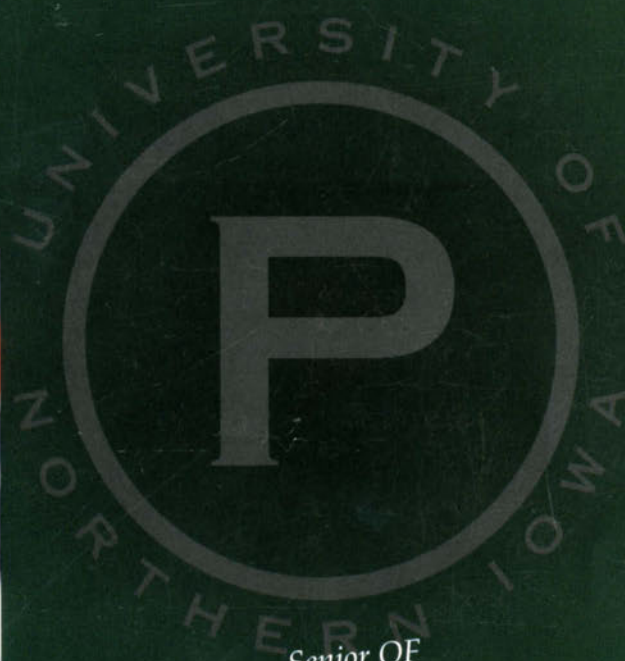

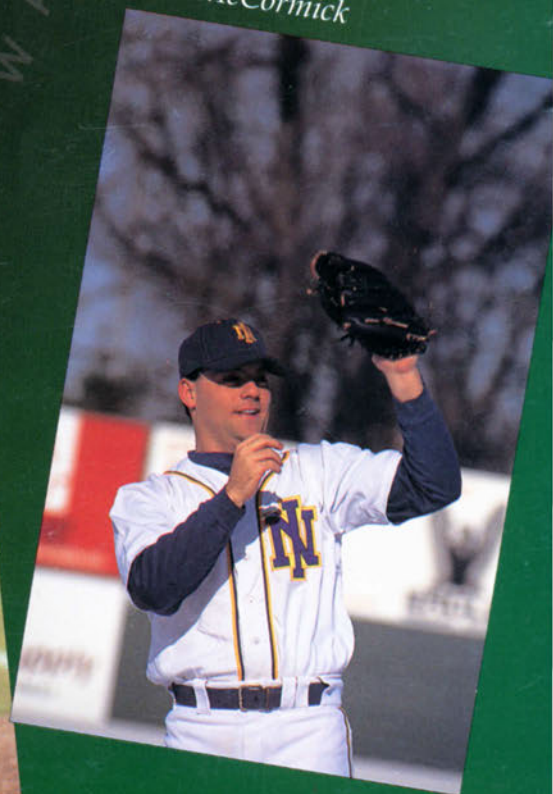

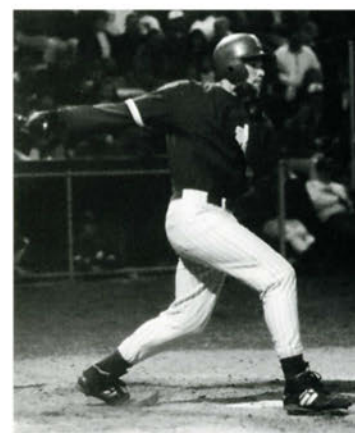
Senior Jeff Johannsen was 3-0 in March last season with three complete-game shutouts. Johannsen also posted a 0.47 earned run average.

A campus-wide commitment to great teaching lies at the heart of the University of Northern Iowa's reputation for providing exceptional undergraduate education, as well as complementary programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. Building on its historic strength in teacher education, the University has developed a number of outstanding programs in business, natural sciences, humanities and fine arts, and social and behavioral sciences.

Northern Iowa prides itself on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university's medium size allows it to offer the faculty, facilities and academic choices of a major university, while retaining a friendly, small college atmosphere. Small classes enable the university to foster one-on-one working relationships between faculty and students. More than 90 percent of UNI's classes have 50 or fewer students.

Students enter the university well-prepared, demonstrated by their selection of high school courses and rank in their graduating class. In recent years, over 90 percent of the entering freshmen ranked in the top 50 percent of their high school classes, with about 60 percent ranking in the top 30 percent. The average undergraduate arrives at UNI with an ACT score of 23.

