Telephones: One telephone is available on a first-come, first-served basis at courtside, while others are available in the Sports Information office located on the West side of the UNI-Dome. Pay phones also are available in the concourses.

1990-91 Season Preview

Talent-Laden Group Returns to Power Panther Attack in 1990-91 Campaign

The dreary days of winter may cast gloom over the State of Iowa, but for Northern Iowa fans there is a compensating factor. It's called Panther basketball.

Thanks to the return of nine lettermen, including three starters, and a splendid recruiting class, UNI adherents are more anxious than ever for the 1990-91 campaign to begin.

Gone is Jason Reese, who became the Panthers' all-time leading scorer during the NCAA tournament last spring, and super-subs Steve Phye and Jonathan Cox. However, there remains a wealth of talent, as the Panthers go after post-season play for the second consecutive year.

Despite the personnel losses, head coach Eldon Miller, beginning his fifth season in Cedar Falls, truly feels the Panthers can be better this season than last, when they tied a school record with 23 wins.

"No one can replace Reese," Miller said, "but our emphasis won't change much. The key is to build on our defensive intensity which we demonstrated at the end of last year. It depends upon how the younger players develop."

Not to worry. The Panthers can live with more of a perimeter game if needed. Four players made their mark at one time or another last year from beyond three-point range, and all return.

We can start with senior forward-guard **Troy Muilenburg**, the team's top returning scorer who was second to Reese last year, averaging 13.8 points. A starter in all 32 games, he began the year at guard but was moved to forward. He led the squad in three-pointers made (49) and attempted (131) and also topped out at the free throw line with 87 percent of his tosses made (91-105). He was third on the team in rebounding (4.8) and in assists dished out (62). Muilenburg was one of three Panthers named to the Mid-Continent All-Tournament team.

Then there's junior **Dale Turner**, UNI's floor leader and another all-tourney pick. The 6-2 guard also started every game and was the third-leading

scorer with 9.9 points. He made 41 of 90 three-pointers while leading the team in assists (152), setting a new school record. He added a team-high 34 steals and shot 71 percent (59-84) at the line. Miller says Turner has the chance to be "the best point guard I've ever had by the time he's a senior."

Let's not forget **Maurice Newby** who made the shot seen 'round the world

should be able to call upon 6-5 senior forward-guard **Brad Hill**, who showed he also can shoot from beyond the arc in UNI's 77-74 win over Iowa before 22,727 fans in the UNI-Dome. His gutsy play in the second half pulled UNI back from a late-game deficit, earning him Most Valuable Player honors. In his first year at UNI after transferring from Kalamazoo Valley Community College,

Hill made 16 of 46 three-pointers and averaged 5.0 points. He started three games early in the season.

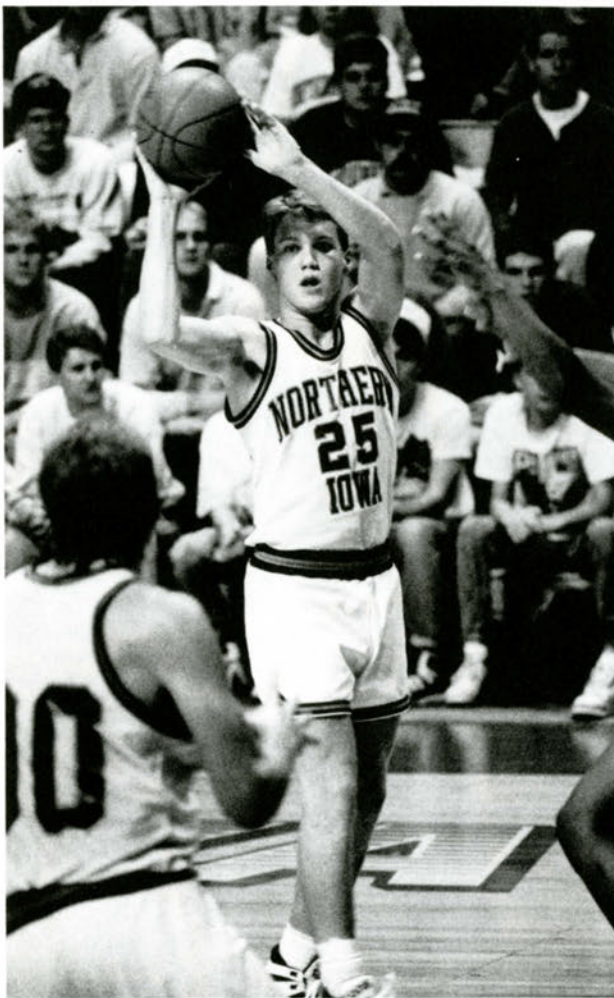
"We'll continue to shoot from the outside, but still develop our inside game," Miller said. "We'll still pressure the basket. We'll play offense depending upon what the defense shows us."

