A campus-wide commitment to great teaching lies at the heart of the University of Northern Iowa's reputation for providing exceptional undergraduate education, as well as complementary programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. Building on its historic strength in teacher education, the University has developed a number of outstanding programs in business, natural sciences, humanities and fine arts, and social and behavioral sciences.

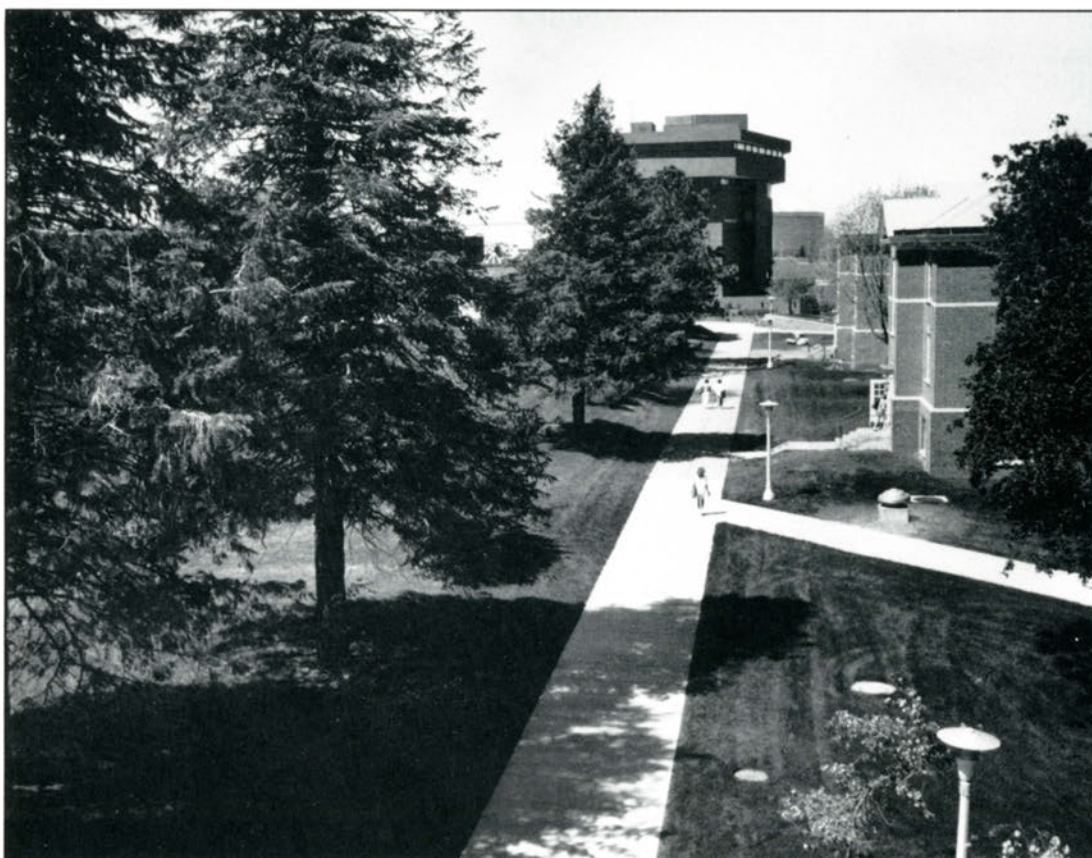
Northern Iowa prides itself on providing a student-centered educational experience. The University's medium size allows it to offer the faculty, facilities and academic choices of a major university, while retaining a friendly, small college atmosphere. Small classes enable the University to foster one-on-one working relationships between faculty and students. More than 90 percent of UNI's classes have 50 or fewer students.

Students enter the University well-prepared, demonstrated by their selection of high school courses and rank in class. In recent years, over 90 percent of the entering freshmen ranked in the top 50 percent of their high school classes, with about 60 percent ranking in the top 30 percent. The average undergraduate arrives at UNI with an ACT score of 23.