U.S. News and World Report has recognized the university by ranking it 11th among the top 119 Midwest regional colleges and universities. The magazine also named UNI the Midwest's most efficient regional university. UNI also received a "1" rating in academic reputation, the highest of any of the top 15 universities in the Midwest region.

The College of Business Administration has become the largest undergraduate business school in Iowa. The College's Department

of Accounting is ranked among the 10 best in the country by educators and accounting professionals. In a national survey of 400 accounting faculty, Northern Iowa ranked as one of their top programs.

Considered a long-time leader in the field of teacher education, UNI has implemented several programs that continue this tradition of excellence. The Regents' Center for Early Development Education is a leading setting for research and training the education of young children. The Center is the only educational resource of its kind in Iowa.

Northern Iowa's 19 men's and women's intercollegiate athletics programs compete at the NCAA Division I level with major conference affiliations. The Panthers boast a nationally recognized coaching staff to maintain consistently competitive programs.

The Northern Iowa campus combines the grandeur of early 1900s architecture with striking, modern building designs that have characterized an impressive growth period over the past dozen years. The attractive, park-like campus contains more than 40 major buildings on 861 acres, yet is compact enough to cross in a 10-minute walk.

UNI is located in Cedar Falls, an inviting and historic community of about 34,000 people. Together with the adjacent city of Waterloo, the metropolitan area has a culturally diverse population of 100,000 and combines big city opportunities with small town friendliness. Cedar Falls/Waterloo is a center for industry, finance, commerce, recreation and cultural activities for northeast Iowa.

The University was founded in 1876 and is one of three state-assisted universities administered by the Iowa State Board of Regents. Additional private support is provided by the UNI Foundation and Northern Iowa Alumni Association, representing more than 65,000 alumni in the United States and other countries.

Panthers Look to Build Off Record-Breaking Season

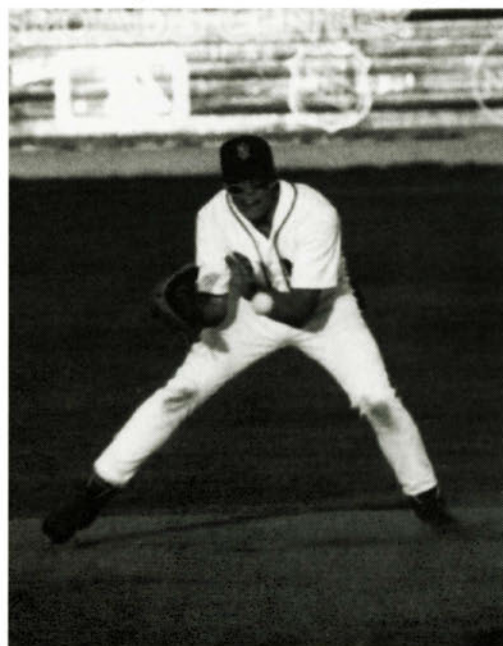
Coming off a record-breaking season in 1995, the Northern Iowa baseball team looks to continue its success in 1996. With experience and confidence gained each season, the Panthers broke through last season. The Panthers set school records for overall wins (28) and Missouri Valley Conference wins (12). UNI also set six team records, including doubles (103), triples (21), pitching appearances (125), shutouts (6), saves (10) and earned run average at Division I (5.13).

In his sixth season at the top of the Panther program, head coach Dave Schrage returns nine position players, including four starters, four pitchers and one starter, from a 28-27 team.

"We return key players at key spots," said Schrage. "Last season was a big year for us and it's a matter of sustaining it this season." Schrage will look to a good blend of returning players and talented freshmen.

"If the returning players have good seasons and the freshmen fit the roles they need to, we can have a successful season," said Schrage. "The players have something to prove. They're striving for that next level, making the playoffs. We want this program to have a legitimate opportunity to be in the MVC playoffs every season."

The Panthers will be anchored in the infield with junior Brian Jergenson, who hit .241 with a career-high four home runs and added 23 RBI a year ago. A two-year starter at first base for Northern Iowa, Jergenson will also see time as a short relief pitcher. "He has power potential and is capable of hitting a lot of home runs," said Schrage. "He is the total package at first base." Freshman Ryan McKernan will back up at first. McKernan had a

very solid fall season, according to Schrage, and is expected to see time at designated hitter and as a closer in the bullpen.