The third returning starter, in addition to Muilenburg and Turner, is junior 6-4 forward-guard **Cedrick McCullough**, the squad's fourth-leading scorer and rebounder with 8.8 points and 4.0 rebounds. Described by Miller as the "best defensive player for his age I've ever coached", McCullough has been given the unenviable job of guarding the opponents' best shooters.

Four additional players return who had playing time a year ago. Sophomore guard **Cam Johnson** started one game, averaged 2.9 points and made 10 of 27 three-pointers.

Senior reserve forward **Kent Pollpeter** also can shoot the lights out if given enough playing time. Junior 6-10 center **Nick Pace** is a probable candidate to replace Reese inside, and **Steve Deering**, a 6-6 sophomore forward, saw action in five games.

Four athletes were redshirted last season, including 6-9 forward **Brian Jones** and 6-9 center **Terry Merfeld**. 6-4 guard **Chris Nuss**, a starting tight end



when he hit a 25-foot bomb with time expiring to down Missouri in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. A 6-3 senior guard who comes in off the bench, Newby made 39 of 90 three-pointers last season while averaging 5.5 points. He led the team in free throw shooting, making 21 of 23 charity tosses for 91 percent.

Last but not least, the Panthers



for the Panthers, sat out basketball last year after playing during the 1988-89 season and he has not indicated as yet if he will play basketball this year. Merfeld will battle with Pace for the inside job.

That leaves the four newcomers — 6-6 junior forward **David Butler** of Lincoln Trail Junior College, freshman 6-7 forward **Jon Ellis** of Dubuque, IA, Senior High School; 6-8 junior forward **Troy Vaughn** of Southeastern Community College, and 6-2 freshman guard **Byron Young** of Iowa City, IA, City High School.

Butler and Ellis agreed to come on board during last November's early signing period, while Vaughn inked his letter of intent in April. Young followed suit as a recruited walk on. Armstrong, however, will not join the squad until second semester. Butler is a likely red-shirt candidate.

"The excitement of this team is in the wide variety of talented players that can contribute," said Miller. "When you've got players like Newby, Muilenburg, Turner, McCullough and Hill and you add Vaughn, anything can happen. The three big kids — Pace, Merfeld and Jones — certainly will play a lot. And Johnson is a talented sophomore. It will be interesting to see how they evolve and blend together."

Miller says Butler has great quickness for his size, has good reach, but still is learning to play the game. He doesn't have a lot of high school experience, having played only his senior year.

"There's no question Ellis has an

ing to Miller, while Merfeld has "good hands and a nice touch inside." Vaughn also has been described as an excellent all-around player with good physical strength. He can shoot from 15 to 17 feet and can get "after it on the boards." Young can play either off-guard or at the point.

Miller's fourth unit a year ago elevated expectations for Panther basketball and the prospects for 1990-91 appear bright with the return of three of the top five scorers and a talented corp waiting on the sidelines. There's every indication that the handful of recent moments in the limelight could be repeated this season. But the road to the "Big Show" doesn't get any easier.

Competition expands in the Mid-Continent Conference this year. Though last year's regular-season champion, Southwest Missouri State, has left the league, Akron and Northern Illinois will compete for the title this season. The Panthers took advantage of the home-court advantage last year when the post-season tournament was held in the UNI-Dome. Next March, it will be played on Wisconsin-Green Bay's home floor.

o u t - standing future at UNI," Miller said. "He's quick, jumps well, is a good passer and plays defense well. He can put the ball on the floor."

Jones is very versatile, accord-

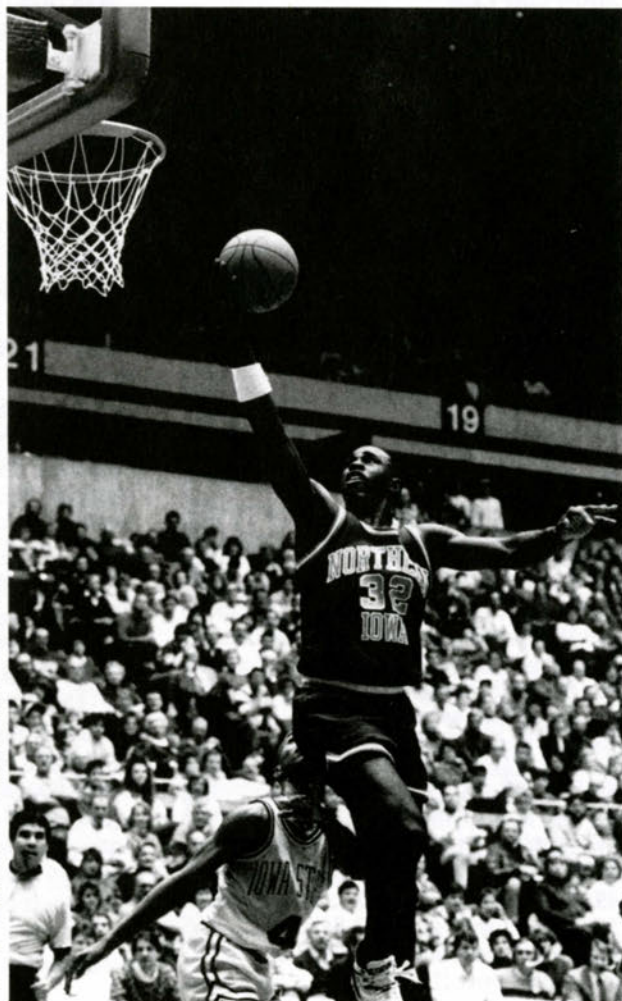
The league steadily has climbed the ladder in the power ratings, rising to 14th at the end of last year's play.

