# Season Outlook

When he took the Northern Iowa Baseball job in 1987, Panther coach Gene Baker began the process of building a program around solid pitching and defense. Now, heading into his third season, Baker thinks the time has come for his team to make the transition from taking its lumps against some of the best NCAA Division I has to offer to being competitive against all its opponents.

"To build a viable program that is competitive year in and year out," Baker says, "you have to have that pitching and defense. The offense is coming to come and go, but we've proven here in past years that that's not going to carry you."

A glance at the 1990 roster shows 10 seniors, all of which figure to play an important role in this season's fortunes. There is no doubt experience is the key for UNI, but it is also a squad with five players who have drawn interest from professional scouts and a group of freshmen and sophomores loaded with some of the finest talent from Iowa high schools.

When asked about the keys to success for the upcoming season, the Panther coach points to three things.

"Our pitching and defense have to play the way we expect them to," he noted, "but they don't have to do any more than that. We expect the pitchers to do a good job and the defense to make the plays. If we do that, we'll be alright."

Another key is timely hitting, according to Baker. "We've got to drive in more runs. If someone can step forward to help (Mark) Lumpa with the RBI load or a healthy Steve Schmelzer can be as consistent this spring as he has been in other falls, that's going to help greatly."

"We've got a little more speed now with (Mark) Chambers and moving (John) Pratt to the top of the lineup. (Geff) Gescheidler and (Mike) Morony give us two more guys who are going to get on base. That's four guys that we can get on base consistently and score runs. We have to find about three RBI guys who can give us the ability to score runs throughout the lineup."

Baker says this year's team also has to learn to play pressure baseball. "I think by the end of last season we earned the respect of most of our opponents," said Baker, "and this year, I think they will know they have to take it to us to beat us. That is going to put a little pressure on us, but I don't think that will affect our players."

"They have worked hard enough the last three years to not let a little pressure from the other teams bother us."

## PITCHING

After two seasons of steady improvement, pitching should be a strong suit in 1990. The Panther mound corps knocked about three runs off its team ERA last year and this season, with each member of the starting rotation being at least a junior, Baker has little doubt who will be carrying the load.

Forming the nucleus will be southpaws Scott Kaul (1-8, 5.74 ERA) and Jim Duthie (2-5, 8.36 ERA), and righthanders Steve Dreyer (2-5, 8.17 ERA) and Dennis Hanken (2-3, 3.38 ERA). Kaul was probably the most consistent of the starters last season and Duthie showed flashes of brilliance against some of the top opponents. Hanken has been as good as anyone UNI has had over the last two years and led the team

in ERA last season, but missed the fall season with a sore arm. Dreyer came into his own last season and has drawn interest from professional scouts.

With improved control, senior Steve Hoffman (2-5, 11.29 ERA) will be a fourth or fifth starter. He showed his potential by throwing a two-hitter last year against Nebraska. Freshman John Thomas, a transfer from Ellsworth J.C., also showed promise in the fall with good mechanics and the ability to throw strikes.

"We feel like we've got four good starters," noted Baker, "in Kaul, Duthie, Dreyer and Hanken. If Hoffman can step in and be a quality starter and throw strikes consistently, then we've got some flexibility to move Hanken back to the bullpen, where he started last season."

Others who could be contributors include junior Adam Huehnergarth, lefthander Jamie Snyder, and senior Mark Hey, who made the team in fall walk-on tryouts.

The top candidate for a relief closer is transfer Brett Priestley, a submarine-style pitcher with good control.

## FIRST BASE

This appears to be a question mark due to the injury sustained by last year's starter, senior Steve Schmelzer. He suffered torn knee ligaments last fall and was forced to undergo surgery and it appears questionable whether he will be able to go full strength. If Schmelzer returns, he will be a frontrunner at first after providing some lefthanded punch in the lineup last season with five home runs and 24 RBI's, both figures ranking second on the team.