At second base, sophomore Todd Rima is the leading candidate for the starting position. Senior Rob McCormick also will battle for playing time at the spot. McCormick played in 31 games last

season with 12 RBI while Rima played in 44 games with 42 starts and 15 RBI. "Rima led the Northwoods League in fielding percentage and he has improved his hitting over the summer,"

said Schrage. "He is as dependable at second base as anyone and he turns the double play well." Rima scored 20 runs and had five doubles last season. McCormick might also see time at designated hitter. "Hitting is an area this team needs to improve on and we'll probably need to find a spot in our line-up for Rob," said Schrage.

Junior Kevin Sawatzky returns at shortstop after starting 49 games and hitting .230 with 20 RBI. "He has power potential," said Schrage. "He has had some big hits for us. He won two

games with home runs as a freshman and had home runs and extra-base hits in key games last season. He seems to get us clutch hits." Sophomore Aaron Houdeshell will back up at shortstop as well as at third base and second if needed. "He is very solid at all three positions and has good bat control and a great throwing arm," said Schrage.

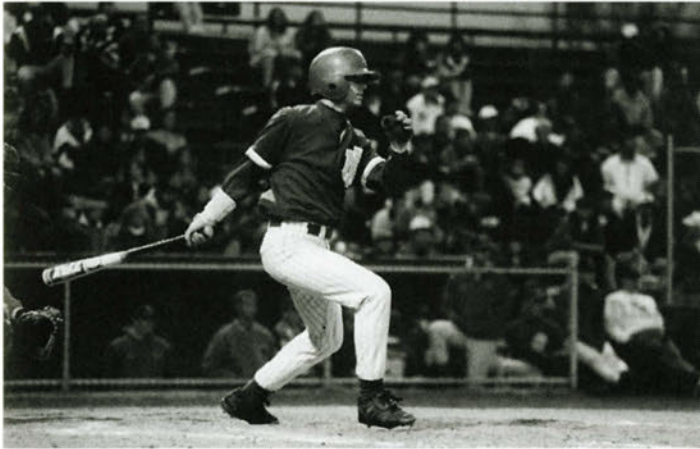
UNI will look to find someone to take over third base for the graduated Tom Owen. Owen was the Panthers' leading hitter last season (.394) and set six individual batting records. This season, Schrage says it's a battle among two transfers. Leading the way is junior Gabe Wyckoff, a two-year starter at Iowa. The versatile Wyckoff could play seven positions for Northern Iowa this season, according to Schrage. "Gabe will hit early in the line-up. He is a good baseball player, someone who knows the game." Another transfer, sophomore Brian Kegler who played at Georgia, should see time at third base. "He is as good a physical player as any infielder on the team," said Schrage. "He has a strong arm and gives us power at the plate."

The catching position will be battled out among three players. "We have inexperience, but a lot of talent," said Schrage. Sophomore Josh Ellwanger is the leading candidate, after hitting .294 in 10 games last season. Other players expected to see action include freshmen Adam Spencer and Mike Waller. "Spencer's defense is good and he's improved his hitting. Waller has done things well in the fall," said Schrage. "We have good arm strength from the catching position, we just need consistency."

Leading the way in the outfield for UNI is senior Andy

Rocksvold, who hit .253 last season with 36 runs scored and 33 RBI. "He's a better hitter than his average indicates. I look for a big year out of him and he can be a catalyst for us," said Schrage.

"He catches everything and gets to the ball well." Rocksvold will start in center field.

Sophomore Greg Woodin is expected to start in left field when he recovers from a broken leg suffered in a fall scrimmage collision. "He played in key MVC games last year and got some valuable experience," said Schrage. Until Woodin returns, freshman Marcus Kjeldsen is expected to fill the void in left field. "He will hit in the lead-off spot and has the best speed on the squad," said Schrage.

Sophomore Josh Dunham will likely be the starter in rightfield. "He has the strongest arm in the outfield, with good speed and he runs well," notes Schrage.