The non-league slate is just as exciting. After a season-opening exhibition game, the Panthers play in the San Juan Shootout November 23-25. Seeded third, they join Illinois, Murray State, Nebraska, St. Louis, Old Dominion, Bucknell and American University of Puerto Rico. They come home four days later to play at Southwest Missouri State in an ESPN nationally telecast game.

Other non-conference tilts are against Nevada, Iowa, Wyoming and Detroit, in addition to hosting Iowa State and Drake.

Miller isn't concerned about the rugged, early competition; in fact, he prefers it that way.

"We try to schedule talented teams early so we don't build up false confidence," he said. "Last year, we were like 10-2 heading into the conference season. We got our nose bloodied when we shouldn't have, then had to come back and get after it. This year's schedule is more challenging."



Panther Points

Newby, Muilenburg next in line

UNI guard Maurice Newby and forward-guard Troy Muilenburg are the next players in line to join the school's career 1,000-point club. The pair would become the 16th and 17th members of the group which is headed by all-time leading scorer Jason Reese with 2,033 points. Newby enters the season with 808 points, while Muilenburg has 823.

Numbers Talk

UNI outshot its opponents 924 to 900 in field goals for a .500 to .475 percentage advantage. The Panthers made 25 more three-pointers (165 to 140) than their opponents, leading .402 to .390 in percentage. In free throws, UNI made 480 to the opponents' 388, a .712 percentage advantage over .670. The Panthers scored 5.1 more points, 77.9 to 72.8, and outrebounded the opponents by 4.4 caroms, 35.8 to 31.4. The Panthers also had 101 more assists, six more turnovers, 10 less blocked shots and 32 fewer steals.

UNI averaged 6,218 fans overall, 6,822 at home and 5,533 on the road.

The Panthers outrebounded their opponents 19 times, winning 15 of those games.

NCAA Tournaments

Last year's trip to the "Big Show" was UNI's first in Division I. The Panthers' last previous appearance in NCAA play came in 1979 when they went to the Division II playoffs. In 1964, UNI advanced to the College Division Midwest Regional, then moved on to the College Division National Tournament, placing fourth.

Head Coach Eldon Miller



Few coaches in Northern Iowa history have entered this program and made an immediate impact like Eldon Miller has in his brief four years with the Panthers. Who would have

thought five years ago that Miller would accomplish what he has? But those who know Miller and have followed his career since his days at Ohio State, Western Michigan and Wittenberg show little surprise. Ever since Miller walked into the UNI-Dome in 1986, he has been delivering the unexpected and delivering winning basketball.

Beginning his fifth season in the UNI program, Miller enters the 1990-91 campaign with the challenge of not only maintaining, but improving upon, the level of success he has helped establish in Cedar Falls.

The official naming of Miller to head the UNI program was made on February 27, 1986, just prior to Ohio State's appearance in the NIT Tournament, a title the Buckeyes eventually captured.

Miller responded by leading his first Northern Iowa squad to a 13-15 record overall and a 7-7 finish in the Mid-Continent Conference which placed the Panthers fifth. Quite an accomplishment, considering they were picked to finish last in the eight-team field with

only three returning lettermen. Those 13 wins tied for second the most wins in a season since moving to Division I, and they won more road games since the 1979-80 season.

Year one laid the foundation for year two and three, the latter of which saw the Panthers erase or tie 12 school records. The Panthers wrapped up 1988-89 with a second place finish in the Mid-Continent with an 8-4 mark, their highest finish ever. Their 19-9 overall mark was their best effort since moving to Division I. They were 14-1 at home and just missed an NIT berth.

That year also brought Miller recognition as Mid-Continent Coach of the Year.

Four years of hard work paid off last season when the Panthers hit plateau after plateau. After defeating Iowa before a state-record crowd of 22,727 fans in the UNI-Dome, they tied for just third place in the regular league season. Then they swept the conference's post-season tournament played in the UNI-Dome and received their first berth in the NCAA tournament since 1979. UNI upset the Missouri Tigers in the first round and barely were edged out by Minnesota in the second round. They finished with a 23-9 record overall, tying a school record for most wins.