If not, junior Brett Elson (.111) could be the favorite. Elson is a lefthanded contact hitter who doesn't possess the power Schmelzer does but should hit for a better average. Dan Dighton, a transfer from Des Moines Area Community College, is a good righthanded hitter but lacks the defensive capability of Schmelzer or Elson. Baker also does not rule out the possibility of moving two-time All-AMCU outfielder Mark Lumpa to first. Although he has not played the position previously, Lumpa was a shortstop in high school and third baseman early in his collegiate career.

## SECOND BASE

As solid as any position defensively, second base will probably be in the reliable hands of senior Mark Vogel. After transferring from a junior college last year, Vogel put together a 28-game errorless streak at the end of the season. He is a switch-hitter who had an off year at the plate last season, but bounced back in the fall season by hitting .321.

Junior Mike Kelly raised some eyebrows last fall with an outstanding showing at the plate and tremendous improvement in the field. Kelly is an aggressive young player who is biding his time behind Vogel, but, Baker says, will be ready to step in if Vogel falters this season.

## SHORTSTOP

Junior Mike Morony moves over from third base, where he was a part-time starter last season. He will replace the graduated Brian Scheidegger, who held down the position in outstanding fashion the past two years. Morony needs to soften his hands a bit, but otherwise possesses all the tools.

He has a strong arm and good range in the field and the capability to be a .300 hitter. Morony has a good eye, is very patient at the plate and normally has a high on-base percentage.

Backing up Morony are freshmen Brian Ortman and Tom Bach. Baker compares Ortman to Scheidegger at the same stage in his career. Bach comes into the program with a reputation as a good hitter but struggled at the plate in the fall.

### **THIRD BASE**

Junior college transfer Mike Himmelsbach is the likely starter at the hot corner. He has always been a good hitter and makes all the plays defensively. He had a shaky fall with the bat, but if he can keep making the defensive plays and hit the way he is capable, Baker feels he will be an outstanding third baseman.

### **CATCHER**

The job will be in the capable hands of senior Brian Dixon (.246, 1 HR, 18 RBIs), who has made great strides both offensively and defensively over the past two years. He has made himself a solid, everyday catcher with a take-charge attitude behind the plate. Dixon also provides a lefthanded bat in the lineup.

Backing up Dixon will be freshman Scott Klein. Klein possesses excellent mechanics defensively and calls a good

game. He will need some time to adjust to college pitching, but looks to have the potential to be an outstanding college catcher.

### **OUTFIELD**

If one position on the team stands out, it will be the outfield with three returning starters. All positions should be strong offensively and solid on defense.

Two-time All-AMCU rightfielder Mark Lumpa (.333, 6 HR, 28 RBIs) returns to provide the biggest power threat for the Panthers. He has good power to all fields and runs well.

Junior John Pratt (.261, 3 HR, 20 RBIs, 16 SB) a legitimate professional prospect, will anchor from center field. He can hit for average, has good power, can run and throw well, and, perhaps most importantly, is constantly improving.

Senior Geff Gescheidler (.277, 2 HR, 20 RBIs) will be the leftfielder. He is very sound fundamentally and makes all the plays in the field.

Three others who can add depth at any of the three positions are sophomore P.J. Conlon, senior Jim Welsh and sophomore Mark Chambers. All three are dependable and could see more playing time if Lumpa is moved to first base.

### **SCHEDULE**

Last year's schedule was ranked the fifth most difficult in the country by Baseball America Magazine and this year's slate, although not quite as imposing, is again one of the toughest in the Midwest.

The season opens with a pair of weekend trips to Oklahoma and Oklahoma State in February, journeys Baker hopes can be made every year. Both are among the top teams in the nation, but with single games slated for Saturday and Sunday against each, Baker thinks his team can be competitive.

The annual spring trip takes the Panthers to Tennessee, Kentucky and Indiana with stops in Missouri and Illinois on the way. A legitimate national contender awaits UNI at Indiana State along with Western Kentucky, Austin Peay, Memphis State, Evansville and Illinois State on the trip.

The Panthers continue to play nearly every Division I school in the area and 1990 will be no exception with the likes of Creighton, Missouri, Bradley, St. Louis, Illinois State, Notre Dame, Kansas, Iowa, Iowa State, Nebraska and Minnesota dotting the schedule.