Others battling for spots in the outfield are juniors Chad Barnes and Cory Thorson along with sophomore Ryan McGuire. "Barnes is a very strong left-handed hitter while Thorson and McGuire give us added depth," said Schrage. Barnes is a transfer from Simpson College and Thorson from North Iowa Area Community College, where he was an all-subregion outfielder. McGuire played at Black Hawk College.

Senior Jeff Johannsen returns as the lone returning starting pitcher after finishing 6-3 last season with a 3.63 ERA. He had five complete games with three shutouts while holding the opposition to a .224 batting average. Included in his wins were victories over Florida International, Southwest Missouri State and Wichita State. "Johannsen will anchor our pitching staff," added Schrage. "He knows how to win big games and we look for him to continue his success."

From an experience standpoint, the next three pitchers are sophomores Scott Brickman, Kevin Briggeman and Scott Hoey. All three pitched last season for the Panthers. "We expect Brickman to move into the rotation and be a solid performer. Briggeman is the most improved pitcher on the staff and could start and Hoey will anchor our bullpen as the set-up man," said Schrage. Hoey allowed no earned runs in six innings last season.

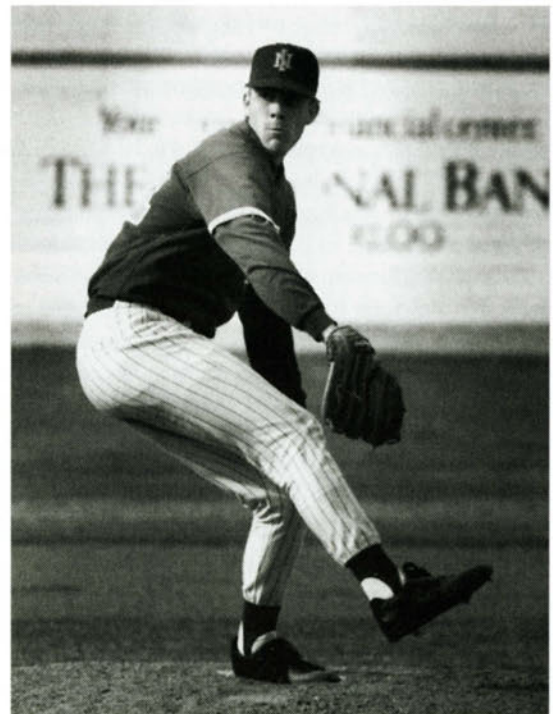
The rest of the staff includes five freshmen, a junior college transfer and a four-year college transfer. The freshmen include Aaron Lubach, Matt Cobb, Matt Schmaltz and Kirk Chamberlain. "All four are very talented, but untested in the MVC," said Schrage.

The fifth freshman, Scott Sobkowiak, is expected to give the Panthers a lot of innings and be a starting pitcher. "He's the best freshman pitcher we have recruited, as far as talent," said Schrage. Sobkowiak was a three-time conference player-of-the-year and pitched on two AAU Junior Olympic teams.

Junior Dave Bourland, a transfer from Waldorf JC, is expected to be the closer. "Bourland is a converted catcher and possesses a strong arm," said Schrage.

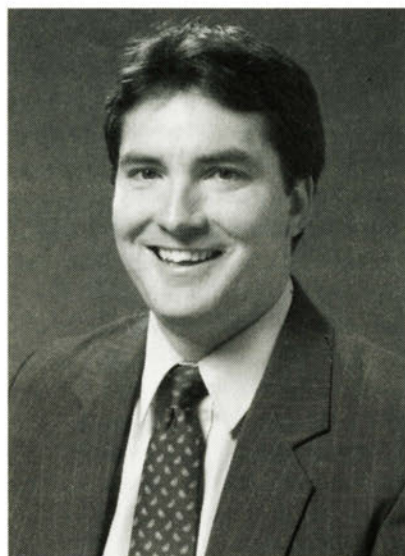
Sophomore Chad Wiltgen is a transfer from Arizona and might find a spot in the starting rotation. "He has a great arm and has the physical tools to be a good MVC pitcher and we look for him to have a big season," said Schrage.

Overall, Schrage says the team's success will improve as the season goes on after the freshmen pitchers get experience. He said it should be a better hitting club from last season, but the experienced players will need to carry the team early in the season.

