on the team last season in scoring at 9.8 points per game and sixth in rebounding at 2.5. "Hopefully, Jason Reese and Steve Phyfe can fill in there.

"We'll probably run a lot more and shoot more," commented Nurse, who led the club in assists a year ago with 99 (3.1 average) and in steals with 53 (1.9 average).

"We have a lot of good outside shooters this year with a couple of kids we brought in," Nurse said. "We'll be much-improved defensively and we'll work on that. We want to have a winning season.

"We want to keep improving toward the end of the year," Nurse said. "The winner of the conference tournament in Springfield, MO, gets to go to the NCAA tournament. It will be important to get better throughout the year. We want to be playing our best at the end."

Nurse has been busy doing his part to get ready for the season.

"I've been running and lifting," commented the Des Moines Register's Male Athlete of the Year in 1985. "I've been doing a lot of three-point shooting. I've been getting up in the mornings and shooting a lot and hopefully, I'll get some shots."

Nurse led the Association of Mid-Continent Universities in three-point shooting a year ago, connecting on 72 of 145 shots for .497 percent.

And Nurse enjoys the three-pointer.

"One of my strengths is being able to shoot the ball and being able to hustle a lot and getting to the loose balls," he said. "I just like doing a lot of little things. I need to work on my defense and work on my quickness."

Nurse, who averaged 3.6 points as a freshman and 5.8 points as a sophomore, doesn't mind not scoring a lot.

"I enjoy the playmaker role," he said. "It's nice to score and that's fun, too. But I'm better at getting the ball where it's suppose to be and let the other guys do their stuff. That's the role I've played all my life."

With just this season left, Nurse has fulfilled his expectations.

"When I came here, I wanted to prove I could play Division I basketball and I just wanted to get some playing time and have some fun," he said. "Personally, I think as far as getting playing time, I've been happy.

"As far as the team goes, there's been an empty hole," Nurse commented. "We haven't had a winning season. We had a lot of success in high school.

"It's been different coming in and losing so many games my freshman year," he added. "I was on teams that lost only 12 games in five years of junior high and high school and here we lost 19 in my first year.

"But I have one year to try and change that and get things turned around and get on the winning side," he said.

Nurse said there was a big difference going from a state championship team at Kuemper to Northern Iowa.

"Like any high school to college, it's the transition," remarked Nurse, who will battle junior veterans Jon Cox of Springfield, IL, and Maurice Newby of Des Moines East and freshman Dale Turner of St. Louis, MO, for a starting guard spot.

"I went from a bunch of guys playing together to a bunch of individual all-stars who are put together," Nurse remarked. "That's a tough thing for kids to adjust to. That has been probably one of our problems here and that's one thing we're trying to get ironed out. We're trying to come together more as a team."

Nurse, who comes from a family of nine which includes five other brothers who played basketball at Kuemper and three sisters, is majoring in accounting.

"First of all, I'll finish up school, but I don't know how long that will take," commented Nurse, who wasn't red-shirted as a Panther. "I'll try to get an intern job this summer in accounting and see if I like that. If I don't like that, I could always coach or do something else."

Whatever happens, the three-year Northern Iowa veteran will be working hard along with Miller and his teammates to get the Panthers on the winning side this winter.

Outlook

All the controversy surrounding the Vikings hides the fact that they should have a very outstanding squad. Leading CSU is 6-1 point guard Kenny "Mouse" McFadden, a candidate for all-American honors after being named the league's Player of the Year last season with his conference-high 20.5 point scoring average. Joining McFadden in the backcourt will be 6-0 Kenny Robertson, who finished ninth in the nation in steals (3.0 per game), and who averaged 6.2 points and 3.7 assists. At forward, the Vikings return Warren Bradley who averaged 6.8 points and 8.5 rebounds. At the other forward slot, JUCO transfer Maurice Harper and Derrick Vinyard, a Proposition 48 casualty last season, will be fighting for playing time. At center, CSU will have either 6-7 Brian Parker or 6-11 Herb Barthol. Parker is a transfer from New Mexico, while Barthol is another Proposition 48 returnee.

AMCU Basketball Tournament

The not-so-annual Mid-Continent Conference basketball tournament, renewed this season after a year's hiatus, is scheduled for March 6-8 in Springfield, MO. The winner of the 1989 post-season tourney will be the league's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Championship Tournament. Southwest Missouri State is the defending Mid-Continent regular season champion and represented the league as its first automatic NCAA qualifier last year.

