### Environmental Issues Instruction (eii) Workshops

A Resource Enhancement and Protection Act (REAP) grant has been awarded for the 1992-93 continuation of eii. The program, designed to teach responsible environmental action, is appropriate for elementary and junior and senior high school students in all disciplines.

Each workshop consists of an instruction and resource gathering session (one weekend) and an "update" session at which teachers will exchange ideas and experiences (classroom application in the topic area is required and should occur between the two sessions).
