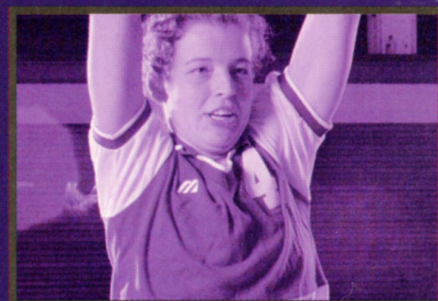

the excellence of their programs.

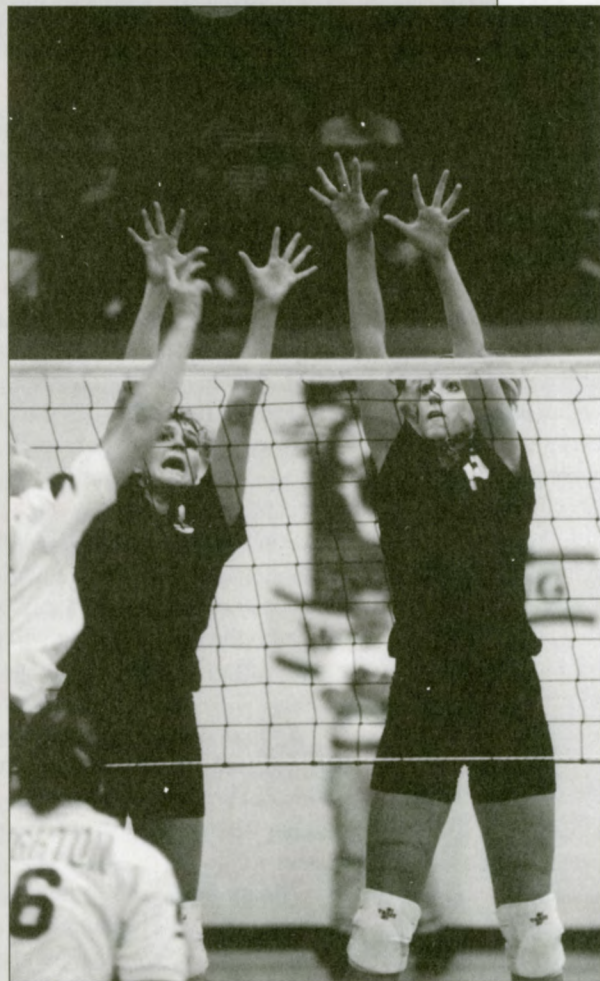

1998 SEASON OUTLOOK

Iradge Ahrabi-Fard is back and he feels like he never left.

While the Northern Iowa coach was on a leave of absence last season to serve as a consultant to USA Volleyball, interim coach Bobbi Petersen led the Panthers to a second-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference and 18-9 record.

This season, Petersen returns to her role as the top assistant and Ahrabi-Fard returns to the bench with a talented but youthful team he thinks could be ready to make a real impact in the race for the Valley title.

"I think we're going to be good, but just how good, I don't know," said the veteran coach, who returns for his 17th season.

"The conference is going to be very competitive...there won't be any easy matches," he continued. "And that will put pressure on everyone and I think give an advantage to the teams who are the best conditioned and can do it time after time.

"I don't think there is an untouchable team even though Illinois State is certainly the preseason favorite with most of their key players back."

The Panthers return their entire roster from a year ago, including a first team all-conference setter with plenty of weapons to dish off to; a solid corps of middle hitters; and veterans in the back row.

But, Ahrabi-Fard noted, few positions on the team are cut and dried entering pre-season practice.

"Our younger players are challenging our returning starters," he said. "Our team is talented and training right, especially the younger players."

Shannon Perry firmly established herself as one of the premier setters in the league as a sophomore a year ago and will direct what should be a potent Panther attack.