The Mid-Continent conducted post-season tournaments from 1984-87, but next March's event will be the first to

determine an automatic NCAA qualifier. SMSU will be hosting the tournament for the fourth time after previously entertaining the event in 1984, 1986 and 1987. There was no post-season tournament last year, and in 1985, games were played at the top four seeded sites.

Four different teams have won the four previous Mid-Continent Tournaments — Western Illinois in 1984, Eastern Illinois in 1985, Cleveland State in 1986 and SMSU in 1987.

A national audience will be viewing the '89 tournament. New Commissioner

Jerry Ippoliti has announced that sports network ESPN will televise live the tourney's championship game at 4 p.m. March 8 from Hammons Student Center on the campus of SMSU.

Only seven teams will be competing in the post-season tournament this time around since Cleveland State is under NCAA sanctions and is disallowed from competing in any post-season action. The Vikings' regular-season games will not be counted in league standings, and they will not compete in the tournament for two years.

Conference Officials



Jerry A. Ippoliti, former associate athletic director at Northern Illinois, was named the new conference commissioner after F.L. "Frosty" Ferzacca retired at the end of

June. Ferzacca had been commissioner since the inception of the league.

Ippoliti has served in the capacities of associate athletic director (1983-88), assistant athletic director (1979-83), head football coach (1970-75) and assistant football coach (1968-69) at NIU.

A graduate of Miami (OH) University, he holds a master's degree from West Virginia. Prior to joining NIU's staff, he was assistant football coach at SUNY-Buffalo for two years following an eight-year high school coaching stint in Damascus, Findlay and Coshocton, OH.



Michael Madsen is in his third year as the league's first fulltime information director. He came to the position after serving as assistant sports information director for two years at Northern Iowa. He also worked at Western Illinois for two years as sports information graduate assistant. A native of Sioux City, IA, and graduate of Morningside College, he began his career as sports information director of his NCAA Division II alma mater for two years. He also has served an internship with the Baltimore Orioles during the summer of 1983 and has written parttime for two newspapers. The Association of Mid-Continent Universities was conceived in 1982 as eight Midwestern universities joined together to form a new NCAA Division I conference for men's sports.

Representing six states, members include Cleveland State, Eastern Illinois, Illinois at Chicago, Northern Iowa, Southwest Missouri State, Valparaiso, Western Illinois and Wisconsin-Green Bay.

In addition to basketball, the league conducts championships in eight other sports, including soccer, baseball, cross country, swimming, indoor track, outdoor track, golf and tennis. In basketball, the league has been represented in the past three NCAA and NIT post-season tournaments. During the 1985-86 campaign, CSU was an at-large selection to the NCAA Tournament, upsetting Indiana and St. Joseph's before a one-point loss to Navy stopped the Vikings from reaching the final round of eight teams. That same season, SMSU was an NIT quarterfinalist, defeating Pittsburgh and Marquette, before a one-point setback at Florida.

SMSU went on to participate in the next two NCAA Championships, defeating Clemson in 1987 before a four-point loss to Kansas, and falling in a four-point decision to Nevada-Las Vegas in the 1988 NCAA First Round. CSU, meanwhile, participated in the past two NIT post-season tournaments, defeating Tennessee-Chattanooga in 1987 before a two-point loss to Illinois State and winning over Illinois State in 1988's first round before a six-point loss at Ohio State in the second round.

UNI-Dome

Not a Nice Place to Visit

If there's one thing tougher than getting presidential candidates to talk about the issues, it's being a visitor trying to win in the UNI-Dome. The Panthers have their own brand of politics, led by head coach Eldon Miller.

Looking all the way back to when the UNI-Dome was first opened, the Panthers are 112-51 at home in the Dome for a 69 percentage. That percentage has decreased some in recent years because of UNI convincing upper echelon teams of playing in Cedar Falls. But nonetheless, the UNI-Dome is a very tricky place to play basketball.

The UNI-Dome (the prefix stands for University of Northern Iowa as well as meaning one and unique) combines the features of three buildings — a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. It contains facilities to hold a variety of events such as concerts, exhibitions, trade shows, pageants, rallies and convocations, as well as football, basketball and softball games and wrestling and track meets.

The Dome has hosted such events as the NCAA gymnastic and wrestling championships, the Iowa High School All-Star Basketball games, the Iowa High School football playoffs, concerts by Dolly Parton, the Eagles, REO Speedwagon, Fleetwood Mac and The Rolling Stones, to mention a few, antique car shows, tractor pulls and many other non-athletic events.

The Dome's air-supported, Fiberglass fabric roof, constructed by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corp., was erected at a cost equal to half that of conventional roof construction. And because of the Dome's translucence, ample natural light is available during daylight hours resulting in a sizeable savings on utility costs.

