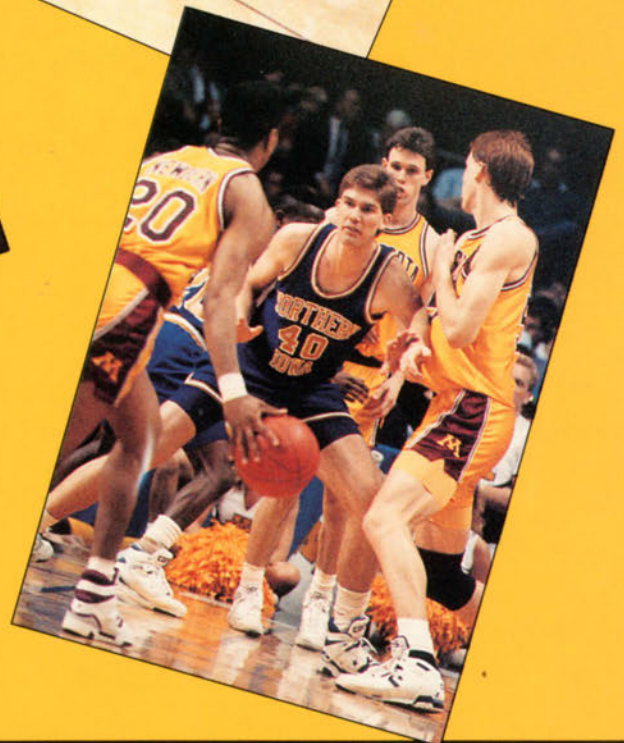
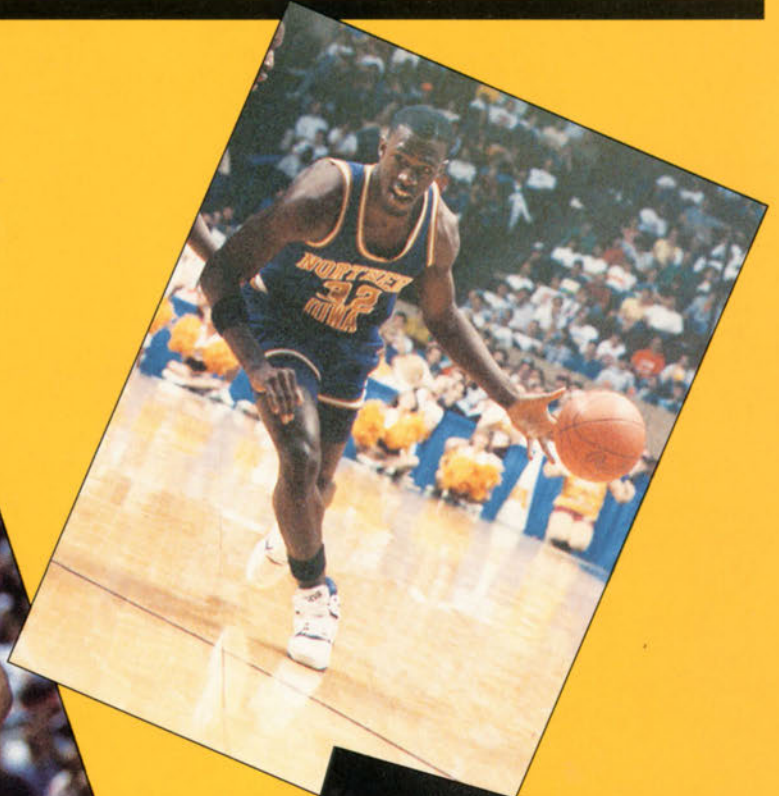

The rich history of Northern Iowa men's basketball began in 1900. A coachless 1900-01 Panther squad failed to post a victory in three tries during its initial season. The team rebounded to post an undefeated 1-0 record during its second campaign. Similar seasons with few games produced a record of 260-205 before a two-year layoff (1943-45) during World War II.

The Panthers joined the North Central Conference in 1935. The first conference championship team was coached by O.M. "Hon" Nordly during the 1947-48 season. Three more titles followed in succession, with Nordly coaching five of the nine conference-winning teams in UNI history.

The '60s were a golden age for the Panthers. UNI went 156-75 for a .675 winning percentage during the decade. Norm Stewart, currently head coach at Missouri, took over the reins in 1961, leading then State College of Iowa to its best season ever. The Panthers finished 19-5 and 8-4 in the NCC, tying for first place. They advanced to their first NCAA regional tournament. The following year, UNI advanced to the Final Eight of the Division II tournament.

The Panthers opened the '70s with their first losing season in 12 years and in 1973, Jim Berry took over the reins. His rebuilding program made steady progress. UNI left the NCC for the newly-formed Mid-Continent Conference before the 1978-79 campaign. The Panthers responded to the challenge, finishing with an 18-11 record and receiving an at-large bid to the NCAA II playoffs.

Berry turned up his scheduling a notch for the 1979-80 season, with the Panthers playing eight Division I schools. And in 1980-81, UNI made the step up to Division I.

The 1983-84 season saw the Panthers finish 18-10 overall and 10-4 in the MCC, good for second place. They were undefeated in the UNI-Dome (14-0) and narrowly missed an NIT berth, losing their last three games of the season, primarily due to an injury to leading scorer Randy Kraayenbrink.

The Eldon Miller era began in 1986. Under his tutelage, the Panthers defeated Iowa before a state-record crowd of nearly 23,000 in the Dome, won the Mid-Continent Conference post-season tournament at home and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 1990, finishing 23-9.

It's 1991. The Panthers enter the "Valley of the Giants".

Radio

For the second consecutive season, UNI Basketball can be heard home and away on flagship station KOEL (92.3 FM Oelwein/Cedar Falls/Waterloo), KCPB-Burlington, KDMI-Des Moines, KIWA-Sheldon, KCLN-Clinton and KLEH-Anamosa. Once again this year, Clare Rampton will serve as the "Voice" of the Panthers, with Virgil Erickson providing color analysis. The listening range of the Network covers virtually the entire State of Iowa.

Credential Requests: All requests for working press, radio, photographer or scouting credentials should be directed to Director of Sports Information Nancy Justis no later than one week prior to the game. Requests for season credentials should be made two weeks prior to the first game. Credentials will be left at the Will Call window located at the Northeast corner of the UNI-Dome.