Heading into his sixth season at Northern Iowa, head coach Dave Schrage has lived up to his reputation as a tireless recruiter by bringing in the finest groups of newcomers in the school's history in just the past five seasons. Schrage led UNI to a school record 28 wins last season, including a conference record 12 wins.

For his efforts, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year. He is

the first person in the MVC to be all-conference as a player and coach of the year.

At Northern Iowa, Schrage has posted a 98-176 record, recording the third highest total of wins in school history while competing against a rigorous schedule which includes 21 games each season in the nationally-acclaimed Missouri Valley Conference.

Already under Schrage's guidance at Northern Iowa, the baseball program has moved to the MVC, to a new home field in a former minor league facility in neighboring Waterloo, has live radio broadcasts of home and away games and has nearly doubled the program's financial support. He has had eight players play professional baseball, including two players drafted.

Schrage came to Northern Iowa in the summer of 1990 after leading Waldorf College in Forest City, IA, to the junior college sub-regional championship game twice in three seasons. In three years with the Warriors, he posted a 62-67 record and sent two of his players on to be drafted by professional teams.

A native of Oak Park, Ill., Schrage was a four-year starter in center field for the Creighton Blue Jays. He led the Missouri Valley in hitting in 1982 with a .400 batting average and followed that up with a .433 mark the next season. He earned Missouri Valley all-conference honors in 1982 and was named to the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American Team in 1983.

His .433 average in 1983 ranks him seventh on Creighton's all-time single-season list while the .400 clip in 1982 ranks 12th. Schrage led the club in stolen bases in 1980 with 15, triples in 1981 with three and hits in 1982 with 66.

Schrage is currently sixth in career hitting at Creighton with a .358 average, ranks fourth in stolen bases with 62 and is ninth in games played with 199.

Schrage's first collegiate coaching experience came as a graduate assistant at Biscayne College in Miami in 1984 before he returned to his alma mater as an assistant coach to Jim Hendry

in 1985 and 1986, where he was instrumental in recruiting the class ranked fifth in the nation in 1985, according to *Collegiate Baseball*. Three players Schrage recruited were drafted by major league teams, most notably former Olympian and current Chicago Cubs catcher Scott Servais. In his four years as a player and two as an assistant at Creighton, the Bluejays never had a losing season, posting a 201-145 record.

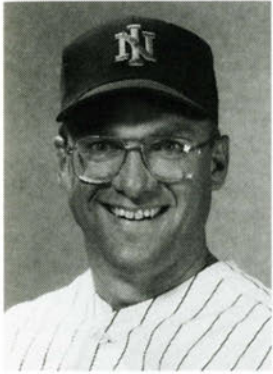
"Dave is as knowledgeable about the entire game as any player or coach I worked with at Creighton," said Hendry, now the Director of Scouting with the Chicago Cubs. "He is a great teacher and communicator with his players in all facets of the game. Dave knows baseball in the Midwest as well as anyone."

He became head coach of the Mt. Gravatt Eagles Club in Brisbane, Australia, in 1987 and played and coached for the National League Champion Queensland Rams.

Schrage is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and helped found the FCA chapter at Creighton.

Schrage, 34, received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Creighton in 1983 and his master's in sports administration from Biscayne in 1984. He and his wife, Jody, have two daughters, Kaitlyn and Brianne.





Ken Misfeldt

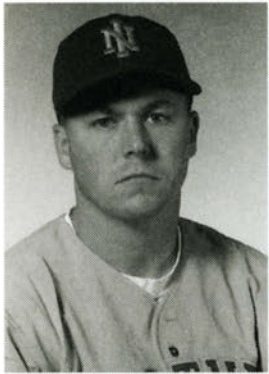
Ken Misfeldt joined the Northern Iowa coaching staff three years ago and will serve his third season as the Panthers' top assistant as well as hitting instructor and infield coach.

Prior to arriving at UNI, Misfeldt was an assistant at Wayne State College in Nebraska from 1991-92 where the Wildcats posted a pair of 25-23 seasons. He served as the infield coach both years and his 1992 infielders posted the best fielding percentage in the school's history with a .979 mark.

His college playing experience includes one year at Hutchinson (Kan.) Junior College and two years at Northwest Missouri State as a third and first baseman. He also played 11 years of semi-professional baseball, two of which ended in state championships (1985 & 1987) with Lincoln Runza.