Miller knows what battles are. Prior to taking the UNI job upon Jim Berry's resignation, he spent 10 years at Ohio State, compiling a 176-118 record there. Nine of his Buckeye teams compiled winning records, seven played in post-season tournaments and four

recorded 20 or more wins. They had participated in the NCAA tournament three of his last five years and, in 1986, defeated Wyoming for the NIT title. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year twice.

He was born June 19, 1939, in Gnadenhutten, OH. He played basketball four years at Wittenberg. As a senior in 1961, Miller starred on the NCAA College Division championship team and was chosen Most Valuable Player.

After graduation, he remained at Wittenberg to take graduate work and to assist coaching. He was named head coach at the end of the 1962 season at the tender age of 23. Miller enjoyed eight successful seasons there, compiling a 142-55 record, and won three Ohio Conference titles while sharing two others. He recently was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Fame.

Miller went to Western Michigan in 1971. Charged with rebuilding that program, his 1976 team won its first Mid-American Conference championship and finished 25-3 overall. Western earned a berth in the NCAA tournament and advanced to the regionals before losing 62-57 to Marquette. He then accepted the Ohio State position.

Miller is starting his 30th year of coaching this fall, 29th as a head coach. His overall record is 469-292.

He and his wife, Dee, have three children — daughters Amy and Caroline and son Ben.

Dr. Constantine W. Curris assumed the Presidency of the University of Northern Iowa in August, 1983. He is only the seventh chief executive in the University's 114-year history.

Prior to assuming the UNI presidency, Curris served 10 years as president of Murray State University in Kentucky. That University's new eight-million dollar student center is named the Curris Center.

Other professional experiences include serving as Dean of Students at Marshall University and Vice-President and Academic Dean of both Midway (KY) College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology.

Curris received a bachelor's degree magna cum laude in political science from Kentucky in 1962. He received a master's in political science and public administration from Illinois in 1965 and his Ed.D. degree in higher education from Kentucky in 1967.

Curris serves as Trustee of Midway College, Director of American Humanics and as a member of the Center for the Study of the Presidency's National Advisory Council. He recently served as Chairman of the Iowa Task Force on Teacher Education and Certification and was a charter member of the National Small Business Development Center Advisory Board. He is a member of the Iowa Future Project; and is on the Board of Trustees of First in the Nation in Education/Iowa's Education Research Foundation and Junior Achievement of Black Hawk Land, Inc.



Robert A. Bowsby was selected Director of Athletics in mid-February, 1984, after serving as Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities and interim AD when Stan Sheriff resigned the post in September, 1983.

A native of Waterloo, IA, he is a 1970 graduate of West High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in health, physical education and recreation from Moorhead State in 1975 and a master's degree in recreation administration from Iowa in 1978.

Bowsby served as Assistant Director of Recreational Services at Iowa from 1978-81, working in facility management and with responsibilities for supervision of a wide variety of recreation and athletics facilities on campus.

He joined the UNI staff in April of 1981. His experience at UNI has been broadbased, including involvement in all areas of the intercollegiate athletics program and promotion of the UNI-Dome. He has worked with a variety of athletic events, special programs and entertainment attractions.

Since the time of his appointment as Director of Athletics, Bowsby has been actively involved in the promotion and marketing of the athletics program, the development of the Athletics Hall of Fame, the Panther Champions Endowment Fund and the formulation of the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference football division.

He has served on the NCAA Committee on Financial Aid and Amateurism and has been chairman of the NCAA Wrestling Committee.

The Panther Assistants



Former University of Iowa basketball star **Kevin Boyle** was the first to be named to head coach Eldon Miller's staff. Boyle played for the Hawkeyes from 1978-82. He was named Big Ten Rookie of the Year in 1979 and was a first team all-Big Ten selection by both AP and UPI as a junior. He was an honorable mention all-American after the 1980-81 season and a pre-season all-American pick as a senior. A starting forward-guard for the Gold Medal team at the 1981 World University Games, Boyle was named Amateur Player of the Year in 1982 by the ABA-USA Olympic Committee. A Hawkeye captain his senior year, he was a four-year starter. He also was named Iowa's Most Valuable Player his senior year. Boyle's other accolades include being named one of the nation's elite defensive players by Sports Illustrated. He played in four NCAA tournaments with the Hawks, including being a starter on the team that made it to the Final Four in 1980. Scoring a career 1,189 points, Boyle was drafted in the sixth round by the Philadelphia 76ers in 1982 and played during the exhibition season. He also played with the San Diego Clippers during the 1983 Los Angeles Summer League. He played extensively in Europe. After being released by the 76ers, he played in England, France



and Switzerland. He also coached youth while playing in Europe. Boyle played his high school career at Saint Laurence in Chicago, IL.

