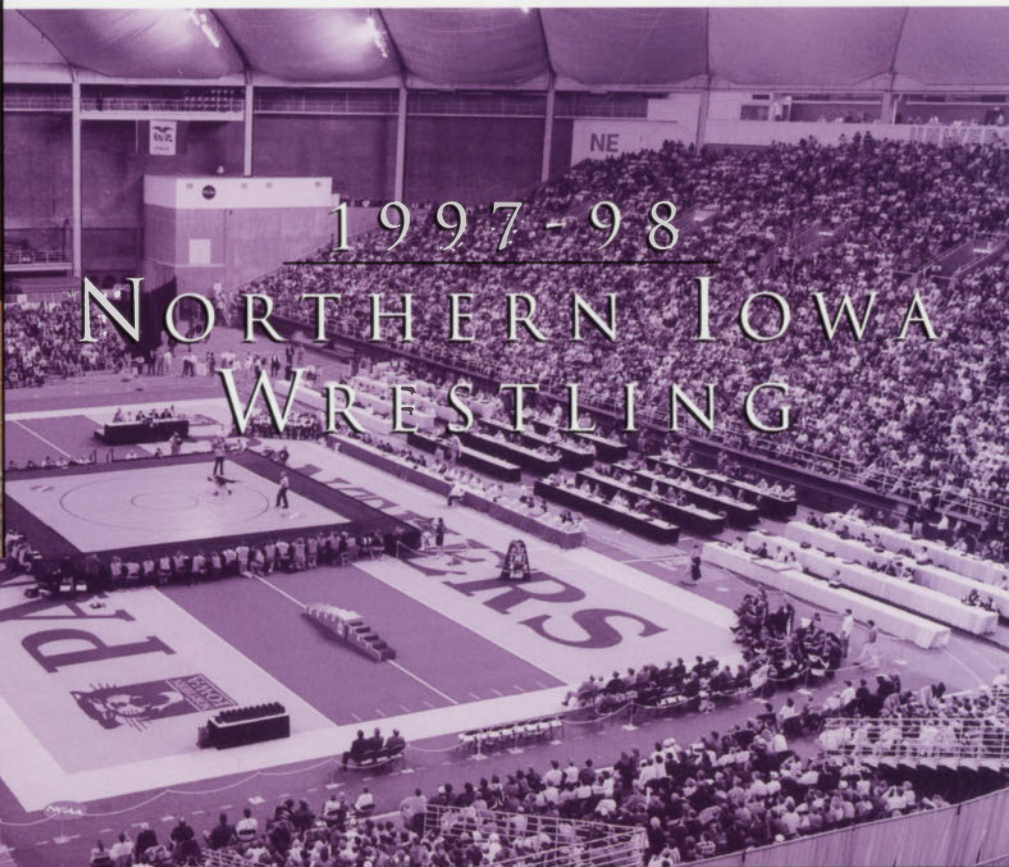

1997-98 SEASON OUTLOOK

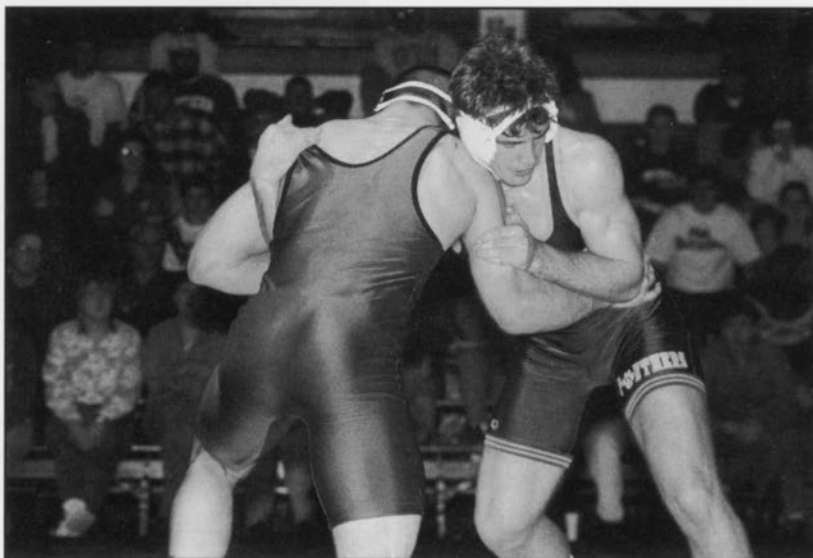
He's enthusiastic. He's excited. And he's raring to go. But he's also realistic.