Press Policies: Press row seats are reserved for working press only. If space permits, scouts will be issued a seat at press row (limited to two per opponent).

Radio & TV: Space is available for radio and television broadcast personnel at press row. One telephone line will be provided to opponents' commercial radio stations. Should another telephone line be needed, please contact US West Communications at 1-800-772-7751, but inform the Sports Information Department beforehand so that we may accommodate the phone company.

Photographers: Only accredited photographers or freelance photographers shooting for the Northern Iowa Sports Information Department will be issued working credentials. UNI reserves the right to admit only those photographers deemed to be on the premises for legitimate media purposes. Any requests for photo credentials must be made to Nancy Justis on company letterhead.

Press Parking: Parking for all UNI-Dome athletic events is available in the PEC (Physical Education Center connected to the Dome) parking lot. A press credential is required to park.

FAX Services: One FAX machine is available for media use in the Sports Information Office located on the West side of the UNI-Dome. We suggest that you

install your own telephone lines and bring your own electronic sending machines. Only one phone is available for media use courtside.

Interviews: All interview requests, player or coaches, should be directed to Director of Sports Information Nancy Justis at least three days in advance unless late-breaking news warrants immediate action. If you intend on covering a practice, please inform the Sports Information Department beforehand.

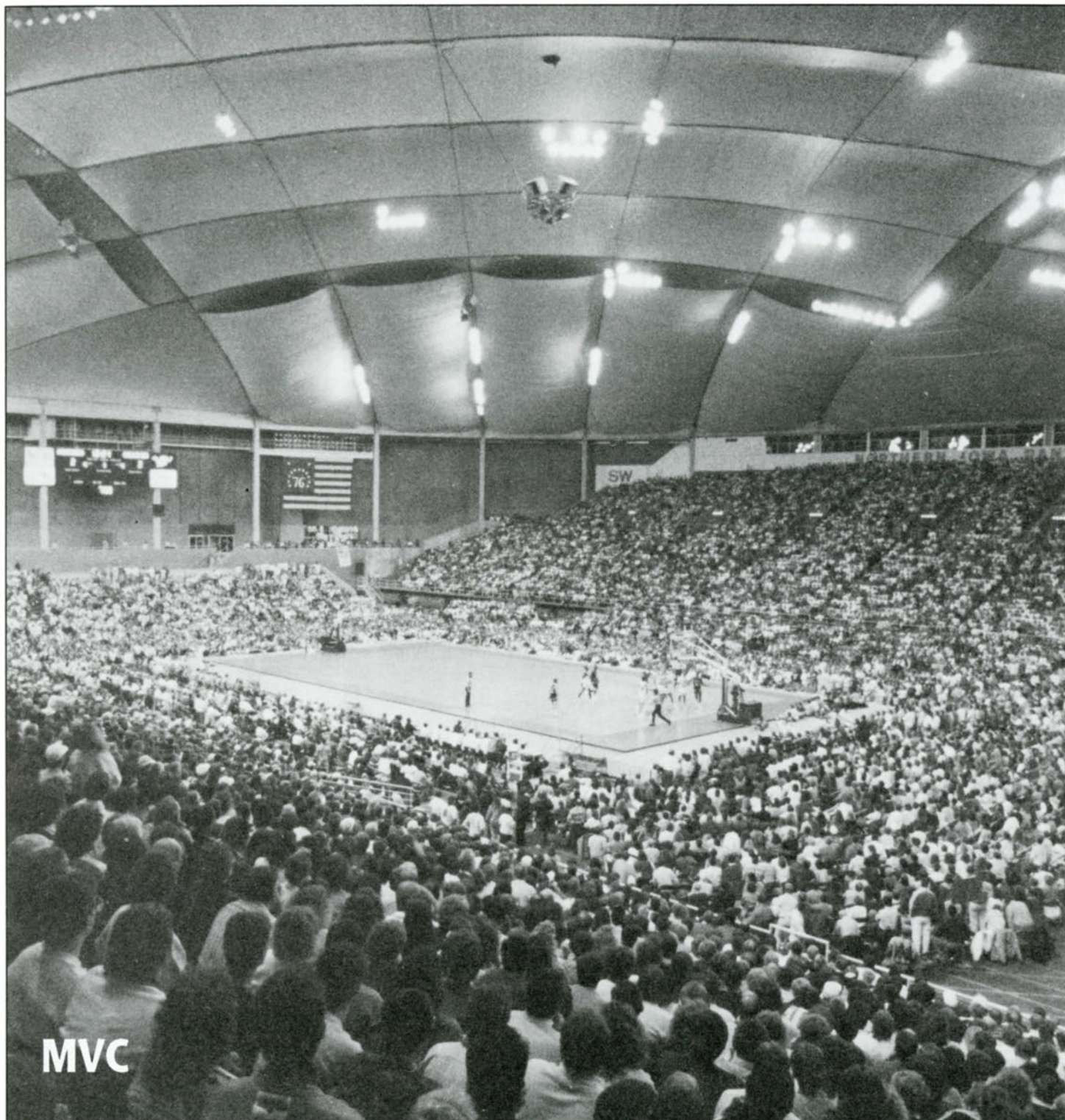
Post-Game Interviews: The interviews may be conducted following the 10-minute cooling off period with Coach Miller in Classroom 186A in the hallway leading directly to the weight room in the Physical Education Center. You find it by exiting the floor of the Dome through the revolving doors at the northeast corner and walking straight ahead through the tunnel connecting the Dome to the PEC. Coach Miller will be available immediately after the end of the game, and an attempt will be made to make the opposing coach available after Coach Miller. Players may be made available at your request, or outside the locker room after the cooling off period.

Another chapter will be written in the Northern Iowa basketball annals beginning this season when the Panthers begin competition in the Missouri Valley Conference. UNI becomes the 10th member of the MVC, concluding a nine-year membership in the Mid-Continent Conference, and the 31st institution to hold MVC membership. Panther teams were some of the most successful in the Mid-Con,

having captured 14 league championships, the most of any team currently in the conference.