Kevin Lehman was the second fulltime aide to be hired by Miller. At the time of his UNI appointment, he was an assistant boys' basketball coach at Dowling High in West Des Moines, IA. He is a native of Iowa City where he played his prep career at Regina High School. Lehman had been on staff at Dowling since 1983. His junior varsity record for three years was 31-5. Prior to that, he was assistant basketball and head golf coach at Johnston (IA) High School three years. He graduated from Wartburg College in 1977 after also attending Palmer Junior College. While at Wartburg, he played with the Knights' basketball team which toured Australia in 1977. He was an all-conference and all-state selection at Regina and an all-region pick at Palmer, when he set records for most points in a single game (49) and season (583). He received his master's degree from Drake University in 1985.

Eldon Miller's staff was made complete with the hiring of former St. Cloud State head coach **Samuel Skarich** as parttime assistant. No stranger to Miller and his style of basketball, Skarich worked with Miller at Ohio State from 1976-78 as a part-



time assistant. A native of Keewatin, MN, Skarich received his bachelor's degree from Notre Dame in 1964 and his master's in 1965. He was a two-year letterman for the Irish, participating in the NCAA tournament in 1963. His coaching background is wide and varied. He assisted the Notre Dame freshman team while working on his master's and the St. Joseph's High School program in South Bend, IN, where he got his first fulltime coaching job following graduation. He also taught and coached at St. Joseph's Catholic High School in St. Joseph, MI. He was promoted to head coach of Lake Michigan Catholic High School after St. Joseph's consolidated. In 1973, he resigned that position to rejoin the St. Joseph staff in Indiana and was elevated to head coach there when Bob Donnewald joined the Indiana University staff. After two years there, he became Miller's parttime assistant.



From 1978-81, Skarich worked with Donnewald at Illinois State as a fulltime aide and then was named head coach at St. Cloud State where he coached until 1984. He spent one more year at St. Cloud as administrative assistant to the athletic director. He was programmer for Sports and Health Clubs of Minnesota immediately prior to taking the UNI position.

Northern Iowa's graduate assistant coach is **Mike Bailey**, a 1989 graduate of UNI. Bailey played for the Panthers from 1986-88 after transferring from North Iowa Area Community College, where he was an honorable mention all-American. He was a co-captain his senior year at UNI. He was a student assistant coach at UNI during the 1988-89 campaign. Since then, he has been substitute teaching. Bailey is a 1984 graduate of Oelwein, IA, High School. He is a son of Michael Bailey, Sr., and Karon Fromm and is a broth-



er of David and Zachary.

Student assistant **Jonathan Cox** played for the Panthers the last four seasons as a part-time starter. Most always showing a smile on his face, he became known as the Panthers' "attitude adjuster". Cox was a two-year letterwinner at Springfield, IL, High School where he also lettered twice in track, baseball and football. He was the basketball team's MVP his senior season and captained the cage, grid and track teams. He was a first team Mid-State and all-city pick and fourth team all-state. Cox is majoring in business administration.

Scott Socha joins Jonathan Cox this year as student assistant coach. A three-year letterwinner at Marshalltown (IA) High School, Socha played a key role for the Panthers the last four years as a reserve forward-center. Socha is completing his degree in accounting.

The Mid-Continent Conference

The Mid-Continent Conference was conceived in 1982 as eight Midwestern universities joined together to form a new NCAA Division I conference for men's sports.

Representing six states, members include Akron, Cleveland State, Eastern Illinois, Illinois at Chicago, Northern Illinois, Northern Iowa, Valparaiso, Western Illinois and Wisconsin-Green Bay. Akron and Northern Illinois will be competing in basketball for the first time this season after participating in other league championships last year.

In addition to basketball, the league conducts championships in eight other sports, including soccer, baseball, cross country, swimming, indoor track, outdoor track, golf and tennis. In basketball, the league has been represented in the past five NCAA and last four of five NIT post-season tournaments.

During the 1985-86 campaign, CSU was an at-large selection to the NCAA Tournament, upsetting Indiana and St. Joseph's before a one-point loss to Navy stopped the Vikings from reaching the final round of eight teams. That same season, SMSU, which left the league this past spring, was an NIT quarterfinalist, defeating Pittsburgh and Marquette, before a one-point setback at Florida.

SMSU went on to participate in the next three NCAA Championships, defeating Clemson in 1987 before a four-point loss to Kansas, and falling in a four-point decision to Nevada-Las Vegas in the 1988 NCAA First Round. In 1989, the Bears lost to Seton Hall in the first round. CSU, meanwhile, participated in two of the last four NIT post-season tournaments, defeating Tennessee-Chattanooga in 1987 before a two-point loss to Illinois State and winning over Illinois State in 1988's first round before a six-point loss at Ohio State in the second round.