U.S. News and World Report has recognized the University by ranking it seventh among the top 15 colleges and universities and second among best buys in the Midwest Region in its America's Best Colleges Book. It also recognized Northern Iowa as one of two "up-and-coming" Midwest regional universities.

The College of Business Administration has become the largest undergraduate business school in Iowa. The College's Department of Accounting is ranked among the 10 best in the country by educators and accounting professionals. In a national survey of 400 accounting faculty, Northern Iowa ranked as one of their top programs.

Considered a long-time leader in the field of teacher education, UNI has implemented several programs that continue this tradition of excellence. The Regents' Center for Early Developmental Education is a leading setting for



research and training in the education of young children. The Center is the only educational resource of its kind in Iowa.

Northern Iowa's 19 men's and women's intercollegiate athletics programs compete at the NCAA Division I level with major conference affiliations. The Panthers boast a nationally recognized coaching staff to maintain consistently competitive programs.

The Northern Iowa campus combines the grandeur of early 1900s architecture with striking, modern building designs that have characterized an impressive growth period over the past dozen years. The attractive, park-like campus contains more than 40 major buildings on 861 acres, yet is compact enough to cross in a 10-minute walk.

UNI is located in Cedar Falls, an inviting and historic community of about 35,000 people. Together with the adjacent city of Waterloo, the metropolitan area has a culturally diverse population of 115,000 and combines big city opportunities with small town friendliness. Cedar Falls/Waterloo is a center for industry, finance, commerce, recreation and cultural activities for northeast Iowa.

The University was founded in 1876 and is one of three state-assisted universities administered by the Iowa State Board of Regents. Additional private support is provided by the UNI Foundation and Northern Iowa Alumni Association, representing more than 65,000 alumni in the United States and other countries.

For the Northern Iowa baseball team, it's time to turn the page. And the next page is headlined with two words — PATIENCE AND CONFIDENCE.

As fourth-year coach Dave Schrage sees it, the time is right for his team to make a move and surprise some people. But not without an attitude adjustment...by the coaches and players.

"As coaches, we're going to be more patient with our guys and stick with them, hoping they develop more confidence in themselves and each other," Schrage said.

The Panthers enter the '94 season with their most experienced team since joining the Missouri Valley Conference three years ago, with hopes that experience and new attitudes will translate into more victories.

UNI posted a 12-39 mark a year ago, 10 victories less than the previous season, and won their third conference game in two seasons. But with only four seniors gone from that team and the maturing of Schrage's first full recruiting class into juniors, prospects look good for another step forward on the journey to being competitive in the Missouri Valley.

"We're a veteran team, with nine seniors," he said. "It's time for these kids to step up. They've played now in the Valley for two years."

"We've stuck with them through some tough times and they've gained a lot of experience. They've played in a lot of big games against the Florida States and the Wichita States and been through the wars," he added.

PITCHING

Although no major additions have been made to a staff that posted a team ERA of 6.79 a year ago, Schrage feels sure this year's mound corps will be much better.

"I feel like we finally have a legitimate Division I pitching staff for the first time as far as depth and throwing velocity," he added.

"We can now go fairly deep in our staff where we have guys throwing 83, 84 (miles per hour) and above."

UNI enters the season with a "big three" of lefthander Jeff Mills and righthanders Mike Irvine and Steve Beard. Schrage plans to use the trio in MVC competition and thinks they stack up favorably against other teams in the league.

"Mills, Irvine and Beard all have gained three or four miles per hour on their velocity during the off-season," said Schrage. "I think you're going to see good years out of those three."

Mills, a juco transfer a year ago, was the team's most consistent starter in conference play, hurling at least six innings in five of his six league starts.

Irvine took a step backward last year after a promising freshman campaign, but appears set to regain his previous form after struggling with his control.

"Mike is a tremendous competitor who is out to prove to everyone that he is better than he showed last year," noted Schrage. "He's also made some

mental adjustments that I think are going to pay off big. He's matured a lot both on the mound and off the field."