Mark Manning, the seventh head coach in the storied history of University of Northern Iowa wrestling, knows the task facing him this season is formidable -- the Panthers are coming off a 7-8 dual season and a 41st-place finish in the NCAA Championships they hosted last March.

But the former North Carolina and Oklahoma assistant is ready to make the Panthers a force once again.

"I'm going in with the attitude that I want our guys to get better every tournament, every dual meet and I'm just taking it one week at a time," said Manning, who replaced Don Briggs after last season. "I think we're going to be competitive in every dual meet this year...(but) we're going to be a better tournament team than a dual-meet team."

Manning will work with a team that returns three NCAA qualifiers, although junior all-American Tony Wieland will likely redshirt after having reconstructive knee surgery in April. He is 50-31 in his career, but struggled through a 16-14

campaign last year with a banged up knee.

That leaves Manning -- and new

assistants Brad Penrith and Steve Hamilton--with qualifiers Chris Bahr and Ben Barton to build around. Both seniors are two-time national qualifiers,

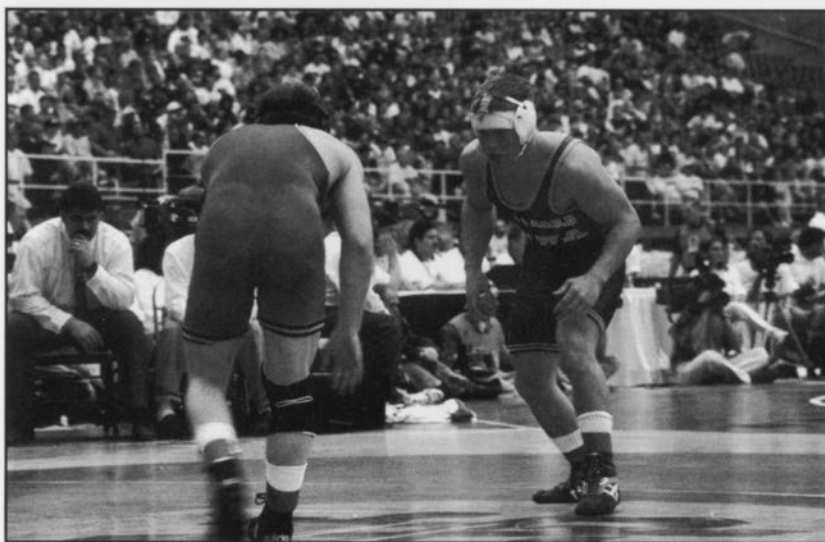
but haven't tasted much success at the NCAA's.

Bahr, a runnerup in the West Regional last season, compiled a 21-18 record a year ago at 150 pounds and is 37-53 in his career. Barton, a regional champ last year, won 28 of 40 matches last season at 177--including a victory in the NCAA Tournament--and is 59-42 in his career. He'll likely replace Wieland at 190 this year.

Those two, plus junior Ken Bigley, will carry the load for Manning's first UNI team. Bigley went 26-7 last season, mostly at 177, but was forced to wrestle heavyweight at the West Regional when he couldn't beat out Barton for a starting spot.

"We have some talent," Manning said. "We just have some gaping holes."

The rest of the Panther lineup will include either John Zelinski, transfer Eric Keller or Mike Kerker at 118 pounds; Mike Corsiglia at 126; Nick Flach or Keith Weber at 134; Glenn Pero, Jeff Evans or Phil Heim at 142; Jason Haag, Nate Lawrenz or Matt Barton at 158; Robert Armey, Tim Duff or Kyle Hansen at 167; and Burt Beamer at heavyweight.

Bahr will be challenged at 150 by Kevin Powell and Amir Alexander, and freshman Jason Payne could play a role at 190.

