During the spring semester of 1960 Iowa State Teachers College will offer evening and Saturday classes which will be taught by regular staff members and will provide residence credit. Every interested and qualified person is invited to enroll in them.

Courses numbered 200-299 are open to graduate students only; those numbered 100-199 are primarily designed for junior, senior and graduate students, but only those 100-level courses which are followed by a "g" provide graduate credit; and those numbered below 100 are primarily designed for freshman and sophomore students and offer only undergraduate credit. These courses afford teachers an opportunity to take work toward certificate renewal or reinstatement, toward meeting the requirements for either a bachelor's or a master's degree, and toward qualifying for an administrative or supervisory endorsement.

A full-time teacher is permitted to carry a maximum of six hours of work in any semester.

The schedule of evening and Saturday classes for the spring semester of 1960 follows. The college reserves the right to cancel a class if an insufficient number of students enroll in it.

REGISTRATION

Registration for evening and Saturday classes should be made at advance registration on January 7 or at regular registration, February 1, 1960. Students who cannot conveniently enroll at one of these times may enroll in Room 10 (basement) Administration Building one hour before the first meeting of the class. Early registration is encouraged to insure entrance to a class.

EXAMINATION

The final examination in each course will be given during the final meeting of the class.