A professional draftee out of high school, Beard got off to a fast start last season but then experienced some typical freshman inconsistency. With a year of experience and increased velocity, Schrage thinks Beard is ready to be an outstanding hurler.

Other starting roles should go to seniors Brad Hames and Bryan Duncan, and junior southpaws Jeff Johannsen and Brett Lagerblade.

Hames finally began to realize his potential near the end of last season and Duncan was a solid juco transfer a year ago. Johannsen was a pleasant surprise after recovering from an elbow injury and Lagerblade was one of UNI's most reliable hurlers down the stretch, picking up its only conference victory.

Senior Dave Freese and junior Matt Klemesrud are tabbed for middle relief roles as the season begins. Righthander Chris Meccia and lefty Jon Goerish also have had off-season arm injuries and will likely fill middle or swingman roles when they return to full health.

Schrage plans to give the closer role to a pair of freshmen — lefty Scott Eibey and righthander Jeff Weime.

"The obvious concern with them is that they're not tested," Schrage said. "They have to have some good outings early to gain some confidence for themselves and the rest of our staff."

CATCHING

Junior Grady Murphy returns after hitting .223 with three homers and 11 RBI a year ago, numbers Schrage thinks will take a big jump in '94.

"We feel very good with him back there," he said. "He's such a competitive person that I think last year he tried to take the whole team on his shoulders when we started struggling and that hurt him at the plate."

Murphy hit near the .300 mark through the first two months of last season, but slumped badly the last several weeks, although his solid defense was a constant throughout the season.

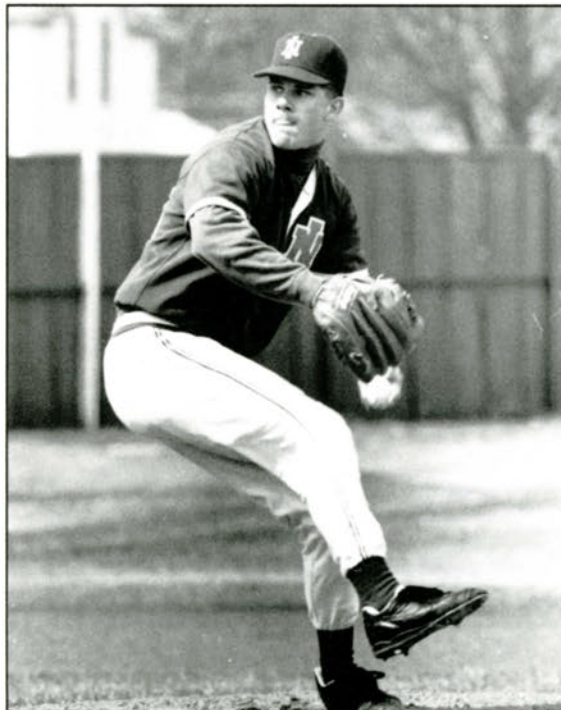
"With Grady, it's a matter of being more selective early in the count and having more confidence with two strikes on him," added Schrage.

A pair of newcomers will spell Murphy occasionally. Freshman Matt Waller, a kicker on the Panther football team, brings a strong arm and good speed while junior Matt Paulson has a more potent bat and may see some designated hitter duty against lefthanded pitching.

FIRST BASE

Newcomers dominate the picture at first base.

Freshman Brian Jergenson gives UNI its most legitimate power threat after being drafted by the Cincinnati Reds out of high school. A free-swinging lefthander who stands 6-5,