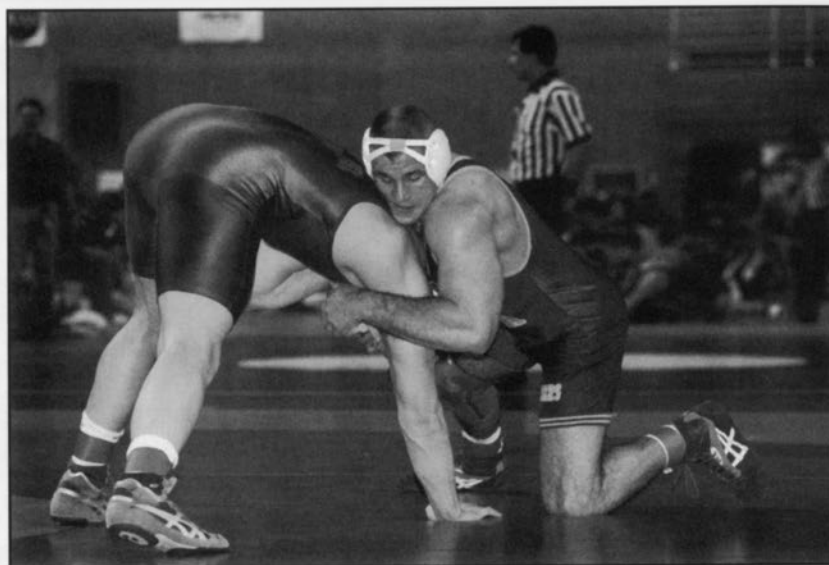
Zelinski, Weber, Pero and Haag all wrestled extensively last year. Zelinski went 7-17, Weber 16-19, Pero 17-19 and Haag 11-13. Arney, 5-10 last season and 16-33 in his career, and Beamer, 0-4 a year ago and 23-28 in two years, also have varsity experience. Keller is a transfer from Iowa State.

"I think it's a team that's going to get better as the year goes on," Manning said. "I think we have the potential for five or six all-Americans. I think that's where the guys have to think."

"I think we have a bunch of hungry wrestlers," he added. "We have some guys that want to be national champions. They have a lot of lofty goals so they have to be willing to pay the price in the practice room."

So far, Manning likes what he sees. Practices have been intense -- "they understand that practice is supposed to be intense if you're going to get something out of it," he said -- and the team has responded well.

"We have some kids that want to work and they want to pay the price," he said, "so good things will happen."

But Manning refuses to set goals that are too lofty -- for his sake and the team's.

"I'm low-keying it until I see them compete," he said. "I want our team to surprise us as a staff. I want our team to surprise me and show the effort that we're going to demand from them in competition, not only in practice."

Northern Iowa won't find any breaks on its schedule. The Panthers will host the annual UNI Open, set for Dec. 6, and also will entertain Penn State, Missouri

and Iowa State. The road tests will be even tougher, with dates at places like Indiana, Cal State Bakersfield, Wisconsin, Wyoming and Nebraska.

"Our schedule is very demanding," Manning said. "We're on the road a lot."

This year's NCAA qualifier is a combined East/West Regional that will be contested at Georgia State University in Atlanta, March 6-7. The NCAA Championships are in Cleveland, March 19-21.

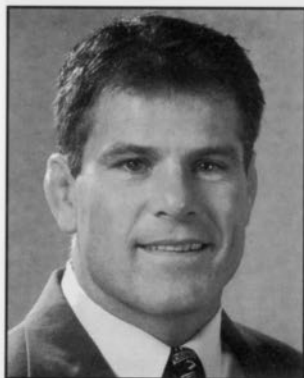

HEAD COACH MARK MANNING



A new era in Northern Iowa wrestling began last June 12 when Mark Manning became just the seventh head coach in school history. Manning succeeds Don Briggs, who stepped down after 15 seasons at the helm.

Manning brings an unparalleled list of credentials as an assistant and national team coach to

his first collegiate head coaching assignment.

His name is widely recognizable throughout the amateur wrestling community for his association with successful programs and involvement in developing young wrestlers through USA Wrestling.

Prior to his appointment at UNI, Manning spent the past four seasons as head assistant coach at Oklahoma, where the Sooners posted three top 10 NCAA finishes. He also was an assistant at North Carolina for eight seasons, helping lead the Tar Heels to three top 10 finishes nationally.