Memories are great. But the past is the past and the 1991-92 UNI basketball team now must develop new rivalries and carve its own name in the record books. With that in mind, we offer you the following preview of the UNI Panther basketball team.

Panthers Look to Build On Year-End Success

The Panthers, under sixth-year head coach Eldon Miller, have run the gamut of emotions. They wrapped up the 1989-90 season in record-breaking fashion with their first trip to the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament, defeating Missouri in the first round and losing to Minnesota by only three points in the second game.

With expectations high last season, UNI fell short of a second straight trip to the "Big Dance". Finishing 13-19 overall and 8-8 in the Mid-Con, tying for fourth place with Cleveland State, it was seeded fifth in the post-season tourney. But Miller saw steady improvement in his team over the last month of the regular season and he thought his team to be a legitimate contender once again. However, a desperation three-point shot in regulation and a 76-63 overtime loss to top-seed Northern Illinois in the semifinal game eliminated UNI from contention.

As many times as the Panthers had things fall their way in '89-90 (they were 10-4 in games decided by five or less points), just as many times in '90-91, the ball bounced the other way. UNI lost 10 games decided by 10 or fewer points and was 1-3 in overtime games. It won seven games decided by 10 or fewer points.

Miller has said you don't measure success when the season is in progress, but when it's all over. After the loss to NIU, he said "this team has improved as much through the season as any team I've worked with". That's where the 1991-92 season begins.

Frontcourt: The Forwards

Of all positions, the front line is the most unsettled for the Panthers. UNI loses reserve Brad Hill, a threat from the outside; and Troy Muilenburg, the team's leading scorer (13.4) and rebounder (8.2) and a second-team all-conference pick.

Sophomore Brian Jones played in 25 of the 32 games last year in a reserve role and should get more of an opportunity to play this season with the departure of Hill and Muilenburg.

Freshman Jon Ellis and Lincoln Trail transfer David Butler are both coming off redshirt seasons. Southeastern Community College transfer Troy Vaughn played in all 32 games a year ago, starting 15 contests. Freshman Todd Veltrop from Rock Falls, IL, has a

shot at either forward or center at 6-9, along with sophomore redshirt John Holterhaus, who walked on last year after playing football for UNI his first year.

Sean Rice of Marion, IA, is another freshman, along with Minneapolis South grad Jason Sims. Sims, however, is recovering from knee surgery and it is not known how quickly he'll be ready to play.

That leaves five players who have not played a game for UNI and two who have only one year's experience. Those people most likely will be teamed up with one of the two people who has the most experience on the team — senior Cedrick McCullough.

McCullough is a three-year starter and last year's second-leading rebounder (4.4) and third-leading scorer

(11.6). He most often is given the job of guarding the opponent's most prolific scorer.

Frontcourt: The Centers

Besides Veltrop, Miller has three other potential candidates at center. One of the reasons the Panthers began to put things together at the end of last season is the emergence of senior Nick Pace, who started 14 of 28 games last year in replacing the graduated Jason Reese.

"Pace was our most improved player last year," Miller says. "He'll be a force at center."

Sophomore Terry Merfeld also has starting experience in six of 16 games played a year ago. The fourth possibility here is Iowa Central Community College transfer Greg Hammar, a force to be reckoned with at 6-9, 225 pounds.

The Backcourt

The backcourt should be a real strength. Northern Iowa has the proven perimeter players in McCullough and his sidekick, senior guard Dale Turner, also a three-year starter and the team's top returning scorer (12.5). Turner also led the team in assists (5.0 per game), and was third in steals (1.2 per game).

The Panthers also should have more depth here this year. Sophomore Cam Johnson returns after a redshirt year. As a freshman in UNI's NCAA tournament season, Johnson averaged only 2.9 points and 1.2 rebounds while dishing out 26 assists in 31 games. However, insiders say he had perhaps the best off-season of anyone on the squad.

Lincoln Land transfer Louis Armstrong, who shared starting duties with the graduated Maurice Newby last year, should be more of a factor this season. Armstrong was not eligible to compete until December last year, thus missing half a year of instruction. He was second on the team in assists (1.8) and tied with Muilenburg in steals (1.4).