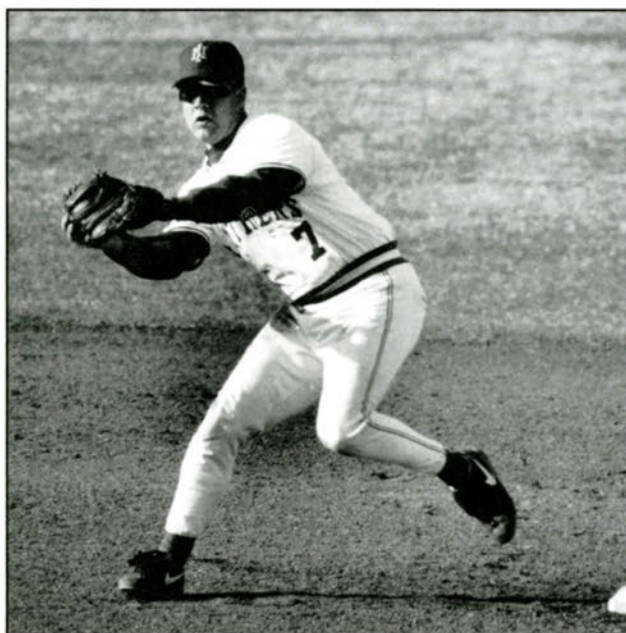
Jergenson is loaded with potential and needs only experience

"He's the first player we've recruited since I've been here that you think has a chance to go deep every time he steps in the box," Schrage said. "He needs to learn the strike zone, but when he makes contact, he can hit it a long way."

Junior college transfer Don Crook, also a lefthander, is the strongest defensively at first and is "probably the best contact hitter on the team", according to Schrage.

Both figure to see plenty of playing time with Crook likely seeing the most action against southpaws "because he hits them better".

Senior John Pankonin fell behind after missing much of the fall season due to illness, but will see playing time in a reserve role.

SECOND BASE

Senior Kevin Bower has taken over the role vacated by the graduated Tom Bach in more ways than one. In addition to taking over at second base, he also has made another move defensively to benefit the team. After starting last season at shortstop, he was moved to third in mid-season and now back to his natural position. "He is a very strong second baseman," Schrage said. "You're not going to see the number of errors you saw from him last season (25). It's going to be a good move for the whole team."

Bower is the leading returner in stolen bases (14), hits (48), runs (24) and doubles (10) while batting .284 with a homer and 14 RBI.

Rob McCormick will serve as the backup and a DH against lefthanded pitching after hitting .300 as a freshman a year ago.

SHORTSTOP

More new faces and more lefthanded bats here with freshman Kevin Sawatzky and junior Mike Rice. "Sawatzky has a great future," said Schrage. "He doesn't look like a shortstop because he's 6-3, but he has great hands and feet, a good arm and throws well." Rice is the best of the two at the plate and running the bases and will likely bat second when he's in the lineup

THIRD BASE

Tom Owen returns as the starting third baseman for the third consecutive season with his sights set on holding down the job this year. He has gone into the past two seasons with the starting job, but slumped badly at the plate. "He's in the same position as (pitcher) Mike Irvine," noted Schrage. "He's played, he's been through the wars...we've worked a lot on the mental aspects of hitting with him and we're going to stick with him this year. Defensively, Owen is head and shoulders the Panthers' best.

Rice also figures to see some time at third and may start some against righthanders.

OUTFIELD

The strength of the team the past several years has gotten even stronger with six players who all will be used considerably.

Junior Keven Saunders is penciled in in left field after finishing second in the Valley batting race a year ago (.374) and earning all-conference honorable mention.

"Keven's worked hard to shore up his defense and throwing since last season and you can see that improvement in him," Schrage noted. "You'll see him hitting second, fifth, sixth...wherever he's got a chance to drive in some runs."

Junior Mark Pasqualini holds down center field for the third straight campaign. He has shown flashes of his potential the past two seasons, but has been unable to sustain it throughout a season.

Schrage said Pasqualini won't have to be looking over his shoulder this year. "We've told Mark he's our man and he has nothing to prove to anyone and I think you'll see a much better player this season," he added.

The possibility for an unusual platoon exists in right field with the return of senior Monty Muller and the arrival of juco transfer Craig Fritz. Muller hit .294 a year ago, .327 in Missouri Valley games, with a home run and 13 RBI while Fritz brings a potent bat and stronger defensive skills. "When we play in the bigger parks, we'll probably use Craig out there," Schrage said, "and in the smaller parks, you'll see Monty." Against lefthanded pitching, Muller will see the majority of the designated hitter duty with Fritz in right.