A native of Arlington, Neb., Misfeldt received his master's degree in sports management from Wayne State in 1993 after obtaining his bachelor's degree in journalism from Northwest Missouri State in 1981.

He and his wife, Debbie, have four daughters—Molly, Meggie, Morgan and Mattie.

Beginning his first season at Northern Iowa is graduate assistant coach Randy Wee. 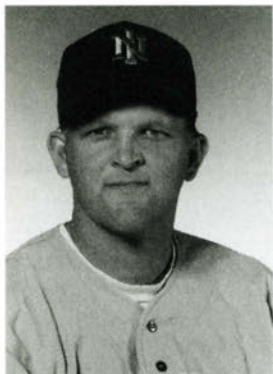

He is married to Nicole Needham Wee.

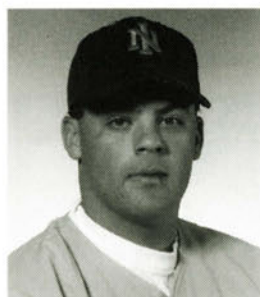

A commitment to excellence, both in the classroom and the athletic arena, has been a trademark of the Missouri Valley Conference since its inception in 1907. In addition to success on the national baseball scene, the athletic accomplishments of MVC institutions through the years have included four national basketball championships and 17 trips to the NCAA Final Four.

MVC members have been especially prominent on the national collegiate baseball scene in recent years. Following Wichita State's national championship in 1989, as many as three Valley teams have been ranked among the nation's top 25 during the past five years. In 1991, two MVC teams advanced to the College World Series as Wichita State and Creighton both made collegiate baseball's Final Four, with WSU finishing second and Creighton tied for third; Wichita State also finished second in the 1993 season. Since 1980, some 27 MVC teams have competed in the NCAA baseball tournament, with nine advancing to the College World Series in the last 12 years.

MVC athletes and coaches have become familiar names during the conference's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers which have followed stardom in the Missouri Valley. Current major leaguers who played their collegiate ball in the MVC include Kirby Puckett, Joe Carter, Dave Steib, Steve Finley, Charlie O'Brien, Dennis Rasmussen, Jim Lindeman, Phil Stephenson, Scott Servais and Zane Smith.

MVC basketball alums include Larry Bird, Xavier McDaniel, Hersey Hawkins, Benoit Benjamin, Oscar Robertson, Chet Walker, Walt Frazier, Wes Unseld and Paul Silas.

The St. Louis-based MVC began operating as a basketball conference and through the years has produced many individual and team national champions in basketball, baseball, and track and field. The league has merged with the Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference, which concluded a decade of excellence in women's athletics.

The Missouri Valley was formed on January 12, 1907, when eight administrators representing five midwestern state universities gathered in a hotel room in Kansas City. In the fall of that year, basketball became the first competitive sport in what was then the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

In addition to Northern Iowa, current MVC members include Bradley, Creighton, Drake, Illinois State, Indiana State, Southern Illinois, Southwest Missouri State, Tulsa, Wichita State and Evansville.

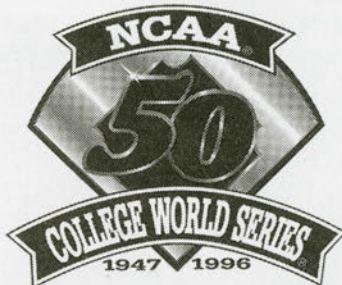

Facilities play an important role in helping Northern Iowa's student-athletes make the most of their collegiate careers.

The Panthers' baseball facilities provide an excellent atmosphere for teaching, learning and training no matter what the weather may bring.

The Panthers begin their fifth season in Riverfront Stadium in neighboring Waterloo, after having played all home dates there for the first time in 1993. A 10-minute drive from the Northern Iowa campus, Riverfront Stadium had been the home of professional baseball in Waterloo since 1948. The city-owned facility was home to the San Diego Padres Class A franchise in the Midwest League until two seasons ago when the Waterloo Diamonds became the Springfield (Ill.) Sultans in April, 1994.

Seating capacity is 4,277 with distances to the double decked outfield fence measuring 330 feet down the left- and right-field lines, 360 feet in the power alleys and 390 to center. Major renovations have been made to the playing surface and press box within the past two years.