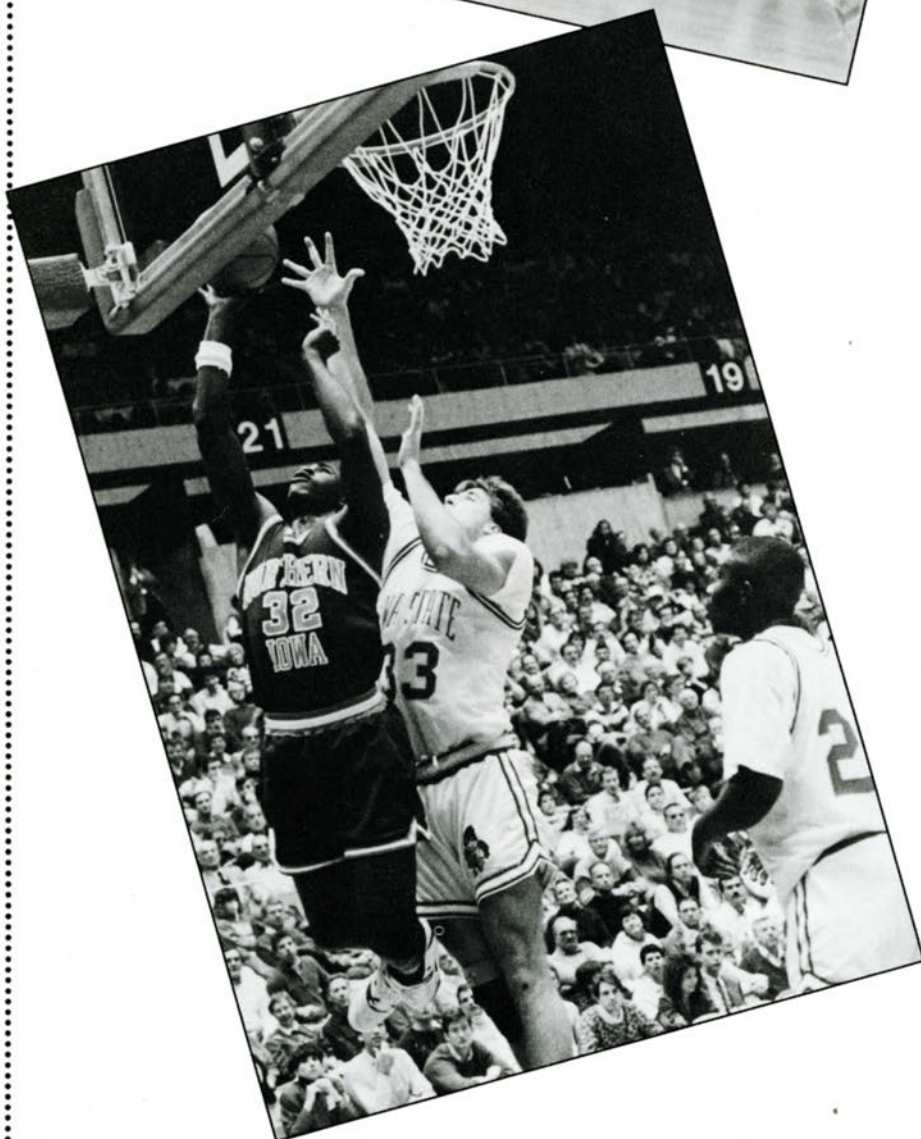
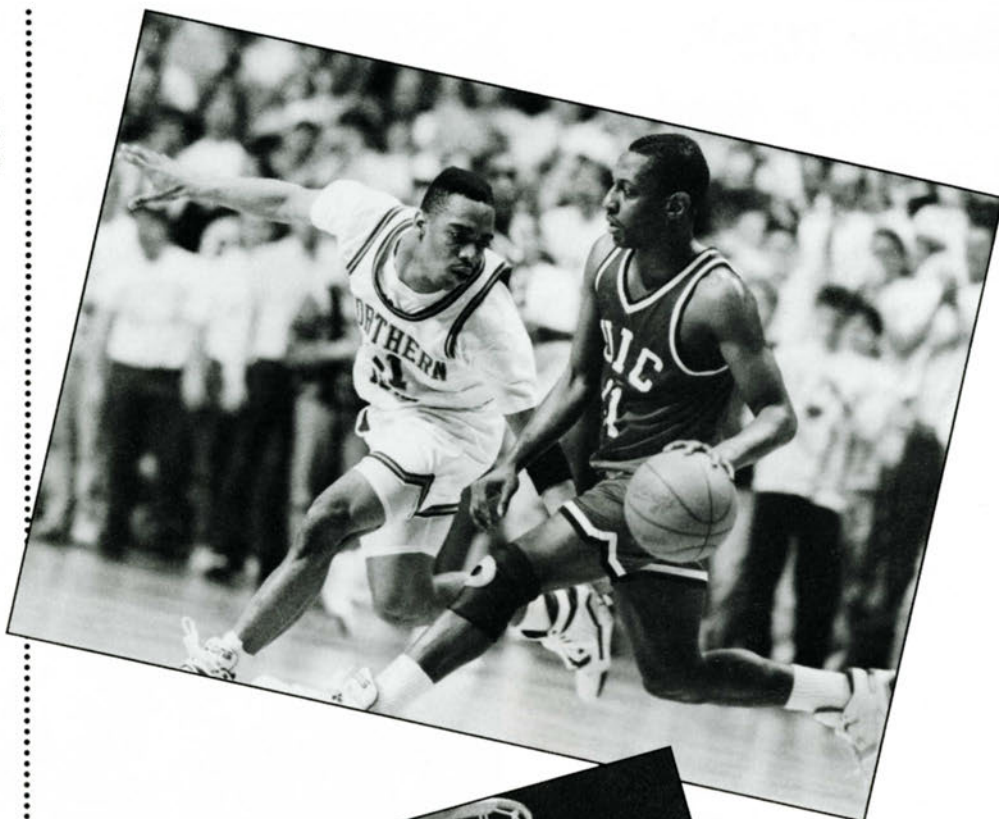
A candidate for "Mr. Basketball" honors in the State of Minnesota, freshman Brian Carpenter rounds out the guard candidates.

Wrapping Up

The Panthers are embarking on a new journey. Eight players haven't stepped on the court during true competition, five players have played only one year and three remaining seniors include only two players with three years of fulltime experience.

"This team has the potential to be the deepest team I've had at UNI," Miller says. "With all the new people, we set perimeters and go from there. But we have no idea who will step forward and who won't."

Besides a tough Missouri Valley schedule, the Panthers host Iowa, which finished 21-11 overall, last year; meet Southwestern Louisiana, which finished 21-10; play at Iowa State, which finished 12-19; host Wyoming, a 20-12 finisher a year ago; St. Louis University, which finished with a 19-14 mark; and participate in the Sun Bowl Tournament along with host Texas-El Paso (16-13), Clemson (11-17) and Texas (23-9).

Few coaches in Northern Iowa history have entered this program and made an immediate impact like Eldon Miller has in his brief five years with the Panthers. Who would have thought six years ago that Miller would accomplish what he has? But those who know Miller and have followed his career since his days at Ohio State, Western Michigan and Wittenberg show little surprise. Ever since Miller walked into the UNI-Dome in 1986, he has been delivering the unexpected and delivering winning basketball.

Beginning his sixth season in the UNI program, Miller enters the 1991-92 campaign with the challenge of not only maintaining, but improving upon, the level of success he has helped establish in Cedar Falls.

The official naming of Miller to head the UNI program was made on February 27, 1986, just prior to Ohio State's appearance in the NIT Tournament, a title the Buckeyes eventually captured.

Miller responded by leading his first Northern Iowa squad to a 13-15 record overall and a 7-7 finish in the Mid-Continent Conference which placed the Panthers fifth. Quite an accomplishment, considering they were picked to finish last in the eight-team field with only three returning lettermen. Those 13 wins tied for second the most wins in a season since moving to Division I, and they won more road games since the 1979-80 season.