Reserve roles will be filled by a pair of speedsters, Roger Brown and Myron Glass. Brown will back up in center field and be the top pinch runner. Glass, who has started off and on during his career and hit .327 as a freshman, will come off the bench to start the season, "but he usually seems to find his way into the lineup somehow", according to Schrage. "It hurts Myron not being there in the fall," Schrage said of the all-conference defensive back on the Panther football team.

DESIGNATED HITTER

Pencil in senior Dan Thielen as the DH against righthanders. He slumped at the plate a year ago after two fine seasons, but bounced back with the best fall season of all the Panther hitters. "Dan's confidence is back...he lost it last year," said Schrage. "We know what he can do after hitting over .300 two years ago. I'm excited about what he can do this year."

"I know this year people aren't going to look at their schedule and say 'we really need to get fired up for Northern Iowa'...but they better," he said. "These guys have a new confidence this year and a new attitude they haven't had before."

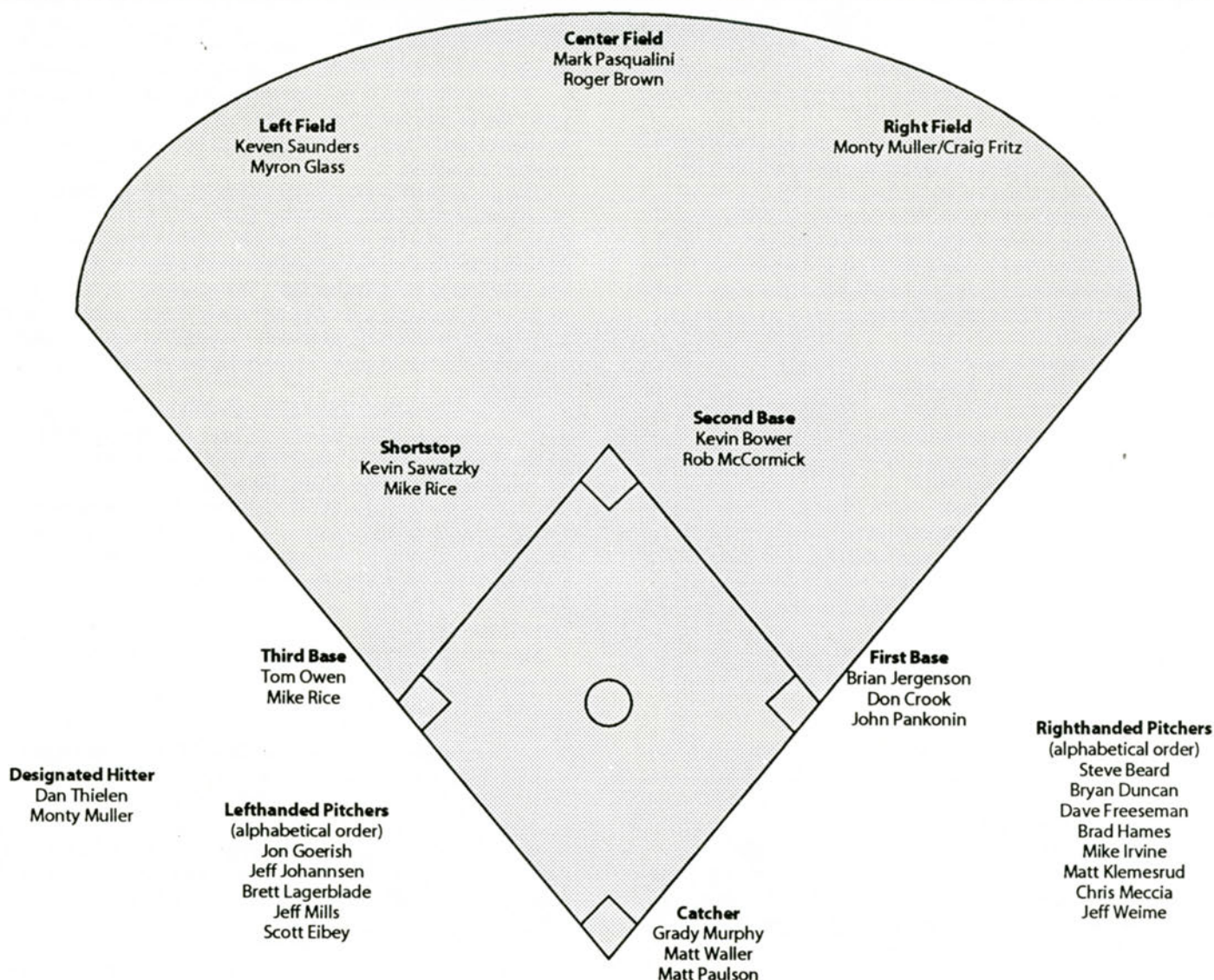

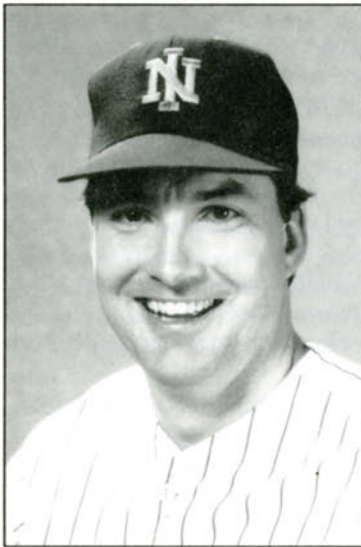

Head Coach Dave Schrage

Despite experiencing some growing pains the past couple of years, Dave Schrage is more optimistic than ever about returning Northern Iowa to respectability in Division I baseball.

As he begins his fourth season in Cedar Falls, Schrage has lived up to his reputation as a tireless recruiter by bringing in the finest groups of newcomers

in school history over the past three seasons.

Schrage came to Northern Iowa in the summer of 1990 after leading Waldorf College in Forest City, IA, to the junior college sub-regional championship game twice in three years. In three seasons with the Warriors, he posted a 62-67 record and had two players drafted by professional teams. At Northern Iowa, Schrage has posted a 46-117 mark while competing against a rigorous schedule which includes 21 games each season in the nationally-acclaimed Missouri Valley Conference.