This past spring, Northern Iowa made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since playing Division I basketball, along with SMSU. The Panthers upset Missouri in the first round and dropped a three-point contest in the second game to Minnesota. Wisconsin-Green Bay saw action in the NIT Tourney.

UNI-Dome

Not a Nice Place to Visit

If there's one thing tougher than getting presidential candidates to talk about the issues, it's being a visitor trying to win in the UNI-Dome. The Panthers have their own brand of politics, led by head coach Eldon Miller.

Looking all the way back to when the UNI-Dome was first opened, the Panthers are 141-54 at home in the Dome for a 72 percentage. The UNI-Dome is a very tricky place to play basketball.

The UNI-Dome (the prefix stands for University of Northern Iowa as well as meaning one and unique) combines the features of three buildings — a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. It contains facilities to hold a variety of events such as concerts, exhibitions, trade shows, pageants, rallies and convocations, as well as football, basketball and softball games and wrestling and track meets.

The Dome has hosted such events as the NCAA gymnastic and wrestling championships, the Iowa High School All-Star Basketball games, the Iowa High School football playoffs, concerts by Dolly Parton, the Eagles, REO Speedwagon, Fleetwood Mac and The Rolling Stones, to mention a few, antique car shows, tractor pulls and many other non-athletic events.

The Dome's air-supported, Fiberglass fabric roof, constructed by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corp., was erected at a cost equal to half that of conventional roof construction. And because of the Dome's translucence, ample natural light is available during daylight hours resulting in a sizeable savings on utility costs.

The UNI-Dome was designed with "something for everyone". Its artificial turf for football games can be installed in a minimum of 36 hours. Underneath, on a synthetic floor area, are basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track. As many as 12 tennis matches and two basketball games could be played simultaneously.

Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football and 20,000 for courtside activities. For stage activities, such as commencements, concerts and speakers' series, total capacity — using movable bleachers and chairs — can reach 25,000.

The 168,000-square foot Dome, which rises 124 feet above the arena floor, is supported entirely by a network of 12 stranded steel cables and air blowers. A concrete and steel ring around the top of the 70 foot high stadium wall holds the cables. The cables weigh around 47 tons.

The roof of the Dome is made of about 49 tons of woven Fiberglass coated with Teflon. Approximately 60 percent of the Dome has an inner liner of fabric that provides acoustical as well as thermal benefits.

A spacious press box atop the east stands has facilities for 20 radio stations, television capabilities and seating for up to 125 people. A photography darkroom, photo bay, concession area and scouting booths are other features. Two huge scoreboards flash messages and information to spectators throughout the events.

The west press box provides a meeting room for the UNI Athletic Club. A new meeting room at the Northeast concourse level of the arena has been completed for a meeting room, primarily for use by the football team. Currently, an enclosed passageway connects the Dome with the Physical Education Center for locker facilities.

1989-90 Season In Review

Postseason Bid, 23 Wins Highlight Season

To say the Northern Iowa Panthers accomplished all their goals in 1989-90 would be inaccurate. But a 23-win season, a conference tournament title and a first post-season appearance at the Division I level definitely were things to write home about.

The '89-90 Panthers encountered their share of highs and lows throughout the course of the season. They realized early the difficulty of playing on the road in the Mid-Continent Conference but at the same time became one of the league's most feared teams when playing on its home floor. When the book closed on coach Eldon Miller's fourth season in Cedar Falls, the Panthers were secure with their steady progress. They had defeated the Iowa Hawkeyes for the first time since 1913, set a state-record crowd in that game with 22,797 screaming fans in the UNI-Dome, won their first conference postseason game and went on to sweep the tournament, and upset Missouri in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Miller became only the seventh coach in history to lead three institutions to the NCAA Division I Tournament. Two Panther assistants made their first tournament appearance as coaches after having participated as players. It was the fifth time Kevin Boyle had been to the tourney. He was a starter on the Iowa teams that went from 1979-82, including the Final Four in 1980. Sam Skarich also played on Notre Dame's 1963 NCAA team.

UNI was the third Mid-Continent team to earn an NCAA berth, following Cleveland State and Southwest Missouri State.

Two-time first team all-league selection Jason Reese passed Randy Kraayenbrink and became UNI's all-time scoring leader against Missouri in the NCAA tourney. He finished with 2,033 career points after leading UNI in scoring each of his four seasons.

UNI's 23 victories tied the mark set in 1963-64 when the Panthers posted a 23-4 mark and placed fourth in the Division II tournament.

After surviving a 99-94 triple overtime win over Illinois at Chicago in the first round of the Mid-Continent Tournament, UNI followers began to sense some magic in the air after the semifinal game with top-seeded Southwest Missouri State. After trailing by eight with

just over two minutes remaining, UNI fought back to tie the game at 61-61 with 23 seconds left. When SMSU's Jeff Ford was whistled for traveling, the Panthers had the ball with two seconds remaining, underneath the SMSU basket. After a timeout, Dale Turner launched an 86-foot pass to center Reese, who whirled, took a step and laid it in at the horn to give the Panthers a near-miraculous 63-61 win.