Renowned as a tireless recruiter, Manning was on an Oklahoma staff that had three recruiting classes ranked in the top five nationally in the four years he was there. In his time at North Carolina, the Tar Heels boasted the top-ranked class in the country in 1990.

Manning was an assistant coach for the United States Olympic Freestyle Team at the 1996 Summer Games in Atlanta. His duties included individual preparation and scouting of upcoming opponents. He also has been the National Developmental Coach for USA Wrestling, heading the Freestyle and Greco-Roman programs for four age groups.

Manning was an assistant coach for the U.S. World Team in 1993, 1995 and 1997. He also served as head coach for the U.S. Junior Team that competed in Budapest, Hungary, in 1994 and Russia in 1996. He was appointed coach for the East team at the 1991, 1993 and 1995 Olympic Festivals.

As a competitor, the South Dakota native compiled a 121-23 record and was a two-time national champion at Nebraska-Omaha and a three-time Division II all-American at 150 pounds. From 1986 to 1989, he was a member of the U.S. Freestyle Team and won the Silver Medal at the 1989 Pan American Games.

Known for his enthusiasm and intensity, Manning thinks those qualities are especially important in wrestling.

"They're especially important when you want to accomplish great things," Manning says. "We want to do great things here....I want to carry on the great tradition here and build upon it."

"To put in the time and effort to be successful at this level is an investment," Manning adds. "I like to say it's an investment because to do something great takes an investment of your time."

And while his wrestlers' accomplishments on the mat may get the most publicity, it's just as important for Manning that they are just as committed away from the wrestling room.

"We want our guys to be committed students and prepare themselves for life," he says. "It's important that they be competitive in the classroom as well as on the mat."

"We also want them to be part of a team and have aspirations to be national champions and all-Americans," Manning adds. "And we demand that they be quality citizens who represent themselves, their family and their community in the proper way."

Manning received his bachelor's degree from UNO in Physical Education and his master's from North Carolina in Sports Administration. He has a nine-year-old son, Matthew, who lives near Charlotte, N.C.



COACHING STAFF



Brad Penrith ***Assistant Coach***

Former University of Iowa three-time all-American and national champion Brad Penrith joined the Panther staff this past summer as the top assistant to new head coach Mark Manning.

Prior to his appointment, he spent the last five seasons as an assistant at Nebraska, coaching the Huskers' lighter weights. He also served a one-year stint as an assistant at Boise State in 1991-92, spent two seasons at Arizona State from 1989-91, and was a graduate assistant at Iowa.

Penrith won the 126-pound national championship at Iowa in 1986 as a sophomore, and then placed second at 126 in 1987 and 1988. He was a three-time Big Ten champ for the Hawkeyes and was named Outstanding Wrestler at the conference meet in 1986.

A 1988 Iowa graduate, Penrith also made his mark on the international level before retiring in 1996. He captured a silver medal at the 1991 World Championships and was the gold medalist at the Pan American Games in 1989 and '91.

Among his many accomplishments internationally, Penrith was third at '94 Goodwill Games; was a two-time Sunkist Open champion; took the Roger Coulon title in France in 1992 and '96; a member of the 1989 U.S. World Team; and third at the World Cup in 1990.

Closer to home, he placed third at the 1996 Olympic Team Trials; won the U.S. Nationals three times--1989, '91 and '93--and was second at the '92 Final Olympic Wrestle-Off.

In Penrith's five seasons coaching the lighter weights at Nebraska, the Huskers had seven all-Americans and four Big Eight Conference champions. As a team, Nebraska posted top 10 finishes at the NCAAAs three times in Penrith's five seasons, including third in 1993, and had the top-rated recruiting class in the nation in 1996.

A native of Windsor, N.Y., Penrith was a four-time state placewinner in high school, including the state title as a sophomore in 1981. He was named the Outstanding Greco-Roman Wrestler at the 1983 Junior Nationals. He is married to the former Laura Wood of Waukee, Iowa.



Steve Hamilton ***Assistant Coach***

Former Iowa State all-American Steve Hamilton is making his first collegiate coaching stop in Cedar Falls. Prior to his appointment last August, Hamilton had spent the last five

years with the Hawkeye Wrestling Club in Iowa City as a wrestler and coach, giving him the unique distinction of having wrestled or coached at each of the three state universities.