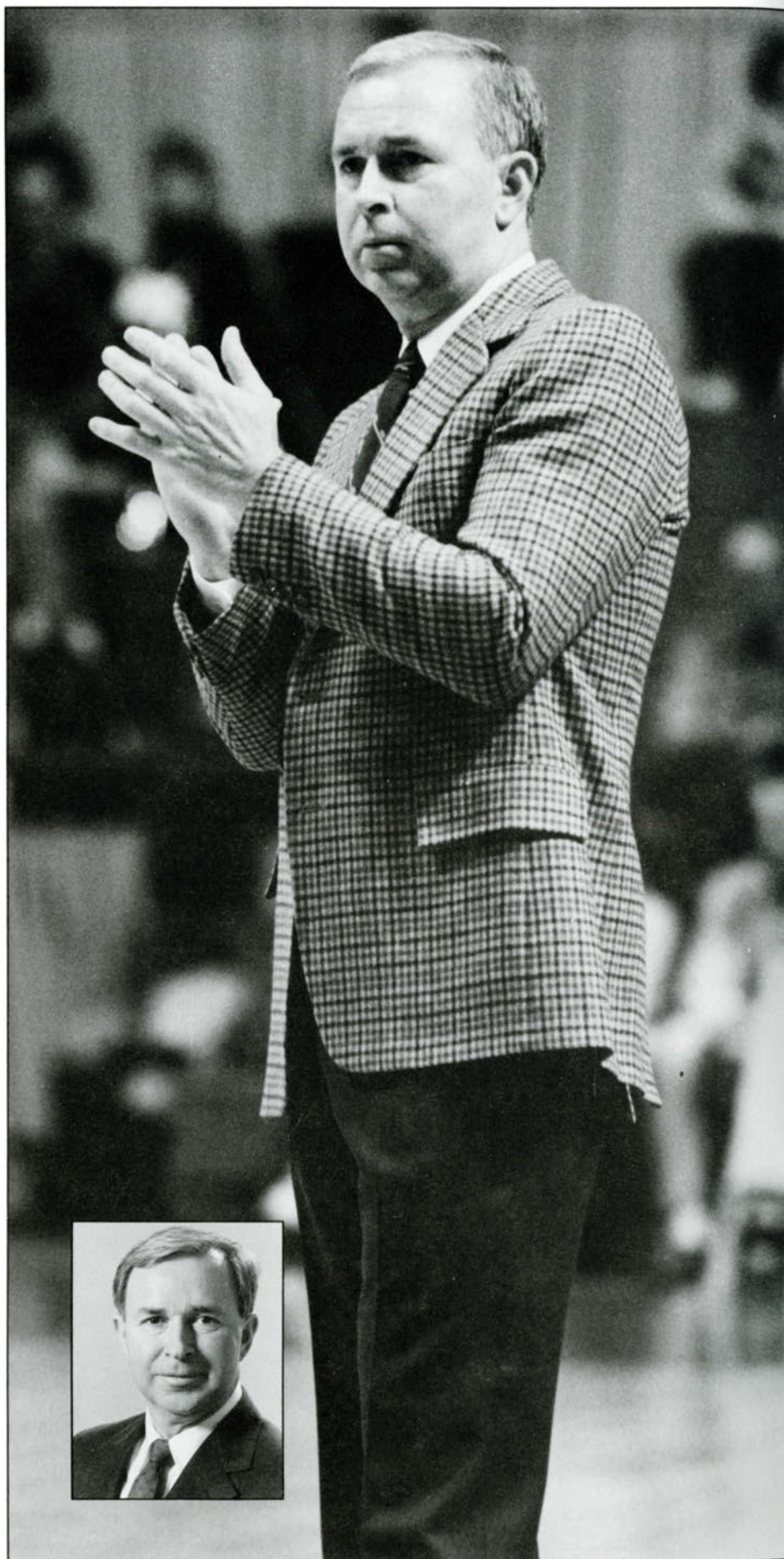

Year one laid the foundation for year two and three, the latter of which saw the Panthers erase or tie 12 school records. The Panthers wrapped up 1988-89 with a second place finish in the Mid-Continent with an 8-4 mark, their highest finish ever. Their 19-9 overall mark was their best effort since moving to Division I. They were 14-1 at home and just missed an NIT berth.

That year also brought Miller recognition as the Mid-Continent Coach of the Year.

Four years of hard work paid off in 1989-90 when the Panthers hit plateau after plateau. After defeating Iowa before a state-record crowd of 22,727 fans in the UNI-Dome, they tied for just third place in the regular league season. Then they swept the conference's post-season tournament played in the UNI-Dome and received their first berth in the NCAA tournament since 1979. UNI upset the Missouri Tigers in the first round and barely were edged out by Minnesota in the second round. They finished with a 23-9 record overall, tying a school record for most wins.

Miller and the Panthers struggled through last season without UNI's all-time leading scorer, Jason Reese. Though the results did not match preseason hopes and dreams following the "Cinderella" season the year before, steady improvement throughout the campaign and competing in a new league this coming year has done nothing but increase the level of excitement surrounding UNI basketball.

Miller knows what battles are. Prior to taking the UNI job upon Jim Berry's resignation, he spent 10 years at Ohio State, compiling a 176-118 record there. Nine of his Buckeye teams compiled winning records, seven played in post-season tournaments and four recorded 20 or more wins. They had participated in the NCAA tournament three of his last five years and, in 1986, defeated Wyoming for the NIT title. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year twice.

He was born June 19, 1939, in Gnadenhutten, OH. He played basketball four years at Wittenberg. As a senior in 1961, Miller starred on the NCAA College Division championship team and was chosen Most Valuable Player.

After graduation, he remained at Wittenberg to take graduate work and to assist coaching. He was named head coach at the end of the 1962 season at the tender age of 23. Miller enjoyed eight successful seasons there, compiling a 142-55 record, and won three Ohio Conference titles while sharing two others. He recently was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Fame.

Miller went to Western Michigan in 1971. Charged with rebuilding that program, his 1976 team won its first

Winningest Active NCAA Division I Men's Coaches

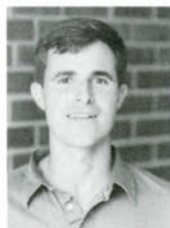
He and his wife, Dee, have three children — daughters Amy and Caroline and son Ben.