For off-season conditioning and practice, Northern Iowa is blessed with one of the finest indoor facilities anywhere. The spacious 16,400-seat UNI-Dome, constructed in 1976, is home to Northern Iowa athletics and many of its teams. The adjoining Physical Education Center provides state-of-the-art weight and athletic training facilities. As for the Dome, home to the Panther football and basketball teams, it allows for a spacious indoor environment for practice when inclement weather prevents outdoor workouts.

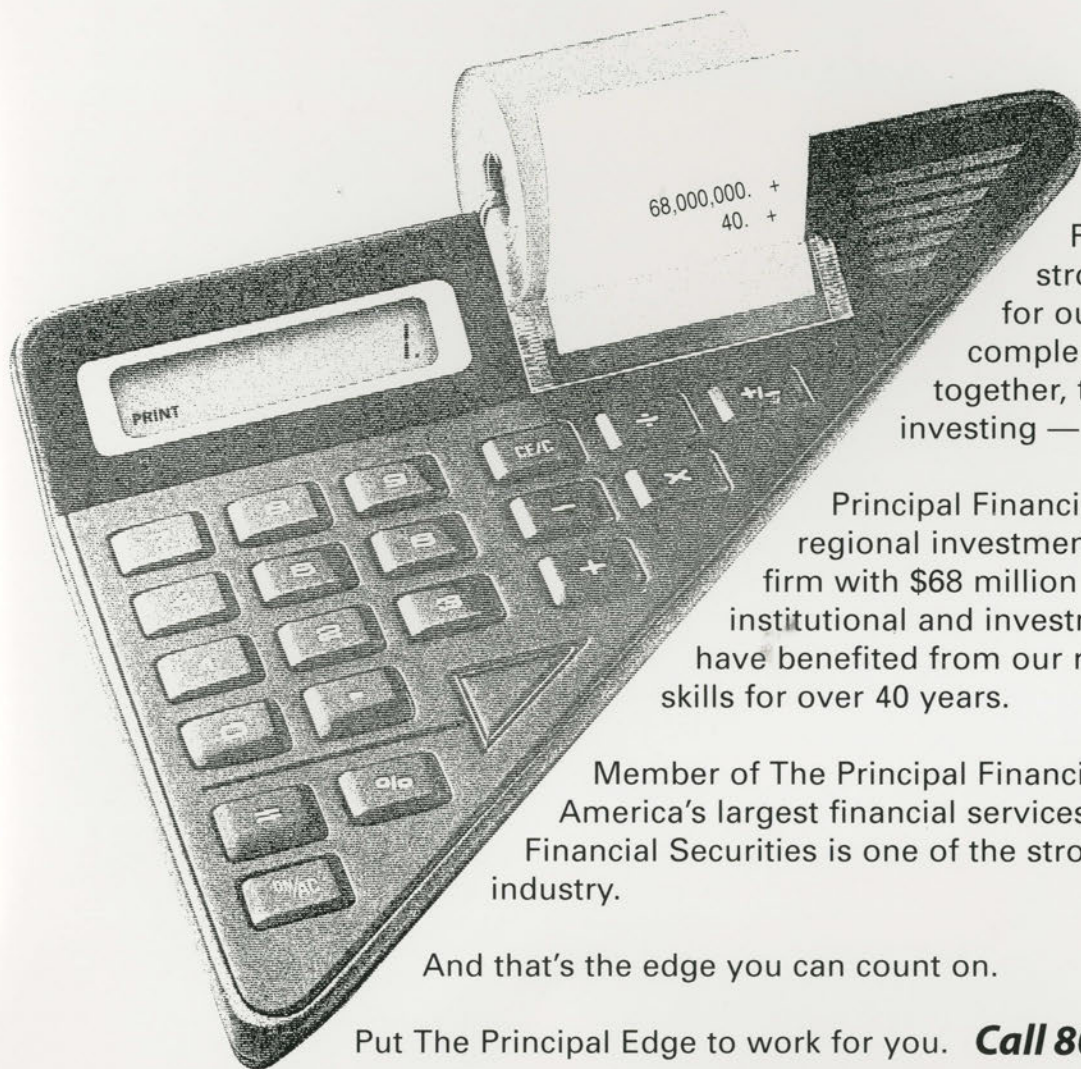