Hamilton is one of six Cyclone wrestlers to earn all-America honors four times, competing from 1988-92. He placed seventh at 158 as a freshman; third at 158 as a sophomore; second at 150 as a junior; and third at 167 as a senior. He was voted a team captain three years and ISU's Most Valuable Wrestler as a junior and senior.

Since the completion of his collegiate career, Hamilton has remained competitive on the national and international level. In 1996, he won the Olympic Trials South and the Michigan International Open. He also placed fifth at the 1995 Grand Prix Slovakia, took second and third at the Sunkist Open in 1993 and '94, respectively, and was a member of the 1993 U.S. Freestyle Team after placing third at the World Team Trials. Hamilton also placed fifth at the U.S. Nationals in 1993 and eighth in '94.

Hamilton has an extensive background in wrestling camps as a director and clinician. He was head coach of the Dan Gable Intensive Camp in Iowa City the last four years.

A native of Emmetsburg, Iowa, Hamilton was a four-time state placewinner, winning the title twice, and a three-time Freestyle all-American.

He received his bachelor's degree in History from Iowa State in 1992. His brother, Pat, wrestled at Northern Iowa from 1987-90.

COACHING STAFF



Joe Stephens **Volunteer** **Assistant Coach**

After completing his collegiate career two years ago at Northern Iowa, Joe Stephens is back for his second year on the Panther staff

as a volunteer assistant coach.

Stephens began his collegiate career at the University of Nebraska in 1991 and wrestled three years for the Huskers. He qualified for the NCAA Tournament as a freshman and placed fourth at the Big Eight Championships at 134 pounds. After redshirting the following year, he went on to post a 26-11 mark for the Huskers in 1994-95.

After transferring to UNI in 1995, Stephens became the Panthers' regular 142-pounder, finished second at the Great Plains Open and won the NCAA West Regional title to earn his second trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Stephens was a three-time state qualifier at Centerville (Iowa) High School, placing second as a sophomore and junior and fourth as a senior. He earned his bachelor's degree from UNI in economics.

He won the University Nationals freestyle title in 1995 and still competes at the national level in hopes of making the U.S. Freestyle Team.

Did You Know...?

- Northern Iowa ranks seventh all-time in number of Division I national champions with 20 and ninth in total all-Americans with 94.
- UNI's 580 all-time victories ranks 10th in NCAA history and its .679 winning percentage ranks 12th all-time.

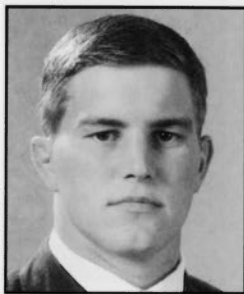

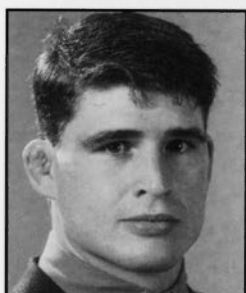

1996-97...Began the season at 158 pounds, wrestling his first 22 matches there, going 12-10...came within one match of placing at the Northern Open...went 3-2 at the Northern Iowa Open...went 5-2 at the Great Plains Invitational to finish fourth...moved down to 150 at the Virginia Duals and won seven of the first nine at his new weight...finished second at the West Regional to earn his second straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, where he went 0-2...posted a 9-8 record at 150 pounds...went 8-5 in dual competition...began the season rated 19th at 150...ranked second on the squad with five major

decisions...posted a season-long six-match winning string from Jan. 18-31. **1995-96**...Took over at 150 during the season after starter Ryan Cummings sustained season-ending injury...enjoyed a fine season, posting a 13-18 record, 5-9 in duals, and sharing the Outstanding Wrestler honor at the West Regional after winning the 150-pound title with three impressive victories...his five major decisions ranked second on the team...earned his first trip to the NCAA Tournament, but lost his first two matches...lost to the eventual 150 and 158-pound national champions, Chris Bono and Joe Williams, respectively...one of the most exciting Panther wrestlers, he was involved in 11 matches which saw double figures in scoring. **1994-95**...Filled a valuable "utility" role by competing at three weights (150, 158, 167) and 10 duals, filling in for injured starters. **1993-94**...Redshirted. **High School**...Won the large school state title in Wisconsin as a senior at 140 pounds after placing the previous two seasons...earned three varsity letters in football and four in wrestling.

THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA



A campus-wide commitment to great teaching lies at the heart of the University of Northern Iowa's reputation for providing exceptional undergraduate education, as well as complementary programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels. Building on its historic strength in teacher education, the University has developed a number of outstanding programs in business, natural sciences, humanities and fine arts, and social and behavioral sciences.

The University's academic reputation again has proven a key factor in landing a spot as the only public institution in *U.S. News and World Report's* top 15 regional universities in the Midwest for 1996.

UNI's 11th-place ranking is two places higher than the previous year's rating. This marks the second year in a row that Northern Iowa was the only public university ranked in the top 15, which are chosen from more than 100 public and private institutions in the region.

UNI received a "1" rating in academic reputation, the highest of any of the top 15 universities in the Midwest region. That rating consistently has improved over the past four years, from 26 in 1993, 20 in 1994 and 13 in 1995.

The magazine also named UNI the Midwest's most efficient regional university and first in "best value". This marks the fifth time in six years that UNI has been cited by

the magazine's "America's Best Colleges" issue in such categories as overall "best", "best buy", "up and coming" and "most efficient".

Enrollment on the 860-acre campus stands at about 13,000 students from every county in Iowa, 40 states and 48 foreign countries.

UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The University nurtures a premier learning environment--it is small enough to offer students individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources and opportunities, as well as distinguished faculty.

The school was founded in 1876 as the Iowa State Normal School. In 1909, it became Iowa State Teachers College. In 1961, the name was changed to State College of Iowa, and in 1967, the Iowa Legislature acted to change the status of the institution to that of a university under its present title.

While maintaining its heritage in teacher education, the University has continued its metamorphosis toward a multi-purpose institution, with nationally acclaimed programs in many disciplines. UNI's accounting program continues to be ranked among the best in the nation. The College of Business

Administration has become the largest undergraduate business school in Iowa and has gained a reputation as one of the finest in the Midwest. Student groups ranging from chemistry to conservation to public relations have been recognized by their respective national groups for the excellence of their programs.

Northern Iowa is located in Cedar Falls, an inviting and historic community of about 36,000 people. Together with the adjacent city of Waterloo, the metropolitan area has a culturally diverse population of 115,000 and combines big city opportunities with small town friendliness. Cedar Falls/Waterloo is a center for industry, finance, commerce, recreation and cultural activities for northeast Iowa.

ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Robert Koob, President

Robert Koob, a native of Hawarden, Iowa, and a 1962 graduate of UNI, was appointed the University's eighth president in August, 1995. He is the first alumnus in the University's 120-year history to return as its president. "It is an honor for me, as a UNI graduate, to return as president," Koob said upon his appointment. "I can't imagine anyone being more honored in the state of Iowa."

The Koob presidency has stressed a commitment to strategic planning to guide the institution's efforts, the effective use of technology in higher education, the importance and value of developing a university community, and has renewed the University's commitment toward teaching and learning. Koob believes in reaching a better understanding of each student's abilities, and ensuring students achieve a university education of the highest quality as they become valued and productive members of society.

"It is important that we define our niche well and that Northern Iowa understand it's an institution committed to four-year undergraduate education, with appropriate graduate programs, but that teaching is its fundamental focus," he says. "We want everyone on the campus to understand that that's (teaching) an honorable and appropriate future for them, and that faculty understand that their good work is appreciated by the state. We want students to understand the education they receive will put them in contention for the appropriate positions when they graduate, as well as prepare them to be good citizens. And we want the people of Iowa to believe they're getting good value for their dollars."

Before coming to UNI, he was senior vice president and vice president for academic affairs at California Polytechnic State University at San Luis Obispo, Calif., since 1990.

Prior to his position at Cal Poly, the 54-year-old Koob was vice president of academic affairs at North Dakota State University in Fargo, N.D., from 1985-90, and served a one-year term as interim president there from 1987-88.

At Cal Poly, Koob was a director and chair of the Cal Poly Foundation, and served on a number of CSU system committees, including the CSU Commission on Telecommunications Infrastructure.

