State College of Iowa

The State College of Iowa regularly schedules part of its residence offerings at evening or Saturday hours and opens them to persons within convenient driving range of the campus. Students enrolling for such classes only are treated as regular students, requiring admission to the college, meeting prerequisites, and other standards. Even though all work offered is usable toward a degree, a student is not required to have a degree goal, except in the case of a teacher certified on less than a bachelor's degree seeking certificate renewal.

Courses numbered 200-299 are open to graduate students only; those numbered 100-199 are primarily designed for junior, senior, and graduate students, but only those 100-level courses which are followed by a "g" provide graduate credit for graduate students; and those numbered below 100 are primarily designed for freshman and sophomore students and offer only undergraduate credit. Courses afford teachers an opportunity to take work toward certificate renewal or reinstatement; toward meeting the requirements for either a bachelor's or a master's degree; or toward qualifying for an administrative or supervisory endorsement.

A full-time teacher is permitted to carry a maximum of six hours of work in any semester. Others pursuing full-time jobs are advised to limit work to a maximum of six hours a semester. The college reserves the right to cancel a class if an insufficient number of students enroll in it, as well as to close classes when a maximum is secured.

REGISTRATION

The college has installed a simplified system of registration which is predicated on the student's giving notice in advance so that registration materials can be prepared ahead of time and be ready when he comes to enroll. If you will fill out and mail the coupon well in advance of registration, it will save you much time and inconvenience.

Early registration is encouraged to insure entrance into class. Registration for evening and Saturday classes should be made at advance registration on January 10 or at regular registration February 4. Students who cannot conveniently enroll at one of these times may enroll in Room 10 (basement), Administration Building, one hour before the first meeting of the class.

REGISTRATION BY MAIL

Individuals who send in the "tear-out" early enough will be sent the proper registration material and instructions. Those who return this material completed, promptly, and with remittance will have their registration completed without having to appear in person. Those who do not give notice in time or who do not receive material and complete it by mail must register at one of the times indicated.

COST

The cost for either evening or Saturday classes is at the rate of \$14 per semester hour with a minimum fee of \$28 for undergraduate students and \$16 per semester hour with a minimum fee of \$32 for students holding a baccalaureate degree.