The UNI-Dome was designed with "something for everyone". Its artificial turf for football games can be installed in a minimum of 36 hours. Underneath, on a synthetic floor area, are basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track. As many as 12 tennis matches and two basketball games could be played simultaneously.



Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football and 11,000 for courtside activities. For stage activities, such as commencements, concerts and speakers' series, total capacity — using movable bleachers and chairs — can reach 25,000.

The 168,000-square foot Dome, which rises 124 feet above the arena floor, is supported entirely by a network of 12 stranded steel cables and air blowers. A concrete and steel ring around the top of the 70 foot high stadium wall holds the cables. The cables weigh around 47 tons.

The roof of the Dome is made of about 49 tons of woven Fiberglass coated with Teflon. Approximately 60 percent of the Dome has an inner liner of fabric that provides acoustical as well as thermal benefits.

A spacious press box atop the east stands has facilities for 20 radio stations, television capabilities and seating for up to 125 people. A photography darkroom, photo bay, concession area and scouting booths are other features. Two huge scoreboards flash messages and information to spectators throughout the events.

The west press box provides a meeting room for the UNI Athletic Club. A new meeting room at the Northeast concourse level of the arena is being constructed for a meeting room, primarily for use by the football team. Currently, an enclosed passageway connects the Dome with the Physical Education Center for locker facilities.

Management

A university and athletic program need sound direction and leadership. The Panthers have the ingredients for success starting at the top.

Dr. Constantine W. Curris assumed the Presidency of the University of Northern Iowa in August, 1983. He is only the seventh chief executive in the University's 108-year history.

Known as "Deno" to the University community, he has emphasized four major themes for the University's development: 1) leadership in strengthening teacher education; 2) development of the School of Business as part of Iowa's economic resurgence; 3) a renewed emphasis upon quality in undergraduate education; and 4) expansion of international studies to prepare students for life in the 21st century.

Prior to assuming the UNI presidency, Curris served 10 years as president of Murray State University in Kentucky. His tenure was characterized by expanding enrollments, extensive academic development and professional accreditation and the development of nationally recognized programs in academic advising and student services. In 1983, the Murray State Board of Regents designated the University's new eight-million-dollar student center as the Curris Center.

Other professional experiences include serving as Dean of Students at Marshall University, Vice-President and Academic Dean of both Midway (KY) College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology and a year's service as Director of Educational Programs for the West Virginia State Board of Education.

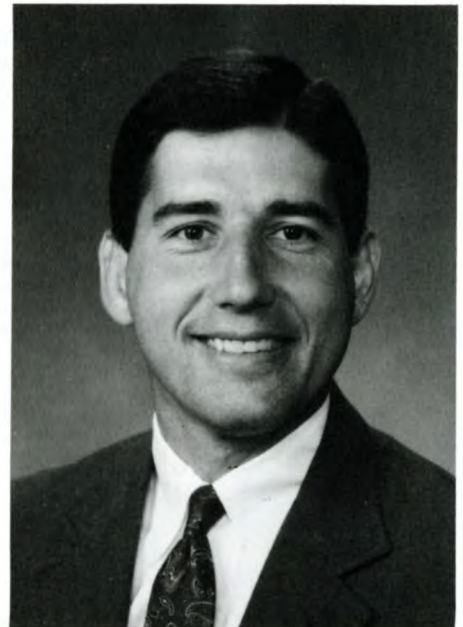
Curris received a bachelor's degree magna cum laude in political science with a minor in speech communication from Kentucky in 1962. He received a master's in political science with a public administration emphasis from Illinois in 1965 and his Ed.D. degree in higher education with minors in student personnel services and public policy from Kentucky in 1967.



Curris serves as Trustee-Emeritus of Midway College and was a charter member of the National Small Business Development Center Advisory Board. He currently serves as a commissioner of the American Council on Education's Commission on Educational Credit and Credentials and on the Committee on Policies and Purposes of the American Assoc. of State Colleges and Universities. He recently served as chairman of the Task Force on Teacher Education and Certification appointed by the Iowa State Board of Public Instruction and now is serving as a member of the First in the Nation in Education Foundation Governing Board on appointment by the Governor. He serves as an ex-officio member of the Iowa Department of Economic Development Board and is a member of Rotary International.

Robert A. Bowlsby was selected Director of Athletics in mid-February, 1984, after serving as Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities and interim AD when Stan Sheriff resigned the post in September, 1983.

A native of Waterloo, IA, he is a 1970 graduate of West High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in health, physical



education and recreation from Moorhead State in 1975 and a master's degree in recreation administration from Iowa in 1978.