He began his teaching career at North Dakota State in 1967 as an assistant professor of chemistry, advancing to professor in 1972. He served as chair of the chemistry department for six years, acting chair of the physics department for a year and dean of the College of Science and Mathematics from 1981-84 before assuming the vice presidency.

Koob graduated from State College of Iowa (now UNI) with a B.A. in chemistry and earned his doctorate in chemistry from the University of Kansas in 1967. He and his wife, Yvonne, have seven children.



Christopher Ritrievi, Athletic Director

Christopher Ritrievi is in his sixth year as Northern Iowa's athletic director. Since the day he joined the department, he has worked to develop a competitive Division I athletic program at UNI.

A former Division I athlete himself, Ritrievi earned three varsity letters in wrestling at Princeton University, where he received a bachelor's degree in economics in 1979. He earned a master's in business administration from Lehigh University in 1983.

His career in intercollegiate athletics started as a graduate assistant at Lehigh. He has served in administrative and coaching positions at the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference, Bowling Green State, Princeton, Pennsylvania and Stanford, where he had been associate athletic director prior to coming to UNI.

During his tenure at Northern Iowa, he has reorganized the management of the athletic department to make it more effective and has set priorities to increase the competitiveness of Panther teams. Emphasizing increased operating budgets for all sports and increased scholarships for women's sports, the department has enjoyed its best performances since joining the NCAA's Division I in 1980.

Since 1992, UNI has celebrated Missouri Valley Conference championships in men's cross country, indoor and outdoor track, and volleyball. The football team has won four Gateway Conference titles and has enjoyed the highest attendance, including six of seven UNI-Dome football sellouts. In 1995-96, six

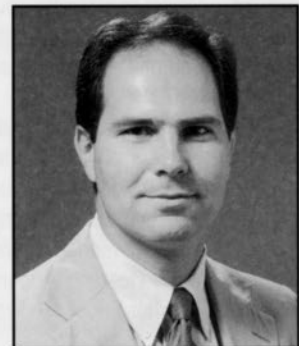
sports enjoyed their highest conference finishes since joining the MVC in 1991.

The department has successfully hosted NCAA playoff games in football and volleyball and the 1996 West Regional Wrestling Championship. Last March, Ritrievi served as tournament director for the most successful NCAA Wrestling Championship in history as over 90,000 fans shattered the previous attendance record in the UNI-Dome.

The department operates on a balanced budget and student-athletes graduate at rates equal to or better than the student body as a whole. And after a year-long process, the department received NCAA Certification last March.

Ritrievi served as vice president for the MVC athletic directors in 1994-95 and chairs the MVC long-range planning and Gateway Conference finance committees. He also has been named president of the Division I-AA Football Athletic Directors Association for the 1996-97 academic year.

The 40-year-old native of Levittown, Pa., is married to the former Stephanie Homeyer, who grew up in Wellsburg, Iowa.

- ✓ Interpret institutional academic requirements

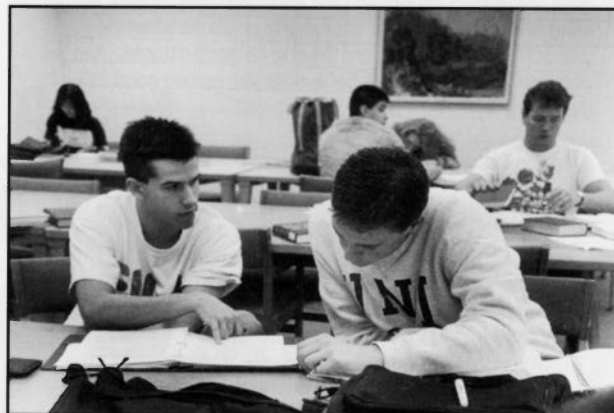
The Reading/Learning Strategies Program provides many services for students, including free four-week courses in:

Ed Ewoldt Scholarship

In January of 1992, Northern Iowa officials announced the establishment of the Ed Ewoldt Wrestling Scholarship, the first fully-endowed scholarship in the history of the University's athletics program.

The scholarship was made possible by a \$120,000 gift to the Northern Iowa Foundation by Ron Magruder of Orlando, Florida. Each year, beginning with the 1992-93 academic year, the Panther wrestling program has awarded a full scholarship from the interest generated by the gift.