Already under Schrage's regime at Northern Iowa, the baseball program has moved to the MVC; moved to a new home in a minor league facility in neighboring Waterloo; had live radio broadcasts of home and away games; and has nearly doubled financial support for the program.

A native of Oak Park, IL, Schrage was a four-year starter in center field at Creighton University. He led the Missouri Valley in hitting in 1982 with a .400 average and followed that up with a .433 mark the following season. He earned Missouri Valley All-Conference honors in 1982 and was named to the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American team in 1983.

His .433 average for 1983 ranks him third on Creighton's all-time single-season list while the .400 clip in 1982 ranks sixth. Schrage led the club in stolen bases in 1980 with 15, triples in 1981 with three and hits in 1982 with 66.

Schrage is fifth in career hitting at Creighton with a .358 average, ranks fourth in stolen bases with 62, and is ninth in games played with 199.

Schrage's first collegiate coaching experience came as a graduate assistant at Biscayne College in Miami in 1984 before he returned to his alma mater as an assistant coach to Jim Hendry in 1985 and 1986, where he was instrumental in recruiting the class ranked fifth in the nation in 1985, according to *Collegiate Baseball*. Three players Schrage recruited were drafted by major league teams, the most notable being former Olympian and current Houston Astros catcher Scott Servais. In his four years as a player and two as

an assistant at Creighton, the Bluejays never had a losing season, posting a 201-145 record.

"Dave is as knowledgeable about the entire game as any player or coach I worked with at Creighton," said Hendry, now in the front office with the Florida Marlins. "He is a great teacher and communicator with his players in all facets of the game. Dave knows baseball in the Midwest as well as anyone."