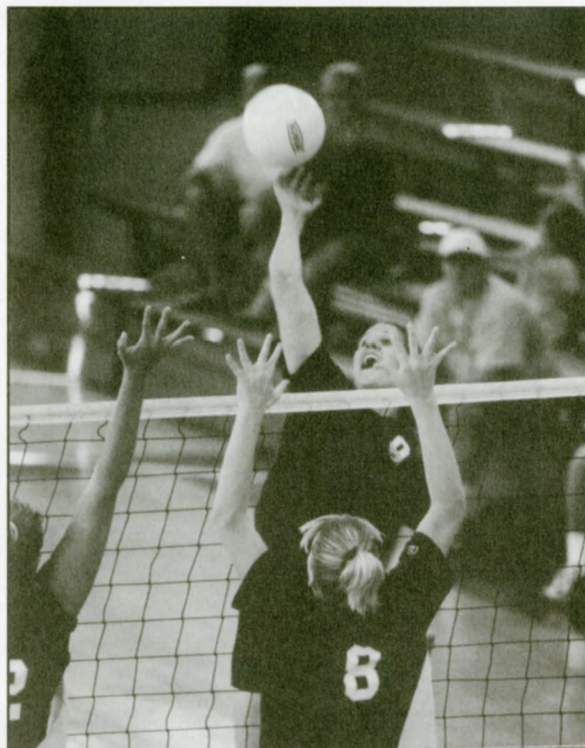
"Shannon is going to be better than ever," said Ahrabi-Fard. "She is a very intelligent player who has a good understanding of the mechanics involved (with setting). She also has good mobility and a good relationship with other players."

Perry's main targets a year ago were senior Kerri Eich and sophomore Alexandra Auker.

Eich emerged as one of the top all-around players in the Valley last season, ranking third in kills, fourth in digs and sixth in service aces. Her 501 kills were the most ever for a Panther junior and ranks third on the school single-season list.

"Kerri worked very hard last off-season and the results are obvious," said the UNI coach. "She's a strong hitter, one who has the power to dominate a match."

Auker enjoyed an

outstanding freshman season, falling just a kill short of the UNI freshman record with 357. She ranked second to Eich on the squad in kills, attempts and digs, and was voted to the MVC's all-newcomer team.

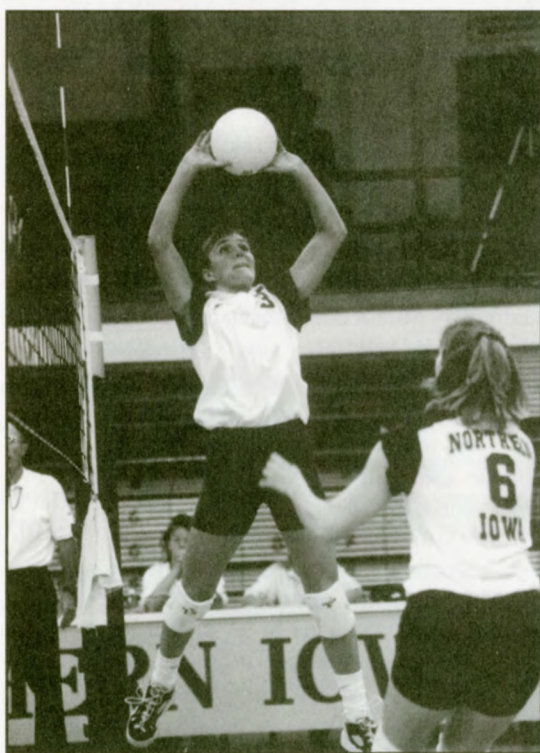
"Alex is a great athlete and a great competitor," observed Ahrabi-Fard. "She's a game player. Some are great in practice and then when it's time to step up in a match, they're not there...Alex steps up and shows more than we expect of her."

Sophomore Jeni Schneckloth, who began her UNI career as a middle hitter, is expected to see plenty of action on the right side, but will still be moved around to take advantage of her versatility.

Sophomores Kim McCaffrey and Maya Hirsch are expected to offer a strong challenge for Auker after making "tremendous strides" in the off-season.