Bowlsby served as Assistant Director of Recreational Services at Iowa from 1978-81, working in facility management and with responsibilities for supervision of a wide variety of recreation and athletics facilities on campus.

He joined the UNI staff in April of 1981. His experience at UNI has been broadbased, including involvement in all areas of the intercollegiate athletics program and promotion of the UNI-Dome. He has worked with a variety of athletic events, special programs and entertainment attractions.

Since the time of his appointment as Director of Athletics, Bowlsby has been actively involved in the promotion and marketing of the athletics program, the development of the Athletics Hall of Fame and the formulation of the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference football division.

He has served on the NCAA Committee on Financial Aid and Amateurism and the NCAA Wrestling Committee.

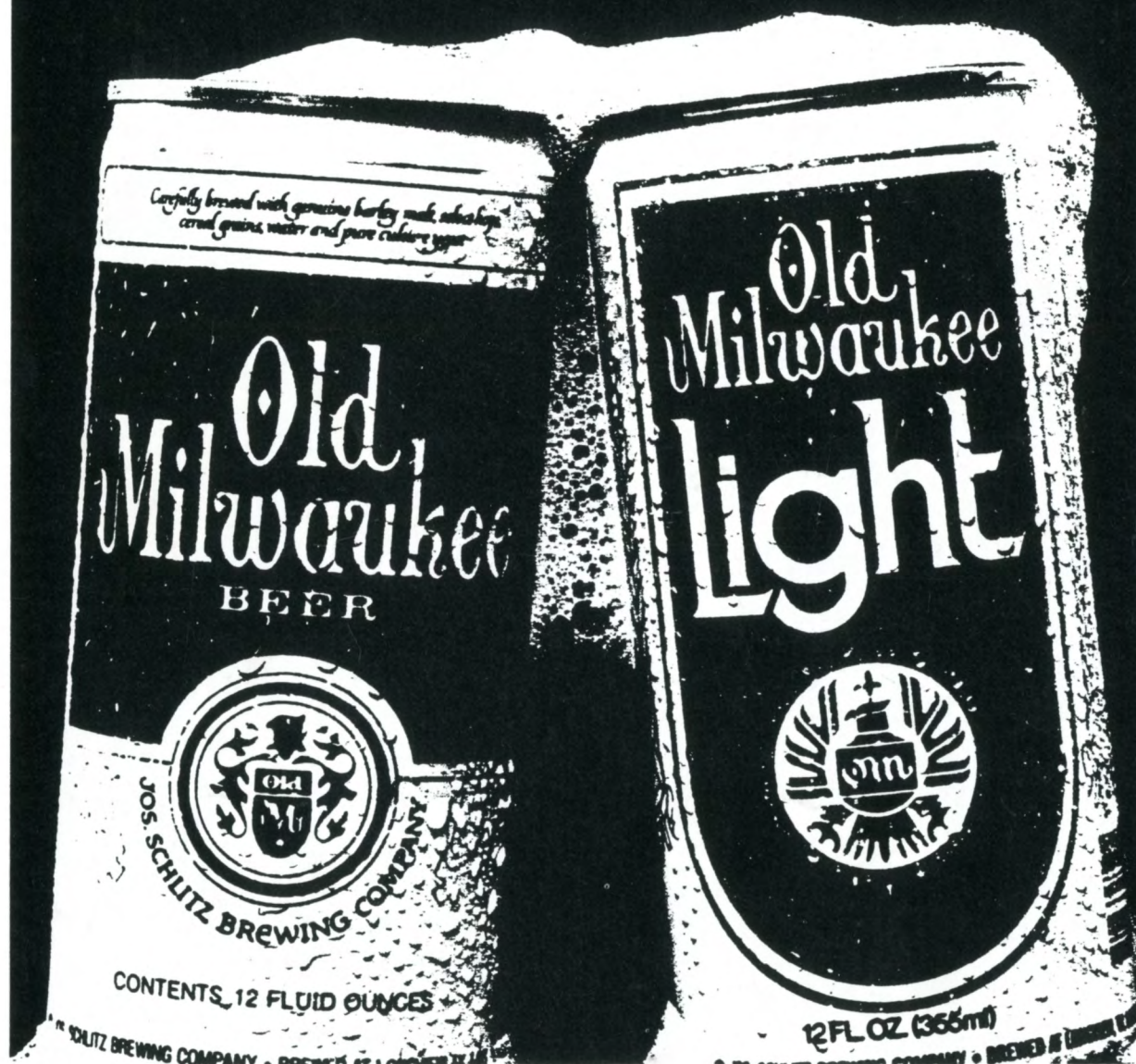