THE PANTHER ASSISTANTS



Former University of Iowa basketball star **Kevin Boyle** was the first to be named to head coach Eldon Miller's staff. Boyle played for the Hawkeyes from 1978-82. He was named Big Ten Rookie of the Year in 1979 and was a first team all-Big Ten selection by both AP and UPI as a junior. He was an honorable mention all-American after the 1980-81 season and a preseason all-American pick as a senior. A starting forward-guard for the Gold Medal team at the 1981 World University Games, Boyle was named Amateur Player of the Year in 1982 by the ABA-USA Olympic Committee. A Hawkeye captain his senior year, he was a four-year starter. He also was named Iowa's Most Valuable Player his senior year. Boyle's other accolades include being named one of the nation's elite defensive players by Sports Illustrated. He played in four NCAA tournaments with the Hawks, including being a starter on the team that made it to the Final Four in 1980. Scoring a career 1,189 points, Boyle was drafted in the sixth round by the Philadelphia 76ers in 1982 and played during the exhibition season. He also played with the San Diego Clippers during the 1983 Los Angeles Summer League. He played extensively in Europe. After being released by the 76ers, he played in England, France and Switzerland. He also coached youth while playing in Europe. Boyle played his high school career at Saint Laurence in Chicago, IL.

Kevin Lehman was the second fulltime aide to be hired by Miller. At the time of his UNI appointment, he was an assistant boys' basketball coach at Dowling High in West Des Moines, IA. He is a native of Iowa City where he played his prep career at Regina High School. Lehman had been on staff at Dowling since 1983. His junior varsity record for three years was 31-5. Prior to that, he was assistant basketball and head golf coach at Johnston (IA) High School three years. He graduated from Wartburg College in 1977 after also attending Palmer Junior College. While at Wartburg, he played with the Knights' basketball team which toured Australia in 1977. He was an all-conference and all-state selection at Regina and an all-region pick at Palmer, when he set records for most points in a single game (49) and season (583). He received his master's degree from Drake University in 1985.

Eldon Miller's staff was made complete with the hiring of former St. Cloud State head coach **Samuel Skarich** as parttime assistant. No stranger to Miller and his style of basketball, Skarich worked with Miller at Ohio State from 1976-78 as a parttime assistant. A native of Keewatin, MN, Skarich received his bachelor's degree from Notre Dame in 1964 and his master's in 1965. He was a two-year

letterman for the Irish, participating in the NCAA tournament in 1963. His coaching background is wide and varied. He assisted the Notre Dame freshman team while working on his master's and the St. Joseph's High School program in South Bend, IN, where he got his first fulltime coaching job following graduation. He also taught and coached at St. Joseph's Catholic High School in St. Joseph, MI. He was promoted to head coach of Lake Michigan Catholic High School after St. Joseph's consolidated. In 1973, he resigned that position to rejoin the St. Joseph staff in Indiana and was elevated to head coach there when Bob Donnewald joined the Indiana University staff. After two years there, he became Miller's parttime assistant. From 1978-81, Skarich worked with Donnewald at Illinois State as a fulltime aide and then was named head coach at St. Cloud State where he coached until 1984. He spent one more year at St. Cloud as administrative assistant to the athletic director. He was programmer for Sports and Health Clubs of Minnesota immediately prior to taking the UNI position.

Northern Iowa's graduate student assistant

is **Benton Miller**, son of head coach Eldon Miller. He's a 1991 graduate of Luther College with a degree in psychology and a 1987 graduate of Cedar Falls High School. He was a member of the Cedar Falls team two years which finished third in the state in 1987 and played three years at Luther. He was team captain his senior year. He has coached at UNI's, Luther's and Ohio State's summer camps. He was named to the Dean's List in 1990 and is a member of Psi Chi, the National Honor Society of Psychology. He's working towards his master's degree in Physical Education.

Brad Hill is this year's undergraduate student assistant. Hill played for the Panthers the last two years after transferring from Kalamazoo Valley Community College. He's a native of Akron, OH. While playing for the Panthers, Hill was known for his outside shot and coming forward in the big games. He was the MVP when UNI defeated Iowa in the UNI-Dome during the 1989-90 season.

MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE

A commitment to excellence, both in the classroom and the athletic arena, has been a trademark of the Missouri Valley Conference since its inception in the winter of 1907. Athletic accomplishments of Missouri Valley institutions through the years have included four national basketball championships, 17 trips to the NCAA Final Four, the 1989 college baseball championship by Wichita State, followed by another historic 1991 baseball season in which the MVC advanced two teams — Wichita State and Creighton — to the College World Series for the first time ever in the same season.

MVC athletes and coaches have become household names during the conference's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers which have followed, as Indiana State's Larry Bird, Wichita State's Xavier McDaniel, Bradley's Hersey Hawkins and Creighton's Benoit Benjamin are still active on NBA rosters, while past stars, such as Oscar Robertson, Chet Walker, Walt Frazier, Wes Unseld, Paul Silas and many others, still are to be found in the Valley's record books.

Seeds for the creation of the conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Assoc. were Washington University of St. Louis, Iowa, Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting,

two more institutions — Drake and Iowa State — were admitted to the league.

Since those early years, some 31 institutions in 13 states have at one time or another been a part of what is now the Missouri Valley Conference. League membership has stabilized over the last dozen years, which has helped make the MVC one of the most respected intercollegiate conferences in the nation.

In recent years, the Valley has been growing and expanding. Last year, Southwest Missouri State was admitted as the league's ninth member, and a 10th member — Northern Iowa — was admitted this past July. It is the newest members of the Valley, which also includes Bradley, Creighton, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Southern Illinois, Tulsa and Wichita State.

The Missouri Valley Conference postseason basketball tournament, held last season at Kiel Auditorium in St. Louis, will remain in that city but will move to The Arena for the 1992 event. The tournament will be played on successive days, with the quarterfinals on Saturday, March 7, the semifinals on March 8 and the championship game on March 9.

The tournament will include the top eight teams, based on regular-season standings, with the winner earning the MVC's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament. Creighton was last year's tournament champ, defeating Southwest Missouri State 68-52 in the title contest. The first neutral-site tournament in the 15-year history of the event attracted 30,000 spectators.