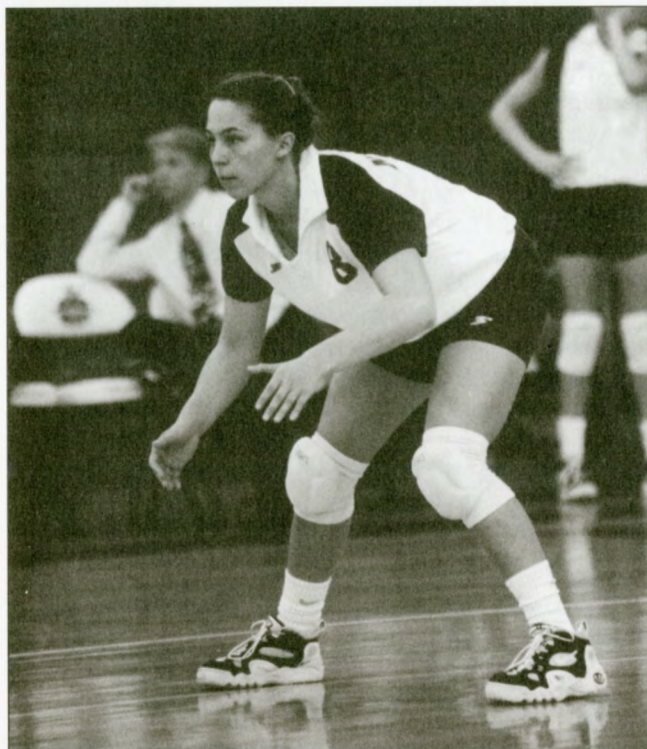
Ahrabi-Fard said it's possible one of those three will be redshirted along with freshman Dayna Depping, a first team all-stater from Dike.

Junior Holly VanHofwegen anchors a trio of middle hitters that helped the Panthers lead the Valley in

blocking last year.

She was fourth in the conference with a 1.23 block average and tossed in over three kills per game as well.

She'll be joined by the seventh-ranked blocker in the Valley a year ago, junior Jodi DeVries, and sophomore Mandie Burke.

"Holly is going to be a force in the conference as a middle player," said Ahrabi-Fard. "Jodi is a great athlete and Mandie will be able to take care of herself so our middles will give us an interesting combination."

With new rules in place this season that take away limitations on the number of substitutions, senior defensive specialists Shishonee Weber and Mindy Workman are set to play an even more important role in the back row.

"Without the limits, they're going to be in there all the time and be very important," said Ahrabi-Fard. "They're great leaders and will add to the smoothness of the transition from offense to defense. They're as good as any back row players we've had here."

"Even though we didn't lose anyone from last year, we're still a fairly young team with seven freshmen and sophomores, most of which play a

lot," he added.

The Panthers open the season with tournaments at Florida State and Northern Illinois, and resume their non-conference rivalry with Iowa State before opening the Missouri Valley season Sept. 18 at Southwest Missouri State.

And what did the season away from the Panther bench do for Ahrabi-Fard?

"I think I'm a better coach...I observed closely a higher level of play and training...any coach would grow from that experience," he said. "The most important thing it did for me was allow me to observe and analyze...be creative with my thinking and soak in more knowledge of the game."

HEAD COACH IRADGE AHRABI-FARD



Recognized as one of the most successful coaches in the Midwest, Dr. Iradge Ahrabi-Fard has compiled an outstanding 419-133 record in 16 seasons at Northern Iowa.

Ahrabi-Fard led the Panthers to Missouri Valley Conference titles in 1994 and '95 after taking the program to the top of the Gateway Conference three times in the final six years of the league's existence.

He collected career win #400 at the Sun Devil Challenge at Arizona State on Aug. 31, 1996, against Wright State. He coached his 500th match at the collegiate level Sept. 15, 1995 in a win over Drake.

The Panthers were without the veteran coach for the 1997 season, however, as he took a leave of absence to serve as a consultant for USA Volleyball and the development of its various teams. Assistant coach Bobbi Petersen headed the program for the season, but Ahrabi-Fard resumed his leadership role at the conclusion of the campaign.

Under his guidance, the Panthers have posted a 304-70 mark in the dozen seasons from 1985-96, with six conference championships, five NCAA Championship Tournament berths and three National Invitation appearances, including a trip to the N.I.V.C. Final Four in 1993.