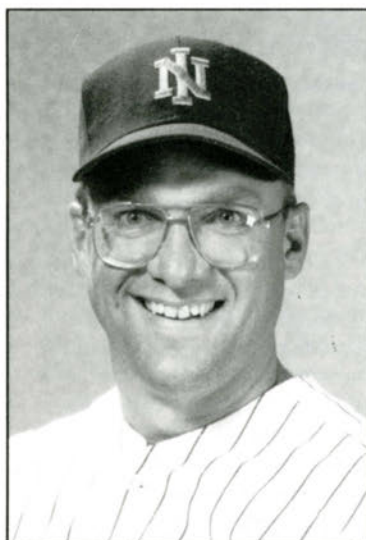
He became head coach of the Mt. Gravatt Eagles Club in Brisbane, Australia in 1987, and played and coached for the National League Champion Queensland Rams.

Ken Misfeldt joined the Northern Iowa coaching staff last August and will serve as the top assistant as well as hitting instructor and infield coach.

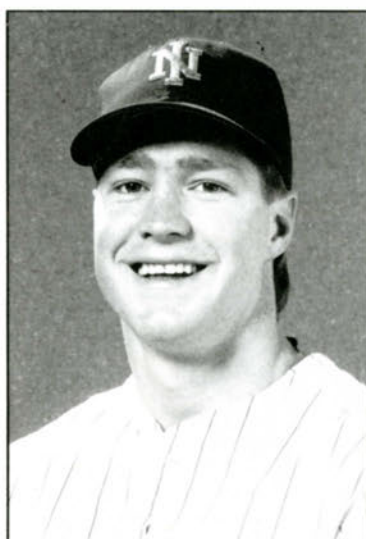
Prior to coming to UNI, Misfeldt was an assistant coach at Wayne State

Missouri Valley Conference

A commitment to excellence, both in the classroom and the athletic arena, has been a trademark of the Missouri Valley Conference since its inception in 1907. In addition to success on the national baseball scene, the athletic accomplishments of MVC institutions through the years have included four national basketball championships and 17 trips to the NCAA Final Four.

MVC members have been especially prominent on the national collegiate baseball scene in recent years. Following Wichita State's national championship in 1989, as many as three Valley teams have been ranked among the nation's top 25 during the past four years. In 1991, two MVC teams advanced to the College World Series as Wichita State and Creighton both made collegiate baseball's Final Four, with WSU finishing second and Creighton tied for third; Wichita State also finished second last season. Since 1980, some 24 MVC teams have competed in the NCAA baseball tournament, with nine advancing to the College World Series in the last 11 years.

MVC athletes and coaches have become familiar names during the conference's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers which have followed stardom in the Missouri Valley. Current major leaguers who played their collegiate ball in the MVC include Kirby Puckett, Joe Carter, Dave Steib, Steve Finley, Charlie O'Brien, Dennis Rasmussen, Jim Lindeman, Phil Stephenson, Scott Servais and Zane Smith.

MVC basketball alums include Larry Bird, Xavier McDaniel, Hersey Hawkins, Benoit Benjamin, Oscar Robertson, Chet Walker, Walt Frazier, Wes Unseld and Paul Silas.

The St. Louis-based MVC began operating as a basketball conference and through the years has produced many individual and team national champions in basketball, baseball and track and field. The league has merged with the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference, which concluded a decade of excellence in women's athletics.

The Missouri Valley was formed on January 12, 1907, when eight administrators representing five midwestern state universities got together in a hotel room in Kansas City. In the fall of that year, basketball became the first competitive sport in what was then the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

In addition to Northern Iowa, current MVC members include Bradley, Creighton, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Southern Illinois, Tulsa and Wichita State with Evansville joining the league in July.

Facilities



Municipal Stadium

Facilities play an important role in helping Northern Iowa's student-athletes make the most of their collegiate careers. The Panthers' baseball facilities provide an excellent atmosphere for teaching, learning and training no matter the weather.

The Panthers begin their third season in Municipal Stadium in Waterloo, after having played all home dates there for the first time in 1993. A 10-minute drive from the Northern Iowa campus, Municipal Stadium has been the home of professional baseball in Waterloo since 1948. The city-owned facility is currently home to the San Diego Padres Class A franchise in the Midwest League.