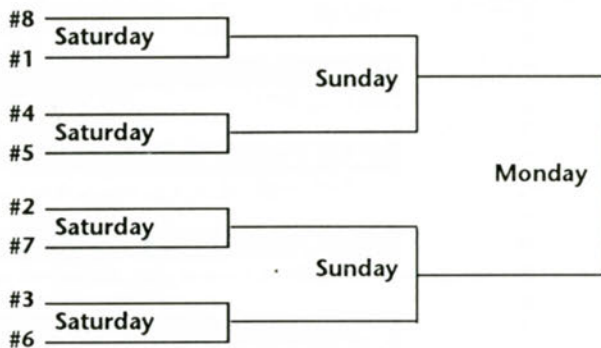

If there's one thing tougher than getting presidential candidates to talk about the issues, it's being a visitor trying to win in the UNI-Dome. The Panthers have their own brand of politics, led by head coach Eldon Miller.

Looking all the way back to when the UNI-Dome was first opened, the Panthers are 150-59 at home in the Dome for a 72 winning percentage. The UNI-Dome is a very tricky place to play basketball.

The UNI-Dome (the prefix stands for University of Northern Iowa as well as meaning one and unique) combines the features of three buildings — a football stadium, field house and large auditorium. It contains facilities to hold a variety of events such as concerts, exhibitions, trade shows, pageants, rallies and convocations, as well as football, basketball and softball games and wrestling and track meets.

The Dome has hosted such events as the NCAA gymnastic and wrestling championships, the Iowa High School All-Star Basketball games, the Iowa High School football playoffs, concerts by Dolly Parton, the Eagles, REO Speedwagon, Fleetwood Mac and The Rolling Stones, to mention a few, antique car shows, tractor pulls and many other non-athletic events.

The Dome's air-supported, Fiberglass fabric roof, constructed by Owens-Corning Fiberglass Corp., was erected at a cost equal to half that of conventional roof construction. And because of the Dome's translucence, ample natural light is available during daylight hours resulting in a sizeable savings on utility costs.

The UNI-Dome was designed with "something for everyone". Its artificial turf for football games can be installed in a minimum of 36 hours. Underneath, on a synthetic floor area, are basketball and tennis courts and an eight-lane, 220-yard oval running track. As many as 12 tennis matches and two basketball games could be played simultaneously.

Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football and 20,000 for courtside activities. For stage activities, such as commencements, concerts and speakers' series, total capacity — using movable bleachers and chairs — can reach 25,000.

The 168,000-square foot Dome, which rises 124 feet above the arena floor, is supported entirely by a network of 12 stranded steel cables and air blowers. A concrete and steel ring around the top of the 70 foot high stadium wall holds the cables. The cables weigh around 47 tons.

The roof of the Dome is made of about 49 tons of woven Fiberglass coated with Teflon. Approximately 60 percent of the Dome has an inner liner of fabric that provides acoustical as well as thermal benefits.

A spacious press box atop the east stands has facilities for 20 radio stations, television capabilities and seating for up to 125 people. A photography darkroom, photo bay, concession area and scouting booths are other features. Two huge scoreboards flash messages and information to spectators throughout the events.

The west press box provides a meeting room for the UNI Athletic Club. A room at the Northeast concourse level of the arena has been completed for a meeting room, primarily for use by the football team. Currently, an enclosed passageway connects the Dome with the Physical Education Center for locker facilities.

MANAGEMENT



Dr. Constantine W. Curris assumed the Presidency of the University of Northern Iowa in August, 1983. He is only the seventh chief executive in the University's 115-year history.

Prior to assuming the UNI presidency, Curris served 10 years as president of Murray State in Kentucky.

Other professional experiences include serving as Dean of Students at Marshall University and Vice-President and Academic Dean

of both Midway (KY) College and the West Virginia Institute of Technology.

Curris received a bachelor's degree magna cum laude in political science from Kentucky in 1962. He received a master's in political science and public administration from Illinois in 1965 and his Ed.D. degree in higher education from Kentucky in 1967.

Curris serves as Trustee of Midway College, Director of American Humanics and as a member of the Center for the Study of the Presidency's National Advisory Council. He recently served as Chairman of the Iowa Task Force on Teacher Education and Certification and was a charter member of the National Small Business Development Center Advisory Board. He serves as co-chairman of the Iowa Commission on Enhancing Educational Leadership. He is a member of the Iowa Future Project, and is on the Board of Trustees of First in the Nation in Education/Iowa's Education Research Foundation and Junior Achievement of Black Hawk Land, Inc.

The UNI Community

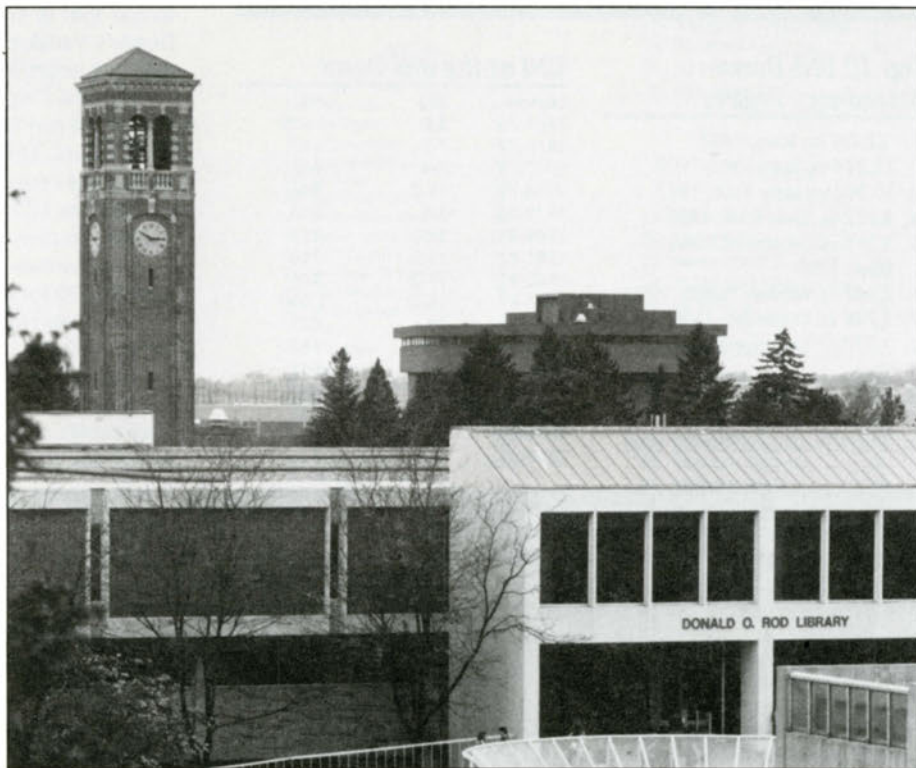
For 115 years, the University of Northern Iowa has emphasized outstanding undergraduate education, with complementary graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. Building on its historic strength in teacher education, the University has developed a number of outstanding programs in business, natural sciences, humanities and fine arts, and social and behavioral sciences. Enrollment stands at over 13,000, a new record this fall, with students coming from every county in Iowa, 40 states and 28 countries.