The conference title game pitted the Panthers against their biggest nemesis in recent history — Wisconsin-Green Bay. The Phoenix had defeated the Panthers 10 straight times. UNI took control of the game from the outset and led 29-18 at the half. UWGB went on a 13-2 run early in the second half to tie the game at 31-31 before the Panthers went on an 11-2 spurt of their own to stretch the lead. The Phoenix narrowed the gap to two again in the final minute, but UNI hit clutch free throws down the stretch to secure its first league tournament championship and the automatic NCAA berth that goes with it.

Three Panthers were voted to the all-tournament team — Reese, Turner and Troy Muilenburg — with Reese earning Most Valuable Player honors.

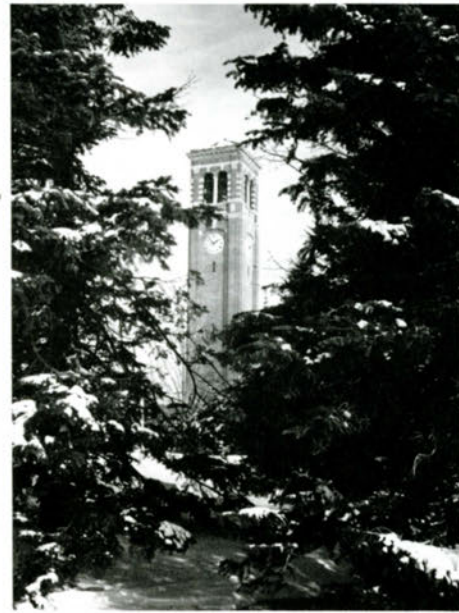

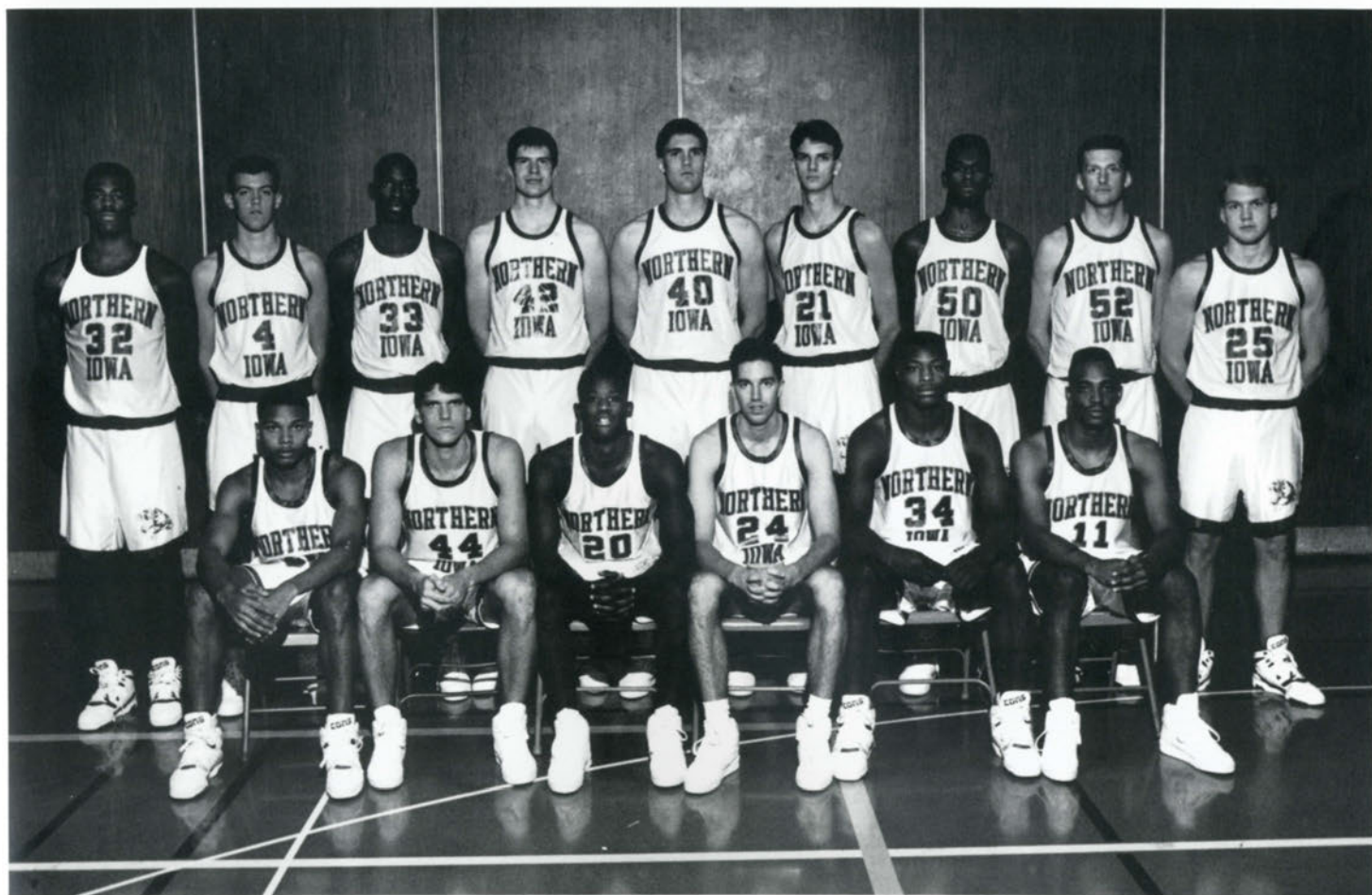

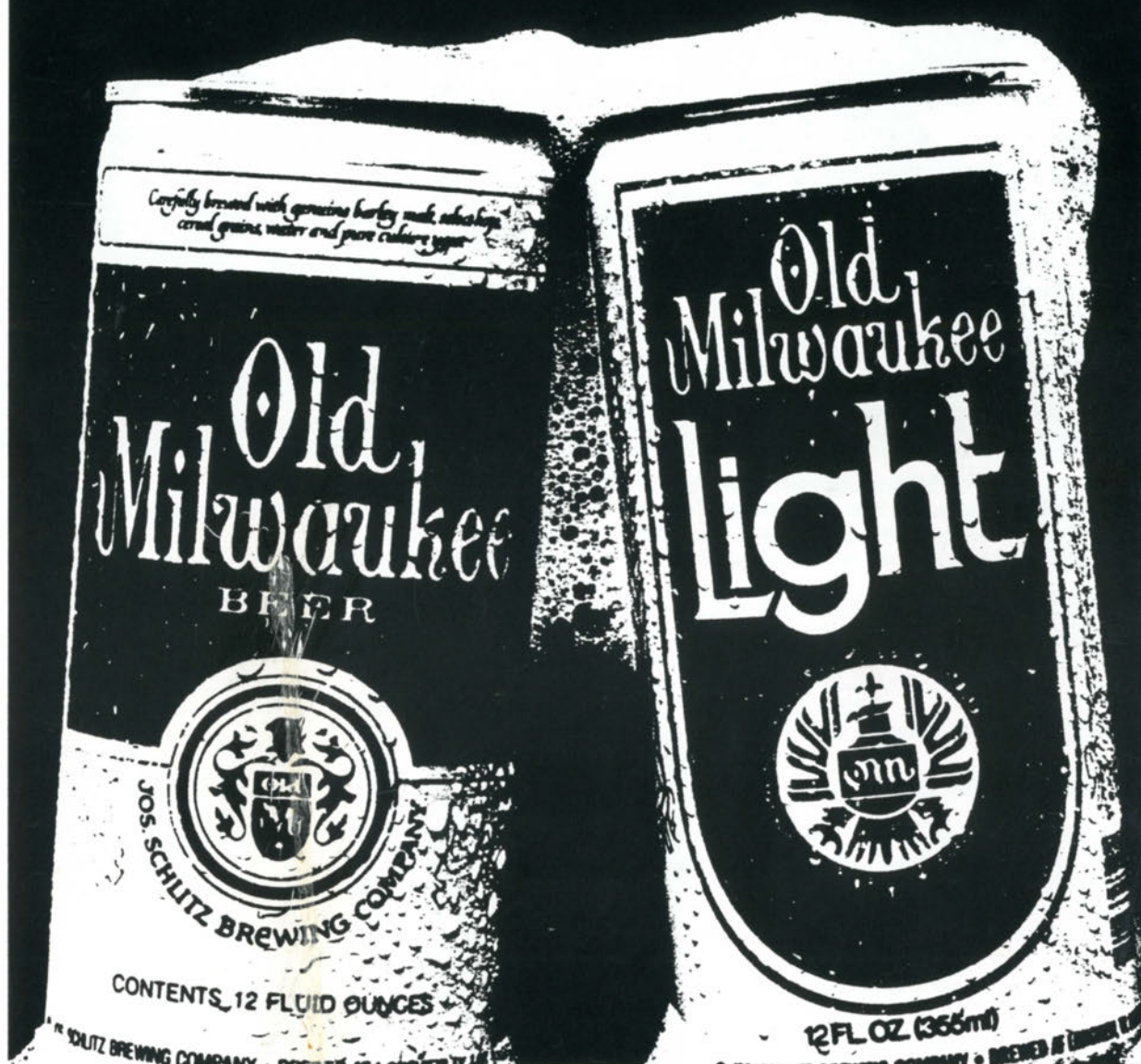