Add to that conference foes Southwest Missouri State, Eastern Illinois and Western Illinois and the Panthers once again will butt heads with the best in the Midwest and some of the top teams in the nation.



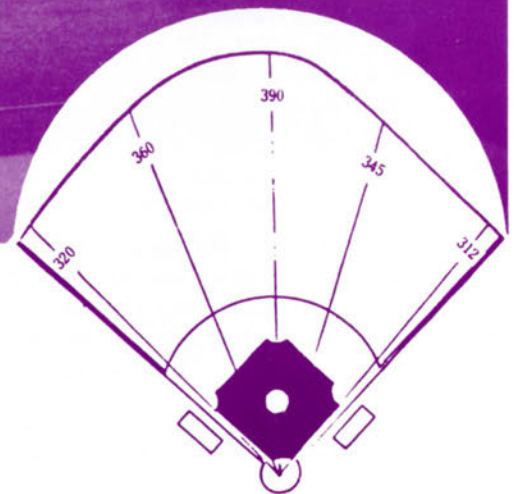


## Bat Cats

## Head Coach Gene Baker

Gene Baker enters his third season as the Northern Iowa head coach in 1990 after serving two previous stints at his alma mater, Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, TN. He served as an assistant with the Governors from 1981-82 and again from 1986-87 after a playing career in which he earned Ohio Valley All-Conference honors in 1980.

A catcher/designated hitter, Baker was voted to the NCAA Division I Academic All-America Team in 1981.

Baker's first head coaching position came at Bristol (TN) College where he was coach and athletic director from 1984-86. He previously served as an assistant at Cumberland College in Lebanon, TN from 1982-84.

The Wappinger Falls, NY native received his bachelor's degree in chemistry in 1981 and master's in health and physical education in 1987, both from Austin Peay.

Baker has compiled a 24-80 record in his two seasons with the Panthers. His career mark is 59-138 in five seasons.

## The Association of Mid-Continent Universities

The Association of Mid-Continent Universities (AMCU) was conceived in 1982 as eight Midwestern universities joined to form a new league for men's athletics.

In 1989, the University of Akron and Northern Illinois University were voted into the league by the university presidents and athletic directors with competition for both institutions in the new league beginning in the 1989-90 academic year with the exception of basketball, which will begin in 1990-91.

Representing six states, other AMCU members are Cleveland State University, Eastern Illinois University, University of Illinois at Chicago, University of Northern Iowa, Southwest Missouri State University, Valparaiso University, Western Illinois University and the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay.

In addition to basketball, the AMCU sponsors baseball, soccer, cross country, indoor track, outdoor track, swimming, golf and tennis.

Conference headquarters are located in Chicago, IL, with a staff of commissioner Jerry Ippoliti, information director Michael Madsen, administrative assistant Marcia Hokin, supervisor of basketball officials Richard Weiler, compliance officer Arnold Fielkow, assistant information director James Betzold and director of communications Jon Steinbrecher. The 1989-90 league president is Dr. Alan Harre of Valparaiso University.

The AMCU is governed by a Council of Delegates, made up of the presidents and athletic directors of member schools.