Ahrabi-Fard's teams have chalked up at least 20 victories in 14 of his 16 seasons. He was voted Gateway Coach of the Year in 1985 and 1987, and earned recognition as Midwest Region Coach of the Year by his peers in 1985. In 1994 and '95, he was voted Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year and, in '95, led his team to its first national ranking, breaking into the top 25 late in the season and finishing 24th in the final poll after the Panthers bowed out of the NCAA Tournament to Stanford in the second round.

A 1965 graduate of UNI, Ahrabi-Fard has long been involved in athletics on the international level. In his native Iran, he served as President of the Institution of Sports from 1967 thru 1969, head swimming coach for the men's and women's national teams from 1967 thru 1970, Executive

Director of the Education Department of Sports Ministry in 1970, and Vice-Minister of Sports Ministry from 1977 thru 1978. He also served as special physical educator for the Crown Prince and Princess of Iran.

As an athlete, Ahrabi-Fard competed on the Iranian national volleyball team internationally and in the Asian Games. He also was a high jumper on the national track and field team and competed his freshman year at UNI.

He was a successful high school coach in several sports at Northern University High School in Cedar Falls prior to taking the UNI job, earning various district, regional and state coach of the year honors in volleyball, track and field, and swimming.

Ahrabi-Fard has authored several books on volleyball coaching and is a highly sought-after speaker/clinician throughout the country.

After earning his bachelor's degree in physical education, Ahrabi-Fard received his master's in physical education from UNI in 1966 and his doctorate in physical education and educational administration from the University of Minnesota in 1975.

Assistant Coach

Bobbi Petersen

One of the greatest players in Northern Iowa volleyball history, Bobbi Petersen joined the Panther program as an assistant coach three years ago. A year ago, Petersen served as UNI's interim head coach while Iradje Ahrabi-Fard served as a consultant to the U.S. National Team, and led her squad to a second-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 13-5 mark, 18-9 overall.

As a player at UNI, the former Bobbi Becker was a three-time first team all-conference selection and two-time first team all-region pick. Although it has been eight years since she last donned a Panther uniform, she still holds four school records and places second in 11 other categories.

Her 40 kills in a 1989 match against Illinois State not only is tops in Northern Iowa history, but also stands as the all-time Missouri Valley/Gateway Conference record. A native of Dike, Iowa, Petersen also holds school records for career and season digs with 1,457 and 471, respectively. She compiled 1,611 career kills and a 3.41 career kill average. In 1992, she was voted Gateway Conference Volleyball Athlete of the Decade.

Petersen earned her bachelor's degree in therapeutic recreation in 1990 and her master's from UNI in physical education in 1992. She served as a graduate assistant with the Panthers in 1990 and after completing her master's was employed as a therapeutic recreation specialist in Fort Smith, Ark., and Fort Dodge, Iowa.

Petersen and her husband, Duane, reside in Cedar Falls.



Assistant Coach

Annie Dailey

The newest member of the UNI staff, Annie Dailey, was appointed in July, replacing long-time assistant Jan Bittner, who retired last spring.

Dailey returns to the coaching ranks this season after a 10-year hiatus, but brings impressive credentials to the program. From 1984-86, she compiled a 76-35 record as head coach at Central College in Pella, Iowa, where she led the Flying Dutch to Iowa Conference titles in 1984 and '86 and a runnerup finish in 1985. She was voted the league's coach of the year in 1984.

After leaving Central, Dailey served as an assistant coach at Wartburg College from 1987-88. Her first coaching experience came as an assistant at Albia (Iowa) High School from 1982-83.

She is a 1981 graduate of the University of Iowa, where she lettered on the volleyball team and was named to the Big Ten all-academic team in 1979.

She and her husband, Dave, live in Waterloo with their son, Kody. She also has a daughter, Kristin Harris, who lives in Grundy Center.