Ewoldt began attending UNI, then known as Iowa State Teachers College, in 1948 and graduated in 1954, competing on the wrestling team his last two years. He went on to teach and coach at West Central-Maynard (IA) High School from 1955-58 and Wheaton (IL) Central High School, where he coached Magruder, from 1959-88.

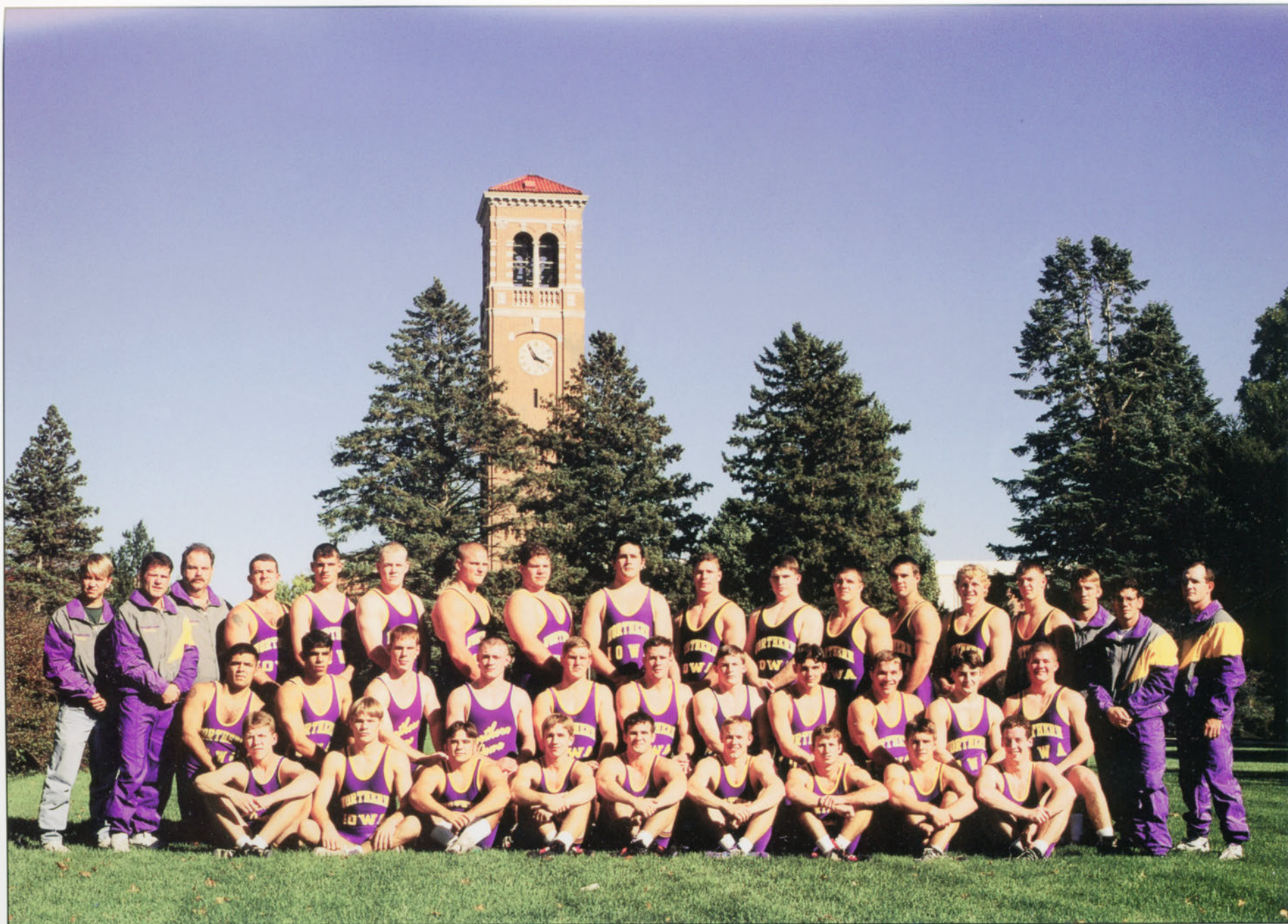
"Ed has had a tremendous impact on my life," Magruder said, "and has helped me get where I am today. This is my way of thanking him for being a great teacher, mentor and friend."