Northern Iowa's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The University nurtures a premiere learning environment — it is small enough to offer its students individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources and opportunities, as well as a distinguished faculty.

UNI's 19 men's and women's intercollegiate athletics programs compete at the NCAA Division I level (1-AA in football) with major conference affiliations. The Panthers boast a nationally-recognized coaching staff to maintain strong programs in football, basketball, wrestling, volleyball, track and field, and softball.

UNI is located in Cedar Falls, a pleasant and historic community of about 35,000 people. Together with the adjacent City of Waterloo, the metropolitan area has a culturally-diverse population of 115,000, combining big city opportunities with small-town friendliness. Cedar Falls/Waterloo is a center for industry, finance, commerce, recreation and cultural activities for northeast Iowa.

The University was founded in 1876 and is one of three state-assisted universities administered by the Iowa State Board of



Regents. Additional private support is provided by the UNI Foundation and Northern Iowa Alumni Association, representing more than 60,000 alumni in the United States and other countries.

The campus combines the grandeur of early-1900s architecture with striking, modern building designs that have characterized a particularly impressive growth period over the past dozen years. UNI's attractive, park-like campus contains more than 40 major buildings on 853 acres, yet is compact enough to cross in a pleasant, 10-minute walk.

The University is enjoying a period of vitality and momentum. Although Northern Iowa is proud of its heritage and reputation for academic excellence, it continues to look ahead with vigor, embracing new programs and ideas with a vision to prepare its students for the 1990s and beyond.

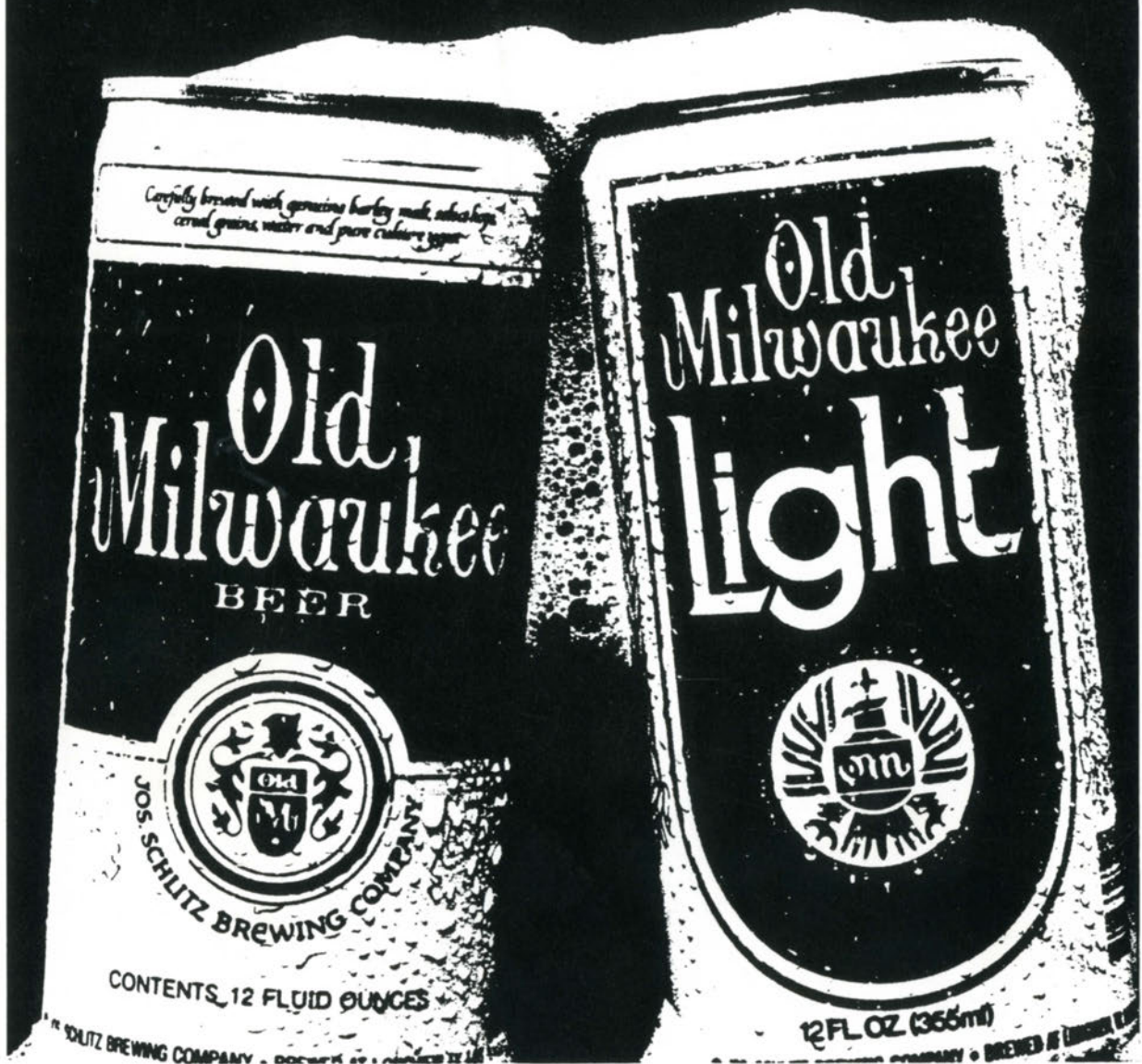