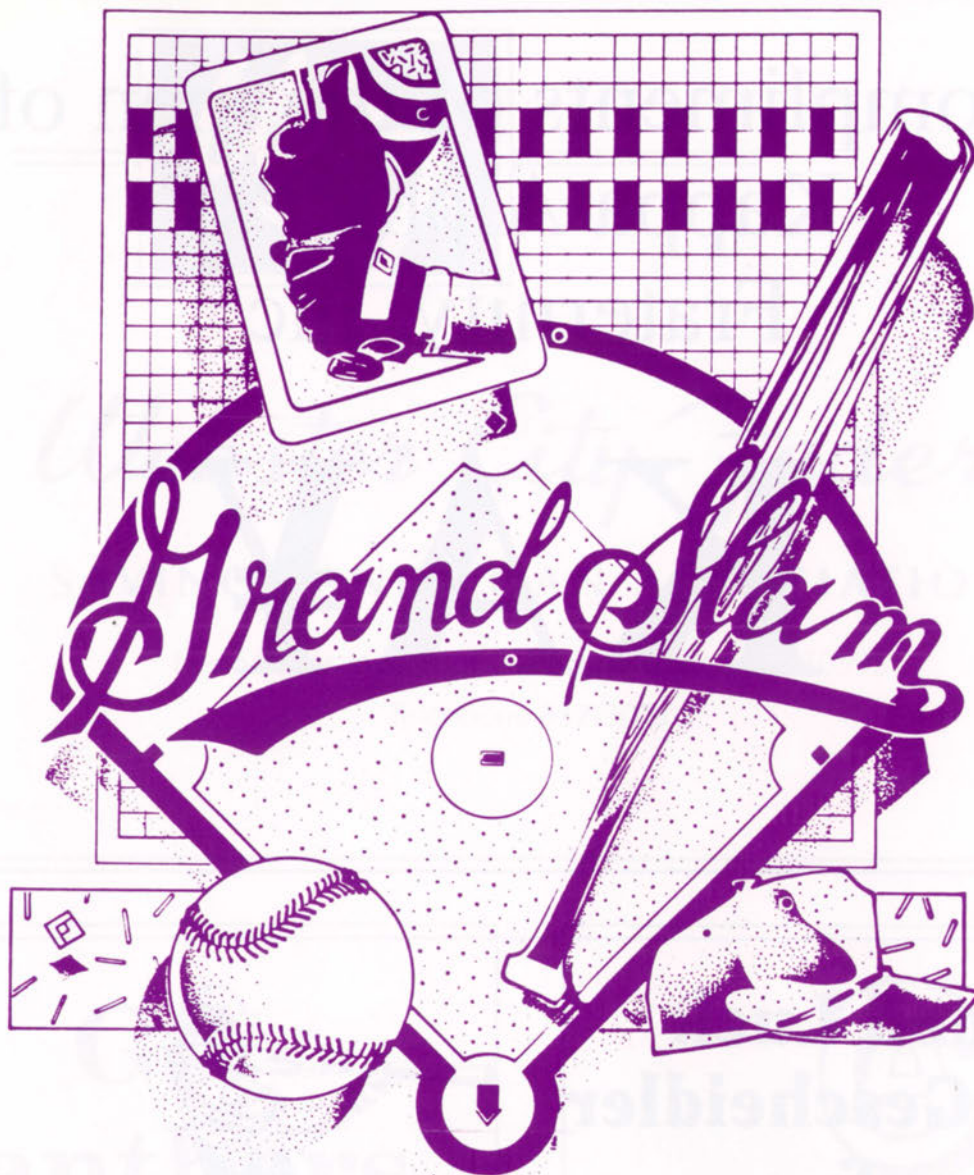

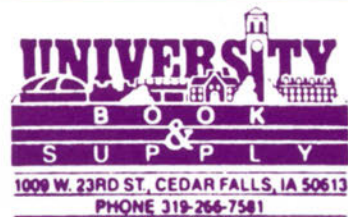

# This is Northern Iowa

For 113 years, the University of Northern Iowa has been committed to providing quality undergraduate education for its students.

The University has expanded its historic mission of teacher preparation to include a number of outstanding programs in business, natural sciences, humanities and fine arts, and social and behavioral sciences, with complementary graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. At Northern Iowa, you may earn a bachelor's degree in more than 120 different majors. In addition to the traditional strength in teacher education, UNI's accounting program is ranked among the best in the nation. But the options don't end there: strong academic programs ranging from art to marketing, biology to music, and industrial technology to social work are just a few of the avenues to be explored.

The University of Northern Iowa is small enough to offer individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources and opportunities.

Although several historical buildings dot the campus, it is steadily growing to meet the academic needs of students. The University is moving into the future with a new library computer automation system, a \$10.2 million College of Business

Administration building under construction and expansion of the Maucker University Union. A variety of computer resources are available to students in more than a dozen areas on campus.

Although the majority of UNI's 11,800 students come from every county in Iowa, students from 40 states and 28 countries foster a rich, diverse atmosphere.