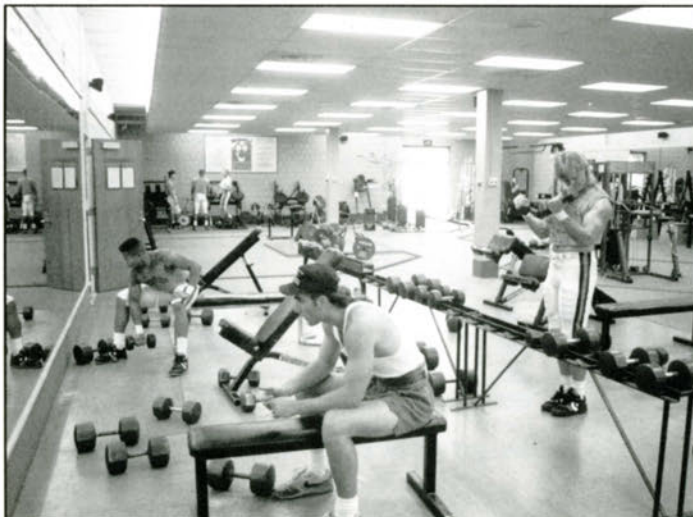
Seating capacity is 4,277 with distances to the double-decked outfield fence measuring 330 feet down the left-and

right-field lines, 360 feet in the power alleys and 390 to center field. Major renovations have been made to the playing surface and press box within the past year.

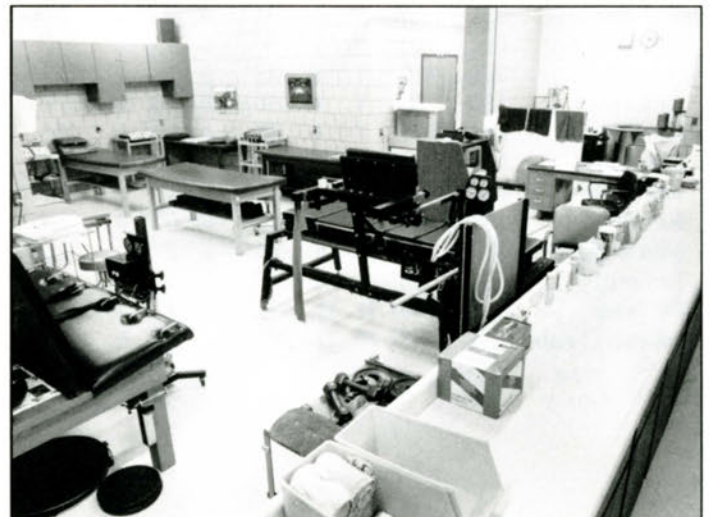
For off-season conditioning and practice, Northern Iowa is blessed with one of the finest indoor facilities anywhere. The spacious 16,400-seat UNI-Dome, constructed in 1976, is home to Northern Iowa Athletics and many of its teams. The adjoining Physical Education Center provides state-of-the-art weight and athletic training facilities while the Dome, home to the Panther football team, allows for a spacious indoor environment for practice when inclement weather prevents outdoor workouts.

Panthers in the Pros

Providing tangible evidence of the dramatic strides made by the Northern Iowa baseball program in recent years, 1990 saw the first two Panthers selected in the major league amateur draft while another was signed as a free agent in 1992.

Pitcher Steve Dreyer became the first UNI player ever selected in the draft when he was taken in the eighth round by the Texas Rangers. Last August 8, he became the first UNI alumnus to appear in the major leagues in 18 years when he drew the starting assignment for the Rangers and picked up a victory against the Seattle Mariners. The Ames, IA, native

went on to post a 3-3 record in 10 games and become the answer to three trivia questions:

Who was the last pitcher to relieve Nolan Ryan?

Who was the last man to retire George Brett?

Who was the last Ranger starter in Arlington Stadium?