1997 - Enjoyed one of the most productive seasons in school history, leading the team in kills (501), attempts (1224), digs (384) and service aces (39)...her 501 kills and 384 digs were the most ever by a Panther junior, while her 1224 attempts is a school single-season record...her kill, kill average (4.77) and dig totals rank third on the school single-season charts...one of just three players in UNI history to register 500 kills in a season...voted to the Missouri Valley all-conference first team after ranking third in the league in kills, fourth in digs and sixth in service aces...one of two Panthers named to the Valley all-tournament team and one of three UNI players voted to the conference all-academic first team...recorded double-figure kills in all but one of the team's 27 matches, eclipsing the 20-kill mark 13 times...notched six matches with at least 20 kills and 20 digs...compiled a career-high 29 kills at Bradley. **1996** - Played in all 28 matches and 83 of the team's 96 games...notched a season-high seven kills at Wichita State...nearly doubled her hitting percentage from the previous season, .228 compared to .134 as a freshman...accumulated a career-best five blocks at Southwest Missouri...four service aces vs. Wright State was a career high...collected six kills, three digs and five blocks at Southwest Missouri State. **1995** - Redshirted. **1994** - Started several matches early in the season, ultimately playing in 19 of 30 matches...enjoyed her best match in the final of the Washington State Cougar Challenge, collecting five kills and nine digs against the host...had two kills, two aces and six digs in the same tournament vs. Nevada...compiled four kills each in back-to-back matches vs. Wichita State and Creighton.

High School - A fourth team all-stater whose Junior Olympic team won the national championship following her senior year...ranked among the state leaders in blocks as a senior with a 1.84 average per game...all-conference performer in volleyball, track, basketball and softball...letters won--volleyball (3), track (4), basketball (3) and softball (2).

Team and Individual Success

In 16 years of Gateway and Missouri Valley Conference competition, Northern Iowa has posted 20 or more victories 13 times, captured six conference titles and appeared in five NCAA Tournaments and three N.I.V.C. Tournaments.

Individually, conference and region honors have become commonplace for Northern Iowa players. In the past 12 years, the Panthers have had 45 all-conference selections, including four league players of the year and 23 first team selections.

Excellence in the Classroom

Three Northern Iowa players have been named Academic All-Americans a total of six times. Mary Bernhardt was a three-time First Team Academic All-American from 1985-87 while Kate Galer was a First Team pick in 1996 after earning Third Team honors the previous season. Kris Schroeder was honored on the Second Team in 1989. Since the Missouri Valley Conference instituted its academic all-conference squad in 1992, Northern Iowa has had 13 selections to the first team.



Great Fans

The Panthers have consistently ranked among the national leaders in attendance in recent years. The 1995 home attendance average of 1,285 ranked 17th in the nation. The friendly confines of the West Gym have helped the Panthers to a phenomenal 149-10 record at home over the last decade, including a 50-match home winning streak from 1992-96, which ranks fourth in NCAA history.

MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE

A commitment to excellence, both in the classroom and athletic arena, has been a trademark of the Missouri Valley Conference since its inception in the winter of 1907. Built firmly on a solid foundation, the Missouri Valley Conference has made great strides and streamlined its resources and skills to become one of the nation's most progressive athletic conferences.

Athletic accomplishments on the men's athletic side include four national basketball championships, 17 trips to the NCAA Final Four and a 1989 national baseball championship.

Obviously, the inclusion of women's programs under the Missouri Valley banner--the oldest athletic conference west of the Mississippi River--has provided an immediate boost. The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference--which began in 1982--merged with the Missouri Valley Conference and was unveiled as part of the new MVC on July 1, 1992.

The St. Louis-based Missouri Valley Conference began its first tradition long ago. Initiated as a basketball conference in 1907, the MVC has produced many individual and team national champions in basketball and other sports.

Seeds for the creation of the conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who gathered at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more institutions--Drake University and Iowa State College--were admitted to the league.

In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball.

MVC student-athletes and coaches have become household names during the conference's illustrious history, both during their collegiate careers and, for some, professional careers which have followed stardom in the Valley.

Some 31 institutions in 13 states have at one time or another been a part of what is now the Missouri Valley Conference. Membership has stabilized in the past decade, and now a league that has survived in what has been a volatile environment for the past few years continues its evolution with women's athletics maintaining its ascent.

Current conference members include Bradley University, Creighton University, Drake University, the University of Evansville, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, the University of Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois University, Southwest Missouri State University and Wichita State University.
