## Iowa State Teachers College

The Iowa State Teachers College will offer evening and Saturday classes during the spring semester of 1958. These will be taught by regular staff members and will provide residence credit. Every interested and qualified person is invited to enroll in them.

Courses numbered 200-299 are open to graduate students only; those numbered 100-199 are primarily designed for junior, senior, and graduate students; and those numbered below 100 are primarily designed for freshman and sophomore students and offer only undergraduate credit. These courses afford teachers an opportunity to take work toward certificate renewal or reinstatement; toward meeting the requirements for either a bachelor's or master's degree; and toward qualifying for an administrative or supervisory endorsement.

A full-time teacher is permitted to carry a maximum of five hours of work in any semester.

The schedule of evening and Saturday classes for the spring semester of 1958 follows. The college reserves the right to cancel a class if an insufficient number of students enroll in it.

### *Registration*

Registration for evening and Saturday classes should be made at advance registration on January 9, or at regular registration on January 27. Students who cannot conveniently register at one of these times may enroll in Room 10 (basement) Administration Building one hour before the first meeting of the class. Early registration is encouraged to insure entrance into a class.

62:202 **Teaching of Literary Forms**—3 hours. Advanced literary analysis and evaluation of the short story, novel, drama, and poetry. Prerequisite: 62:21. Section 1. 7:00-9:50. Stageberg. Aud. 232.

64:120 **Heritage of the Bible**—2 hours. A non-sectarian study of the Bible. Section 1. 7:00-8:50. Bernhard. Aud. 130.

80:132 **Teaching of Arithmetic I**—2 hours. For teachers of kindergarten and grades 1-3. No credit on a minor. Prerequisite: 80:31. Section 1. 7:00-8:50. Crumley. Wright 116.

21:241 **Elementary School Supervision II**—2 hours. Prerequisite: Teaching experience. Section 1. 7:00-8:50. Hult.. Aud. 332.

82:280 **Seminar in Science Teaching**—2 hours. Section 1. 7:00-8:50. Winier. Wrt. 10.

96:136 **American Colonial History**—3 hours. Section 1. 7:00-8:50. Wohl. Sab. 221.

Wednesday evening classes will meet weekly from January 29 through May 28, with the exception of April 2.

## *Saturday Morning Classes*

21:171 **Secondary School Supervision**—3 hours. Teaching experience recommended. Section 1. 9:00-11:50. DeKock. Aud. 331.

21:294 **Educational Research**—3 hours. Methods and evaluation of educational research. Individual exploration of a possible thesis project in cooperation with student's adviser. Section 1. 9:00-11:50. Rhum. Aud. 333.

60:50 **Ceramics**—2 hours. Clay and glazes for pottery and ceramic sculpture. Section 3. 9:00-11:50. Finegan. Cer. Lab.

60:150 **Advanced Ceramics**—2 hours. Wheel-thrown pottery, ceramic sculpture problems, and the study of glazes and ceramic processes. Section 3. 9:00-11:50. Finegan. Cer. Lab.

The final examination in each course will be given during the final meeting of the class.

## *Cost*

The cost for either evening or Saturday classes is at the rate of \$12 per semester hour with a minimum fee of \$24 for undergraduate students and \$14 per semester hour with a minimum fee of \$28 for students holding a baccalaureate degree.
